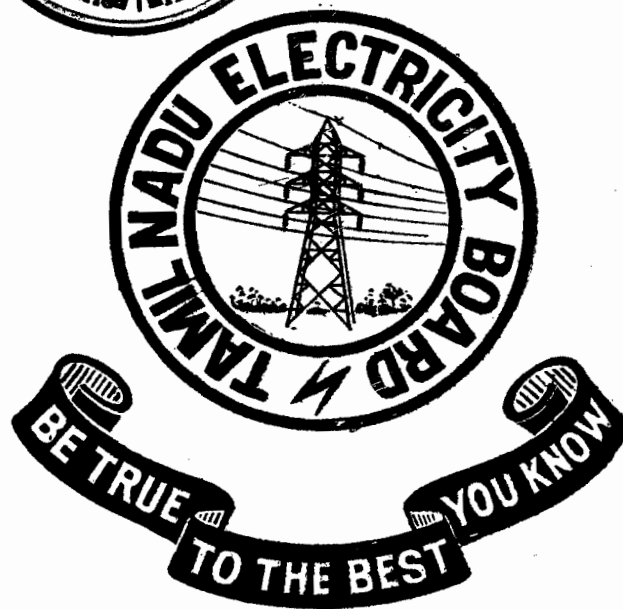
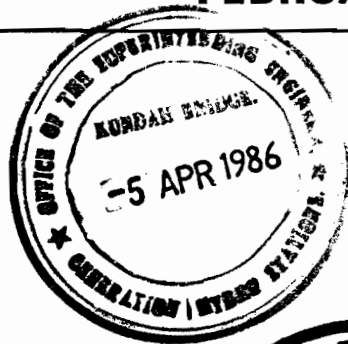

From the Chairman's desk:

Being the Chairman of an Electricity Board, it is an occupational hazard for me to have to inaugurate, preside over, present papers at, deliver valedictory addresses at workshops, seminars, conferences, symposia and meetings of various descriptions. I have to make it appear as if I know a lot about assorted subjects. By and large, I have carried this pretension with some measure of success. But I never imagined that one day I would be called upon to inaugurate a workshop on 'nuts and bolts'. That was precisely what happened some months back. But then I realised that, perhaps, I was not being fair to nuts and bolts. These are not trivia to be scoffed at. They are what hold things together, and but for them everything will fly away from everything else or collapse in a heap.

We are all familiar with the story of how for want of a nail a shoe was lost, for want of a shoe a horse was lost, for want of a horse a rider was lost, for want of a rider a battle was lost, and how then the kingdom itself was lost. Many are the kingdoms that have been lost for want of a nail. Do not overlook the significance of the least little thing

Many of us are apt to be shoddy and perfunctory in doing things, and leave a lot to chance in the hope that 'nothing will happen'. Or, trust in God as we deceive ourselves into thinking. We will do well to remember Mahomet's advice to one of his soldiers who said that he would turn his camel lose and trust him to God. Mahomet said: 'Tie your camel and then trust him to God'. Trust in God without any effort on one's own part is the easy excuse the idler finds. Oliver Cromwell told his soldiers: "Trust in Providence, but keep your powder dry".

I remember reading in a novel by Cronin (I forget which) about a young doctor who was being interviewed for a job and was asked: "What is the most invaluable lesson you have learnt?" And the young man replied: "Never take anything for granted". This is an admonition of inestimable significance which none of us can afford to ignore. Many are the occasions where some major mishap has taken place because of our inclination to take things for granted, because of our temptation to take refuge in the comfortable belief that no disaster will befall us just because we overlook some minor matter.

It is a great art to be meticulous in giving attention to details, never to allow anything to leave one's hands without improving it one way or the other and stamping it with some part of one's personality.

But, then, this also has its negative side. It may so happen that the time spent on the effort is disproportionate to the benefit. For instance, I have often wondered whether much of the time I spend on polishing some of my drafts could have been better utilised in some other pursuits. I am then reminded of an old story narrated by Ernest Gowers in his *Complete Plain words*. It is about an Indian official in the days of the *Raj* who, on finding his British superior laboriously correcting a letter he had drafted to a brother Indian official, remarked: "Your honour puts yourself to much trouble correcting my English and doubtless the final letter will be much better literature; but it will go from me Mukherji to him Bannerji, and he Bannerji will understand it a great deal better as I Mukherji write it than as your honour corrects it."

More than the wasted efforts, the obsession to take care of all possibilities and all eventualities often results in total inaction: If you have to go on a long and tiresome journey, you will never make it if you ponder too much over the distance you have to cover and of all the likely and the not-so-likely hardships on the way. But, prepare as best as is ordinarily needed and then put out your feet, one at a time, and, in due course, you would have covered the distance.

One of the tragedies of life is that, with the best of intentions, you fall into the trap of "perfectionism". It is the "all-or-nothing" attitude, and you end up gaining nothing because you will not take anything less than all. While a passion for excellence is admirable, a compulsive pre-occupation with 'perfectionism' can be counter-productive.

How often do we put off something we are eager to do to some future date because we think the present is not opportune and does not give us full scope—with the result the future recedes like the horizon and our plans get aborted, whereas if only we had made a beginning promptly when the idea occurred to us we would have achieved something even if not the best we wanted. We must realise that the 'golden hour' is not in some fictitious future but it is right here and now. Take advantage of every little opportunity that comes your way instead of waiting endlessly for some grand opportunity that will never be.

I. Generation particulars :

II. Hydro Inflows :

The hydro inflows in February '86 were only 54 m.u. as against the ten year average of 67 m.u. The total inflows for the period July '85 to February '86 were only 1901 m.u. as against 2673 m.u. during the corresponding period last year and the ten year average of 2949 m.u. for the corresponding period. The inflows this year so far are 772 m.u. less than that of last year and also 1048 m.u. less than the ten year average inflows. This year inflows were only 64.5% of the ten year average.

III. Storage Position :

The storage equivalent in million units as on 1—3—86 when compared to the storage on the same day last year was as follows:

During the period from July 1985 to February 1986, the generation in TNEB's own thermal stations was 3894 m.u. as against 3175 m.u. during the same period last year—an increase of 22.65%.

VI. Commissioning of Servalar Hydro Electric Project

The 20 MW set in Servalar Hydro Electric Project was spun on 26—2—1986 at 6.30 p.m. satisfactorily.

VII. Signing of agreement with Neyveli Lignite Corporation

A fresh agreement for the purchase of power for the period from 1—4—1984 to 31—3—1988 was signed with Neyveli Lignite Corporation on 24—2—1986. This agreement abandons the **ad hoc** formula adopted in the agreement for the period 1980—84 and adopts the 'Cost plus' formula which was in vogue till 1980 and is followed in the agreements for other Central Sector Power Stations even now. The salient aspects of the rates approved in this agreement when compared to the rates in the last agreement (1980—84) are as follows:—

Under the present agreement, the arrear claims of Neyveli Lignite Corporation which were of the order of Rs. 64 crores stand scaled down to Rs. 32 crores. It has also been agreed that these arrears will be frozen and will be paid in equal instalments during the period 1—4—1986 to 31—3—1987.

VIII. Wind Farm Project :

The Wind Farm Project with a capacity of 550 KW at Mullaikadu near Tuticorin in Tirunelveli District has been functioning satisfactorily and has generated 95,616 units upto 28—2—1986 since the date of commissioning on 18—1—1986.

IX. Establishment of Main Load Despatch Centre :

The Main Load Despatch Centre for Tamil Nadu located in the Board's Headquarters office complex at Madras has been commissioned.

X. Bifurcation of Madras Region :

At present, there are four Regional Chief Engineers at Madras, Madurai, Coimbatore and Trichy looking after 26 distribution systems with 142 divisions. Madras Region has 7 systems with 41 divisions as against 7 systems with 31 divisions in Madurai Region, 6 systems with 35 divisions in Trichy Region and 6 systems with 35 divisions in Coimbatore Region. The Madras Development Circle also comes under the Madras Region. There are 169 sub stations in Madras Region as against 105 in Madurai Region, 97 in Trichy Region and 72 in Coimbatore Region. There are 1096 HT services in Madras Region as against 408 in Madurai Region, 251 in Trichy Region and 667 in Coimbatore Region. The total services in Madras Region are 17.41 lakhs as against 14.71 lakhs in Madurai Region, 13 lakhs in Trichy Region and 13.26 lakhs in Coimbatore Region. The Board has decided that the Madras Region be bifurcated into two Regions with Headquarters at Madras and Vellore. The distribution systems now under Madras Region will be regrouped as follows:—

A. Madras Region :

1. M. E. S. North
2. M. E. S. South
3. M. E. S. Central
4. Chengelpet Electricity System
5. Madras Development Circle

B. Vellore Region :

1. Dharmapuri Electricity System
2. Tiruvannamali Electricity System
3. Vellore Electricity System

The Headquarters of the Vellore Region will be at Vellore.

XI. Tamil Nadu Electricity Consultative Council :

The Government of Tamil Nadu in G. O. MS. No. 337 dated 17th February, 1986 has reconstituted the Tamil Nadu Electricity Consultative Council. The reconstituted Council met on 27-2-1986.

XII. Unit Level Joint Committee :

The Board has reconstituted the Unit Level Joint Committee consisting of representatives of the Management and the Employees.

