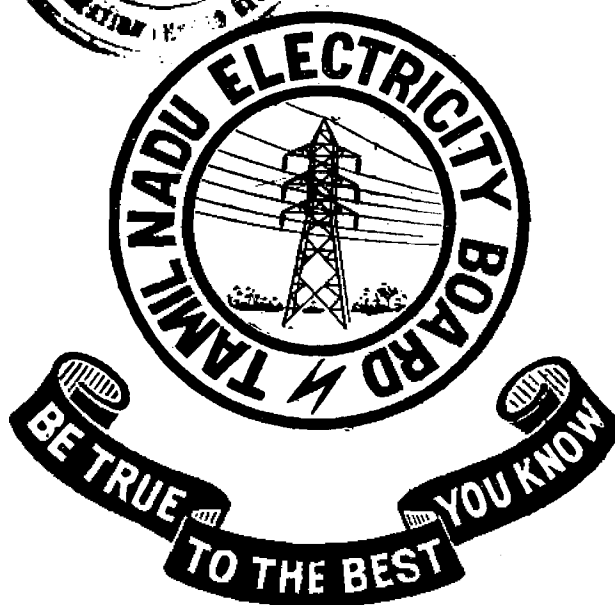

## *From the Chairman's desk:*

It was a wise man who said: "There's one consolation about matrimony. When you look around, you can always see somebody who did worse." This goes equally for many things in life. We tend to take an exaggerated view of our own little misfortunes and, at the same time, not give credit to the gods there are for the many good fortunes we have had. We have to accept that life is an inevitable mixture of good and evil and so long as the sum total of the effect is beneficial, or at least tolerable either in itself or in comparison with the lot of others, we have no reason to grumble. We cannot be the winners all the time. Successes and failures are woven together into the mosaic of life. It is the bitterness of failure that enhances the sweetness of success. It is the possibility of failure that makes the anticipation of success a pleasurable experience. Every time you feel you have lost something, count not what you have lost but what you have left with you. Remind yourself that it could have been worse. How enlightening is the ditty:

"I had the blues because I had no shoes,  
Until upon the street I met a man who had no feet"!

It is folly to demand or expect justice at every turn. The Law of Life just does not provide for it. A principal reason for this is that what I consider as justice for myself may not be Justice in the absolute sense and may even be unjust to someone else. It is only my inflated view of my own importance among God's creations that makes me feel otherwise.

Very often we feel utterly miserable about some happening because we view it from the very narrow perspective of the immediate present. Set it in a more reasonable time-frame and it may become hardly noticeable. Boswell narrates how he once told Dr. Johnson of an incident which had caused him much distress. Johnson laughed and said: "Consider, sir, how insignificant this will appear a twelve months hence." As Boswell rightly adds: "Were this consideration to be applied to most of the little vexatious incidents of life, by which our quiet is too often disturbed, it would prevent many painful sensations." Johnson's recipe is so simple and yet so efficacious. Try it every time you feel miserable about something or the other and, in most cases, you will realise how trivial your complaint is.

Rationalise your emotions. It is a characteristic of persons who suffer from bouts of depression that they will not be able to precisely define what they are depressed about. When you are in the dumps, take out a piece of paper and try to write down clearly and cogently—and honestly—what the source of your worry is. You may end up with a blank sheet of paper before you, or write down things which, on a second reading, you will find ridiculous. If you are indeed able to delineate your fear in clear terms and satisfy yourself that it is a very real one, then ask yourself what is the worst that can happen. You may well find that the worst is not all that frightening or all that irremediable. Next, think for yourself calmly and objectively how to cope with it. Then, do it.

Whenever I find something has gone against me, I play a favourite game with myself. I try to explore all the ways in which I can make the best of the bad situation. The situation may be small or big—anything from missing a bus to missing one's life's ambition. It is a fascinating game and there have been many occasions when I have had a quiet laugh over the gains I have been able to extract from an apparently adverse situation. I believe in the theory of compensation. Almost every situation or every incident in life has its compensations. It all depends on how you look at it and how you deal with it.

We must strive for the inner grace that enables us to accept life as it comes. We must achieve the clarity of vision that shows us the numerous opportunities that lie about us. Every day brings in its wake opportunities—to learn something new, something inspiring; to do something different, something good.

In the course of our eventful journey through this world, occasions do arise when we genuinely feel we have been wronged. The only thing to do then is to find solace and strength within ourselves. Exhibiting your raw bleeding flesh to the vulgar gaze of the crowd, wailing and beating your breast in public is most demeaning. That apart, it only intensifies your affliction. Never make the mistake of ventilating your grievances before others in the hope that it will bring you relief. Such relief as you may imagine you get from this exercise is of a false kind and short-lived. Your grief can never be shared or lightened by a mere declamation. The result is often the converse. Giving vocal expression to our little miseries tempts us to exaggerate them and dramatise them. The more we indulge in such overt expression, with or without embellishments, the more confirmed we become in our self-pity. And there is no greater mistake than self-pity. Moreover, the person on whose shoulders you sob very often encourages you in your belief that you have been grievously wronged—either because he thinks he has an obligation to sympathise with you in return for your confiding in him or because it makes him feel superior to have you whimpering before him. And that encouragement, however subtle, is enough to make you feel worse than before. If you have cause to feel aggrieved, contain it within yourself if you cannot altogether dismiss it from your thoughts by conscious effort. When all is said and done, you have to stand by yourself. No one can give you peace except yourself.

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**PART—I****News and Notes****1. Power from Madras Atomic Power Project, Kalpakkam :**

Government of India have now confirmed that Tamil Nadu will be given the full generation from the first unit (235 MW) and half the generation from the second unit (235 MW) of Madras Atomic Power Project, Kalpakkam. The tariff for the power from Kalpakkam has been fixed at 39.00 P/KW hr (excluding excise duty) and this will remain in force for a period of three years from January 27, 1984 or until commencement of commercial operation of Madras Atomic Power Project unit II whichever is earlier.

