VI. Training :

The following special training programmes were conducted during October '89 :

1. Two days training programme on Uniform Commercial Accounting System conducted from 16-10-89 to 17-10-89 and 23-10-89 to 24-10-89 by Hydro Training Institute/Athikadavu and from 20-10-89 to 21-10-89 by Transmission and Sub-station Training Institute/Madurai.

2. One Assistant Executive Engineer/Electrical from Tuticorin Thermal Power Station deputed to attend the "Advanced Control and Instrumentation" Course in United Kingdom under Colombo Plan from 23-10-89 to 20-4-90.

VII. Movement of persons in critical condition by Car or Taxi - Permitted :

In Circular Memo. No. 112250/J.R. 4(3)/89-1, dated 7-10-89, the Chief Engineers/Superintending Engineers have been given discretion to move the employee who met with an accident to the hospital either by Board's vehicle if readily available or by private car or taxi at Board's cost.

VIII. Action Plan in key areas for the development of Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe colonies :

In Circular Memo. No. SE/RE & I (D)/RE 2/E/D. 108/89, dated 16-10-89, detailed instructions have been issued in regard to implementation of Action Plan in key areas for the development of Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe colonies. Based on the above, revised target for street lights and bus services have also been issued apportioning the target between the Action Plan and the normal programme.

IX. Payment of bonus and ex-gratia to the employees of the Board for 1988-89 :

In Per. B.P. (FB) No. 69 (Sectt. Branch), dt. 17-10-89, orders have been issued for the payment of bonus to the employees of the Board for the accounting year 1988-89 calculated at the rate of 8.33% of the yearly salary or wage earned by them during the said accounting period or Rs. 100/- whichever is higher subject to provisions of the payment of Bonus Act, 1965 as amended upto date. The Board has also directed payment of ex-gratia to the employees entitled to get bonus at the rate of 4.17% of the salary or wage earned during the accounting year 1988-89 or Rs. 500/- whichever is higher.

X. Reduction of the lumpsum payment of Rs. 75/- to Rs. 50/- for agricultural services with a contracted load of 5 HP and below :

In G. O. Ms. No. 2063 (PWD) dt. 29-10-89, Government have reduced the lumpsum payment in respect of agricultural services of Rs. 75/- per HP of the contracted load per annum to Rs. 50/- per H.P. per annum for a contracted load upto and inclusive of 5 HP. There is no change in the lumpsum payment of Rs. 75/- per HP per annum in respect of agricultural service with contracted load above 5 HP.

XI. Concession granted in regard to recovery of arrears—Waiver of Belated Payment Surcharge—Extension of date :

Based on the Government orders, in Circular Memo. No. X/CFC(R)/Agrl/BPSC/237/86-25, dt. 28-10-89, the time limit for payment of arrears of C.C. charges by (1) agricultural consumers who are still paying the arrears under 1+1 formula if they clear the balance amount of arrears of C.C. charges either in one lumpsum or in instalments (2) agricultural consumers in the non paying area (resistance area) if they clear the entire arrears of C.C. charges due prior to 1-4-79 and also arrears arising after 1-4-79 either in one lumpsum or in instalments has been extended from 30-9-89 to 31-12-89.

XII. Energisation of on line/one pole extension of agricultural pumpsets—Enhancement from 10,000 to 20,000 Nos.

In Circular Memo. No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE 2/D. 227/89, dt. 25-10-89, the target for energisation of on line/one pole extension of agricultural pumpsets during 1989-90 has been increased from 10,000 to 20,000 out of the total target of 40,000 pumpsets fixed for the year 1989-90. The target under this scheme will be restricted to 50% of the target fixed for the divisions. If there are not enough applications in the division to achieve the target of 50% limit, the Superintending Engineers may reappropriate the target of 50% among other divisions and Circle target of 50% should be kept up. The date of expiry of the 45 days' notices should be 31-1-90 so that all the ready cases are effected service connections on or before 31-3-90.

XIII. Generation of power from private windmills—Parallel operation with Board's grid—Guidelines:

In Per. B.P. (Ch) No. 199 (Tech. Branch), dt. 12-10-89, detailed instructions have been issued in regard to installation of private windmills and their parallel operation with the Board's grid.

XIV. Maintenance of street lights by Municipalities and Municipal Townships—Continuance for further two months:

In Circular Memo. No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE 2/D. 231/89, dt. 30-10-89, instructions have been issued that the maintenance of street lights by Municipalities/Municipal Townships may continue to be done by the Board upto 31-12-89.