XIII. Quality Circles :

Action has been initiated for introducing Quality Circles in the Board. As a preliminary step, a seminar on Quality Circles was conducted for the Senior Officers of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board at Madras on 1st September, 1985 by Thiru N. Kuppuswamy, Joint Director, Central Labour Institute, Bombay. An appreciation programme on Quality Circles was conducted at Ennore between the 24th and the 28th February 86 by Thiru N. Kuppuswamy. Thirty Engineers working in various areas of Ennore Thermal Power Station participated in this.

XIV. Joint Training for Management and Workers :

In B. P. Ms. (Ch) No. 609, (Adm. Branch) dated 27-10-85, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board has approved a programme to bring together management and union representatives for joint training in industrial relations. There will be forty participants (20 from the management side and 20 from the workers' side) in each batch and they will be trained for six days at the Tamil Nadu Institute of Labour Studies, Madras. So far, 3 batches have undergone this training in April, July and September 85. Further batches will be deputed for this training in the coming months.

XV. Closing of Work orders :

As on 1-7-85, about 6.33 lakhs work orders were pending to be closed under the following categories, namely

(i) Capital	—	2.44 lakhs (issued upto 82-83)
(ii) Service connection	—	3.70 lakhs (issued upto 83-84)
(iii) Others	—	0.19 lakhs (issued upto 83-84)

As the work of closing of work orders had gone into heavy arrears, a special review was made during July 1985. Instructions were issued to the Superintending Engineers fixing target dates for clearing the arrears. During the seven months period upto January 1986 from the date of issue of these instructions, the Systems/Circles have cleared 3.05 lakhs of work orders, that is, about 50% of the arrears. As far as service connection work orders are concerned, almost all have cleared these upto 31-3-84 except in the case of Dharmapuri, South Arcot Electricity System (North) and Madras Electricity System (South). The details of work orders pending as on 1-7-85 and as on 31-1-86 are furnished in the Annexure.

Proceedings :

In the memorandum first cited, while defining the distribution experience in the type of work concerned for promotion as Foreman I Grade, orders were issued that all categories of staff under the Junior Engineer II Grade in charge of distribution section without sub-station and Extra-High Tension lines other than the categories of Sweeper, Gardener, Watchman, Sanitary worker, Telephone Boy/Messenger Boy, Telephone Operators, Cleaner and Driver who are attending to works on distribution side as well as minor extension works may be considered to have gained experience in distribution side and that the Diploma Holders who have gained experience in any one of the above posts for a period of five years can be considered to possess experience in the type of work concerned for the purpose of promotion as Foreman I Grade in distribution side.

2. As some of the Superintending Engineers sought further clarifications, clarificatory orders were issued that the experience in the posts such as Switch Board Operator, Electrician, Oil Tester and Filter Operator which are not interchangeable between II Grade to I Grade sections and vice versa shall not be reckoned as the type of work concerned on the distribution side. Similarly orders were issued that the office experience of Commercial Assistants, Assistant Commercial Inspectors and Commercial Inspectors who attend to estimation and survey work shall not be considered as field experience for promotion as Foreman I Grade.

3. Consequent on the issue of the above instructions in the reference 2nd cited, as many of the workmen who did not satisfy the requirement of distribution experience could not get promotion as Foreman I Grade a number of posts of Foreman I Grade remained unfilled for want of prescribed experience. Representations have been received from the Unions of workmen for liberalisation in reckoning distribution experience:

4. The matter has been examined further and the following orders are issued:—

- (i) Non-diploma holders who work as Lineman Operator, Switch Board Operator/Switch Board Attendant, Electrician etc. in the Sub-Station and having a total experience of 12 years as prescribed in the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulation shall be considered for promotion as Foreman I Grade, if they had already worked in the categories of Temporary Casual Labour, Helper, Wireman, Lineman for atleast a period of 5 years on the distribution side.
- (ii) Similarly in view of possession of their technical qualification, the experience of the diploma holders who had worked as Temporary Casual Labour, Switch Board Operator/Switch Board Attendant, Electrician I Grade in Sub-Stations shall also be reckoned as distribution experience.
- (iii) The experience put in both by diploma holders and non-diploma holders as Temporary Casual Labour, Helper, Lineman and Line Inspector in (Extra-High Tension lines) Line sections also shall be deemed as experience on distribution side for the purpose of promotion to Foreman I Grade.
- (iv) In consideration of their better qualification of S. S. L. C. (completed) when compared to other non-diploma holder Regular Work Establishment workmen, if the Commercial Inspectors had field experience for 5 years such as Temporary Casual Labour, Helper, Wireman within the 12 years' experience prescribed in the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulation, they shall be considered for promotion as Foreman I Grade. Similarly the experience of the diploma holders who had worked as Temporary Casual Labour,

Switch Board Operator/Switch Board Attendant, Electrician I Grade in sub-stations, Extra-High Tension lines and as Commercial Inspector etc. shall also be reckoned as distribution experience for promotion as Foreman I Grade.

- (v) While reckoning the experience as mentioned above, the experience put in the category of Temporary Casual Labour for over and above 2 years shall be restricted to and counted as 2 years only.
- (vi) While considering promotions to the post of Foreman I Grade both the diploma holders and non-diploma holders in the identical categories of the immediate lower posts who possess the requisite experience on the distribution side as indicated above shall be considered as per their seniority in the common panel and subject to their suitability.

Labour, Coimbatore—Communicated.

A copy of the order passed by Deputy Commissioner of Labour, Coimbatore on the above subject is enclosed for information and guidance.

The order dated 31—10—85 of the Deputy Commissioner of Labour, Coimbatore contains an important decision upholding the action of the Management in having deducted wages on the principle of "no work no wage" for one day/half-a-day/permission to participate in a demonstration as well within the rights of management and highlighting, at the same time that the provisions in Standing Order No. 14 (1) of Standing Orders for Clerical Workmen and Standing Order No. 20 (iii) of the Standing Orders for non-Clerical Workmen, governing sanction of Casual Leave, shows that it is not only obligatory on the part of employees to apply for casual leave well before availing, but also obtain the prior sanction/permission before availing the casual leave and the purpose for which casual leave applied for in the instant case viz. participation in a procession cannot be said to be unforeseen and so the employees concerned ought to have availed the leave only after seeking prior sanction.

These are applications filed by Thiru P. Subramaniam and 9 others against Assistant Accounts Officer, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, Avanashi and Divisional Engineer, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, Avanashi, Thiru K. Balan and 4 others against Junior Engineer (Operation and Maintenance) Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, Nambiampalayam, Thiru A. Arukkutty and 2 others against Assistant Accounts Officer, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, Palladam, Thiru A. Felix Antony and 32 others against Assistant Accounts Officer, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, Tiruppur, Divisional Engineer, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, Tiruppur, Thiru V. Harikrishnan and Thiru M. Shanmugam, against Divisional Engineer (Operation and Maintenance) Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, Tiruppur, Thiru K.P. Divakaran and Kalanidhi against Divisional Engineer (Operation and Maintenance) Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, Tiruppur, Thiru M. Sivaramakrishnan, against Assistant Divisional Engineer/Town/Operation and Maintenance, Tiruppur, Thiru M. Appukutty and three others against Junior Engineer/East/Koduvai, Thiru K. Krishnan against Junior Engineer (East), Koduvai, Thiru P. P. Unnikrishnan, against Junior Engineer (East) Koduvai, Thiru N. Mohamed Sali against Junior Engineer (West) Koduvai, Thiru N. Ramasamy against Junior Engineer (East) Thiru R. Veerasamy and 5 others against Assistant Engineer, Pollikalipalayam, Thiru K. Palaniappan and S. Kaliappan against Assistant Engineer Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, Pollikalipalayam, Thiru R. Ponnusamy and 4 others against Assistant Engineer, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, Pollikalipalayam, Thiru M. Karuppusamy against Assistant Engineer/Town/North, Tiruppur. 3, Thiru M. Ibrahim against Assistant Engineer/Town/North and Thiru Hanifa against Junior Engineer/Town/Perianaickenpalayam under Section 15 (2) of the Payment of Wages Act, 1936 claiming refund of the alleged illegal deduction of wages amounting to Rs. 1,885-55 (as detailed in Annexure) for refusal of casual leave for one day, and $\frac{1}{2}$ a day and an hour permission to the various applicants on 26-5-84. The opposite parties were called upon to file their counterstatement and the same was filed. The matter was taken up for hearing on various dates and finally on 10-6-85 at Coimbatore. On 10-6-85, Thiru S. Arumugham Authorised Representative for applicants and Thiru C. Venugopal, Counsel for opposite parties and Thiru Mohamed Meeran Sahib, Assistant Accounts Officer, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board for opposite parties were present. On hearing the contentions of both the parties the materials placed before me and the matter having stood over till date for consideration, I pass the following order.

The issues involved in all the above cases are one and the same in nature, and so I pass a common order in all the above cases. In their claim petition, the applicants have stated that they have applied for casual leave for a day, some applicants for half a day and for some others permission for an hour on 26-5-84. Most of the Respondents were refused leave only after the expiry of the leave period i.e. after they have availed of the leave which is against the provisions of the certified standing order both for clerical and non-clerical staff of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board. Those who applied for casual leave have complied with the provisions of clause 19 (vi) for non-clerical and clause 13 (ii) for clerical staff of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board. Clause 14 of certified standing order for clerical staff and allied workmen does not say, that the casual leave applications should be given before 24 hours of leave to be availed of. According to clause 20 (iii) and 14 (i) of the said certified standing orders, Casual leave can be availed of without prior sanction in unforeseen circumstances and in case of sickness. The applicants applied for casual leave and permission for attending to some personal and domestic affairs. A procession was proposed to be held after 5 P.M. on 26-5-84 i.e. only after office hours. The applicants leave for a day/half a day/permission to go early for an hour on 26-5-84 was not in connection with the procession. Hence there are no concerted action. Eventhough about 3000 employees participated in the procession, only a few were picked out and victimized by the Respondents. According to the certified standing orders, if the leave is refused in time, the reasons therefor shall be recorded in writing and shall be communicated to the workmen concerned before commencement of leave.