**2. Tariff for supply of electricity for combined purpose of residence and office :**

In B. P. Ms. (FB) No. 146 (Adm. Br.), dated 2—11—1984 instructions have been issued that the benefit of domestic tariff allowed to the residences of professionals like Lawyers, Doctors, Chartered Accountants, Engineers, Post Masters of Experimental Post Offices and Goldsmiths who use part of their residences for non-domestic purposes be withdrawn from 1—5—1985. If any consumer having such combined services desires to have domestic tariff for his residential portion, he should obtain a separate service connection/additional meter for residence portion.

**3. H. T. supplies involving demand of 5000 KVA and above :**

In G. O. Ms. No. 2301 P. W. (Elec.), dated 22—11—1984 the Government of Tamil Nadu have amended the schedule of Tamil Nadu Revision of Tariff rates on supply of Electrical Energy Act and the amendment will take effect from 22—11—1984.

(a) Any H.T. supply involving a sanctioned demand above 5000 KVA shall be given supply only at 33 KV if available in the area or at E.H.T. voltage.

(b) Existing H.T. consumers to be given time upto 31—8—1985.

(c) Existing H.T. consumers whose sanctioned demand is 5000 KVA or less and who require additional demand by which the total would exceed 5000 KVA shall be given the additional load only after they are ready to receive supply at the voltage specified in (a).

(d) In case of existing H.T. consumers whose demand exceeds 5000 KVA who do not avail supply at voltage specified in (a) within the stipulated period shall be charged an extra levy of three paise per KW hr for the entire energy consumed.

(e) Existing H.T. consumers whose sanctioned demand with the additional demand exceeds 5000 KVA may be allowed the additional demand at the high tension voltage itself for a period not exceeding 12 months from the date of sanction of additional demand provided they agree to be charged an extra levy of three paise per KW hr for the entire energy till they avail the supply at 33 KV or at E.H.T. voltage as the case may be.

**4. Financial assistance to T. N. E. B. Engineers Association for 'Power Engineers Hand Book' :**

The Board in B.P. Ms. (FB) No. 156 (Adm. Br.), dated 28—11—1984 has sanctioned an amount not exceeding Rs. 1,58,500/- (Rupees One lakh fifty eight thousand and five hundred only) as a grant to the T.N.E.B. Engineers Association to meet part of the expenses for printing and publishing 7,500 copies of the Sixth edition of the Power Engineers Hand Book.

### 5. Conservation of Energy in pumpsets :

Under a programme sponsored and financed by the Rural Electrification Corporation, the Board has decided to carry out modifications in 3,125 agricultural pumpsets in 1984—85 to improve the efficiency of the pumpsets. The programme covers the following districts:—

North Arcot	Vellore/Tiruvannamalai Systems	1125 Nos.
Periyar	Periyar/Udumalpet Systems	1000 Nos.
Madurai	Madurai (North) and (South) and Udumalpet Systems	1000 Nos.

Detailed instructions in this regard have been issued in Memo. No. SE/IEMC/EPS/A1/MP/D4/84, dated 29—11—1984.

### 6. Meetings :

(i) The re-constituted Permanent Consultative Committee for Industries held its first meeting on 30—11—1984.

(ii) The Secretary to Government of India, Department of Power and the Secretary to Government of India, Cabinet Secretariat (Co-ordination) visited Madras on 29—11—1984 and 30—11—1984 respectively and held discussions on matters relating to movement of coal to Tuticorin and Ennore, sharing of power from Ramagundam Super Thermal Station, tariff for power from Ramagundam Super Thermal Station, etc.

### 7. Guide Book for power consumers :

The Board has brought out a comprehensive Guide Book for power consumers priced at Rs. 5/- furnishing all necessary information for the consumers of the Board.

**Sub :** Fundamental Rules—Fundamental Rule 49—Calculation of period of  
additional charge—Instructions—Issued.

As per Fundamental Rule 49, Additional charge allowance is admissible upto five months only.

The period of additional charge is calculated for the first spell of 3 months by adding 3 months to the date of assumption of additional charge and for the next spell of 2 months by adding thereafter 2 months. It is not correct. The period of additional charge should be calculated with reference to ruling under Fundamental Rule 9 (18). The method of calculation of additional charge arrangement for a period of five months from 26—7—1983 F.N. is illustrated below :—

The attention of the disciplinary authorities is invited to Regulation 10—(C) of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Employees' Discipline and Appeal Regulations which is extracted below :

**10-C. Service of Notice :**

"Every order, notice and other process made or issued under these Regulations shall be served in person on the Board employee concerned or sent to him by registered post acknowledgement due, or if such person is not found, by leaving it at his last known place of residence or by giving or tendering it to an adult member of his family or if none of the means aforesaid is available by affixing it in some conspicuous part of his last known place of residence."

Serving notices and orders on the delinquent officer at the appropriate time is very important. The disciplinary authorities should scrupulously observe the procedure prescribed in Regulation 10-C in regard to the mode of service of notices or order on the delinquent officer who may refuse to receive such orders or make themselves scarce adopting dilatory tactics.

**Proceedings :**

The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board directs that the duties, functions and responsibilities of the Personal Assistants including Selection Grade Personal Assistants in Class II, Division IX, Category 2 of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service be broadly as specified below :

1. The Personal Assistant will be in-charge of some sections in the office of the Chief Engineers or Superintending Engineers comprising Superintendents/Accountants, Assistants, Junior Assistants, Typists etc.
2. He is charged with the overall responsibility for processing of files relating to the subjects allotted to the Sections under his control.
3. He will guide the staff in the sections under him for the efficient and effective disposal of business and supervise their work at all stages.
4. He will see that the staff in the sections under his control follow proper priority in their work and that really emergent matters are given immediate attention.
5. He will himself wherever necessary undertake to deal with the difficult and important papers.
6. He will also prepare original notes and drafts depending upon the exigencies of administration.
7. He will be responsible for the accuracy of the notes and drafts emanating from the sections under his control.