Sub: Disciplinary Proceedings from a Vigilance report—Furnishing of a copy of Inquiry Officer's report to the Director of Vigilance and Anti-Corruption—Revised Instructions—Issued.

Ref: 1. G. O. Ms. No. 2181, Public (Services-B) Department dt. 4—7—74.

In the G. O. cited, orders were issued that in all cases where disciplinary proceedings are started on a report from the Directorate the disciplinary authority should send a copy of the enquiry officer's report to the Directorate of Vigilance and Anti-corruption.

The Director of Vigilance and Anti-Corruption has now suggested that it is desirable that the Director be supplied with a copy of the enquiry officer's report in all departmental proceedings started on a report from the Directorate immediately after the enquiry is over and before any action is initiated on them.

The Government accept the suggestion of the Director of Vigilance and Anti-Corruption and issue the following revised instructions:—

In all cases where disciplinary proceedings are started on a report from the Director of Vigilance and Anti-Corruption the disciplinary authority should send a copy of the enquiry officer's report to the Director of Vigilance and Anti-Corruption immediately after the enquiry is over instead of sending them along with the final orders passed. The disciplinary authority should, however, mark a copy of the final orders passed on them to the Director of Vigilance and Anti-Corruption as already instructed in the reference cited.

Proceedings :

Adopting the G.O. Ms. No. 1108 P&AR dt. 18—12—87, orders have been issued in the B.P. cited, for giving weightage of not exceeding five years to those who retire voluntarily from Board's service, subject to certain conditions specified in the above B.P. The above orders have been given effect from the date of issue of the B.P. viz. 22—6—88.

2. Representations have been received from certain employees who have retired voluntarily after issue of the Government Order mentioned above that the Board's orders may also be given effect to from the date of issue of the Government Order, namely 18—12—87, so that the benefit would be available to such of the employees who retired voluntarily on or after 18—12—87 also on par with Government employees.

3. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board after careful consideration directs in modification of the orders in para 4 of the B.P. cited, that the orders in the said B.P. be given retrospective effect from 18—12—87, viz. the date of the Government Order.

Memorandum No. 65035/C1/87-33 (Secretariat Branch) dated the 5th October, 1989

Sub: Establishment—Tamil Nadu Electricity Board—Revision of scales of pay and allowances to workmen from 1—12—1988—Option to come over to revised scale of pay already exercised by workmen—Revision—permitted.

Ref: (i) (Permanent) B.P. (FB) No. 57 (SB) dt. 5—8—89.
(ii) (Permanent) B.P. (Ch) No. 255 (SB) dt. 18—9—89.

The revised scales of Pay and allowances ordered in B. P. cited came into force from 1st December, 1988. Under Regulation 7(1) of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Revised Scales of Pay (Workmen) Regulations 1989, an employee may exercise option to remain in the existing scale of pay until the date on which he earns his next increment in the existing scale of pay, within the specified time limit of 4 months. He may also exercise option to come over to the revised scale of pay on getting promotion/on moving to Selection grade during the period between 1st December, 1988 and 31st July, 1989. The option once exercised shall be final. A format for exercising the option was also given in Appendix II to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Revised Scales of Pay (Workmen) Regulations 1989.

2. By virtue of the provision in Regulation 5(i) of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Revised Scales of Pay (Workmen) Regulations, 1989, in the case of an employee, who had drawn an increment in the existing scale on 1st October, 1988, pay fixation in the revised scale may be made on 1-12-88 taking into account his present emoluments as on 30—11—1988 and an increment in the revised scale may be given on 1—12—88 itself, if he opts for such an arrangement. The option format in the workmen wage revision order does not specifically provide for coming over to the revised scale of pay on 1st December, 1988 taking into account the pay as on 30th September, 1988, as provided in the option format given in the Officer's Wage Revision order.

3. It is represented that some Workmen have given the option as per the format in the Workmen Wage Revision Order without noticing the provision in Regulation 5(i) of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Revised Scales of pay (Workmen) Regulations, 1989, even though pay fixation on 1—12—1988, taking into account the pay as on 30—9—88, is advantageous to them and hence a chance should be given to such persons to exercise a revised option.

4. The representation mentioned in para 3 above has been considered. The request is reasonable. It is therefore hereby ordered that the workmen who had drawn an increment in the existing scale of pay on 1st October, 1988 and who had already exercised option to come over to the Revised scale of pay on 1st December, 1988 will be permitted to exercise a revised option to come over to the Revised scale of pay on 1st December, 1988 taking into account his pay as on 30—9—88 for pay fixation, if they so desire. This option should be given in the format in the Annexure. There shall however be no change in the time limit already fixed in the B. P. cited for the receipt of such revised option.