In case Nos. P.W. 34/84, 35, 36, 63 and 64/84 the Respondents refused leave to the applicants without giving any reason and leave was not refused to applicants in P.W. 27/84, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 56, 57/84 and 4/85. In P.W. 26/84, first they sanctioned the leave to the applicants and there after they refused. Hence, the action of the Respondents in refusing the leave to the applicants and deducting the salary for the period in question is illegal. The applicants therefore prayed this court to direct the Respondents to pay the deducted wages to the applicants concerned.

The opposite parties in their counterstatement, have stated that the claim of the applicants are for the refund of the wages cut imposed by the opposite party are unsustainable in law and on facts. They have stated that no leave/permission was sanctioned to the applicants and it is not a matter of right for the applicants to go away from the working spot after applying for leave/permission and without waiting for the sanction of leave/permission. The applicants applied for casual leave/permission not for any bonafide reason but only to participate in a mass rally that was taken out at Coimbatore on 26-5-84. The applicants were not prepared to await for the sanction or refusal of leave/permission and they left the working spot after throwing the leave/permission letter in a casual manner. The same was not denied by the applicants. The leave letters were mostly submitted on 26-5-84 itself. In some cases only on 25-5-84 i.e. the previous day. The leave letters of the applicants are marked as exhibit R1 series and EX. R2 is a statement giving details of R1 series in nutshell. There was no change/opportunity to the management to take action on the leave letters because there was no sufficient time given to the opposite party and the leave letters were only thrown on the management.

The opposite party further stated that there was no question of victimization of the applicants. On the principle of 'No work—no wage' the opposite party caused deduction of wages from the applicants for the period of absence in their duties. No further disciplinary action was taken against any of the applicants. The opposite party is running an essential service employing nearly a lakh of workers and in such an essential service no leave can be demanded and obtained as a matter of right. They therefore stated that their action in having deducted the wages is justified and legal. They therefore prayed this Hon'ble court may dismiss these applications.

The applicants have applied for casual leave for one day/half a day/permission on 26-5-84. According to the Ex-R1 the leave letters were submitted on 25-5-84 in respect of applicants in P.W. Case No. 29/84, 34/84, 35/84 and 36/84. In respect of the applicants in P.W. Case No. 27/84 though the leave letters were dated as 25-5-84 they were submitted only on 26-5-84. In respect of applicants in P.W. 36/84, the leave was refused on 25-5-84 and the opposite party got acknowledgement on 25-5-84 itself. In other cases the leave was refused on 26-5-84. Regarding the remaining applicants the leave letters were produced only on 26-5-84 and the same was refused by the Respondents on that day itself.

The applicants contended that leave was refused by the opposite party only after the applicants had availed of the leave applied for by them which is against the provisions of the certified standing orders applicable to clerical and non-clerical staff of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board. Those who have applied for casual leave have complied with the provisions of Clause 19 (vi) of certified standing orders applicable to non-clerical staff and 13 (ii) of clerical staff of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board.

The said clause 19 (vi) reads as, "A workman who desires to obtain leave of absence shall apply to an officer or officers appointed for the purpose by the Management. He shall also mention in his leave application his address during the period of leave. Application for the leave of absence for three days or less should ordinarily be made atleast twenty four hours previous to the time from which the leave is required. Application for leave of absence for more than three days shall be made atleast 15 days before the date from which the leave is required except in case of sickness or other emergencies. If the leave is granted, a leave sanction order shall be issued to the workman. If the leave is refused or postponed the fact of such refusal or postponement and the reasons therefor shall be recorded in writing and shall be communicated to workman concerned. If the workman after proceeding on leave desires an extension thereof, he shall make an application for the purpose to the authority granting leave who shall send a written reply either granting or refusing the extension of leave to the leave address of the workman".

The conditions said down in the above sub-clause i.e. 19 (vi) can only apply to the employees who have applied for leave entitled as per sub-clause 19 (i), 19 (ii), 19 (iii), 19 (iv) and 19 (v) only. It does not apply to Casual leave. Similarly the conditions laid down in sub-clause 13 (ii) can only be applicable to the leave enlisted in appendix to sub-clause 13 (i) of the certified Standing orders for clerical and allied workmen.

According to clause 14 (i) and Clause 20 (iii) of certified Standing orders applicable to clerical and non-clerical workmen, they can avail of casual leave only after getting prior sanction from the competent authority.

Clause 14 (i) of certified standing orders for clerical and allied workman and clause 20 (iii) reads as follows

Clause 14 (i) of certified Standing Orders for Clerical Staff.

Every workman may be granted casual leave for 15 days in a calendar year. Except in unforeseen circumstances and in cases of sickness for which intimation should be sent to the sanctioning authority for issue of appropriate sanctions. Casual leave shall be availed of only after getting prior sanction of the competent authority.

Clause 20 (iii) of Certified Standing Order for non-Clerical staff.

Except in unforeseen circumstances and in cases of sickness for which intimation should be sent to the sanctioning authority for issue of appropriate sanction casual leave shall be availed of only after getting sanction of the competent authority.

According to the conditions laid down in the above clauses of certified standing orders applicable to clerical and non-clerical staff, the staff member can avail of Casual leave only after getting prior sanction of the competent authority. In this case though the applicants would contend that they had applied for casual leave prior to availing of the leave the Management had not communicated the order refusing the leave.

The reading of the relevant clause of the certified Standing order would show that it is not only obligatory on the part of the applicant to apply for casual leave well before availing but also obtain the prior sanction before availing of the casual leave. In this case the purpose for which casual leave or permission sought for is to participate in a procession meant to express their resentment over the action of the Management. This purpose cannot be said to be unforeseen and so the applicants ought to have availed of the leave only after getting prior sanctions.

Hence it is established that the applicants after presenting the leave applications had left their work spot and availed of the Casual leave without getting prior sanction of the competent authority. In view of the above circumstances, I come to the conclusion that the action of the applicants amounted to absence from duty without proper sanction.

I therefore hold that the opposite party is well within their rights to deduct wages for one day/half a day/permission applied for by the applicants on 26-5-1984, in accordance with section 7 (2) (b) and 9 (1) of the payment of Wages Act 1936. Since the workmen themselves absented from duty they would not be eligible for wages and so deduction of one day's wages or half day's wage as the case may be is justified. In the result I find the action of the opposite party is in order and the claims are not sustainable in Law.

1. The proposed Management Information System was explained in detail in the circular under reference. The above circular was published in the Gazette for June '85 and was also printed and supplied as a separate booklet. In the above memo, it was intimated that the date from which the system would come into effect, would be intimated separately after the printing was over (vide para 15 of the circular memo).

2. Chairman has approved that the new system may be implemented from 1—4—86. I request you to make sure that the system is implemented as detailed in the circular memo. from 1—4—86.

3.1. The registers of returns O & M section for the year 85—86 were already printed and issued to Superintending Engineers, Operation and Maintenance as per allotment order SE/Plg/DB/10423/85—20 dt. 15—6—85. The register of returns Operation and Maintenance Section for 1986—87 will be printed and issued separately.

3.2. The other 6 registers of Return are allotted to various Operation and Maintenance systems. The allotment to various officers in your system may be made as follows :

Sub : Establishment—Class III Service—Retention of Assessors who have not opted for Card Billing as Junior Assistant in the same system.

Ref : Memo. No. 035374/309/Adm. Br./C1 (3)/85—3, dated 27—9—85.

The request of the Regular Work Establishment staff and Office Helpers working as Assessors for retention in the same system on their opting out of that category was not accepted as their seniority is not common like provincial staff:

But, it is represented that the Regular Work Establishment Helpers and Office Helpers who are working as Assessors opting for reversion to Regular Work Establishment category and provincial cadre, respectively, may be permitted as there are large vacancies. After careful examination, it has been decided that retention of Regular Work Establishment Helper and office Helpers can be permitted in the system where they are now working. But in the case of RWE Helpers, they should give an undertaking accepting to forego seniority and take last rank in the present system, relinquishing rights in the parent System/Circle.

APPENDIX

(I) Formation of Joint Committees :

(1) A joint Committee consisting of representatives of the Management and the employees will be formed at the Electricity Board's level and this will be called "Apex Level Joint Committee."

(2) Joint Committees consisting of representatives of the Management and the employees each will be formed at the level of every System/Circle.

(II) Constitution of Joint Committees :

(i) The Apex Level Joint Committee and the Unit Level Joint Committees shall be constituted by the Chairman, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board consisting of five members (including the Chairman of the Committee) representing the Management and five members representing the employees.

(ii) The period of office of the Apex Level Joint Committee and the Unit Level Joint Committees shall ordinarily be two years. The Committee is liable to be re-constituted even within the said period of two years if so required.

(iii) The Chairman of the Apex Level Joint Committee will be the Chairman, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board. The Chairman of the Unit Level Joint Committee will be the Superintending Engineer/Chief Engineer/General Superintendent as the case may be of the System/Circle concerned.