8. He will be responsible for enforcing discipline in the sections under his control and see that his instructions are carried out.
9. He will be the authority competent to sanction casual leave, permission to the staff in the sections under his control.
10. He will be authority competent to suspend, to frame charges and to impose minor punishments on the workmen covered by the Standing Orders under his control vide B.P Ms. No. 370 (S.B.), dated 8—7—80.
11. He will authenticate such of the important fair copies B.Ps., Memoranda Letters, etc. based on the orders in force from time to time. He will correspond with outside offices in respect of matter of routine nature.
12. He will cause to issue routine reminders to the subordinate offices of the Board.
13. He will periodically inspect the P.Rs., Arrear Lists, Reminder dairy of the staff in the sections under his control.
14. He will exercise the powers delegated by the Board/Chief Engineers/Superintending Engineers in the matter of sanction of leave, P.F. loans etc. in respect of the employees in the Systems/Circles/Offices.
15. He will be appointing authority for the categories of Record Clerks and Office Helpers in the Systems/Circles/Offices.
16. He will represent the Management of the Board before various forums like officers of the Labour Department, Labour Court etc.

**Order :**

In the Government order first read above, orders were issued that destitute widows as defined in Rule 3 of old age pension rules may also apply for the posts advertised by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission and other appointing authorities and the question of relaxing any technical restrictions including age limit prescribed in the Service Rules will be considered if they are otherwise suitable for the posts. In the Memorandum read above, these orders were kept in abeyance, pending issue of certain clarifications as to how and to what extent relaxation is to be given to the destitute widows.

2. The Government have carefully considered the matter and issue the following revised instructions in the matter of giving preference to the destitute widows in the matter of appointment to Public Services in modification of the orders issued in the G.O. first read above:

- (a) Special consideration shall be given to the destitute widows for appointment to all posts in Government service, local bodies and Government aided institutions provided the candidates fully satisfy the qualification rule and are otherwise eligible on merits; the word "Special consideration" denotes that when other things are equal, destitute widows should be preferred over others who are also competitors for a particular post;

- (b) Same age limit as prescribed for Scheduled Caste candidates shall be made applicable for destitute widows of all castes;
- (c) Special consideration shall also be given to the destitute widows for admission to the training institutions provided they satisfy the educational requirements prescribed under the rules and are otherwise eligible on merits;
- (d) The expression "destitute widows" is defined as one who has neither any means by herself to live on nor any dependant to protect her from starvation.

3. Orders amending the General Rules for the Tamil Nadu State and Subordinate Services with reference to para 2(b) above will be issued separately.

Thus, there is no question of giving automatically original seniority in such cases. Hence, it is not feasible to accept the suggestion of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Engineers Association and Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Workers Federation.

**Sub :** Elections—General Elections—Government Servants desirous of contesting elections—Resignation letters—Processing of.

The General Elections to the Lok Sabha and to the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly are due to be held shortly. Certain Government Servants may seek to contest the elections by resigning their Government jobs just on the eve of elections. I would like to reiterate once again the instructions issued on this subject for ready reference.

2. As soon as a Government Servant tenders his resignation with an intention of contesting an election, the concerned authority should take a decision, without any delay whatever, either accepting the resignation or rejecting it, and communicate the decision to the Government Servant in writing.

3. Only under the following circumstances a Government Servant's resignation could be ordinarily rejected :—

- (i) If he has executed any bond for a certain number of years of service.
- (ii) If loans and other dues are to be recovered from him.
- (iii) If serious charges are pending against him.
- (iv) If his resignation letter contains any conditions instead of being unconditional one.

In all other cases the resignations must be accepted and communicated to the Government servant, promptly to enable him to file his nominations in time. Any undue delay in taking and communicating the decision may lead to serious difficulties including an election petition before the High Court.

4. Kindly ensure that there is no delay in these cases.

Chairman's Circular No. 53316/Adm. Br./IR-2(2)/197/82—12, dated 26—11—1984

*Sub :* Labour—Demonstration etc., by employees during working hours—reg.

One of the Unions proposed to take out a procession in Madras City on 24—11—1984 during working hours. On coming to know of this, instructions were issued in my Circular No. 123395/1885/IRI(3)/Adm. Br./84 dated 21—11—1984 and 22—11—1984, pointing out that while it was open to the Unions to indulge in such activities outside working hours or on holidays any attempts by them to dislocate the work of the Board during working hours should be visited with severe penalties. Instructions were also given on the lines on which action should be taken to counter the proposed agitation. Thereupon, the Union abandoned its effort.

2. All concerned are informed that any attempt by any section of employees to indulge in demonstrations or unseemly behaviour during working hours under the pretext of trade union activities should be dealt with severely. In this connection the observations made by the High Court of Madras in two recent cases will be of relevance.

*Order of the Hon'ble Mr. Justice Mohan dated 18—7—1983 in W.P. No. 5699 of 1979. (General Secretary, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Accounts Subordinate Union vs. The Management of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board).*

"It is true trade unionism is recognised all over the world. But that does not mean that an office bearer of any trade union can claim, as of right, to do trade union activities during office hours. In a poor country like India, tax payers pay money not for the purpose of encouraging trade unionism, but in the fond and reverend hope that every person who is entrusted with the task of doing service will do his service. Whether he actually does service or not, there can be a fond expectation of the same. To allow one to claim as of right to do trade union activity without attending to the office duties, would in my opinion be an anachronism since it will amount to fleecing the tax payer in order to encourage the trade union activities. That is not the purpose for which the workman was appointed by the Electricity Board.....It should be noted that nobody prevents the workman who is an office bearer in the trade union from espousing the cause of workman which he can do as loudly as possible and crying at the top of his voice; but the only restriction is "Don't do that during office hours"..... If this kind of trade unionism is allowed to flourish in our country, I could say, 'Woe to our country and poor tax payers'. For my part, not that one should be against trade unionism, which is welcome because it is that which brings about a solidarity among workers, the crucial question is, can a right be claimed to activate trade unionism during office hours. The answer should be an emphatic 'no'."

*(2) Order of the Hon'ble Mr. Justice Natarajan dated 9—10—1984 in WMP Nos. 13878 and 15011 of 1984 in W.P. No. 8653 dated 5—3—1984. (The Workmen of Indian Bank represented by Secretary, General Federation of Indian Bank Employees Union vs. The Management of Indian Bank represented by its Chairman and Managing Director.)*

"The Bank can function without the Union but the Union cannot function without the Bank. It therefore follows that the prime duty of the employees is to serve the Bank and then only the Union .....The Union activities can always be carried on after office hours, whereas the services to the Bank have to be rendered only during banking hours."