During discussion in Chief Engineers (Distribution) conference held on 21—09—89, it was pointed out that there are vacancies of Accounts Assistants in Revenue Branches and for attending to the works of the vacant seats honorarium is paid. In this connection, the attention of the Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles is invited to this office Memorandum (2) cited, wherein clear instructions were issued with regard to deployment of surplus Accounts Assistant. Whenever, vacancies arise due to Death, Retirement, Promotion, Transfer etc., excepting leave vacancies exceeding a month in Revenue Branches, it is for the Superintending Engineers to transfer the Assistants in Central Office to Revenue Branches to fill up the vacancies. It is therefore not correct on the part of the Superintending Engineers to keep the posts vacant (other than the leave vacancies) in Revenue Branches and keeping the surplus in Central Office. The Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles are therefore instructed that in future there should not be un-filled vacancies of Accounts Assistant in Revenue Branch except in the case of Accounts Assistant going on leave for more than a month and also for the services in excess over the yardstick. The Superintending Engineers should not create an anomalous situation of keeping surplus Assistants in the Central Office and at the same time having unfilled vacancies in Revenue Branches.

Sub : Leave - Restrictions for grant of long leave to Board employees in Class I and II Service—Clarifications Issued.

Ref : B. P. Ms. (Ch.) No. 211 (SB) dt. 11—7—88.

Orders have been issued in the B. P. cited restricting the grant of long leave to employees in Class I and II Service of the Board (other than probationers and temporary employees) who have not completed five years of regular service/who have completed five years of service, to six months/one year respectively, except that the said limit could be exceeded by Unearned leave on Medical Certificate or Study Leave granted under the relevant regulations. There should be an interval of three years period between two spells of maximum leave so granted. For a probationer or a temporary employee, the leave will be granted with reference to regulation 19 (b) of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Leave Regulations. Here also, there should be an interval of three years between two spells of maximum Leave.

2. Now, after examining certain points raised with reference to the above orders, the following clarifications are issued :—

Points raised

- (1) Whether the interval of three years between two spells of long leave is to be adhered to for the grant of leave even for 5 months, 5½ months and 11 months and 11½ months, as the case may be.
- (2) Whether Extra-ordinary leave on Medical Certificate can be granted without any restriction exceeding one year/six months as in the case of Unearned leave on Medical Certificate and Study Leave.

Clarification issued

- (1) In cases where the maximum period of leave does not exceed one year/six months, as the case may be, the interval of three years period between two spells of leave need not be insisted upon. The same principle applies to probationers and temporary employees.
- (2) The maximum period of leave of one year/six months could be exceeded for any leave on medical grounds, subject to the condition that all rules and the procedures/instructions relating to the sanction of Unearned Leave on Medical Certificate/Extra - ordinary Leave on Medical Certificate regarding reference to Medical Board etc. are followed scrupulously.

Sub : Recovery of dues from the employees Salary—Instructions—Issued.

It has been brought to the notice that certain employees of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board have purchased two wheelers on hire purchase basis through the private Financiers based on the undertaking given by the pay drawing officers to effect recoveries from the salary who are not competent to issue such undertaking without specific approval of the competent authority. The monthly instalment amounts recovered in such cases are being remitted by the Officers concerned to the financiers. However, it has been informed that there are huge amounts still outstanding and the loanee employees have defaulted in repayment of their dues to the financiers inspite of repeated demands. The pay drawing officers who have issued the undertakings may also likely to be liable for legal action by the financiers for the failure to implement the undertaking.

The Officers of the Board are informed that the recoveries from the employees' salary i.e. for credit purchase from Co-optex, Khadi, loan raised from the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board employees Co-operative Thrift and Credit Societies and any other advances or dues specifically authorised by Board shall alone be entertained and recoveries effected.

The request for recoveries in the case of hire purchase of Two wheelers etc, through private financiers should not be entertained in Tamil Nadu Electricity Board unless otherwise it is specifically authorised by the Board and any lapse to carry out the above instructions will be viewed seriously.

According to Regulation 4(2) of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Revised Scales of Pay (Workmen) Regulations, 1989, the pay of an employee appointed or promoted to a post on or after 1st December, 1988 should be fixed in the manner specified therein. It has been specified inter-alia that if an employee was appointed to the service in the Board for the first time on or after

1st December, 1988 and before the 31st July, 1989, his emoluments on the date of joining comprising the basic pay and Dearness Allowance at 608 points on the date of his joining service shall constitute the emoluments and the revised pay shall be fixed as per Regulation 4 with effect from the date of his joining service.