(iv) Industrial Relations Adviser will be the observer in the Apex Level Joint Committee.

(v) At Ennore Thermal Power Station, Tuticorin Thermal Power Station and Mettur Workshop, the Labour officers concerned will be the observer in the Unit Level Joint Committees.

(III) Meetings of Joint Committees :

(i) The Joint Committees will meet once in three months.

(ii) The Chairman of the Joint Committee concerned will preside over the meetings of the Joint Committees.

(iii) Whenever the Chairman of the Joint Committee is unable to attend any meeting, he shall nominate one of the members representing the Management in the Committee to preside over the meetings.

(iv) The quorum for a meeting will be seven.

(v) The convenor specified in the orders nominating the members of the Joint Committee will convene the meetings of the Joint Committee after obtaining the orders of the Chairman of the Committee, prepare the agenda for the meeting with reference to the notes received from the members on subjects allowed by the Chairman of the Committee. He will maintain the minutes book and other records and watch the follow-up action on the recommendations of the Committee.

(vi) The decision of the Chairman of the Committee on the subjects for inclusion in the Agenda shall be final.

(vii) The recommendation of the Apex/Unit Level Joint Committees will be acted upon expeditiously.

IV. Functions of Joint Committees :

(A) The functions of the Joint Committees shall be purely recommendatory in character.

(B) The Joint Committees will deal with the following matters, provided that the Unit Level Joint Committees will deal with only such matters as pertain to their respective units and lie within the power of the Officers at that level:—

(i) Measures for optimising the operational efficiency and improving the management at all levels.

(ii) Optimum utilisation of men, machineries, spares, stores, stationery and equipments and elimination of wastage and over-time work.

(iii) Development of skills of the workmen and provision of training facilities.

(iv) Prevention of theft of power and other malpractices.

(v) General discipline in the workshop, steps to reduce absenteeism, negligence and indiscipline.

(vi) Welfare, health and safety measures.

(C) The subjects other than those enumerated above shall not be discussed by the Joint Committees and, particularly, the following subjects shall not be discussed:—

(i) Appointments, postings, promotions, and transfer.

(ii) Pay, wages and allowances.

(iii) Disciplinary matters.

(V) Addition, deletion and alteration to the scheme :

The Chairman of the Electricity Board shall have powers to make additions, deletions or alterations to the above scheme.

TAMIL NADU ELECTRICITY BOARD — Simplification in maintenance of Accounts—Stores Handling Suspense Account—Dispensing with—orders issued.

Proceedings :

At present, all incidental expenses connected with stores viz. cost of carriage, store-keeping maintenance expenses, rent for store house, wages paid to store coolies and work charged establishment for handling of materials in the stores godown or yard etc., are debited to "Stores Handling Suspense Account", with the following exceptions, as per para 427—A of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Manual Vol. I :

- (a) Incidental expenses connected with heavy equipments or heavy materials or materials in respect of which incidental charges could be readily allocated such as Transformers, Cement, Girders, Joists, Rail Poles and other Line supports ;
- (b) Customs Duty and Taxes ;
- (c) Overseas Freight and Insurance charges; and
- (d) Ocean Freight and Handling charges upto destination on stores imported directly for specific works.

The Stores Handling Suspense Account is cleared by charging a variable fixed percentage every quarter on all the issues made and the left out balance at the year end is charged to Revenue Account.

In the case of the above exceptions, the incidental expenses which are identifiable are directly charged to the cost of the equipment and materials itself.

2. In the present procedure, stores handling expenses are reviewed every quarter and are being charged in each and every requisition as percentage of the cost of materials, which involves considerable volume of work. Since a major portion of the incidental charges in the stores in respect of equipments on heavy materials, Customs Duty, Freight, Ocean Freight, etc is directly charged to equipments and materials itself, the balance stores handling expenses will not be substantial.

3. As a measure of simplification, it is hereby ordered that the incidental expenses on Stores Handling except the items at (a) to (d) in Para 1 above, should be charged directly to Revenue Expenditure dispensing with the maintenance of "270 Stores Handling Suspense Account" in the Systems and "039 Stores Handling Suspense Account" in the Circles.

4. The above simplified procedure should be followed with immediate effect. Any balance in the Stores Handling Suspense Account should be charged directly to Revenue Expenditure in the case of Systems and charged to Capital works of the Circles/Project to which bulk of the stock materials are issued.

5. Necessary amendment to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Manual Volume I Para 427—A will be issued separately.

Sub : Inter State Sales—obtaining of 'C' forms—Certain instructions issued—Regarding.

In the course of check of Central Sales Tax accounts of the Board, by the Commercial Tax Department, it was observed by the Commercial Tax Officer that 'C' forms obtained by the Board from the customers of the Board do not contain full particulars, that are necessary for the check of accounts of purchasers, who has furnished the 'C' Form.

The Sales Tax Officers do not accept such defective 'C' Forms for assessing at the concessional rate of tax and they have proposed to assess at higher rate of Sales tax applicable to non-Registered dealer. Hence to avoid such a difficulty all the Superintending Engineers of Systems/Circles are requested to follow the instructions given below :

All 'C' Forms obtained by the Board should invariably contain the following information.

- (1) Purchaser's Name with complete address.
- (2) Purchaser's Central Sales Tax Registration No. and date of Registration.
- (3) Signature of the Purchaser.
- (4) Sale Note or Sale order No. and date of the respective Systems/Circles.
- (5) Date of Sale.
- (6) 'C' Form should be for the full amount collected (i.e.) Total Sale Value plus Tax.

All the above information should be available in the 'C' Forms obtained from the Purchasers for Inter State Sales and sent to this office with the Return of Sales Tax Collected.

2. According to the provision in Note (2) under Regulation 53 of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Employees Travelling Allowance Regulations, a journey performed within the Madras City Limits, though it may exceed 8 Kilometres, will not be treated as a journey on tour.

3. Consequent on the expansion of Madras City Limit due to the inclusion of the 12 more Town Panchayats mentioned at para. 1 above in the Madras Corporation, the question of regulating the payment of Travelling Allowance to the employees of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board in case if they perform a journey within the extended Madras City limit by virtue of provisions in Travelling Allowance Regulations was considered by the Board and after reaching an amicable settlement with the Unions, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board has decided that payment of Travelling Allowance to the employees of the Board for their journey within the extended Madras city **including** the areas mentioned in para. 1 above, will be regulated as per Note-2 under Regulation 53 of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Travelling Allowance Regulations.

4. Accordingly, after careful consideration, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board directs that the journey performed by the employees of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board working within the unexpanded Madras City limits to a place in the above mentioned 12 Town Panchayats, though it exceeds 8 Kms. and hitherto treated as a journey on tour and allowed Travelling Allowance, Daily Allowance etc. as per the provisions of Travelling Allowance Regulations be, hereafter, will not be treated as a journey on tour and for such a journey the employees will be entitled to actual expenses only. Similarly, the journey performed by the employees of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board working in the above mentioned 12 Town Panchayats exceeding 8 Kms. and reaching a place within the unexpanded Madras City limit which was hitherto treated as a journey on tour and allowed Travelling Allowance and Daily Allowance etc. as per the Travelling Allowance Regulations, hereafter will not be treated as a journey on tour and for such a journey the employees of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board will be entitled to actual expenses only.

REGULATIONS—Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Employees' Travelling Allowance Regulations—Regulation 53—Amended.

Proceedings :

According to the provision in Note (2) under Regulation 53 of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Employees' Travelling Allowance Regulations, a journey performed within the Madras City Limits, though it may exceed 8 Kms., will not be treated as a journey on tour.

2. The Government in Finance Allowance Department in their G. O. Ms. No. 644, Finance (All-I), dated 17—6—1985 have directed that the journey performed within the City Limits of Municipal Corporations like Madurai, Coimbatore, etc., also, though it may exceed 8 Kms., will not be treated as journey on tour.

3. An Industrial Dispute was raised in regard to regulation of Travelling Allowance and Daily Allowance to the employees of the Board for their journey within the expanded Madras city, including the places newly added to the Madras Corporation, as per G. O. Ms. No. 790, Rural Development and Local Administration Department, dated 29—5—1978. This dispute has been amicably settled. The Unions have agreed that the Travelling Allowance and Daily Allowance claims of the employees for the journeys within the city limits of Madras, may be regulated as per the provision in the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Employees' Travelling Allowance Regulations as mentioned in para. 1 above. The above principle will also equally apply in the case of travels within the Municipal city limits of Madurai and Coimbatore Corporations etc.

4. Accordingly, after careful consideration, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board directs that the journeys performed within the city limits of Municipal Corporations like Madurai, Coimbatore, etc. also, though it may exceed 8 Kms., will not be treated as a journey on tour.

5. In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 79 (c) of the Electricity Supply Act, 1948, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board hereby makes the following amendment to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Employees' Travelling Allowance Regulations:

A M E N D M E N T

In the said Regulations, in Regulation 53, for Note (2), the following 'Note' shall be substituted, namely:

"Note: (2) A Journey performed within the limits of Municipal Corporations like Madras, Madurai, Coimbatore, etc., though it may exceed 8 Kms., will not be treated as a journey on tour".

As per the existing orders, if an employee, who is eligible to draw washing allowance, is on leave for a period exceeding 15 days in a month proportionate cut shall be made on the claim of washing allowance and if the absence is less than 15 days no cut shall be imposed in this regard.

