From the Chairman's desk:

Most of us live in perpetual dread of the 'Gang of Four'. Know who these four are? I know not, myself. But that is how we have it in some of our languages: "What will Four People say?" It is these anonymous four people who determine what we should wear, what material possessions we should have, what social functions we should attend, how much we should spend on a marriage or a funeral—in short, how we should order our personal lives which alas! is all that we truly possess. That only true possession of ours we surrender to others. This is the tragedy of our daily lives, atleast in the case of most of us. To live the life of a rag-doll motivated and manoeuvred all the time by everyone around is the very negation of life itself.

We can never hope to have peace of mind until we become masters of our own thoughts and actions, until we learn to cultivate a studied disdain for other people's opinion about us. This is not the same as being 'self-opinionated' or bumptious. The disregard for other people's criticism I refer to comes from a deep-seated awareness that I am my own critic. The only valid standard of measurement of one's actions is one's own better judgement and not the opinion of someone else who may, most often, be either ill-informed about us or biased or himself of dubious merit. But we must take care to see that one's judgement of one's actions maintains a very high degree of objectivity. It should not be based on a passing whim or self-righteousness or, worst of all, self-pity. If I am merciless in my appraisal of my own conduct, what need have I to be apprehensive of another's opinion about me? In fact, if I give unfettered freedom to my conscience to sit in continuous moral judgement over every one of my actions, I am bound to be correct in my dealings with others also. As Polonius tells Laertes in *Hamlet* :

" This above all: to thine own self be true,
And it must follow as the night the day,
Thou canst not then be false to any man".

No doubt, those who try to manipulate or exploit you for furthering their own selfish interests may still be left dissatisfied—but they are best left dissatisfied.

Accept yourself. Your whole outlook on life must be built upon that acceptance. You may have certain short-comings. Who has not? Be aware of them. Beware of them. There is no need on that ground to deride yourself. After you accept yourself, make a conscious, continuous effort to improve yourself. In this, you are your own umpire.

Most cases of depression and gloom arise from our lack of confidence in ourselves, our persistent craving for someone else's approval and our failure to get it. But once you make sure that your sense of self-worth alone determines how you feel, you liberate yourself. 'Some will praise thee, some will blame thee, some will flatter, some will slight'—that is the way of the world and do not allow yourself to be swept off your feet by that. Other people's praise or blame should be viewed with equal disregard.

Your goals in life, your attitude to the world around you, the rules of personal conduct you set for yourself must all be those of your own adult choice and mature judgement—not imposed on you by your family or friends or strangers, however well-meaning they may be. Make it clear to everyone that you wish to live your life only on your own terms.

It is a curious thing in life that very often you will get the price you ask for yourself. If you have under-stamped your own value, that is all you will be given. That was why, more than five hundred years before Christ, Pythagoras said: "Above all things, reverence yourself".

News and Notes

1. Restriction & Control Orders :

(a) In G. O. Ms. No. 1215 dt. 15—6—84 the demand cut on power intensive H.T. industries (i. e.) caustic soda, calcium carbide, silicon carbide, aluminium and potassium chlorate has been reduced from 30% to 15%. The energy cut of 30% on these industries has completely been removed.

(b) In Government letter 184871/Y1/84—1 dated 26—6—84 the Government have imposed a cut of 15% on demand on the consumers who had earlier been given cuts of less than 15%.

(c) Consequent on the relaxation of cut on demand in respect of power intensive industries from 30% to 15% these units have been permitted to work for 24 days in a month at a stretch without cut on demand (vide Memo. No. SE/LD & GO/Eg/AS/PC (G1)/D62/84 date 28—6—84.)

(d) In Government letter 184656/Y1/84—2 dated 23—6—84 the Government have directed the 20 hours supply (except between 6-00 p.m. and 10-00 p.m.) be given to the agricultural pumpsets in Thanjavur District and the Taluks of Chidambaram, Kattumannarkoil of South Arcot District and Tiruchirappally, Musri, Kulithalai and Lalgudi Taluks of Tiruchirappally District where monopoly procurement of paddy is made.

2. Tariff Revision :

With effect from 15—6—84 the tariff in respect of the following services has been revised as follows [vide G. O. Ms. 1181 PW (Electricity) dated 12—6—84].

(a) Registered factories, tea estates, textiles, railway traction, fertilizers and industrial establishments other than caustic soda, calcium carbide, aluminium and potassium chlorate.

Thiru V. Satyanathan, Chief Engineer/Mettur Thermal Power Project has been appointed as a Member of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board with effect from 1—7—1984 in the place of Thiru V. Mahalingam who retired from service on 30—6—1984. (G. O. Ms. No. 1317 PWD dt. 28—6—84.)

7. Meetings :

(a) The quarterly review meeting on the performance of generating stations and progress of Power Projects was held on 15—6—1984 in the Board's Conference Hall under the chairmanship of the Minister for Electricity.

(b) The meeting of the Southern Regional Electricity Board was held at Neyveli on 29—6—1984.

(c) The Secretary to Government of India, Cabinet Secretariat (Co-ordination) held a meeting in the Board's Office on 30—6—1984 to discuss coal supplies to thermal stations in Tamil Nadu.

All the officers concerned are requested to take immediate action in the matter.

According to the condition prescribed in para 1 (c) of the reference cited, for grant of permission to the retired employees of the Board to take up private employment, the pensioner should not during the tenure of his service under the Board had any dealing with the employer under whom he proposes to seek employment as might afford a reasonable basis for the suspicion that such pensioner had shown favours to such employer.

2. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board has now decided that for the purpose of granting permission to a retired employee of the Board to take up private employment, it would be sufficient if the pensioner had no dealing with the employer under whom he proposes to seek employment during the last three years of service.

3. Accordingly it is hereby ordered that the existing condition in para 1 (c) of the Memo. cited be substituted by the following:—

“Whether the pensioner while in service had any dealing during the last three years with the employer under whom he proposes to seek employment as might afford a reasonable basis for the suspicion that such pensioner had shown favours to such employer.”

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Chairman's Memo. No. 1314/SGC—1/84—4 Dated 3—6—1984

Sub : Meetings convened by Collectors—Attendance by Officers of the Electricity Board.

Some of the Collectors have complained that the officers of the Electricity Board do not attend some of the meetings convened by them. Since the Collectors have overall responsibilities for coordination of all aspects of district administration, officers of the Electricity Board are expected to extend their fullest cooperation to the Collectors just as the Collectors are expected to extend their cooperation fully to the Board in matters such as recovery of arrears etc.