2. Doubts have arisen with regard to fixation of pay of the employees appointed to the Board's service for the first time after 1st December, 1988. It is hereby clarified that all benefits contemplated in Regulation 4 viz. allowing minimum benefit of Rs. 175, ensuring of Rs. 200/- between the existing pay and Dearness Allowance and new pay and Dearness Allowance will be admissible to such persons. For example, a Helper appointed between 1-12-88 and 31-7-89 drawing the pre-revised pay of Rs. 510/- will get his pay fixed at Rs. 975/- as per fixation Table No. 1 in Annexure IV to the B.P. cited.

In the Government Order first read above, orders were issued sanctioning revised Dearness Allowance to the State Government employees as detailed below :-

(i) Employees in 'A', 'B', 'C', and 'D' Groups were sanctioned the revised Dearness Allowance from 1st January 1989 at the following rates :-

For pay upto Rs. 3,500	—	—	29 per cent of pay
For pay above Rs. 3,500 and upto Rs. 6000	—	—	22 per cent of pay subject to a minimum of Rs. 1,015 per mensem.

(ii) For the purpose of pay, the basic pay (including personal pay) shall be taken into account and the revised Dearness Allowance shall be rounded to the nearest Rupee.

2. The Government of India have now sanctioned revised rates of Dearness Allowance to their employees in Groups A, B, C, and D, with effect from 1st July 1989. Following the orders issued in Government Orders read above, the Government sanction the revised Dearness Allowance to the State Government employees with effect from 1st July 1989 as detailed below :-

For employees in Groups 'A', 'B', 'C' and 'D'.

Pay Range	Revised Dearness Allowance
Upto Rs. 3,500 	34 per cent of pay
Above Rs. 3,500 and upto Rs. 6,000 	25 per cent of pay subject to a minimum of Rs. 1,190 per mensem.

3. For the purpose of calculation of revised Dearness Allowance, the basic pay including personal pay, if any shall be taken into account. The details of admissibility of the revised Dearness Allowance for employees in Groups A, B, C, and D are given in Annexure. In cases, where the pay plus Personal pay of Government Servants fall between the two pay ranges indicated in Column I in the Annexure to this order, the revised Dearness Allowance shall be worked out at the percentage rates.

4. Government also direct that the revised Dearness Allowance sanctioned above shall apply to full-time employees who are at present getting Dearness Allowance and paid from contingencies at fixed monthly rates and full-time non-provincialised work-charged establishment. The revised Dearness Allowance sanctioned in this order will not be admissible to part-time Government servants.

5. The revised Dearness Allowance sanctioned in this order will also apply to the teaching and non-teaching staff working under local bodies and in aided teaching institutions.

6. The difference between the Dearness Allowance already drawn from July, 1989 and the revised Dearness Allowance now sanctioned shall be drawn as arrears.

7. The expenditure should be debited to the sub-detailed head of account "Dearness Allowance" under the detailed head "Salaries" under the relevant minor, sub-major and major heads of account.

8. The Treasury Officers are requested to make payment of the revised Dearness Allowance when bills are presented without waiting for the authorisation from the Accountant-General.

9. Funds will be provided in the Revised Estimate/Final Modified Appropriation, 1989-90. The Heads of Departments are requested to take this expenditure into account while sending proposals for Revised Estimate and Final Modified Appropriation, 1989-90.

The quantum of bonus and ex-gratia payable to the employees of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board for the accounting year 1988—89 has been carefully considered. The matter was discussed with the representatives of Unions, who demanded higher bonus and ex-gratia.

2. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board hereby directs that the employees of the Board be paid, for the accounting year 1988—89, a bonus calculated at the rate of 8.33% of the salary or wage earned by them during the said accounting year, or Rs. 100/-, (Rupees one hundred only), whichever is higher, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the Payment of Bonus Act, 1965, as amended upto-date.

3. The employees of the Board (monthly paid and full-time employees paid from contingencies) and also the employees of the State Government, Central Government and others, who had worked on deputation under the Board during the accounting year 1988—89 and drawing a salary or wage not exceeding Rs. 2,500/- p.m. will be eligible for the bonus sanctioned in para 2 above.

4. The Board, with the concurrence of the Government of Tamil Nadu, also directs that the employees of the Board and the deputationists entitled to get bonus with reference to the orders in paras 2 and 3 above shall also be paid ex-gratia at the rate of 4.17% of the salary or wage earned by them during the accounting year 1988—89, or Rs. 500/- (Rupees Five hundred only), whichever is higher.