3. The instructions issued in my Circular No. 053316/Adm. Br./IR2(2)/197/82-10 dated 31—8—1984 on the manner in which such agitations should be dealt with are reiterated. While sending a D.O. report to me on the names of employees participating in such demonstrations as instructed in the above Circular, officers should also specifically list out the names of persons who are responsible for inciting or instigating the workers to disrupt the Board's work. This latter category deserves to be dealt with more deterrently than the others since not only are they primarily responsible for the disruption of the Board's work but are also responsible for the hardship caused to the workers consequent on the action taken by the Board for participation in such illegal demonstrations.

It has been represented that ever since formation of Ponneri Revenue Unit, it was the practice that on completion of a period of nine months in the Ponneri Revenue Unit, the staff in that Revenue Unit were permitted to apply for transfer to any one of the City Offices. Based on such request application they were also retransferred to City Offices and in their places, the senior-most employees in the City Offices were transferred and posted to Ponneri Revenue Unit. Consequent on implementation of the revised procedure on request transfers, it has been represented that the staff who were transferred to Ponneri Revenue Unit are put to hardship and could not get retransfer to City Offices. It has therefore been represented to consider their cases for retransfer to City Offices atleast on completion of two years in Ponneri Revenue Unit.

2. The matter was examined and after careful consideration, it has been decided that there should be rotation of staff for Ponneri Revenue Unit in respect of the employees who worked there for 2 years on duty. Accordingly, it is hereby instructed that the staff of Ponneri Revenue Unit, who applied for transfer to City Offices, may be considered for retransfer to anyone of the City Offices, provided they complete their stay on duty for a period of two years in Ponneri Revenue Unit, by transferring the senior-most persons in the City Offices under the jurisdiction of Madras Electricity System/Distribution/North to Ponneri Revenue Unit by rotation.

In paras 2 and 8 of the B. P. cited while approving formation of another system as Madras Electricity System (Distribution) (Central) in addition to the existing two systems viz. Madras Electricity System (Distribution) South and North, orders have been issued in Annexure B to the B. P. cited regarding allocation of certain staff. But no orders have been issued in respect of Regular Work Establishment staff and Clerical staff to each of the three systems.

2. After formation of the new system also the Regular Work Establishment staff and clerical staff are working on "as is where is basis".

3. The unions have represented that as in the case of bifurcation of seven systems in the moffusil, option may be given to the Regular Work Establishment and clerical workmen at the time of physical formation of the systems and the same procedure as followed in regard to filling of posts sanctioned based on increase on the number of services/transformers as on 1—4—81 and 1—4—83 may also be followed in the case of Madras Electricity Systems also.

4. The requests of the unions have been considered and the following orders are issued :—

(i) As on 1—11—1984 the date of creation of one additional system as Madras Electricity System (Distribution)/Central, the Regular Work Establishment posts sanctioned based on review of workload as on 1—4—81 and 1—4—83 have not so far been filled in the Two Madras Electricity Systems and promotions given. As such the promotions against these R. W. E. Posts sanctioned, shall have to be given first as per seniority list of R. W. E. workmen maintained for each of the composite systems viz. Madras Electricity System (Distribution) South and Madras Electricity System (Distribution) North and then subsequent promotions considered based on the seniority of staff actually working in the Systems concerned.

(ii) In view of the separation of the areas and consequent on creation of an additional system, the Regular Work Establishment Workmen so promoted shall be retained in the same area subject to availability of posts or be posted to the nearest area in the composite system, and

(iii) The Superintending Engineers of the composite Madras Electricity Systems who were in charge of Establishment prior to separation shall ensure action as above, to promote the R.W.E. staff based on common seniority.

(iv) Options shall be obtained from these R.W.E. workmen concerned either to serve in the same system or for allotment to the newly created system. Allotment of the workmen shall thereafter be made to the respective systems based on their option so exercised in this regard.

(v) Similar options may also be obtained in respect of clerical employees in the Madras Electricity Systems (Distribution) South and North.

The Mayavaram—Mannargudi—Thiruvapur Electrical Undertaking of the South Madras Electric Supply Corporation Limited, Tiruchirappally, was acquired by the Government of Tamil Nadu on 15—5—1968 under the Tamil Nadu Electricity Supply Undertakings (Acquisition) Act, 1954 (Tamil Nadu Act XXIX of 1954). The Government determined Rs. 1,15,92,216/- (Gross) and Rs. 66,36,548.23 (Nett) as compensation payable to the said licensee in their G.O. Ms. No. 1911, PWD, Dated 12--9—1968 and G.O. Ms. No. 1552, PWD., Dated 9—9—1969 respectively.

2. The Licensee did not agree to the Compensation amount determined by the Government and therefore the matter was referred to Arbitration. The Award given by the Arbitrator was confirmed by the High Court, Madras with necessary modification after hearing the objections raised by both the parties viz. Electricity Board and the ex-licensee. The High Court decreed an amount of Rs. 91,58,172/- as additional compensation payable based on the working sheet furnished by the Licensee with reference to the judgement of the High Court on the award.

3. The Board filed an appeal against the judgement of the High Court on certain issues. The amount involved in the appeal is Rs. 37,14,352/-. Out of the Balance Rs. 54,43,820/-, the following amounts accepted by the Board after checking of the ex-licensees working sheet and reconciling the figures with that of Board's working sheet were ordered to be paid in Board's Proceedings noted against each plus interest at 3% per annum.

2. After careful consideration, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board have also decided to sanction financial assistance by way of interest free advance on the terms hereunder :—

The Association has furnished details to show that it anticipates a loss of Rs. 1,58,500/- in publishing 7,500 copies of the new edition of the Hand Book. It has therefore requested the Board for a grant to the above extent.

2. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, after careful consideration and in view of the eminent usefulness of the technical hand book to the Engineers and other technical staff of the Board, directs that financial assistance to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Engineers' Association to make good the loss it sustains in publishing 7,500 copies of the 6th edition of Power Engineers' Hand Book upto a maximum of Rs. 1,58,500/- (Rupees one lakh fiftyeight thousand and five hundred only) be sanctioned, as a grant, subject to the following conditions:—

- (i) that payment will be made on production of accounts and vouchers ; and
- (ii) the instructions issued in Chairman's Circular No. 10202/VC1/83—4, dated 12—7—1983 banning collection of advertisement charges shall be strictly adhered to.

3. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Engineers' Association shall give 25 complimentary copies to the Chief Engineer/Personnel for distribution among the Members of the Board and all the Chief Engineers including the Regional Chief Engineers.

4. The expenditure is debitable to the following head of accounts:—

"Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Funds—Revenue Expenses—F. Adm. Expenses—(vii) other expenses—III. Misc. charges—(ii) Recurring and non-recurring expenditure to Service Associations."

5. The Chief Engineer/Personnel will made arrangements to effect payment of the grant sanctioned in para 2 above subject to satisfying the conditions stipulated thereunder.

In continuation of the above memo. the following instructions are issued for further action:

The 3 phase energy meters released from the existing agricultural services as per Memo. cited are to be utilised in the new single phase services, setting apart the required quantity for use on 3 phase services.

In the MRT Laboratory, the 3 phase meters may be tested for single phase operation by giving connections so as to utilise any one pressure coil and corresponding current coil and necessary adjustments made so as to bring the errors within permissible limits. The connections in the terminal blocks of the meters may be suitably modified for using as single phase meter. Modified wiring arrangement may be drawn and pasted on to the inner side of the terminal cover.

If the errors could not be brought within permissible limits in certain meters especially under 1/10th load, reason may be inadequate friction compensation: In such cases the following methods may be tried to overcome that.

1. Providing additional friction compensation loops in the limb of pressure coil.
2. Attaching an iron vane to the pressure coil core so that this vane creates a definite leakage field.
3. Copper loops may also be used for friction compensation.

The Assistant Divisional Engineers/MRT may be instructed to send weekly progress reports, direct to Director/Research & Development in the proforma enclosed. The first report may be sent on 15—10—84.

**Proceedings :**

The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board is allowing the benefit of domestic tariff for supply to the residences of Professionals like Lawyers, Doctors, Chartered Accountants and Engineers and the Post-Masters of Experimental Post Offices who use a portion of their residences as their office. There are also cases where the residences of Gold-smiths are used as a place for manufacture of jewellery etc. and the benefit of domestic tariff is allowed to them.

2. It has been examined by the Board whether Professionals like Lawyers, Doctors, Chartered-Accountants and Engineers who carry on their consultancy and professional work in a portion of their residences, Post-Masters of Experimental Post Offices who use a portion of their residences as their office and Gold-smiths using their residences for manufacture of jewellery etc. could be allowed the benefit of the domestic tariff for the portion of the premises used for non-domestic purposes. It is considered that in these cases, domestic tariff should not be allowed for the portion of the premises used for non-domestic purposes.

There are cases where a portion of the residence is used for official purposes by Members of Parliament/Legislative Assembly and Officers of the State/Central Government etc. The use of a portion of the residences by the Members of Parliament/Members of Legislative Assembly and Officers of State/Central Government etc. as their office-room cannot be compared to the use of residences as offices by Professionals referred to above, since no payment of remuneration for the services rendered is involved in the former cases.

3. After careful consideration of the matter, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board directs that—
- (i) the benefit of domestic tariff allowed to the residences of Professionals like Lawyers, Doctors, Chartered-Accountants and Engineers, Post-Masters of Experimental Post offices and Gold-smiths who use their residences for non-domestic purposes be withdrawn;
  - (ii) they should be asked to apply for and obtain a separate service connection/additional meter for the portion of their residence used by them for non-domestic purpose under appropriate tariff;
  - (iii) the existing consumers of the above categories should be allowed time till 30—4—1985 for the purpose of segregating the loads and obtaining a separate meter; and
  - (iv) wide-publicity be made through the media of the Newspapers about the withdrawal of the concessional tariff.
4. The above orders shall not, however, apply to the residences of Members of Parliament, Members of Legislative Assembly, Officers of the State/Central Government etc. who use their residences in connection with their official work.

- (4) Only for eligible “On line services” for which readiness has already been entered supply should be effected before 31—12—84.
- (5) Those who want to register their readiness before the expiry of 30 days which has already been given, may be permitted to enter their readiness.

Minutes of the High Power Committee meeting held at 3 P.M. on 17—8—84 at Conference Hall of Secretariat new buildings (10th Floor).

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Chief Secretary presided over the meeting.

The Commissioner and Secretary to Government, Revenue Department welcomed the officers present and explained that the meeting was intended to alert them to be in a state of readiness to meet any eventuality of an emergency by way of floods and cyclone.

The subjects suggested by various Heads of Department were taken up.

**1. Advance action to be taken by respective Departments in regard to relief measures like provision of food, supply of petrol, kerosene, diesel oil and aviation fuel, clothing etc. :**

The Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Revenue Administration stated that he has already issued instructions to Collectors in this regard.

**2. The provision of out-of-pocket expenses for staff engaged in flood/cyclone relief for previous floods. :**

The question of sanction of out-of-pocket expenses is under consideration of Government. It was decided that in future out-of-pocket expenses for relief operation should be given for any seven days during October to December by Collectors. There is however no objection for giving out-of-pocket allowances during the period of flood, cyclone etc.

**3. Standardising reporting system during floods/cyclone. :**

The Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Revenue Administration will issue instructions to the Collectors and Heads of Departments to furnish particulars in the standardised proforma.

**4. Cyclone Shelters :**

The Director of Town and Country Planning has stated that maintenance and repair works of cyclone shelters should be completed by mid September and kept ready for use during monsoon season. The Chief Engineer, Public Works Department (Buildings) who is incharge of maintenance of cyclone shelters will issue necessary instructions in this regard.

**5. Timely requisition of Helicopters :**

The Collector of Ramanathapuram requested that the State Helicopter might be stationed at Tiruchirapalli during times of floods so that it could be pressed into service at short notice. The Chief Secretary stated that State Helicopters could not be used for relief operation. The Defence personnel offered that their helicopters could be pressed into service at short notice.

**6. Provision of V.H.F. sets in major tanks :**

The Director of Civil Defence could prepare a scheme with locations for the V. H. F. and come up for sanction.