2. When the Superintending Engineer or Divisional Engineer is a Member of a Committee or Council presided over by the District Collector, he should invariably attend the meetings of the Committee or Council. He should attend the meeting even if no particular subject on the agenda for the meeting relates to him since it is possible that other subjects also come up during the meeting.

3. In other cases where the Divisional Engineer gets a requisition for a meeting taken by the Collector, he should invariably attend the meeting.

4. Similarly, in other cases, where the Superintending Engineer gets a requisition for a meeting taken by the Collector, he should as far as possible attend the meeting. If, for unavoidable reasons, he is unable to attend the meeting, he should depute the Divisional Engineer concerned if the issue is of a local nature or the Divisional Engineer, (General) of his office if the issue is of a general nature.

Sub :— Establishment—Employees retired from service Terminal benefits not settled for want of "No due Certificate" from the field—Instructions issued.

There is inordinate delay in the sanction and settlement of terminal benefits in respect of employees retired or dead.

2. One of the main reasons for such abnormal delay in releasing the terminal benefits is the non issue of "No due Certificate" by the immediate Superior as on the date of retirement.

3. There are two types in this category (i) where the retired employee is still alive and (ii) where retired employee died subsequent to retirement. The retired employee who is still alive will have to reconcile the accounts in respect of works executed by him and also reconcile the shortage of T & P if any. In all pending cases three months notice may be given to the retired employees to attend the discrepancies failing which the shortages may have to be recovered from the retired employees' terminal benefits to the extent possible. In respect of retired employees who died subsequent to retirement, the Superintending Engineers should arrange to close all the work orders and reconcile all the accounts operated by the retired employees within six months period. If amount due to shortages of materials or T & P is not feasible of recovery, proposals may be sent to the Board to write off the losses due to shortages.

4. In order to avoid such a situation in future the S. Es. and other Officers who are competent to settle the terminal benefits are informed that whenever superannuation notice is issued to an employee incharge of works, he should be specifically instructed that he should close all the work orders operated by him within a period of service of one year and also hand over the balance of materials drawn by him for the works under progress with the pole schedule and other details for all the work carried out by him. Similarly, officers/staff incharge of T&P should also hand over all tools and plants in complete shape on the date of retirement and obtain the "Clearance Certificate". It may also be indicated in the notice that it would be the responsibility of the Officer to close the work orders and account for the materials drawn by him before the date of his retirement failing which the Board would not be responsible for the delay in settling the terminal benefits.

5. In respect of those who die while on duty the Superintending Engineers and the Other Officers should immediately make arrangements to take inventory of the materials and T & P available at site and arrange to close the work order operated by deceased officer within three months of death. If there are any shortages, the amount due to the Board may be recovered from the surrender leave salary, duty pay etc. If however, the amount due to shortage could not be recovered, necessary proposals may be sent to the Board to write off the losses. In these cases a time limit of six months is fixed to settle the terminal benefits.

Sub :— Acceptance of Gifts—offered by foreign Governments.

The Director of Audit, Central Revenues, New Delhi have pointed out in their audit paragraph on "Receipt and Disposal of gifts in Toshakhana" that the gifts/presents received by the officers particularly in our Missions/Posts abroad are not intimated regularly to this Ministry.

2. According to the Foreign Contribution (Acceptance or Retention of gifts or presentations) Regulations, 1978, (copy enclosed), every gift or present received by any Government official from a foreign source should be reported to this Ministry within thirty days of the date of its receipt irrespective of its cost. It may also be clarified once again that if more than one gift/present is received from the same source, the recipient is allowed to retain only one gift/present within the permissible monetary limits, while the other gifts/presents are required to be deposited with the Toshkhana of this Ministry.

3. It may also be added, that the limit of Rs. 3,000-00 is also applicable to officers and members of their family, who receive gifts/presents in their capacity as Government servants or as member of their family.

4. It is therefore, requested that all such gifts/presents received by any officer should promptly be reported to the Toshakhana of this Ministry.

This may please be brought to the notice of all concerned.

Copy of Communication from Ministry of Home Affairs The Foreign Contribution (Acceptance or Retention of Gifts or Presentations) Regulations, 1978 Amended upto 5-11-81.

In pursuance of clause (d) of Section 8 of the Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act, 1976 (49 of 1976), the Central Government hereby makes the following Regulations with regard to the acceptance or retention of foreign contribution by way of a gift or presentation made to any person specified in section 4 as a member of any Indian delegation, namely :—

1. Short title and commencement :— (1) These regulations may be called the Foreign Contribution (Acceptance or Retention of Gifts or Presentations) Regulations, 1978.

(2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the official Gazette.

2. Definitions :—In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires :—

(a) "Act" means the Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act, 1976 (49 of 1976).

(b) Words and expressions used in these regulations and not defined but defined in the Act shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.

3. Regulation of acceptance or retention of foreign contribution by way of gift or Presentation, - (1) Any person specified in section 4 of the Act who is a member of any Indian delegation may accept any foreign contribution by way of a gift or presentation made to him as a member of such delegation (hereinafter referred to as such person), subject to the provisions of this regulations.

(2) Where such person receives any foreign contribution by way of gift or presentation, he shall, within thirty days of the receipt thereof intimate to the Secretary to the Government of India in the Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of External Affairs and the Ministry or the Department of the Government of India sponsoring the delegation of which he is a member, in writing :—

(a) the fact of his having received such gift or presentation ;

(b) the foreign source from which it is received ;

(c) Its approximate market value in the country of origin :

(d) the place in which, and the date on which, it is received, and

(e) such other details relating thereto as he may, in the circumstances, consider appropriate ;

Provided that in case where such person received such gift or presentation while he is visiting any foreign country or territory outside India, such intimation may be made by him within thirty days from the date of his return to India.

(3) Every gift or presentation received by such person from any foreign source shall (2) be deposited by him with the Secretary to the Government of India in the Ministry or the Department which had sponsored the delegation of which he was the member, within thirty days from the date of intimation by him of such receipt under sub-regulation (2)

(4) The Secretary to the Government of India, referred to in sub-regulation (3) shall forward every such gift or presentation deposited with him to the Toshakhana in the Ministry of External Affairs for assessment of its market value in the country of origin.

(5) Such assessment shall be made within thirty days from the date of receipt of the gift or presentation in the Toshakhana, in accordance with the rules applicable, for the time being in force, to the valuation of articles in the Toshakhana, and such person shall be intimated in writing of such assessment forthwith.

(6) The assessment so made under sub-regulation (5) shall be final and shall not be called in question by such person.