5. 'Salary or Wage' for the purpose of payment of bonus and ex-gratia will include only the following :—

- (a) Basic Pay/leave salary.
- (b) All classes of special pay (including shorthand and typewriting special pay).
- (c) Personal pay.
- (d) Additional pay for additional charge.
- (e) Additional days wages paid for work on National and festival holiday.
- (f) Dearness allowance.
- (g) Personal compensatory allowance given for protecting loss of pay; and
- (h) Deputation allowance.

The term 'Salary or Wage' will not include over-time pay and allowances and will not include any pay and allowances other than those mentioned from (a) to (h) above. Salary or wage for the leave surrendered by an employee during 1988—89, Personal Compensatory Allowance paid with reference to Board's Memo. No. 48015-R1/85-3 dated 4-1-1986 and Interim Relief sanctioned in B. P. Ms. (Ch.) No. 278 (Sec t. Br.) dt. 13-9-1988 paid to workmen till its absorption in Revised Scales of Pay 1988 should not be taken into account for computation of bonus.

6. The expenditure on the payment of bonus shall be debitable to "Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Funds—Revenue expenses—Account No. 75.501" and the expenditure of the payment of ex-gratia shall be debitable to Account No. 75.502.

7. All employees, who have worked in the establishment for not less than thirty working days in the accounting year 1988—89 are entitled for the payment of bonus and ex-gratia.

8. Where an employee has not worked for all the working days in the accounting year 1988—89 the minimum bonus of Rs. 100/- (Rupees one hundred only), if such bonus is higher than 8.33% of his salary or wage for the days, he has worked in the accounting year 1988—89 and the minimum ex-gratia of Rs. 500/- (Rupees Five hundred only) if such ex-gratia is higher than 4.17% of his salary or wage for the days he has worked in the accounting year 1988—89, shall be proportionately reduced.

9. Where the salary or wage of an employee entitled to bonus/ex-gratia exceeds one thousand and six hundred rupees per mensem, the bonus/ex-gratia payable to such employees should be calculated as if his salary or wage is one thousand and six hundred rupees per mensem.

10. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board also directs that the bonus and ex-gratia payment for the year 1988—89 should be disbursed to all the eligible employees on 24th October, 1989.

The Government in the G.O. cited (1) above imposed power cut on sick High Tension industries covered under clause 6 of R & C order, which were originally exempted from power cut for a period of 3 to 5 years as per the respective sub-clauses of clause 6 of R & C orders.

2. The original concession of exemption from power cut to such H.T. industries was restored from 27-6-89 in G.O. cited (2) above (copy enclosed).

3. The Government in their letter cited (3) above have ordered that the period between 9-5-89 and 26-6-89 when such H.T. industries were subjected to power cut, shall be compensated by way of extending the exemption period suitably.

4. The Superintending Engineers of Electricity Distribution Circles are therefore instructed that the H.T. sick industries which are covered under clause 6 of the R&C order, on expiry of their present exemption period, as applicable as per the respective sub-clauses of clause 6 of R&C orders, may be granted power cut exemption for an additional period equivalent to the extent they were subjected to power cut during the period between 9-5-89 and 26-6-89.

Order :

Consequent on the slight improvement of power position in the State, the Government have decided to withdraw the power cut imposed on High Tension industries, which were originally exempted from power cut for a period of 3 to 5 years from the date of availing High Tension supply, sick High Tension industries and other High Tension industries which were given exemption/relaxation by the Government earlier.

The following notification shall be published in an extra-ordinary issue of Tamil Nadu Government Gazette dated 26—6—89.

Notification

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Tamil Nadu Essential Articles Control and Requisitioning Act, 1949 (Tamil Nadu Act XXIX of 1949), the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby makes the following amendments to the Tamil Nadu Restriction on Consumption of Electricity Order, 1976 as issued in G. O. (Ms) No. 1111, Public Works Department, dated 24—7—76 and as amended subsequently.

The amendment shall come into force with effect from 27—6—89.

Amendment

The following shall be substituted as Clause 6.