**7. Requisition of vehicles for relief works :**

It is reported that during floods in December '83 much difficulty was experienced in getting other departmental vehicles.

The Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Revenue Administration was requested to send proposals for issue of orders authorising the Collectors to requisition all Government vehicles in the districts during natural calamity, overriding those orders if any restricting the requisitioning of vehicles.

**8. Delegation of financial powers :**

It was agreed to increase the financial powers to Tahsildars, Revenue Divisional Officers, Collectors and Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Revenue Administration generally.

**9. Cyclone Shelters :**

At present the cyclone shelters could be used fully from January to September for various community purposes. It was decided that this period of non-cyclone months should be reduced to February to September.

All Regional Chief Engineers are instructed to provide energy meters in the Rural area Distribution Transformers as below in all the L.T. feeders feeding agricultural services.

(1) In order to check the malpractices in the Agricultural services like excess lighting load, excess power load, all the Agricultural services should be checked once in a year by the O&M Section Officers.

(2) The Assistant Divisional Engineer will counter check 20% of the Agricultural services once in a year in each section and Divisional Engineer will check 5% of the Agricultural services of sections once in a year.

(3) During these inspections, tong test readings should invariably be taken in all the Agricultural services to ascertain the correctness of the connected load of the motor and the lighting load with reference to sanctioned loads as per test report as well as the name plate found on the motor.

(4) The Regional Chief Engineers (Distribution) are requested to furnish a monthly return of annual inspection of all agricultural services in their regions separately for each system in the enclosed "Proforma" to the Monitoring Cell by 20th of every month.

(5) During the above inspections, the Inspecting Officer should ensure that there is no scope for unauthorised extensions, misuse of tariff, the farm lighting loads and the power loads connected are all within permitted/sanctioned limits.

(6) These inspections are to be done in addition to the routine inspections, mass-raid, surprise inspections and AE/R. 46 inspections.

In the above references the Regional Chief Engineers (Distributions) and System Superintending Engineers were instructed to maintain 100% burning of street lights in their systems by 31-3-84.

On a review, it is now seen even though the performance has improved considerably some of the systems have not yet reached the 100% level. They have been specifically instructed to achieve 100% burning.

Therefore the following instructions are issued to the Field Officers to maintain 100% burning of street lights :—

- (1) Each sub-division will be the unit responsible for the 100% burning of street lights.
- (2) The Assistant Divisional Engineer will review the burning of street lights in his sections once in a fortnight and take action to bring up the shortfall in those sections within the next fortnight. A margin of maximum 5% is allowed for exigencies. A review report should be sent to the concerned Divisional Engineer with copy to the Superintending Engineer.
- (3) A review will be conducted by the Divisional Engineer concerned based on the fortnightly reports received from the sub-divisions and action taken promptly to pull up the sections where the 100% burning has come down by more than 5%.
- (4) The Divisional Engineer will arrange to check the % burning in each sub-division by another adjacent sub-division staff of his division once in a month and co-relate the reports sent by the concerned sub-division with that of the results of this inter-sub-division checking and send his reports in this regard to the Superintending Engineer.
- (5) A surprise check of the 100% burning in one section at random will be arranged by System Head Quarters once in two months by deputing Public Relation Officers of the system for site inspection.
- (6) Instructions have been issued already to change all incandescent bulbs into single 40W tubes in a phased manner in M (D)'s D. O. SE/RE & I (D) DE (SS)/A1/C. 1580-1/84, dated 27-3-84. Therefore the burnouts of the incandescent bulbs must progressively come down thereby increasing % burning. This aspect also may be taken into account while reviewing the % burning at sub-division and Division level.
- (7) The System Superintending Engineers may be requested to communicate the above instructions to their Officers to ensure 100% burning of street lights in their systems.
- (8) In this connection their attention is invited to Memo. No. SE/RE & I (D)/ER/A5/F3/D.71/82, dated 22-1-82 wherein instructions were issued to maintain 5% of rolling stock of 1×40W tube light fittings to each O & M Section. This must be ensured. Necessary estimate for rolling stock for tube light fittings may also be sanctioned.
- (9) It is essential that pole schedules for the street lights in each village is maintained correctly so that the locations where the replacement of the bulb or tube has been done could be easily identified and also verified. Therefore, the System Superintending Engineers may be instructed to see that such pole schedules are available in each section and wherever not available action should be taken to get ready these street light schedules. Action should be taken immediately in this regard.

The receipt of this circular instructions should be acknowledged to Superintending Engineer, Rural Electrification & Improvements (Distribution), Madras-600 002 and action taken reported.

In exercise of the power vested under Section 22 (1) (b) of the Atomic Energy Act, 1962 (Act 33 of 1962), the Central Government, with the concurrence of the Central Electricity Authority (CEA), hereby fixes the tariff for power supplied from the Madras Atomic Power Station Unit-I (MAPS-I) to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board (T.N.E.B.) as under :—

**1. Rate :**

The tariff rate for MAPS-I is fixed at 39.00 p/KWh (excluding excise duty), subject to

fuel and heavy water adjustment charges as described in clause 2 below.

2. The base rates taken into account for computation of fuel and heavy water charge are :

Fuel and heavy water adjustment charges (p/KWh) applicable for any period will be worked out as follows :

The applicable fuel and heavy water rates will be determined by MAPS. Such adjustment charges may be made provisionally month by month based on estimated fuel and heavy water rates, and will be subject to final adjustment from time to time.

3. The rates mentioned in clause 1 above will remain in force for a period of three years from January 27, 1984, or until commencement of commercial operation of MAPS Unit-II, whichever occurs earlier. Bills based on these rates shall be payable on a monthly basis.

4. Subject to clause 2 above, the above fixed tariff rate can be revised by giving the Government of Tamil Nadu and TNEB a notice of three months.

5. In case a new tariff is not finalised before the date mentioned in clause 3, TNEB shall continue to pay for the power supplied beyond this date in the manner detailed in clauses 1 and 2 above.

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Sub : General Election 1984—Power supply to premises—Precautionary measures

- (vii) Election offices of recognised/registered parties and contesting candidates.
- (viii) Venues of meetings organised by political parties and contesting candidates.