(7) Every such gift or presentation, the market value in the country of origin of which, as assessed under sub-regulation (5) does not exceed three thousand rupees, shall be returned to such person for retention by him;

Provided that where more than one such gift or presentation is received by such person while he is in one delegation, such person be entitled to retain only one such gift or presentation.

(8) Every such gift or presentation, the market value in the country of origin of which, as assessed under sub-regulation (5), exceeds three thousand rupees shall be retained in the Toshakhana ;

Provided such person shall have the option, that exercised by him within thirty days from the date of receipt by him of the intimation under sub-regulation (5) to purchase such gift or presentation on payment of the difference between the market value in the country of origin of such gift or presentation, as assessed under sub-regulation (5) and three thousand rupees :

Provided further that the option once exercised under this sub-regulation shall be final.

Proceedings :

With a view to enable the pension sanctioning authorities to initiate action for the sanction of pension and other terminal benefits to the employees in advance of the date of their superannuation, a list of employees who are due to retire will be notified through a proceeding by the competent authority on two occasions each year as follows :—

- (i) 1st January of every year—List of employees who are due to retire between the 1st January and 30th June of the subsequent year.
- (ii) 1st July of every year—List of employees who are due to retire between the 1st July and 31st December of the subsequent year.
- (iii) In respect of categories of officers under Class I, the Board Office Secretariat Branch will issue a proceeding notifying the list of officers due to retire as prescribed in Items (i) and (ii) above.
- (iv) In respect of various categories of officers under Class II, III and IV, the list of employees due to retire as specified in items (i) and (ii) above should be notified by the concerned authority.

2. The proceeding should be communicated to all the Heads of offices and the pension sanctioning authorities and also to the individual employees who are due to retire during the particular period. The authorities who notify the list of employees due to retire should ensure that the notification is acknowledged by the pension sanctioning authorities as well as the Heads of offices under whom the employee is working.

3. Soon after the receipt of the communications notifying the dates on which the employees are due to retire, the pension sanctioning authority shall send an application form with all connected forms and instructions to the employee concerned with a direction that the forms should be returned with correct and complete information before a specified date, normally within a period of 3 months. Simultaneously, the pension sanctioning authority should initiate action for the preparation of History of service, Leave Account, No Due Certificate, Last Pay Certificate etc. without waiting for the receipt of the application for pension from the employee concerned.

4. A register as described below will be maintained by the pension sanctioning authority to keep track of the settlement of retirement benefits to the retiring employees :—

- (i) On the first page of the Register, the details of retirement benefits normally allowed to retiring employees should be noted as in Annexure I.
- (ii) The second page of the Register should contain the details of forms and certificates to be submitted by the employee and to be prepared by the office which are required for sanctioning the pension as in Annexure II.
- (iii) The third and further pages of the Register should contain the details of part/final settlement of the pensionary/terminal benefits as given in Annexure III.
- (iv) The pension sanctioning authority shall review the register every fortnight.

AMENDMENTS

In the said Regulations in Regulation 17,

1. in sub-Regulation (g) 'Explanation II' shall be omitted and
2. After sub-Regulation (g) the following sub-Regulation shall be added namely :

(gg) (i) : A Board employee who has completed qualifying service of not less than twenty years, may retire from service by giving notice of not less than three months in writing to the appointing authority. Before giving such notice he may satisfy himself by means of a reference to the appointing authority that he has completed twenty years of qualifying service for pension.

Explanation—I : For the purpose of this clause, the period of notice shall commence from the date of its receipt by the appointing authority.

Explanation—II : The term "Appointing Authority" shall include the immediate official superior to the Board employee and the period of three months notice, shall commence from the date of receipt of notice by the said immediate superior, in cases where a Board employee has to address the appointing authority through proper channel.

Explanation—III : The three months notice referred to in sub-Regulations (g) and (gg) may be given before the Board employee attains the age and the qualifying service specified in the said sub-Regulations provided that the retirement takes place after he has attained the specified age or has completed the specified qualifying service, as the case may be.

(ii) The Board employee desiring to retire under Clause (i) shall be given weightage upto five years in addition to the qualifying service rendered by him subject to the conditions that the total qualifying service after adding the weightage shall not exceed the qualifying service that he would have had if he had voluntarily retired under the sub-Regulation (g). The weightage given under this clause shall be an addition to the qualifying service for the purpose of calculating pension and gratuity only and it shall not entitle the Board employee retiring voluntarily to any notional fixation of pay for the said purpose. The pension and gratuity shall be based on the actual emoluments on the date of retirement.

A Board employee seeking voluntary retirement under this scheme on,

- (a) attaining the age of 45 years and completing a qualifying service of 20 years shall have a weightage of five years;
- (b) attaining the age of 48 years and completing a qualifying service of 21 years shall have a weightage of two years;

Amendment

In the said Regulations, in Regulation 24, the sub-regulation (1) and the Notes thereunder shall be deleted and the following substituted :—

“(1) ‘A competent authority may grant maternity leave on full pay to permanent married women Board employees for a period not exceeding 90 days which may be spread over from the pre-confinement rest to post confinement recuperation at the option of the Board employee. The maternity leave will not be admissible to married women Board employees with more than three children. Non permanent married women Board employees, whether appointed in a regular capacity or under the emergency provisions of the relevant Service Regulations, should take for maternity purposes the earned leave for which they may be eligible. If, however, such a Board employee is not eligible for earned leave or if the leave to her credit is less than 90 days, maternity leave may be granted for a period not exceeding 90 days or for the period that falls short of 90 days as the case may be. Non-permanent married women Board employees employed under the emergency provisions should have completed one year of continuous service including leave periods if any, to become eligible for the grant of maternity leave;

Provided that the maternity leave shall be allowed to married woman Board employees even for their third confinement if they are having two living children and no maternity leave shall be allowed for the confinement of the married women Board Employees who are already having three living children.

Note : 1. Approved probationers in other than Class IV Service shall be eligible for maternity leave as for permanent Board Employees.

Note : 2. In the case of married women Board employees who are confined during the period of their leave including extraordinary leave, the 90 days period referred to above shall be reckoned only from the date of confinement”.

While codification of issues was thought of at a certain point of time in the interests of clarity and for the information of all concerned, attempts in the past at such codification through the issues of guidelines etc. in certain matters have had undesirable consequences because of the practice of some of the Unions coming to look upon such guidelines as inflexible and as conferring a right on the unions and involving the Board in litigation over alleged "violation of guidelines". It has, therefore, been decided that it will not be advisable to have any codification of issues which require to be discussed by the Board with the Unions. Whether a particular issue has to be discussed with the unions, the unions with which such discussions should be held and in what manner are best left to be decided by the Board as and when occasion arises and with reference to the circumstances of the case. This will not apply to cases where such consultation is mandatory under the relevant statute.