- (i) The services of foreign consultates, Embassies, Railways, Traction, News Papers, Weekly, Fortnightly and monthly magazines, Modern Rice Mills of Tamil Nadu Civil Supplies Corporation and Food Corporation of India shall be exempted from cut.
- (i) (a) M/s. Madras Refineries Limited, Manali, Madras shall be exempted from power cut from the 15th December 1986.
- (ii) M/s. B & C Mills Limited, Madras shall be exempted from power cut for 5 years from 11—10—84.
- (ii) (a) M/s. Sri Hari Mills, Coimbatore shall be exempted from power cut for 3 years from the 31st October 1986.
- (iii) All Oxygen Plants will have only 15% cut both on demand and energy.
- (iv) All freezing plants and cold storages of sea food industries will have only 15% cut both on demand and energy.
- (v) The liquid Nitrogen Plant of Tamil Nadu Co-operative Milk Producers Federation Ltd., Salem shall be subjected to only 15% cut both on demand and energy.
- (vi) The Industries located in the Madras Export Processing Zone, Tambaram shall be exempted from power cut.
- (vii) All Roller Flour Mills will have only 15% cut both on demand and energy.
- (viii) In respect of Tea Industries and Salt Industries, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board may on application fix a higher quota during the season and the quota for the rest of the period ending 30—9—89 be reduced correspondingly.
- (ix) Exemptions/relaxations given already in individual cases by the Government will remain unaltered.
- (x) The following co-operative spinning Mills shall be exempted from power cut for a period of three years from 3—3—88.
 1. Kancheepuram Kamatchiamman Co-operative Spinning Mills.
 2. Madurai District Co-operative Spinning Mills.
 3. South Arcot District Co-operative Spinning Mills.
 4. Thanjavur District Co-operative Spinning Mills.
 5. Srivilliputhur Co-operative Spinning Mills A & B Units.
 6. North Arcot District Co-operative Spinning Mills
- (xi) The following High Tension consumers be exempted from power cut for a period of three years from the date of reopening of the mills.
 1. M/s. Tamil Nadu Spinning Mills Ltd., Tiruppur.
 2. M/s. K. G. S. Spinners, Coimbatore and
 3. Akshaya Textiles, Coimbatore.
- (xii) M/s. Somasundaram Super Spinning Mills, Muthanendal shall be exempted from power cut for a period of three years from 5—1—1989.
- (xiii) M/s. Jothi Mills, Coimbatore shall be exempted from power cut for a period of three years from 6—1—1989.

- (xiv) M/s. Dhanalakshmi Mills Ltd., Tiruppur shall be exempted from power cut for a period of three years from 23—9—88.

II. In clause 7, sub clause (1) shall be substituted as follows: For High Tension industries, base consumption will be the average of any three consecutive months advantageous to the consumers between 1—12—83 and 30—6—88 and base demand will be the highest maximum demand in KVA registered in any month during the same period. High Tension industries who have availed supply after 30—6—88 shall be given computed quota at the present level of cut as per powers vested with the Chairman.

III. In clause 7, now sub clauses (viii), (ix), (x) and (xi) shall be introduced:—

- (viii) All New High Tension Industries, save those specified in sub clause (ix) shall be exempted from power cut for a period of three years from the date of availing High Tension supply. High Tension Industries save those specified in sub clause (ix) who have not completed three years from the date of availing High Tension supply shall also be exempted from the power cut till they complete the three years period from the date of availing H. T. supply.
- (ix) All new H. T. industries coming up in the industrial complexes, of SIPCOT at Tuticorin, Manamadurai, Pudukottai, Cuddalore and Gummidipoondi shall be exempted from power cut for a period of five years from the date of availing H. T. supply.
- (x) All new H. T. industries coming up in the industrial complexes of Small Industrial Development Corporation shall be exempted from power cut for a period of five years from the date of availing H. T. supply.
- (xi) All new H. T. Industries coming up in areas notified as industrially backward areas shall be exempted from power cut for a period of five years from the date of availing supply. This concession shall be extended to new units set up by existing entrepreneurs of industrial groups also, provided the new units are located in notified backward areas, different from those of the existing units.
 “Existing H. T. Industries in areas notified in industrially backward areas which have not completed five years from the date of availing supply shall also be exempted from power cut till they complete the five years period from the date of availing High Tension Supply.”

Explanation :

For the purpose of sub-clause (viii) (ix) (x) and (xi) in the case of Low Tension Industry converted in to a High Tension Industry, the date of availing H. T. supply shall mean “the date of conversion to High Tension” supply.

IV. In clause 8, the sub clause (iii) shall be substituted as follows :

The services listed in clause 6 (iii) (iv) and (v) shall not be disconnected for exceeding the demand quota.

V. In clause 9, sub clause (i) shall be substituted as follows :

- (i) in respect of the services listed in clause 6 (ii) (iv) and (v), in this order.
 - (a) any excess consumption over and above the energy quota fixed shall be subject to a penal levy of 50% of the units rate.
 - (b) in cases, where the demand quota is exceeded the penal levy shall be twice the normal demand charges in addition to the normal demand charges.