2. Officers are informed that every care should be taken to see that uninterrupted power supply is maintained to the above and similar premises *without any distinction of parties*.

Amendment to Schedule to Tamil Nadu Revision of Tariff Rates on supply of Electrical Energy Act.

**No. II (2)/PWE/6539 (b)/84.**

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Tamil Nadu Revision of Tariff Rates on Supply of Electrical Energy Act, 1978 (Tamil Nadu Act 1 of 1979), the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby makes the following amendment to the Schedule to the said Act.

2. The amendment hereby made shall take effect on and from the 22nd November, 1984.

**Amendment**

In the said Schedule, in "Part A High Tension Supply", after the proviso to "HIGH TENSION TARIFF VII", for the entries under the heading "*General Provisions applicable to consumers covered under High Tension Tariffs I to VIII*", the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—

(i) Any High Tension supply involving a sanctioned demand above 5000 KVA (Plus 2 per cent marginal adjustment) shall be given supply only at 33 KV if available, in the area or at EHT voltage.

(ii) *Time limit to avail supply at 33 KV or EHT Voltage—(a) Category I.*—Existing High Tension consumers, whose sanctioned demand exceeds 5000 KVA, shall be given a period up to 31st August 1985 to avail the supply at the Voltage indicated in item 1 above.

(b) *Category II.*—Existing High Tension consumers, whose sanctioned demand is 5000 KVA or less and who require additional demand by which the total sanctioned demand would exceed 5000 KVA shall be given the additional demand only after they are ready to avail the supply at the voltage indicated in item 1 above.

(c) *Category III.*—New High Tension consumers requesting supply for a demand above 5000 KVA shall be given supply only at the voltage indicated in item 1 above.

(iii) *Extra Levy—(a) Category I.*—In the case of existing High Tension consumers whose sanctioned demand exceeds 5000 KVA and who do not avail supply at the voltage indicated in item 1 within the stipulated period, they shall be charged an extra levy of three paise per KWH (over and above the normal tariff) for the entire energy consumed.

(b) *Category II.*—The existing High Tension consumers whose sanctioned demand with the additional demand sanctioned exceeds 5000 KVA may with the approval of the Board be allowed the additional demand at the High Tension supply itself for a period not exceeding 12 months from the date of sanction of the additional demand, provided they agree to be charged the extra levy of three paise per KWH (over and above the normal tariff) for the entire energy consumed till they avail the supply at 33 KV or at EHT voltage as may be applicable.

Sub: Adverse Seasonal Condition 1983—Crash Programme of sinking 5000 Filter Points in the Cauvery Sub basin in Thanjavur district—Implementation of scheme—sending of progress report—Instructions issued.

In their letters first and second cited the Government have sanctioned a sum of Rs. 7½ crores for granting loans to agriculturists in Thanjavur district to have filter point tube wells sunk in their own fields for irrigating their lands. The total number of wells targetted for this scheme was 5,000. Implementation of this scheme was ordered to be under the overall control and direction of the Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Revenue Administration who is incharge of drought relief works in the State. In this office letter F4/113647/82-22, dt. 11—12—82 the Collector of Thanjavur was requested to send weekly periodical report on the progress on sinking of filter point tube wells. It was subsequently converted into fortnightly.

2. Now the Government in their order third cited have ordered the continuance of the scheme under drought relief programme only upto 30—6—84 and thereafter under the normal programme. In this context the Collector has requested instructions whether submission of this progress report may be continued or the periodicity of the periodical converted into monthly. The latest position as on 15—8—84 as reported by the Collector are :

1. Total Number of applications sanctioned (Out of this 127 cases after the sanction of loans, the loanees have not come forward to register the loan bond)	—	3713
2. Total No. of filter point tube wells sunk	—	3009
3. Number of successful tube well sunk	—	3009

3. In this regard, the Collector has reported that Government released only a sum of Rs. 450/- lakhs under this scheme and 3000 filter points have so far been sunk against the target of 5000 filter points and that for sinking the balance of 2000 filter points further allotment is awaited, that the work of sinking of filter point tube well, over and above 3000 numbers has been suspended at present for want of funds and that according to the recent instructions of the Government, a common seniority has to be maintained for all the applicants for pumpsets in Thanjavur district including Crash programme cases and no priority was given for filter point sunk under crash programme. In view of this the Collector has stated that the progress in energisation has naturally slowed down.

4. The Crash Programme urgency attached to this scheme is no longer present. Under the normal programme, with the Register of Co-operative Societies, Agricultural Engineering Department, Tamil Nadu Elec. Board participating the scheme has to be implemented in an orderly way. It should be remembered that these successful Filter Points will play a very useful role in times of adverse seasonal conditions and also during delayed supply of water. Through these Filter Points, nurseries could be raised which could become handy and ready for transplantation synchronising with the release of water. Collector has to watch the progress of the implementation even under the normal programme as Head of the District incharge of schemes. The main thrust now should be on commissioning and utilisation of 3009 successful Filter Points already sunk by the Agricultural Engineering Department. Out of these 1876 are reported to be in operation and the balance of 1133 are in various stages of progress. The Co-operative Department, Agricultural Engineering Department and the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board should be moved to play their respective roles and ensure proper commissioning of these wells (1133). Collector should monitor the progress very effectively to ensure this.

5. Instead of a monthly progress report, the Collector is requested to send a quarterly report indicating (i) the progress of commissioning of wells now in different stages of progress and (ii) number of new wells over and above 3009 which are reported to be successful upto 10-8-84. If no new work is taken up beyond 3009 for want of funds, such fact should also be indicated in the periodical report.

6. The progress report with the above particulars should be sent so as to reach this office on the dates noted below:

Progress report of quarter ended 31st March to reach on 5th April.

R. C. Es./Distribution are hereby authorised to accord approval to Superintending Engineers/O & M for accepting the materials such as U.G. cable, dividing box, H.T. compound, C.Ts. etc. from the consumers for provision of indoor control and metering cubicles in the premises of the H.T. consumers whenever such materials are not available in the Board's stores, subject to the following conditions :

(i) Proportionate supervision charges should be included in the estimate.

(ii) The materials should conform to Board's standards and of reputed standard make conforming to the relevant I.S.S.