3. The Board has decided to adopt the above orders of Government. Proceedings :

It has been decided to review the staff strength, both permanent and temporary, in all the Systems/Circles/Offices in the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, with a view to determine whether there is adequate volume of work for the existing staff, which is being continued from time to time based on the recommendations of the Superintending Engineers, without a detailed analysis of the volume of work. In pursuance of this decision, a review of the staff strength in a select few Distribution Systems excluding those covered under workload Agreements has been conducted. Based on the review, it has been decided to laydown certain procedures in the sanction and utilisation of staff. The following orders are issued :

- (i) Hereafter, both permanent and temporary posts shall be reviewed every year before their continuance is approved on yearly basis. For the purpose of the review, no distinction will be made between permanent and temporary posts.
- (ii) Posts borne on the cadre strength of one System/Circle but under the Technical control of another System/Circle shall be transferred to the latter office, if no real administrative control, except payment of salary and sanction of Earned Leave etc., vests with the former office. This shall be done by suppressing the posts in the System/Circle which merely pays the incumbents and creating appropriate number of posts in the System/Circle which has technical control.
- (iii) The surplus posts diverted from one System/Circle to another shall be accounted for separately and continued from time to time, until all the incumbents are absorbed against regular sanctions for the System/Circle to which they are diverted. The number of diverted posts will stand abolished as and when these employees are counted against vacancies in regular sanctions. The absorption of the diverted staff shall be taken up immediately and shall be completed within a period of one year. Suitable guidelines shall also be evolved for their absorption.
- (iv) The present arrangement of payment of salary to the Anti Power Theft Squad staff in the Systems who are on the cadre strength of the Secretariat Branch, shall be discontinued and in future their pay and allowances etc. shall be claimed and disbursed by the Secretariat Branch and not by the System in which they are working.

In B.P. first cited, orders were issued to the effect that in the matter of employment of Engineering Graduates under the Board, preference should be given to those who have satisfactorily completed the Apprenticeship Training over raw graduates. The same concession was extended in the selection of diploma holders also in the Board's Proceedings second cited provided they were sponsored by the respective Employment Exchanges.

2. Under the Apprentices Act, the employees are not under any obligation to give full employment to the apprentices whom they trained as soon as the training is over. Further, there were difficulties in suspending Employment Exchange criterion in that the Backward Classes and Schedule Castes may not receive proper representation and senior trained apprentices, who were without a job may not get a chance for appointment at all. With a view to obviate these difficulties Government have in the Government Order read above issued orders setting out certain procedure to be followed in the matter of absorption of Apprentice trainees in the same establishment where they have undergone training.

3. In the light of the orders of Government in the said Government Order and subsequent amendment issued in their letter fourth cited, the absorption of Apprentices in the Board after their successful completion of Apprenticeship training in the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board has been re-examined and after careful consideration and in modification of orders already issued, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board hereby directs that the Engineering Graduates, diploma holders and Industrial Training Institute Trade certificate holders, who have completed satisfactorily the period of Apprenticeship training under the Apprenticeship Act in the Board, be considered for selection to posts, which are filled by direct recruitment through Employment Exchanges in preference to others by adopting the following procedures provided they possess the qualification prescribed for the post.

- (i) All vacancies to be filled by direct recruitment through Employment Exchanges, other than the vacancies which could be filled by internal selection, should first be notified to the Employment Exchanges concerned requesting them to nominate Apprentices trained by the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board against the vacancies. If no such candidates are available, the Apprentices trained by the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board and passing out in the recent batch on successful completion of the training can be appointed to suitable posts after obtaining a non-availability certificate from the Employment Exchange subject to other conditions with regard to qualification, age, etc. being satisfied.
- (ii) The rule of reservation should be followed while absorbing the apprentices as contemplated in para. 3 (1) above without any deviation (i. e.) if the immediate beneficiary is a Backward Class candidate and when the next turn is to be filled by Schedule Castes candidate or vice-versa, the Apprentice is not entitled for absorption before filling the earlier turn reserved for Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribes or Backward Classes, as the case may be. In that case the apprentices are at liberty to get themselves registered with the Employment Exchanges, which will sponsor such candidates as and when vacancies are notified.

They are not eligible to have free treatment for their parents-in-law (i.e. mother-in-law and father-in-law) after their marriage.

2. The Government of India in their letter cited have decided to grant/allow the female Government servant the choice to include either the parents or her parents-in-law for the purpose of availing the benefits of medical attendance under Central Services (Medical Attendance) Rules on her marriage to a Government employee.

3. The Government have examined the decision of Government of India and have decided to allow the Government servants to both male and female to have their choice to include either their parents or their parents-in-law for the purpose of availing the benefits of medical attendance under Tamil Nadu Medical Attendance Rules. In the G.O. cited, the Government have issued orders treating the period of absence from the date of compulsory retirement to the date of reinstatement in Government service in respect of Government servants compulsorily retired under FR 56(d) as duty.

2. In the light of the clarifications issued by the Government of India in the reference second cited and in the light of the orders issued in the G.O. first cited, Government pass the following orders.

- (i) As the entire period from the date of compulsory retirement to the date of reinstatement has been declared as duty, such persons are entitled to pay and allowances less the pension already received, if any.
- (ii) The Notice salary already paid may be adjusted against the duty pay to be disbursed. No interest need be charged on the notice salary.
- (iii) No interest need be charged on encashed leave salary.
- (iv) As regards the adjustment of Death-cum-Retirement Gratuity already paid, the same should be adjusted against the pay and allowances admissible to the extent possible. The balance Death-cum-Retirement Gratuity may be allowed to be retained by Government Servant concerned on payment of simple interest as prescribed for General Provident Fund for the Corresponding period. The amount to be retained will be adjusted against the final Death-cum-Retirement Gratuity becoming due on final retirement and the balance, if any will be paid to him.

Sub : Compulsory retirement of Government Servants under FR 56 (d)—Clarification on certain points.