Notification

As per Rule 45 of Indian Electricity Rules 1956 all electrical works in domestic houses, commercial establishments, Industries, temporary illuminations etc., including additions and alterations to existing installation should be carried out by an electrical contractor licensed on this behalf by the State Government under the direct supervision of a person holding a valid competency certificate whose name found entered in the Contractor's licence. The electric supply to electrical works done by unauthorised persons is liable to be refused as per the said rule. Besides the unauthorised persons and the owner of the electrical installation are liable for punishment as per Rule 139 of Indian Electricity Rules 1956 and such persons are liable to be subjected to Police Action.

All consumers are therefore advised to entrust their electrical works only to licensed contractors after verifying their licences and certificates to avoid penal action.

It has been brought to the notice of the Government that the Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Land Administration in his letter third cited has issued instructions to all the Collectors/District Revenue Officers/Additional Collectors etc. that the lands acquired under the Land Acquisition Act should be given to requisitioning Departments/bodies only on lease basis and that the above instructions should be followed by all Land Acquisition Officers pending finalisation of Land Policy by Government. In the letter fourth cited he has reiterated the above instructions and has ordered that all Collectors/Additional Collectors/District Revenue Officers should not send their

recommendations direct to Government and that they should send their reports on land matters only through Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Land Administration. He has also directed that the above instructions should be scrupulously followed without any deviation or omission on any account.

2. In the D.O. Letter 5th cited, the Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Land Administration has pointed out to all the Collectors that draft proposals for Land Acquisition are not sent by them as per the new land policy of the Government. He has therefore instructed that the Collectors should ensure definitely that the last paragraph of the draft award incorporates the following:

"By making payments of compensation as noted above the title, ownership and right of enjoyment of the registered holders, enjoyers, lessors, mortgagers, mortgagees tenants and their successors and legal heirs if any of the land are extinguished. The lands are free from encumbrances. The lands acquired by this award become the property of the Government of Tamil Nadu. They will be registered in the name of the Collectors of.....District and thereafterwards they shall be given to the.....only on lease basis."

He has also instructed the Collectors to communicate it to everybody involved in Land Acquisition work and has ordered that if Draft proposals are received without this paragraph they would be returned to the Districts for rectification of this defect.

3. The present Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Land Administration in the letter last cited has reported that, in addition, his predecessor has insisted on the condition of lease in the individual cases of Draft Declaration proposals, valuation proposals and draft award proposal which came to this office for approval.

4. The instructions issued by the Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Land Administration are contrary to the specific orders/instructions issued by the Government in the G.O. first cited as well as the Government letter second cited. In the order first cited it has been specifically ordered that in all cases of disposal of lands acquired under the Land Acquisition Act, the provisions under the Land Acquisition Act and Manual shall apply and there is no question of leasing out the Land acquired under the Land Acquisition Act at the cost of the requisitioning body. Again in the letter second cited the Special Commr. and Commr. of Land Administration was very specifically informed that the Land Acquisition Act, 1894 is a Central Act. Neither the Act nor the rules framed thereunder provides for leasing out the land acquired under the Act at the cost of the requisitioning body. While acquiring land under the Act no particular State can claim exemption from any provision of the said Act nor can it modify or alter any provision unilaterally to suit its convenience or policy without the express concurrence of the Government of India and specific Amendment to the Act. Hence the stand taken by the Special Commr. and Commr. of Land Administration that the lands acquired at the cost of the requisitioning body should only be leased out is violative of the provisions of the Act. He was accordingly requested to give effect to the orders issued in G. O. Ms. No. 2318, Revenue dated 14-12-1983.

5. The Government consider that the failure on the part of the Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Land Administration to adhere to the statutory provisions of the Land Acquisition Act, 1894 and the Manual is unfortunate and that as the Head of the Department incharge of implementing the Land Acquisition Act, he should have scrupulously followed the provision of the Act and the Manual. It is also considered that Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Land Administration should have implemented the orders issued in G. O. Ms. No. 2318, Revenue, dt. 14-12-88 and the instructions issued in Govt. Lr. No. 73364/C2/89-1, Revenue, dated 7-8-89 which it is now learnt he has failed to implement. Instead of implementing and acting upon the orders of the Govt. the Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Land Administration had been issuing instructions contrary to the orders of the Government.

6. The Government, therefore, hereby cancel the instructions issued by the Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Land Administration in the letters cited third, fourth and fifth.