(iii) Type test certificate, routine test certificate etc. obtained from the supplier should be produced and got approved by the Superintending Engineer before acceptance, wherever necessary.

(iv) Necessary tests should be conducted by the testing wings of the Board and materials should be accepted if only found satisfactory.

(v) The ownership of the cables and other materials shall rest with the Board once they are handed over and commissioned.

(vi) Any loss or inconvenience, prima-facie arising on account of such use of materials supplied by the consumers shall be made good by the consumer at no extra cost to the Board.

(vii) If the works are carried out by the Board reduction (on the portion of estimate chargeable to consumer) for the materials supplied shall be credited to the consumer as per current cost data of Board or rates is decided by Board based on previous procurements of such materials.

(viii) An undertaking from the consumer agreeing to the above conditions should be obtained before accepting the materials.

2. As per the Government/Public Works Department Letter under para—1, the following categories of pumpsets may be given power connection on priority basis.

“Tube well pumpsets installed in the community wells of Government Corporations or Local Bodies”.

The categories of Agricultural pumpsets for which special priority are to be accorded in energising pumpsets are as follows :

1. Government Departmental pumpsets such as those belonging Government seed farms, Government research centre etc.
2. Tube well pumpsets installed in community wells of the Tamil Nadu State Tube well Corporation Ltd.,
3. Agricultural pumpsets installed in tribal areas and owned by Tribal people living in Tribal areas.
4. Pumpsets installed in Boodan and Gramdhan lands in the State by the applicants after verifying from the Collectors of districts.
5. Community wells sunk by the District Development Corporation.
6. Tube well pumpsets installed in the community wells of Government Corporation or Local Bodies.

In accordance with the existing orders, extension of supply is given, on priority basis, among others, to the pumpsets coming under the following category :

“The tube well pumpsets installed in the community wells of Tamil Nadu Tube wells Corporation, and District Development Corporation”.

2. The Chairman, Electricity Board has reported that District Collectors are approaching to give power supply, on priority basis, to the community Bore wells sunk by Agricultural Engineering Department under DPAP. Since the community wells sunk by various agencies are intended to benefit the community as a whole, the Chairman, Electricity Board has suggested that orders may be issued on the following lines so that power connections, on priority basis, may be given to such community wells, irrespective of the agency which executed such wells.

“Tube well Pumpsets installed in the community wells of Government, Corporations or Local Bodies.”

3. The Government have examined the suggestion of the Chairman, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, and they, in modification of the existing orders mentioned in para-1 above, direct that power connection be given, on priority basis, to these pumpsets coming under the purview of the following category :—

“Tube well pumpsets installed in the community wells of Government Corporations or Local Bodies.”

*Sub :* Modification to pumpsets—energy conservation (ECP) —Scheme.

The R.E.C. have indicated that sanction is being accorded for modification to 3,125 pumpsets in 1984—85 with a view to improve the efficiency of existing pumpsets, resulting in energy conservation.

2. It has been decided to carry out the scheme in Madurai, North Arcot and Periyar Districts.

The Annexure furnishes the guidelines for the execution of the scheme.

An abstract of the estimate sent to R.E.C., along with a copy of the Booklet relating to the schemes containing the detailed instructions of the R.E.C., is also enclosed.

3. As the time is short, the Regional Chief Engineers, Superintending Engineers are requested to initiate action and identify the pumpsets of the 5 H.P. capacity as per norms stipulated, urgently.

Necessary advance action may be taken to place orders for procuring the materials as per specifications and terms of R. E. C., so that orders can be placed and work commenced as soon as sanction of the Project Report is received actually from R.E. Corporation.

Additional staff at the rate of One Assistant Divl. Engineer and Three Assistant Engineers/ Junior Engineers to each of the three regions is being sanctioned separately.

The Regional Chief Engineers/Superintending Engineers are requested to form the gang and the staff suggested by R. E. C. by suitable internal arrangement.

The Regional Chief Engineers will allot the pumpsets in their Region (as indicated in the Annexure) among the system Superintending Engineers of the Districts concerned suitably.

### ANNEXURE

The scheme is for conservation of energy in pumpsets. The efficiency of pumpsets could be improved by using efficient type of foot valves and replacing the G. I. pipes by P. V. C. pipes. It has been decided that the modification in 3,125 pumpsets may be carried out in Tamil Nadu during 1984—85.

2. The following districts/systems were selected for this purpose.

The number of pumpsets that are in service in these Districts are significantly high.

As far as possible, the pumpsets may be selected feederwise so as to cover max. number of pumpsets.

Pumpsets satisfying the requirements of R. E. C. viz., 5 H.P. capacity, consumption more than 3,500 units/year, etc., may be selected.

3. For the execution of the work, the Regional Chief Engineers may engage contract labour.

Material procurement will be done by the R.C.E's after identification of the pumpsets and assessment of the materials required.

4. The following shall be the tentative programme for carrying out the work.

- (i) Identification of pumpsets and preparation of estimates, according approval at the rate of 50% each in December '84 and January 1985.
- (ii) Material procurement on sanction by R. E. C.
- (iii) Carrying out the actual modifications from Jan. '85 to March '85 (30%—50%—20%.

For every region, the Superintending Engineer incharge of the district as noted below will be responsible for the execution and monitoring of the work.

5. In order to assess the actual conservation of energy in the pumpsets included in the project report the meters already provided need not be removed and consumption monitored before and after the modifications. In case the meters had been removed already meters may be provided in such pumpsets.

The R. E. C. have since stipulated that at least 25% of the existing 5 H. P. pumpsets on the selected feeders should be taken up for rectification.

6. The list of Agricultural pumpsets identified for inclusion in the scheme may be furnished section/S.S./Feeder/village wise along with S.C. Nos. to Superintending Engineer/Industrial Energy Management Cell from 15—12—84 onwards every fortnight. The Number of pumpsets for which estimates have been sanctioned, No. for which modification works have been completed and the expenditure incurred may also be furnished in the fortnightly report.

Apart from the above, the monthly progress report in Annexure—II of R. E. C's Booklet may also be sent promptly.

An abstract of the estimate sent to R.E.C. is enclosed for guidance. On receipt of sanction of the Project Report by R. E. C., the same will be communicated.