I am directed to state that the following points regarding matters concerning Government Servants who were retired compulsorily under 56 (d) and then reinstated in service on appeals have been raised by the Accountant General for issue of orders :

- (i) Orders may be issued regarding recovery of leave salary received on account of encashment of leave on the date of retirement. It is presumed that when once the leave salary is refunded the leave account will be credited automatically to the extent leave was encashed.
- (ii) It may be clarified whether for the period of absence from duty, a Government servant is eligible to draw deputation allowance and charge allowance if on the date of compulsory retirement, he was on deputation or holding additional charge of a post.
- (iii) It may also be clarified whether the period of absence from duty can be reckoned as duty for all purposes viz., increment, qualifying service for pension, training and probation.
- (iv) Attention of Heads of Departments may also be invited to instruction (6) below FR 54 regarding creation of supernumerary posts and to the proviso to rule 28 of Tamil Nadu G. P. F. rules regarding refund of G. P. F. accumulations.

2. The Government have examined the matter and issued the following instructions on the above points.

Point (i) : No specific orders have been issued in the matter except to the effect that no interest need be charged or encashed leave salary. [Para 2 (iii) of G. O. Ms. No. 597 Finance (Pension) dt. 22—6—1978]. It is implied that the encashed leave salary need not necessarily be recovered and the Govt. servant need not be asked to repay the encashed leave salary. A simple procedure of allowing on the date of normal superannuation only the balance of surrender of earned leave at the credit of such an individual (i.e.) Earned Leave at credit minus the surrender already allowed on the date of compulsory retirement can be followed.

Point (ii) : Eventhough the period of absence is treated as duty deputation allowance and charge allowance need not be given to a person who was on deputation or holding additional charge of a post on the date of compulsory retirement.

Point (iii) : As the period of absence is treated as duty, it has to be reckoned as duty for increment qualifying service for Pension, training and Probation.

Point (iv) : Attention is invited to instruction (6) below FR 54 extracted below, regarding the creation of supernumerary posts :—

“A permanent post vacated by the dismissal, removal or compulsory retirement of Govt. Servant should not be filled substantively until the expiry of the period of one year from the date of such dismissal, removal or compulsory retirement, as the case may be. Where, on the expiry of the period of one year, the permanent post is filled and the original incumbent of the post is reinstated thereafter, he should be accommodated against any post which may be substantively vacant in the grade to which his previous substantive post belonged. If there is no such vacant post he should be accommodated against a supernumerary post which should be created in this grade with proper sanction and with the stipulation that it would be terminated on the occurrence of the first substantive vacancy in that grade”.

Attention is also invited to the proviso to Rule 28 of the Tamil Nadu G. P. F. Rules extracted below regarding refund of G. P. F. accumulations :—

“Provided further that a subscriber who has been dismissed or removed or compulsorily retired or invalidated from the service and is subsequently reinstated in the service, shall, if required to do so by Govt., repay any amount paid to him from the fund in pursuance of this rule, with interest thereon at the rate provided in rule 13, in the manner provided in the proviso to rule 29. The amount so repaid shall be credited to his account in the Fund”.

The Superintending Engineer/Distribution/Madras Electricity System/South, in his U. O. cited has requested orders for sanction of out-of-pocket expenses to the staff of Central Breakdown, Fuse off Call Centres and Operation and Maintenance Distribution Sections for attending to certain items of work beyond normal working hours.

2. After careful consideration, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board authorises the Superintending Engineers/Distribution Madras Electricity System/South and North, to make payment of out-of-pocket expenses for the following items of work attended to by the staff of Central Breakdown, Fuse off Call Centres, and Operation & Maintenance Distribution Sections beyond hours of work in continuation of their work during normal working hours:—

- (i) V. I. P. functions.
- (ii) Breakdown of H. T./L. T. lines or cable and
- (iii) Continuation of shift duty in view of absentees.

3. The rates of out-of-pocket expenses to be made are as below :

- (b) Payment at rates mentioned in para 3 above should be made only for the 3 items of work indicated in para 2 above.
- (c) Approval of the Divisional Engineer/O & M should be accorded in writing prior to the undertaking of the work.
- (d) The payments made in each case should be reviewed every month by the Superintending Engineer concerned.

Chairman's Memo. No. X/Rev./Arrears/VI/RR. Act/84-1 (Accounts Branch) dated 5-6-1984

Sub : Electricity—Udumalpet Electricity System—T.N.E.B. (RD) Act of 1978 and R.R. Act—Implementation for recovery of Electricity Dues.

Ref : From the S.E./Udumalpet D.O. Letter No. RCS/A1/FRRA/84, dt. 22-3-1984.

The Superintending Engineer, Udumalpet, is informed that action under Revenue Recovery Act has to be taken in all cases irrespective of the amount involved and no amount can be considered as trivial or meagre for the purpose of action under the Revenue Recovery Act.

2. Action on the following lines should be ensured by the Divisional Engineers, Accounts Officer and Assistant Accounts Officers in order to improve collection and clearance of arrears.

- (i) The various notices issued under the R.D. and Revenue Recovery Act should be served on the consumers effectively and promptly. The Divisional Engineer should issue suitable instructions to the Junior Engineers and other field officers in this regard. Random checks should be made to ensure that all notices have been served on the parties promptly and that there has been no delay in this regard.
- (ii) The Deputy Financial Controller and the Accounts Officer should watch the progress in this item of work during their visits to the Revenue Units and lapses should be brought to the notice of the Divisional Engineer/Superintending Engineer.
- (iii) All disconnected services should be brought to the outstanding ledger and notices under R.D. Act should be issued immediately and follow-up action taken promptly.
- (iv) Where Execution Petitions have not been filed in respect of the Suits decreed in favour of the Board, prompt action should be taken to file the same.
- (v) Where suits are filed by the Consumers immediately after service of the Section 3(i) and/or Section 4 Notice under Tamil Nadu Electricity Board (R.D.) Act without depositing the dues as laid down under Section 5 of the Act, immediate steps should be taken to file counter stating that the suit is not maintainable, and steps should be taken to vacate the injunction order, if any, granted by the Courts.
- (vi) Steps should be taken to dismantle the services remaining disconnected for more than 3 months so that the consumers may come forward to get the services restored on payment of the dues in full.

3. Instructions on the above lines should be issued to all concerned for strict adherence and for implementing in full the provisions in the Recovery of Dues Act and the Revenue Recovery Act for realising the amount due to the Board without any omission.

- (i) As per existing procedure, number of applications have been received so far. Whether applications received now may be recorded in the office and new applications may be invited as per Board's Memorandum (Permanent) No. 37155-N1/83-7 dt. 27-3-84, after funds for cycle advance are allotted.