2. In this connection, the Chief Internal Audit Officer/Board Office Audit Branch has requested clarification in respect of the following points:

- (i) Whether different spells of leave in a month may be taken for total absence for imposing proportionate cut in washing allowance.
- (ii) If one spell of leave which exceeds 15 days falls in 2 months, the procedure to be adopted in this regard.
- (iii) If one spell of leave falls in two continuous months, i.e., in one month more than 15 days and in the next month less than 15 days, the method to be adopted in imposing the cut.

3. The following clarifications are issued in respect of the points raised in para 2 above.

- (i) The different spells of leave in a month need not be taken for total absence for imposing proportionate cut in the washing allowance.
- (ii) If the employee is continuously on leave for 15 days irrespective of the fact whether the leave is spread over two months or falls in a month, the proportionate cut in the washing allowance shall be imposed.
- (iii) If the one spell of leave of an employee falls in two continuous months (i.e.) in one month more than fifteen days and in the next month less than fifteen days, a cut should be imposed on the claim of washing allowance in the month in which the leave exceeds fifteen days and no cut should be imposed on the claim in the month in which the leave is for less than fifteen days in keeping with the orders in B.P. Ms. No. 161 (S. B.) dt. 8—4—82.

Proceedings :

Generating Equipments, Machineries, Spares, Tools and Plants are purchased for Power Projects, by making Advance Payments, debiting the same to 091 Capital Miscellaneous Advances Account and clearing them after the erection of the Equipments, Machineries, etc. are completed.

2. There is no uniform procedure for the receipt and accounting of the Equipments, Machineries, Spares, Tools and Plants, etc. In some circles, the receipts of the equipments are taken both in the Stores Receipt Book and in the Measurement Book. In some other Circles, the Project Equipments, as and when received, are entered only in the Measurement Book. The value of such Equipments, etc. received are kept under suspense without debiting the Stock Account or charging the Capital Works Account, but cleared only when all the equipments are received and erected. This results in accumulation of heavy balances in 091 Capital Miscellaneous Advance Account and presents a distorted picture in the Balance Sheet.

3. To have a uniform procedure in order to avoid heavy accumulation of 091 capital Miscellaneous Advances Account and to simplify the procedure of Accounting of the Equipments etc. received, it is hereby ordered that:

1. When the Equipments, Machineries, Spares, Tools and Plants, etc. ordered for the Specific Project Works are supplied and taken by the field officers and kept in their custody for erection, the same shall be taken in the Measurement Book only, duly checkmeasured by the Competent Authority, and the cost charged to the Capital Works, crediting 091 Capital Miscellaneous Advances Account without waiting for the actual erection of the equipment.
2. Such items should not be entered in the Stores Receipt Book and taken to Stock Account.
3. Spares, Tools and Plants ordered subsequently, after placement of the original Equipment on Machineries Purchase Orders, are to be accounted for in the Stores Receipt Book only with their respective values.
4. If the exact values of some items not received in a consignment are not readily available, an assessed value of the items not received in the consignment should be deducted and the balance supply value should be adjusted, debiting the Capital Works and Crediting the 091 Capital Miscellaneous Advances Account.
The executive Engineer concerned will be the Competent Authority to furnish the assessed value.
5. Tools and Plants, Spare, etc. supplied along with the Equipments, Machineries listed and not listed in the Packing List, shall also be accounted in the Measurement Book without value, in case it is in the custody of the Field Officers.
6. In case these spares, Tools and Plants, listed and not listed, but supplied is taken to Stores, then the procedure for Accounting the Spares, Tools and Plants by taking in the Stores Receipt Book without value should be adopted (Numerical Account only).
7. After completion of the works at the time of closing the contract all the Equipments, Machineries, Spares, Tools and Plants, etc. supplied shall be checked with the Measurement Book and Stores Receipt Books and then only final adjustment of the Contract Account, 091 Miscellaneous Advances Accounts, etc. made. It shall be ensured that no amount is left unadjusted in the 091 Capital Miscellaneous Advances Account.

4. This simplified procedure will take effect immediately.

5. A new para shall be incorporated for the above procedure in the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Manual Volume I under Para 411.

Order :

The Government have decided to sanction two additional instalments of Dearness Allowance to their employees. The new rates of Dearness Allowance shall be calculated on the following basis :—

	Above Rs. 1,100 ...	10.80 per cent of pay subject to a maximum of Rs. 270

The Dearness Allowance worked out as above will be rounded off to the nearest rupee.

2. The new rates of Dearness Allowance will be as shown in the Annexure. These rates will be in lieu of the existing rates of Dearness Allowance.

3. The Government also direct that the increased rates of Dearness Allowance sanctioned above shall apply to full-time employees who are at present getting Dearness Allowance and paid from contingencies at fixed monthly rates and full-time non-provincialised workcharged establishment. The increased rates of Dearness Allowance sanctioned in this order will not be admissible to part-time Government servants.

4. The increased rates of Dearness Allowance sanctioned in this order will also apply to the teaching and non-teaching staff working under local bodies and in aided teaching institutions. This will be classified as Additional Dearness Allowance in respect of the employees governed by University Grants Commission Scales of Pay.

5. The expenditure should be debited to the sub-detailed head of account "Dearness Allowance" under the detailed head "Salaries" under the relevant minor, sub-major and major heads of account.

6. The Treasury Officers are requested to make payment of the revised rates of Dearness Allowance when bills are presented without waiting for the authorisation from the Accountant-General.

7. Funds will be provided by re-appropriation in the Final Modified Appropriation for 1985-86. The Heads of Departments are requested to take this expenditure into account while sending Final Modified Appropriation for 1985-86.

3. During the review of the stock work orders in the Regional Chief Engineer's Meeting on 13—2—1986, the Chairman has taken a serious view of the failure on the part of the system/circles to adhere to the target dates fixed and Chairman has observed that all the pending work orders issued prior to 31—3—1983 should be closed forthwith since the target date has already lapsed. 4. The Superintending Engineers/System/Circles are requested to ensure that all the stock work orders issued prior to 31—3—1983 are closed forthwith and report on the progress of clearance of stock work orders are sent to this office immediately so that the progress could be reported at the next Review Meeting.

5. In regard to Stock Work Orders issued after 31—3—1983 and upto 31—3—1984, the Work Orders should be closed before 31—5—1986 and for the work orders issued upto 31—3—1985 should be closed before 30—6—1986.

6. Since the progress of Stock Work Orders closing will be reviewed in the next Regional Chief Engineer's meeting also it should be ensured that the target dates fixed above are kept up and the monthly progress of clearance of Stock Work Orders indicating the yearwise clearance are sent to this office on **10th of succeeding month**.

7. It has been repeatedly pointed out that the review and closure of Stock Work Orders cannot be allowed to go into arrears as it involves the review of accounts rendered by field officers for the large quantities of materials drawn for manufacture of R. The following amendment is issued to the B.P. cited.

AMENDMENT

For the existing para 3 of the B.P. the following shall be substituted :

"The question of enhancing the ceiling on the grant of House Building Advance to the employees of the Board has also been considered by the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board in the context of increased cost of construction. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board after consideration directs that the ceiling from 60 months pay plus Dearness Allowance be enhanced to 75 months of pay including officiating pay (except officiating pay drawn in a leave vacancy) dearness allowance and personal pay where admissible subject to the maximum ceiling limit and will be recoverable from the salary of the Board employee during his/her service period itself at the rate not less than 40% of his/her pay and Death-Cum-Retirement Gratuity which he/she can surrender towards the repayment of the advance. In case of Board employees having 20 years service, the recovery of the advance shall be made in not more than 180 monthly instalments, and then interest shall be recovered in not more than 60 monthly instalments. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board also directs that the maximum ceiling limit on the grant of House Building Advance to Board Employees be correspondingly enhanced as follows :—

- (i) Partly for purchase of land and partly for construction of house thereon or for the construction of a house or for the purchase of ready built house/flat Rs. 1,75,000 and
- (ii) For enlargement/improvement of living accommodation Rs. 75,000/-.

Proceedings :

Consequent on the revision of scales of pay to the employees of the Board with effect from 1—12—1984 ordered in the B. Ps. 3rd and 4th cited, the question of reclassification of employees into various Grades for the purpose of Travelling Allowance and also revision of rates of Daily Allowance, Mileage Allowance, terminal charges etc. have been examined. After careful consideration, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board passes the following orders :

I. Classification of employees of the Board for purpose of Travelling Allowance claim :

The classification of the employees of the Board for the purpose of determining Travelling Allowance shall be revised as indicated below :—

- Grade— I** Employees drawing a basic pay of Rs. 2060/—p. m. and above.
Grade—II : Employees drawing a basic pay of Rs. 995/—and above but below Rs. 2060/—p. m.
Grade—III : Employees drawing a basic pay of Rs. 660/—and above but below Rs. 995/—p. m.
Grade—IV : Employees drawing a basic pay below Rs. 660/—p. m.

II. Daily Allowance :

(i) The normal rates of daily allowance applicable to the employees of the Board shall be as indicated below :

Grade	Normal rate of D. A.
Employees in Grade—I	Rs. 22/—
Employees in Grade—II	Rs. 15/—
Employees in Grade—III	Rs. 10/—
Employees in Grade—IV	Rs. 8/—

(ii) Double the rates of daily allowance shall be allowed for stay in **Madras City**.