- (ii) As per Board's memorandum cited, the applications received in the field offices will be forwarded to central office. On account of this procedure, there is a chance for central office staff to submit their application immediately on receipt of communication for receipt of application, whereas there will be some delay in the case of field staff.
- (iii) Whether the applications received from the staff who has drawn bicycle advance before 6 years and recovery completed and another one who applies for the first time this year, may be taken equally for sanction of Bicycle advance.
2. After examination the following clarifications are issued :—
- (i) Applications received so far in the office may be recorded. After receipt of funds from the Board Office Administrative Branch instructions may be issued for submission of applications afresh as per Board's Memorandum (Permanent) No. 37155-N1/83-7 dt. 27-3-84.
- (ii) While issuing instructions for submission of applications, a specified date may be fixed conveniently in order to receive applications on the same date from the staff both in Central office and field office.
- (iii) Preference should be given to such of those employees who apply for the first time. If funds are available, applications from employees who have already availed the advance and a period of Six years lapsed, shall be considered.

The Government have decided to sanction three additional instalments of Dearness Allowance to their employees. The new rates of Dearness Allowance shall be calculated on the following basis :—

	Above Rs. 650/-	45 Per cent of pay subject to a maximum of Rs. 720/-
1—3—1984	Upto Rs. 650/-	62.5 Per cent of pay subject to a minimum of Rs. 156/-
	Above Rs. 650/-	46.875 Per cent of pay subject to a maximum of Rs. 750/-

The Dearness Allowance worked out as above will be rounded off to the nearest rupee.

2. The new rates of Dearness Allowance will be as shown in the Annexure. These rates will be in lieu of the existing rates of Dearness Allowance.

3. The Government also direct that the increased rates of Dearness Allowance sanctioned above shall apply to full-time employees who are at present getting Dearness Allowance and paid from contingencies at fixed monthly rates and to full-time non-provincialised work-charged establishment. The increased rates of Dearness Allowance sanctioned in this order will not be admissible to part-time Government servants.

4. The increased rates of Dearness Allowance sanctioned in this order will also apply to the teaching and non-teaching staff working under local bodies and in aided teaching institutions. This will be classified as Additional Dearness Allowance in respect of the employees governed by University Grants Commission Scales of Pay.

5. The expenditure should be debited to the sub-detailed head of account "Dearness Allowance" under the detailed head "Salaries" under the relevant minor, sub-major heads of account.

6. The Treasury Officers are requested to make payment of the revised rates of Dearness Allowance when bills are presented without waiting for the authorisation from the Accountant-General.

7. Funds will be provided by re-appropriation in the Final Modified Appropriation for 1984—85. The Heads of Departments are requested to take this expenditure into account while sending Revised Estimate 1984—85 and Final Modified Appropriation proposals for 1984—85.

2. As per orders in B.P. Ms. No. 589 (Secretariat Branch) dated 3—11—1980 the Travelling Allowance claims in respect of Class III and IV employees shall be regulated as per the normal Travelling Allowance Rules i.e. Taxi fare limited to Second Class Train fare or Bus fare as the case may be.

3. The Superintending Engineer/Lower Mettur Hydro Electric Project has raised a point for clarification as to whether the Go-home Travelling Allowance Bills of Class I and II Officers who have performed their journey by Taxi may be admitted as per procedure ordered in B.P. Ms. No. 589 (Secretariat Branch) dated 3—11—1980 in respect of Class III and IV employees. He has also raised another clarification whether the Travelling Allowance Bills of Go-home concession claimed by Class I and II Officers who have performed the journey by their own conveyance, can be admitted allowing mileage, eligible to them as per Travelling Allowance Rules.

4. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board hereby directs that the procedure ordered in B.P. A second advance for the purpose can be sanctioned only after a period of six years after satisfactory evidence is produced by the Board employee concerned, and no advance for purchase of Motor Car, Motor Cycle, Scooter or Moped should be granted to a Board employee who already possesses such a conveyance purchased out of an advance granted by the Board and gives it away as a gift to near relatives.

2. When a Conveyance Advance has been fully recovered in an office and thereafter the Board employee is transferred to a new office, when he applies for a Conveyance Advance in the new office, it has to be verified from the office in which he worked in the past six years as to whether he applied for Cycle Advance or whether he has given away as gift to a near relative the vehicle purchased from a previous advance granted by the Board. In as much as there is considerable loss of time in obtaining the above particulars, it is hereby ordered that entries regarding the sanction of conveyance advance to a Board employee should be made in his/her service book or record of service, as the case may be.

An Officer, who has a Steno-typist drawing a special pay for shorthand working under him, will be required to certify in March every year whether or not the steno-typist can discharge his duties efficiently. If an officer is unable to certify that such a steno-typist can discharge such duties efficiently, the steno-typist will become ineligible to draw the special pay with effect from the 1st April succeeding. The Special pay shall not be admissible to any person unless, in the opinion of the Head of the Office, he continues to be employed in a post which requires the possession of the stenographic qualification for the discharge of its duties and unless also he is regularly employed in shorthand work.

Note : The certificate for the drawal of shorthand special pay need not be insisted upon in the case of permanent stenographers attached to officers whose posts are kept vacant for one month or more."

In the reference second cited, it has been ordered that in case where a Board employee constructs house/enlarges the house, outside the state of Tamil Nadu, the utilisation certificate and the certificate of correctness of construction of house shall be obtained from a Civil Engineer not below the rank of an Assistant Executive Engineer/Civil of the concerned State Government and produced, for drawal of subsequent instalments of the House Building Advance.

2. On further examination, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board directs in partial modification of the Memorandum second cited that where an employee of the Board constructs a house/or enlarges his house outside the State of Tamil Nadu, availing of House Building Advance/from the Board the utilisation certificate and the certificate of correctness of construction of house shall be obtained from a Civil Engineer not below the rank of an Assistant Executive Engineer/Civil, of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board only, and produced, for drawal of subsequent instalments of the House Building Advance. The sanctioning authority may direct an Assistant Executive Engineer/Civil of the Board who is nearer (in Tamil Nadu) to the place of construction, to issue the certificate for correctness of construction. The Assistant Executive Engineer/Civil before he starts his tour, should obtain necessary permission from the concerned Competent Authority in order to claim Travelling Allowance.

Proceedings :

The Government of Tamil Nadu in their G.O. Ms. No. 1342 Housing and Urban Development Department dt. 2—9—83 have permitted the Government Servants who have obtained House Building Advance from the Government, to create a second charge on the property with certain recognised financial institutions for meeting the balance cost of the houses/flats subject to certain conditions.

2. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board after careful consideration directs that the employees of the Board who have obtained House Building Advance from the Board may be permitted to create a second charge on the property provided they obtain prior permission of the Competent Authority concerned and the draft deed of second mortgage is submitted to the sanctioning Authority for House Building Advance for scrutiny prior to their registration. Such a second charge may be created only in respect of loans to be granted for meeting the balance cost of the houses/flats by recognised financial institutions such as the following :—

- (i) Banking institutions including Co-operative Banks.
- (ii) Financing Corporations set up by the State Government which provide loans for house constructions.
- (iii) Apex Co-operative Housing Finance institutions.
- (iv) Public companies formed and registered in India with the main object of carrying on the business of providing long term finance for construction or purchase of houses in India for residential purposes like the Housing Development Finance Corporation Limited.

3. While according permission for a second mortgage, the competent Authority should take into account the repaying capacity of the individuals, by obtaining a certificate from the concerned sanctioning Authority.

4. The total amount of the House Building Advance sanctioned by the Board and the loan to be raised by the Board employees from outside institutions, taken together, should not exceed the estimated cost of construction referred to in the estimates submitted by the Board employees at the time of applying for house building advance to Board/the final cost of the ready built house/flat mentioned in the application for the sanction of house building advance, as the case may be.

5. It would be for the Board employees to ascertain the willingness of the financial institution concerned to accept the second charge before applying for permission to the Competent Authority. In all cases, the expenditure on registration of the mortgage deed etc., shall be borne by the Board employees themselves.

6. Necessary amendments to House Building Advance Rules will issue separately.

Delegation of Powers—Law charges—Payment of fees and Incidental expenses by Superintending Engineers—Enhancement of powers—orders—Issued.

B.P. Ms. No. 1938, dated 17—9—1970

Proceedings :

In the B.P. read above, the Superintending Engineers have been empowered to sanction costs of suits upto Rs. 150/- (Rupees One hundred and fifty only) inclusive of pleader's fees, court fees, stamps and other inevitable incidental expenses where costs are recoverable from the other party.

2. The Board's Standing Counsels and Government Pleaders who are attending to Board's cases at System level have expressed that inordinate delay is being caused for the payment of their fees for the work done by them on the file of different courts because the Superintending Engineers are empowered to sanction costs of suits only upto Rs. 150/- Inclusive of Pleader's fees and other incidental expenses which are recoverable from the other party. Almost in all the cases, the fee and cost payable for each suit works out to more than Rs. 150/- and therefore the Superintending Engineers could not sanction the fees to the counsels. In turn they have to forward each proposal to the Regional Chief Engineer concerned for sanction which results in delay in the payment of fees. As a matter of fact the Superintending Engineers could not sanction the fees even in a single case in furtherance of delegation granted in the B.P. dt. 17—9—70. The delay in the settlement of fees to the counsels causes discontentment among them who insist on quicker payment.

3. The matter has been carefully considered by the Board. It is felt that if the powers of the Superintending Engineers to sanction the fees and cost of the suit is enhanced, they will be in a position to sanction such fee and cost and the delay in their settlement will be minimised. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board hereby empowers the Superintending Engineers of Systems/Circles in modification of the orders in the B.P. cited to sanction fees upto a monetary limit of Rs. 300/- (Rupees Three hundred only) to the Board's Standing Counsels/Government Pleaders besides actual expenses for filing or defending of suits/cases/writs whether costs are recoverable from the other party or not.

4. The delegation of powers to sanction Pleader's fees by the Superintending Engineers will be applicable only in respect of regulation fees and in cases involved excess payment over and above regulation fee, the Board's orders should be obtained.

Acceptance of three phase 10 Amps meters from consumers—Instructions—
issued.

Instructions have been issued to the Superintending Engineers of the Operating Systems in Board Circular Memorandum cited, to accept new single phase meters from the prospective consumers requiring L.T. service connections for lighting purposes, subject to the procedure prescribed therein.

2. It has been decided to accept new 3 phase, 10 Amps meters from the L. T. consumer requiring supply for industrial/Commercial and Domestic purposes if supply is required under 3 phase. The new 3 phase meter offered by the consumers shall be valued at the rate shown in the purchase bill but **not exceeding** such rate as may be fixed by the Board from time to time, with reference to the prevailing market conditions and a refund shall be made to the consumer of such price. The ceiling price of 3 phase 10 Amps meter shall be Rupees 187/- (Rupees One hundred and eighty seven) until further orders.

3. The Superintending Engineers of the Operating Systems are informed that new 3 phase 10 Amps meters from the prospective consumers requiring 3 phase supply for Industrial/Commercial/ Domestic purposes may be accepted subject to the refund of Rs. 187/- being the ceiling price of the meter or the cost of the meter as per the purchase bill whichever is less. 3 phase higher capacity meters should not be accepted as these are available in stock.

4. All other procedure in regard to testing of meters refund of costs of the meter and the accounting procedure as outlined in this office Circular cited should be followed without any deviation.

Order :

In view of the increase in the cost of inputs used for generation of power as well as the other incidental expenditure, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board has proposed an increase in the power rates in respect of all class of consumers. After careful consideration of the proposal of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, the Government have decided to increase the power rates under High Tension Tariff in respect of the consumers under High Tension Tariff I-1, I-2 and VII, and under Low Tension Tariff in respect of those under Low Tension Tariff IV and VIII mentioned in the G.O. first read above. Orders regarding the revision of tariff in respect of other categories of consumers will be issued separately.

2. The Government order the publication of the following Notification in an Extraordinary issue of the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette dated the 12th June 1984.

Notification

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Tamil Nadu Revision of Tariff Rates on Supply of Electrical Energy Act, 1978 (Tamil Nadu Act 1 of 1979), the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby makes the following amendments to the Schedule to the said Act.

2. This amendments hereby made shall come into force on and from the 15th June 1984.

- (iv) Applications seeking power connection to pumpsets registered on or before 31-3-76 and in respect of which notices have already been issued, be given power connection immediately.

Proceedings :

H.T. supply to M/s Tirupur Co-operative Sale Society Limited, Tirupur, was effected on 4—1—84 with a sanctioned demand of 250 KVA. The consumer was given notice of availability of supply on 15—6—1983 and the three months' notice period expired on 14—9—83. The supply was not availed within the notice period. The Superintending Engineer, Coimbatore Elec. System/South has levied and collected, monthly minimum charges of Rs. 9,076/- from the date of expiry of notice period till the date of availing of supply at the rate of Rs. 10/- per KVA which is payable by the H. T. consumer for the disconnected period, as per B.P. Ms. No. 1890, dt. 22—11—1976.

2. The consumer has requested waiver of monthly minimum charges levied and collected for the period when the supply was not connected on the ground that the delay in getting the safety certificate was mainly due to the delay in getting the cradle guarding wiring by Tamil Nadu Electricity Board and due to the circumstances beyond his control.

3. The request of the consumer has been examined. In terms of Clause 24(d) of Terms and Conditions of Supply, if a consumer fails to avail supply within the 3 months notice period, he shall have to pay monthly minimum charges or special minimum guarantee as the case may be from the date of expiry of the period of the notice. As per the conditions of Tariff, monthly minimum charges are payable only by L.T. consumers. For H.T. Consumers, the H.T. Tariff does not provide for any monthly minimum charges. In the absence of any provision to levy monthly minimum charges under the H. T. Tariff, the special guarantee should be enforced.

4. In the circumstances the Tamil Nadu Elec. Board, directs that special guarantee with reference to capital cost incurred for effecting supply may be collected from M/s. Tirupur Co-operative Sale Society Limited, Tirupur, for the period of non-availing of supply within the time stipulated in the notice of availability of supply and the monthly minimum charges levied for the above period at the rate of Rs. 10/- per KVA which is applicable only for the disconnected services, may be withdrawn.

It is seen that at present in Thanjavur System separate priority is maintained for the applications received under Crash Programme and for the applications received under Normal Programme.

Please issue necessary instructions to Superintending Engineer/Thanjavur to maintain a common priority based on the entry in the "readiness register". In respect of crash programme the date of receipt of YTCs will have to be taken as date of readiness and priority assigned. The recasting of the priority should be done immediately. Separate Identity has to be maintained for the applications received under Crash Programme so that the weekly progress report for Crash Programme can be continued.

In the memo under reference, for Thanjavur Electricity System even though a target of 2502 pumpsets in respect of energisation of pumpsets for the year 1984—85 against the pending applications 3415 Nos. as on 1—4—84 has been fixed, I request you to take necessary action to dispose off all the pending applications (3415) as on 1—4—84. Suitable monthly programme may be drawn up.

You will also monitor the progress made every month against the programme.

Any difficulty encountered in this regard should be got over then and there. The following items of extra facilities, if required, for maintaining the above programme for 84—85 may be arranged immediately at your level :—

- (i) Enhancement of imprest to Section Officers and ADEs wherever found necessary.
- (ii) Diversion of vehicles required for this programme from other Systems of your region.
- (iii) Diversion of materials required from other Systems of your region.

Orders from Headquarters if required, you may come up with necessary proposals immediately. Your request to extend the time limit of enhancement of powers for purchase of materials under "Limited Tender System" to SE/Thanjavur upto 30—9—84 is under consideration.

In partial modification of the memo under reference, supply may be effected in other six taluks in Cauvery delta area of South Arcot/South System, Tiruchi/North System and Trichy/South System to the parties as and when they are ready on their own accord with their pumpsets. No ninety days notices need be issued to the applicants in Cauvery delta area but the priority may be fixed as per date of readiness of the party as entered in the concerned register. But the number of pumpsets to be energised should be as per the target fixed for the Cauvery delta area in the memo. under reference. Priority to these parties of Cauvery Delta area will be given over the priority of other applicants in non-Cauvery delta area in the three Systems.

M/s. Delta Marine Consultants b. v. The Netherlands, have been appointed for studying and recommending the options for the drawal of cooling water for the existing Ennore Thermal Station (450 MW) and the proposed North Madras Thermal Station (1050 MW capacity initially and 2100 MW ultimately).

2. Two of the representatives of M/s. Delta Marine Consultant visited Madras in Dec. 1983 and had discussion with the officers of the Board and also other agencies viz. State Port Officer, Madras Port Trust, CWPRS/Pune, MAPP etc.

3. An interim report from M/s. Delta Marine Consultants was received in Jan. '84 and a final report from them was received in April '84.

4. In their reports they have suggested a number of options for drawal of cooling water for both Ennore and North Madras Thermal Stations. Two representatives of M/s. Delta Marine Consultants again visited Madras and presented their report/options in May '84. Also they had discussions with the Officers of the Board. The Consultants have promised to give a summary, as an addendum to their final report based on the above discussions. The Consultants have since forwarded the summary in June '84.

5. The drawal of cooling water for North Madras Power Station is going to be a difficult task and involves a highly technical/feasible solution. The cost is also going to be fairly high. The successful operation of the North Madras Thermal Station is dependent very much on satisfactory cooling water arrangements and hence this issue merits deep consideration and detailed study over the various options given by M/s. Delta Marine Consultants.

6. Tamil Nadu Electricity Board after careful consideration has decided to form an expert committee consisting of the following officers.

1. Thiru S. Ramaswamy, CE/Hydro Projects
2. Thiru T. Umapathy, CE/Civil Designs
3. Thiru V. N. Prabhu, SE/Civil/Thermal

7. The above expert committee will study all the reports (interim, final and addendum to final report) furnished by M/s. Delta Marine Consultants and give their recommendation with reference to the drawal of cooling water for both Ennore Thermal Station and North Madras Thermal Power Station. The Committee shall also give the future course of action that is to be taken immediately in respect North Madras Thermal Power Station, as CEA has already cleared the project with 3 units of 210 MW each and the proposal is with Planning Commission for approval.

8. This Committee shall submit their report to the Chairman on or before 15th July 1984.

Necessary instructions have already been issued in the above cited Mamos., to accept new single phase meters from the prospective consumers requesting L.T. service connection for lighting purposes and new three phase 10 amps. meters from the L.T consumers requiring 3 phase supply for industrial/commercial and Domestic purposes, subject to the Procedure prescribed therein.

The available 3 phase 10 Amps. meters may therefore be used only for effecting agricultural services. However, as it is reported that there is not sufficient and adequate stock of 3 phase 10 amps. meters for effecting new agricultural services, the following instructions are issued.

(i) Available 3 phase 10 Amps. meters in “disconnected services of more than 6 months” may be released and used for effecting new agricultural services.

(ii) If sufficient 3 phase 10 amps. meters are not readily available either from stocks or from disconnected services as mentioned above, three Nos. of available ~~single~~ single phase meters of 10 amps. capacity may be used for giving service to agricultural services instead of 3 phase 10 amps. meters **as a temporary measure** and replaced by 3 phase 10 amps. meters immediately on receipt of supplies at stores.