III. Eligibility for journey by air or rail or a regular public motor service :

Board employees will be permitted the class of journey by air/by rail as indicated below :

Grade—I

- (a) Employees drawing a basic pay of Rs. 3000/— and above and Accounts Member, Secretary and Inspector General of Police (Vigilance). Air or Air-conditioned First Class or first class by rail irrespective of whether the journey is within or outside the State.
- (b) Others i.e. employees drawing a basic pay of Rs. 2060/—and above but below Rs. 3000/—

(i) First Class by rail for journey within or outside the State.

(ii) **By Air**: For journey outside the State with the prior permission of Chairman/Tamil Nadu Electricity Board.

Note: Employees in Class I and II alone are eligible for travel by air.

Grade—II: First Class by rail.

Grade—III & IV: Second class by rail

Note: (1) When the travel is by night, the employees of Grade—III & IV will be permitted to travel by second class with sleeper berth.

Note: (2) The cost of reservation and sleeper accommodation will also be included in the journey expenses. The claim will be preferred in the Travelling Allowance bill itself.

IV. Mileage Allowance :

The revised rates of mileage allowance for travel by Motor car and Motor cycle/Scooter/Moped etc. shall be as below :—

Motor Car :

For the first 100 Kms.	...	Rs. 1.50 per K. M. //
For the next 100 Kms.	...	Rs. 1.30 //
For the remaining distance.	...	Rs. 1.20 //

Motor Cycle/Scooter/Moped etc. :

The limit for this allowance for journeys not involving change of camp or from headquarters and back to headquarters on the same day shall be subject to a maximum limit of Rs. 120/- for Motor Car and Rs. 60/- for Motor Cycle/Scooter/Moped etc.

The lump sum grant payable under Transfer Travelling Allowance shall be as indicated below

Circular Memorandum No. 6195—E2/86—1 (Secretariat Branch), dated the 28th February, 1986.

Sub : LOANS AND ADVANCES—House building advance—Clarification regarding revision of plan and estimate for the purpose of availing the advance—Further clarifications—Issued.

- Ref : 1. Board's Circular Memo. No. 105098—N1/83—2, dated 18—12—84.
2. Board's Circular Memo. No. 7653—N1/85—2, dated 30—5—85.

According to Board's House Building Advance Rules, application for construction of a house should be accompanied by an approved plan and detailed estimate, and the amount of advance shall be determined with reference to the same, subject to individual's eligibility. The construction of the house shall be carried out as per the plan and estimate. Instructions have also been issued that the estimate submitted with the plan should be the basis for sanction of advances, and revised estimates subsequently submitted and enhancement of loan based on that should not be accepted; since there is already provision under Rule 4(a) of House Building Advance Rules for sanction of additional advance to complete the house as per original plan in view of increase in the cost of materials and labour. The loanee employees are however permitted to make deviations in construction as per B. P. Ms. No. 656 dated 9—12—80 duly intimating the sanctioning authorities. Prior concurrence of the sanctioning authority is not to be insisted for such deviations.

2. Now requests from certain employees have been received for permitting them to avail the advance on the basis of revised plan and estimates **reducing the plinth area** of construction already proposed, as they are not able to proceed with the construction as per original plan submitted with their application, in view of the increase of cost of materials and labour during the period between the date of application and sanction of loan.

3. After a detailed examination of the matter in the light of the orders already issued in B. P. Ms. No. 656, dt. 8—12—80 and the further clarifications issued in item (IV) of Board's Memorandum first cited, the following instructions are issued :—

- I. An employee who has already been sanctioned House Building Advance may be unable to complete the construction as per original plan due to escalation of cost of materials and labour. But he may desire to complete the house as per original plan. In such case additional advance shall be sanctioned subject to eligibility and as provided under Rule 4(a) of House Building Advance Rules. The amount of additional advance shall be the amount arrived as per Rule 4(a) or the amount recommended by the Executive Engineer/Civil whichever is **less**.
- II. (a) On the other hand a loanee employee/the applicant may desire and prefer to make deviations from the original plan for construction, in the circumstances such as the following :—
 - (i) Where a part of the advance has already been drawn (and there is increase in the cost of construction in the mean-while) but the loanee desires to complete the construction with the amount of advance **already sanctioned**.
 - (ii) Where a loanee employee who proposed to meet a part of the cost of construction from sources other than House Building Advance due to lesser eligibility, is subsequently unable to raise the amounts from the proposed sources. The loanee therefore desires to complete the house with the House Building Advance for which he is eligible.

- (iii) Where the period from the date of registering the application in the priority register and the date of sanction is too long and there is increase in the cost of materials and labour. The applicant is therefore not able to construct the house as per original plan with the amount of House Building Advance for which he is eligible.
- (b) In the cases referred to in (a) above the deviations may be permitted, subject to the following conditions:—
- (i) As already provided in B. P. Ms. No. 656, dt. 9—12—80, the prior concurrence of the sanctioning authority need not be insisted upon and it is sufficient if such deviations are reported to the sanctioning authority.
 - (ii) In cases where House Building Advance has already been sanctioned a revised plan shall be obtained and produced to the sanctioning authority if the deviation would be viewed by the local authority as a case requiring regularisation by obtaining a revised plan.
 - (iii) In cases where the House Building Advance has not been sanctioned, the applicant may be permitted to submit a revised estimate and loan sanctioned on the basis of that as per original priority, after observing the provisions in House Building Advance Rules and instructions. A revised plan shall also be obtained and produced to the sanctioning authority if the deviations would be viewed by the Local authority as a case requiring regularisation by obtaining a revised plan.
 - (iv) The deviations or alterations, that could normally be got approved by the Local authority will come under the purview of these instructions.
 - (v) The deviations should be within the specifications relating to the classes of houses indicated under Rule 3(a) of House Building Advance Rules and the period of repayment of advance and interest thereon shall be regulated as shown in the above Rule.
 - (vi) It should also be ensured that the amount of House Building Advance is fully utilised for the purpose for which it is sanctioned.

Sub: **ELECTRICITY—Inspection of L.T. Services—Non-provision of Meter Terminal cover seal and cutout seals.**

During inspection of L.T. Services under all categories by the Anti Power Theft Squad, it has been reported that in a good number of services, the seals for the meter terminal cover and cutouts (in the case of cable services) are not provided. It has also been reported that even while effecting the service connections, the terminal cover seal and cutout seals are not provided. Non provision of seals in the meter terminal cover and cutouts will help the unscrupulous consumer to **thieve energy**. If the terminal cover seal is not provided even if the seal is provided, but proper acknowledgement for having sealed the terminal cover and that the seal is intact is not taken from the consumer responsibility for tampering with the meter connections etc. cannot be fixed on the consumer and prosecution launched against the consumer under section 39 (1) and 44 (c) of Indian Electricity Act 1910.

The Superintending Engineers of O & M Systems are hereby instructed to ensure that whenever a new service is effected or whenever the meter in a consumer's premises is changed, the meter terminal cover is sealed in the presence of the consumer or his representative after verifying the correctness of the meter terminal connections and demonstrating it to the consumer. The details of the sealing plier used should be entered in the meter change slip or register. Specific acknowledgement from the consumer to the effect that the terminal cover has been sealed in his presence and that the seal is intact should be taken from the consumer by the departmental staff who installs/changes the meter and meter change/installation record along with the consumer's acknowledgment should be maintained as a permanent record. A specimen form of meter change slip now used in the Madras Metropolitan area with certain improvements is enclosed for guidance. Specific tick mark should be made in the meter change slip against the items indicated on the lefthand bottom of the change slip.

The above instructions should be specifically brought to the notice of all the Divisional Engineers/O & M and the Divisional Engineers/M. R. T. and the Assistant Divisional Engineers/O & M and the Assistant Divisional Engineer/M.R.T. and responsibility for failure to adhere to the above instructions should be fixed on the officers and staff concerned.

In addition to the above, all the L.T. Power services of 20 HP and above should be arranged to be inspected and terminal cover seals provided wherever seals have not been provided after verifying the meter connections and action initiated against the consumer wherever theft of energy is noticed. A completion report should be sent to the Regional Chief Engineers concerned before 31—3—1986:

The other L.T. Industrial services should be taken up after this and completed within a reasonable period.

The Tamil Nadu Elec'y. Board has amended Clause 21 sub-clause (b) of the Terms and Conditions of Supply in B.P. Ms. (F.B.) No. 112, (Adm.) dt. 31—12—85 approving the formula for determining the **low power factor** and for levying the compensation for such low power factor. Clause 21 (b) (iii) as amended provides that in the event of power-factor going below 0.70 consecutively for 3 months, in addition to the levy of compensation charges at the above rate, the service is liable for disconnection, at the discretion of the Board, after giving due opportunity to the consumer.

It may be confirmed that all the H.T. consumers were duly intimated about the amendment with reference to para 4 of B.P. Ms. No. 556, dt. 1—11—85. However, as a matter of abundant caution, all the H.T. consumers may be informed again in the 'proforma' enclosed about the amended provisions of the Terms and Conditions of Supply and the procedure that would be followed, for disconnecting the service, in the event of the power-factor going below 0.70 consecutively for 3 months and thereafter and the acknowledgement of the consumers obtained.

Sub : Elec'y.—H.T. services—Maintenance of power factor—levy of compensation charges—Reg.

The Tamil-nadu Electricity Board, has amended sub-clause (b) of Clause 21 of Terms and Conditions of Supply in B.P. Ms. (FB) No. 112, (Adm.) dt. 31—12—85 to the following effect :—

- "b (i) The power-factor for the month shall be the ratio of Kwh./KVAh. recorded during the month as defined in Clause 2 (viii). The power-factor shall be calculated upto 2 decimal places. The power-factor of consumer's installation shall not be less than 0.85.
- (ii) Where the tested or recorded or computed power-factor of the installation is less than the stipulated limit of 0.85, a compensation charge at the rate of 1% of the total power supply bill for that month excluding duties and taxes, if any, for every 0.01 reduction in power-factor will be levied.
- (iii) In the event of power-factor going below 0.70 consecutively for 3 months, in addition to the levy of compensation charges at the above rate, the service is liable for disconnection at the discretion of the Board, after giving due opportunity to the consumer".

You were already informed, if the power-factor of any service goes below 0.70 consecutively for 3 months, the service shall be disconnected besides levying compensation charges. The following procedure shall be adopted for disconnection of the services, if the power-factor goes below 0.70:—

- (a) If the power-factor of a service, continues to be less than 0.70 for consecutive two months, a notice will be served on the consumer, informing him that the power-factor should be improved well above 0.70 before the next normal meter reading date, failing which, the service will be disconnected forthwith and that the service will be kept disconnected for a period of one week. If the power-factor is found to be below 0.70 at the end of the third consecutive month, the service shall be kept disconnected for a week and then reconnected.
- (b) If the power-factor of the H.T. service is observed to be still below 0.70, during the next normal meter reading date, the service will again be kept disconnected for fifteen days and then reconnected.
- (c) If the power-factor is found to be still not improved in the subsequent reading on the normal date, the service will be kept disconnected for a period of three months. Only after this period of three months, the additional equipments provided by the consumers for the improvement of power-factor will be examined by the System Superintending Engineer and the service, will be reconnected only if the Superintending Engineer is satisfied that the arrangement for improvement of the power-factor is adequate with reference to Board's Terms and Conditions of Supply.

- (d) If the power-factor of the H.T. service at the time of subsequent normal meter reading is below 0.70, the service shall be kept disconnected for a period of one year, irrespective of the fact whether the power-factor has been improved in the meantime and shall be reconnected only if the System Superintending Engineer is satisfied that the power-factor will be as per the Board's Terms and Conditions of Supply.
- (e) If the power-factor computed is found to be below 0.70 at the time of subsequent normal reading date, the supply shall be permanently disconnected, without prejudice to the rights of the Board to claim the minimum charges, payable as per the Terms and Conditions of supply.
- (f) It is to be noted, that at the time of every reconnection, the consumer should be served with a notice stating that if the power-factor is not improved to the stipulated level before the next normal reading date, the service will be kept disconnected for the periods as mentioned in (b) to (e) above.

The above procedure shall be subject to modification from time to time.

Sub : Procuring and use of consumables by O & M Divisions—Instructions issued.

1. During the course of Technical Examination of few Purchase Orders placed by the Divisions of O & M Systems, the following major defects have been observed :
 - (a) Two purchase orders have been placed on the same material on the same day.
 - (b) The consumables drawn by the Field Section Officer have not been accounted properly. Placing more than one Purchase Order for the same material on the same day is a serious defect and exhibits total lack of procedures and adoption of rules by the Officers placing the Purchase Order.
2. Instructions were already issued from Technical Audit that not more than two Purchase Orders should be issued for the same material **during a month** vide Techl. Audit Memo. No. TM/TA/ETAM/F. 112/D. 78 (Technical Audit) dated 18-5-83, Instruction No. 1 (Vol. II No. 3 of TNEB Gazette).
3. The consumables drawn from the Stores should be fully accounted for in the consumables register **without any omission**. The inspecting officials should often check the consumables register to see whether the issues have been properly made. Frequent issue to a particular location will require investigation.

All the Officers of the O&M Systems are instructed to bear this in mind and avoid the recurrence of defects pointed above.

Sub : Electricity—Agricultural Tariff—Application of Agricultural tariff for crushing of sugarcane—clarifications—issued.

It is represented by Agricultural consumers that certain Operation and Maintenance Systems are insisting on availing temporary supply under L.T. Tariff—IV for carrying out sugarcane crushing in their field.

2. As per Para 159 (a) of Tamilnadu Electricity Board Manual, power supplied and service given for the purpose of mowing, threshing and sugarcane crushing is charged under Agricultural tariff, provided :

- (i) they are not on industrial scale ;
- (ii) the consumer's Own Occupation is agricultural ; and
- (iii) the Operations are carried out in the land or the premises of the consumer.

3. The Agricultural consumers should be permitted to use their Agricultural service for sugarcane crushing without any extra charge, subject to the conditions mentioned above. No temporary supply under L.T. Tariff—IV should be insisted upon from the Agricultural consumers for carrying on the sugarcane crushing operations if the conditions mentioned above are satisfied.

Clause 22 (c) of the Terms and Conditions of Supply of the Tamilnadu Electricity Board has been amended whereby the H.T. consumers should pay for the actual recorded demand or 75% of the sanctioned demand, whichever is higher.

In view of the revised billing procedure, the H.T. consumers have been permitted to apply for and obtain reduction of demand to the extent necessary.

2. As per Clause 36 (d) of the Terms and Conditions of supply, the consumer with a connected load of 75 H.P. (which has now been increased to 130 H.P.) should avail H.T. supply.

3. A point has been raised whether any minimum demand should be fixed while considering the request for reduction in demand.

The consumer has the liberty to avail H.T. or L.T. service to ensure reliability of supply and they can also manage to work the loads exceeding 130 H.P. with the demand required to be sanctioned by making their own operational arrangements. As such, it is considered no minimum demand need be prescribed for availing H.T. supply. The Superintending Engineers of O & M Systems should take action accordingly.

Sub : Distribution Transformers—Preventive measures—Reg.

The Committee on Public Undertakings (1985—86) (Eighth Assembly) in the fourth report has observed that the failure of distribution transformers had progressively increased from 8.5 percent during 1977—78 to 10.9 percent during 1979—80 and recommended that the effective steps should be taken to bring down the failure rate within reasonable level by enforcing proper maintenance and improving the system.

In this connection, it is to be stated that the schedule of maintenance for distribution transformers has already been given in the Appendix-3 of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board's Code of Technical Instructions.

If it is strictly adhered, the failure rate may be brought down to the appreciable level. The following were some of the common lapses noticed during inspection of the various systems.

- (a) Oil level not being maintained at required level.
- (b) Non-checking of earth connections and non-maintenance of proper earth value.
- (c) Lack of rigid connections on the LT side and non-changing the LT cables which were found to be worn out.
- (d) Non-meggering of lightning arresters as per the schedule.

The Regional Chief Engineers and System Superintending Engineers are requested to ensure that the maintenance works on distribution transformers are carried out as per the above schedule of maintenance and bring down the rate of failure of distribution transformers within a reasonable level. Sufficient transformers have also now been ordered and supplies against these orders have already been commenced. All the overloaded transformers may be arranged to be brought to normal condition either by replacing these transformers with higher capacity transformers or by erecting additional transformers and transferring loads.

Specifications for distribution transformers have recently been revised stipulating minimum weight for core; winding, oil etc., to improve the quality of transformers.

Regional Chief Engineers and Superintending Engineers are requested to closely watch and study the performance of these transformers conforming to the revised specifications and send periodical reports to this Office with their suggestions, if any, for revising the specification to further improve the quality of transformers.

The Regional Chief Engineers and the system Superintending Engineers are requested to acknowledge receipt of this memo and confirm action taken in this regard.

Sub : Computer Centre — Computerised Load Monitoring system — Instructions Issued —Reg.

1. It has been decided to introduce Computerised Load Monitoring system for Tamil Nadu Electricity Board as a whole. Accordingly, initial study has been done at the Headquarters and suitable input and output formats required for the same have been finalised.

2. The load monitoring and interruption analysis package developed using off-line data on ECIL make SUPER—16 Computer is aimed at, to generate reports on Generation, Transmission and Distribution of Power to monitor the load effectively.

3. The power generation module produces daily/monthly and annual reports regarding power generation demand, targets, Load and frequency, generating units under shut down, etc.

4. The power transmission and distribution module displays daily/monthly reports for load shedding on HT and EHT feeders, break-down of HT and EHT feeders, load details (i.e. MW, MVAR and MVA) sub-station wise and bus wise, capacity utilisation of static capacitors / synchronous condensers, breakdown of equipments and non-reporters statements.

In addition to the above, the outputs will facilitate study on

1. Load forecasting
2. Necessity for establishment of New S. S.
3. Locations where shunt capacitors/synchronous condensers are to be installed.
4. Low Voltage packets.
5. Quantum of Loads shed.
6. Interruption of power supply

5. For getting the various informations as above, a set of input as listed below have been designed, indicating the due dates for sending the input information.

The date from which the above computerised system would be introduced and the codifications will be intimated later. In the meantime the concerned may be asked to familiarise themselves with the system.

The following Notification shall be published in an extra ordinary issue of Tamil Nadu Government Gazette dated 15-2-86.

NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 3 of the Tamil Nadu Essential Articles Control and Requisitioning Act, 1949 (Tamil Nadu Act XXIX of 1949) and in supersession of all other amendments to G.O. (Ms.) No. 1111 Public Works dated 24-7-76, the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby makes the following amendments to the Tamil Nadu Restriction on Consumption of Electricity Order, 1976, as issued in G.O. (Ms) No. 1111 Public Works dt. 24-7-76.

The amendments shall come into force from 15-2-86.

AMENDMENTS

In the said order,

I. In clause 6, the following shall be inserted as sub clause (vi) and the existing sub clause (vi) renumbered as (vii)

“(iv) In respect of Tea Industries and Salt Industries, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board may, on application fix a higher quota during the season and the quota for the rest of the period ending 30-6-86 be reduced correspondingly”.

II. In clause 7, the following shall be inserted as sub clauses (v) and (vi) and the existing sub clauses (v) to (vii) renumbered as (vii) to (ix) respectively.

“(v) On specific request from H.T. consumers, additional energy quota in a particular month will be sanctioned by the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board subject to corresponding reduction in the quota for the subsequent month or months upto 30-6-86. Prior sanction should be obtained from the Board before the quota already fixed is exceeded for such additional quotas.”

“(vi) H.T. consumers will also be permitted to surrender in advance their energy quota not required by them in a particular month and utilise the energy quota so surrendered in the subsequent month or months before the end of June 1986, provided that intimations of such surrenders are filed before the Chairman, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board before the 15th of the month to which the quota relates.”

Circular Memo. No. 189/Adm. Br./Tariff—1 (4)/85-1, dt. 21-2-86.

Sub : Electricity—Energisation of fence—Prosecution under Indian Electricity Act and Indian Penal Code—Instructions issued.

Electrical energisation of fence to prevent entry of cattle and to prevent theft of agricultural products are reported to be taking place in certain areas in the State. This is an offence under the Indian Electricity Act, 1910, and any individual who energises fence by directly tapping from the Board's overhead mains (unmetered source) is punishable under sections 39 (1), (whoever dishonestly abstracts,

consumes or uses any energy), Section 40, (whoever maliciously causes energy to be wasted or diverted, or, with intent to cut off the supply of energy, cuts or injures, or attempts to cut or injure, any electric supply line or works), Section 46, (whoever negligently causes energy to be wasted or diverted) and Section 44 (d), (Improperly uses the energy of a Licensee) of the above Act. The above action is also punishable under IPC 336 read with the above sections of the Indian Electricity Act.

IPC 336 :

"Act endangering life or personal safety of others"—whoever does any act so rashly or negligently as to endanger human life or the personal safety of others, shall be punished with imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to six months or with fine which may extend to five hundred rupees, or with both". The offences under Sections 39 and 44 of I.E. Act 1910 have since been made cognizable enabling the Police Officer to arrest the accused without a warrant."

2. The Superintending Engineers of Operation and Maintenance System are instructed to deal with "Energisation of fence" cases on the above lines.

Sub: Lands/Buildings belonging to the Board—Maintenance of records by S.Es.

It is seen that Registers for both buildings and lands belonging to the Board are not maintained. Instances have come to light of encroachments on Board's property by private parties and of such encroachments remaining without action for long periods. This is due to non-inspection of sites by Board's officials periodically and non-maintenance of relevant records. Such gross neglect of Board's interests by the officers concerned will be taken serious note of in the future.

2. All S. Es. of Systems, Generation Circles and TLC and Projects are instructed to strictly ensure that Registers pertaining to Board's building/lands are maintained by the A.Es./J.Es. Civil in the Office of the respective Systems/Circles in the proforma enclosed. The concerned AEE/ADE will inspect all the lands and buildings in his jurisdiction **once a month** and review the Registers. The report of inspection and review so made should be intimated to the concerned DE/EE, SE and Chief Engineers.

3. Whenever encroachments are noticed, the AE/JE should report such cases to the concerned AEE/ADE, with copy marked to the concerned S.Es. and Regional C.Es. immediately. It will be the personal responsibility of the concerned officers to see that prompt action is taken to remove the encroachment. The EE/Civil of the concerned RCE will review the Registers once in 3 months. The Registers should be reviewed by S.Es. once in six months and by C.Es. once in a year.

4. All C.Es. concerned will prescribe suitable periodicals to keep a watch over compliance with the above instructions.

5. The extract of the Register should be sent to CE/Civil Designs who will maintain a Central Register at Headquarters. The review report of S.Es. and C.Es. should also be marked to CE/Civil Designs.

Sub. Elec'y.—Coimbatore Elec'y. System/South—SC. No. 289, Nehru Nagar—Recovery of arrears under R.R. Act.

Ref : From the S.E. (South) Lr. RSG/BSG/F. Arrears/RR Act/HQ, 511/85. dated 12—12—85.

The question of recovery of arrears under R.R. Act in respect of D.T.SC. No. 289, Nehru Nagar has been examined in consultation with the Legal Cell of the Board. The views of the Board is reproduced below :—

"The two suits O.S. No. 142/67 and 279/71, were decreed in favour of the Board. The third suit in O.S. No. 95/74 was dismissed for default of the plaintiff Board. First two decrees were not executed within the period of limitation (ie.) within 12 years from the date of decree. Now the point for consideration is whether the amounts decreed and the amount due/under dismissed suit may be recovered under Tamil Nadu Electricity Board (Recovery of Dues) Act, 1978. It is stated that notices under Section 3 & 4 of the said Act have been issued on the debtor consumer. The position as set-out in paras 10, 13 and 14 of your letter is correct. Hence further proceedings for distraining properties of the debtor, may be taken, after a lapse of three months from the date of issue of notice under Section 4 of the Act."

The receipt of the reference may be acknowledged and the report on the matter may be sent early.

Sub: Recovery of dues under R. R. Act SC 289/Nehru Nagar claim disputed by the party—Legal Opinion—Requested.

1. The Service No. 289/Nehru Nagar was effected on 14-1-63 in the name of one Thiru A. Natarajan Under Tariff IV with Special guarantee of Re. 50/- per H.P. per year. The sanctioned load is 3 H.P. but the actual connected load is 1 H.P. only.

2. The service was disconnected on 23-1-64 for non payment of c.c. charges.

3. A Civil Suit was filed in O. S. 142 of 1967 for the recovery of C. C. arrears and A.M. charges upto 66-67 amounting to Rs. 556.48 and the same was decreed in favour of Board on 31-3-67.

4. A Second Suit was also filed in O. S. 279/71 for the recovery of A.M. charges from 14-1-67 to 13-1-70 (Three years) for Rs. 507/- and decreed in favour of the Board on 26-6-71.

5. A Third Suit filed for Rs. 495/- in O. S. 95/74 for the recovery of A.M. charges from 14-1-70 to 13-1-73 was dismissed on 23-7-74 for default of the Govt. Pleader to be present in the court proceedings.

6. After the enactment of R. D. Act 29/78 in 1978, action was taken to recover the above decreed amounts and accordingly notice under Section 3(1) and 4 were issued to the party for the recovery of Rs. 3115.65 being the total of three Suit amounts plus cost of suits and interest thereon for delay in payment.

7. The party disputed the claim through a lawyer. The lawyer's notice dt. 9-8-85 questions the validity of our claim under limitation Act of Civil Proceedings. The above notice was relied on 30-8-85 stating that the question of limitation does not arise in the case of Electricity charges, as the recovery is made under the T.N.E.B. R.D. Act, 1978.

8. This was not accepted by the lawyer and he, in his reply notice, dated 10-9-85, has stated that under Article 136 of limitation Act, our claim cannot be enforced.

9. The copies of lawyer's notice dt. 9-8-85 and 10-9-85 and reply notice dt. 30-8-85 given to the lawyer are sent herewith for favour of perusal.

10. I am of the opinion that the question of limitation Act applies only when the decree holder is to execute the decree through a court of law. Since action is instituted under the T.N.E.B. R.D. Act 1978, the Board can initiate distraint proceedings in respect of first two decrees. The notice of the lawyer dt. 10-9-85 that "decree of the court should be executed within 12 years under Articles 136 of Limitation Act etc" is untenable because the recovery proceedings are not initiated through court, but under R.D. Act.

11. In respect of the Third Suit No. SC 95/74 for Rs. 495/- also action under R.R. Act can be taken as the suit was dismissed only because the Govt. Pleader was not present and not because of the court rejecting the claim of the T.N.E.B.

12. Section 6 of the T.N.E.B. (R.D.) Act of 1978 clearly spells out that the dues of the T.N.E.B. shall without prejudice to any other mode of recovery be recoverable as an arrear of land revenue notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any other law or instrument or agreement and this Act has received the assent of the President of India on 13-6-78.

13. Therefore, the law of limitation has no relevance to the recovery of dues under T.N.E.B. (R.D.) Act and R.R. Act:

14. The Board (Legal Cell) in its memo. No. 10376-L C2/80-1, dt. 27-4-80 has clarified that the dues of the T.N.E.B. which have become time barred and cannot be recovered by filing Civil Suits may be recovered under the provisions of the T.N.E.B. (R.D.) Act irrespective of the fact whether the amount due because time barred prior to or after the coming into force of the T.N.E.B. (R.D.) Act of 1978.

15. These points were referred to the Special Officer (R.R.) T.N.E.B. to which he has suggested in his letter dt. 16-11-85 (copy enclosed) to refer to Legal Cell for instructions.

16. In the circumstances, I request that the matter may kindly be arranged to be examined and referred to Legal Cell for valuable Legal Opinion as to whether distraint proceedings can be instituted in all the above three cases under the R.D. Act 1978 after sending a reply to the Lawyer's Notice dt. 10-9-85.

Early action is requested.