7. All the Collectors/District Revenue Officers, Addl. Collectors and the officers entrusted with Land Acquisition work are instructed to follow scrupulously the provisions in the Land Acquisition Act, 1894 and the Manual and the orders and instructions of the Government in G. O. Ms. No. 2318, Revenue dt. 14-12-88 and Lr. No. 73364/C2/89-1/Revenue dated 7-8-1989.

8. The Commissioner of Land Administration is requested to issue suitable instructions to all concerned in this regard.

It is brought to the notice of the Board that effecting of lighting services (single phase) is getting delayed for want of single phase meters. It is, therefore, decided to accept new single phase meters offered by the prospective consumers, requiring lighting service connections.

Instructions have already been issued for acceptance of consumers meters in the circular memos. under reference cited above. They are reiterated with certain modifications to suit the present conditions as below :

1. New Single Phase meters (as per required rating) may be accepted from the consumers requiring supply.
2. This acceptance of consumer meter is permitted upto 31—1—1990.
3. The meters from consumers should be accepted only if there is no stock at the concerned sub-stores.
4. The Assistant Engineer shall accord approval for acceptance of the consumer meter based on the sanction accorded for the service connection.
5. The meter to be supplied by the party should be given along with the cash receipt for the purchase. It should be ensured that the meter is a new one **and of standard make conforming to ISS.**
6. The meter should be tested by MRT free of cost and accepted only if it is alright.
7. If the meter supplied is found to be defective, the same should be returned to the party under acknowledgement. The subsequent replacement meters, supplied, should be got tested by MRT, after collecting the necessary testing charges.
8. Wherever the meters are supplied by the consumers supply may be effected to them by overlooking the priority. In other words, the applicants who do not come forward to supply the meter may be overlooked. However, supply may be effected to such overlooked applicants for service connection as soon as the meters are received in sub-stores out of purchases by the Board.

ACCOUNTING PROCEDURE

1. The meters accepted should be accounted through Stores transactions.
2. After test by MRT the Assistant Engineer/Junior Engineer should devolute the meter to stores under A/c. 096 Misc. Deposit-Name of consumer/his address.
3. The devolution should be credited to the Misc. Deposit 096 Account of the consumer concerned.
4. The meter may be valued at Rs. 159/- each.
5. The Assistant Engineer/Junior Engineer shall draw the meter under proper requisition.
6. Requisition should be debited to the concerned service connection account, duly mentioning the name of the consumer, application registration no. in the requisition slip. The approval memo. given for acceptance of the meter supplied by the consumer should also be noted in the remarks column of the requisition.
7. Both the devolutions and requisitions should contain the details of the meter and initial reading.
8. Such consumers meters should be accounted separately in the priced ledger/quantity ledger.

Electricity—Generation of power from private windmills—Parallel operation with Board's grid—Guidelines issued.

Proceedings :

The Board has issued orders in B.P. first cited permitting private parties to set up windmill generators in windy areas in the State and to transfer power so generated by the windmill generators to a location where the power is required by the private party, using the transmission system of the Board. In the B.P. second cited, the Board has clarified that windmills may be installed by a group of companies and that the private agencies may lease their windmill generators to the financial institutions for the purpose of getting funds for setting up the windmill generators. The above orders have evoked interest among many private industries who are aspiring for power. Number of representations are being received by the Board seeking permission to set up private windmills and requesting the procedures to be followed in installing private windmills and to have parallel operation of the same with the Board's grid.

2. After careful examination of the requests made by the private parties to set up private windmills, the following guidelines, to be followed while permitting private windpower generation and their tie up with the Board's grid, are issued.

(i) The approval of the Chief Electrical Inspectorate to the Government of the Tamil Nadu (CEIG) should be obtained by the private parties before applying for the approval of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board for setting up windmills of their own. Necessary safety certificate issued from the CEIG should also be obtained from them before effecting tie up of their windmills with the grid.

(ii) Parties seeking permission for setting up private windmills should submit their application, as per the proforma enclosed in the Annexure, to the concerned Superintending Engineer of the Electricity Distribution Circle along with a top sketch, village map, ownership certificate of the land from the concerned revenue authorities, electrical layout showing the tie up with the grid, protection arrangement proposed for windmills and the grid.

(iii) Permission for generation of power at voltage other than 400 V to 433 V will require a special permission from the Board.

(iv) The entire cost of interfacing of the windmills with the Board's grid, including the cost of transformers, protection arrangement, metering arrangement, HT lines from the point of generation to the Board's nearest HT line etc will be borne by the private party.

(v) Two separate meters one for the export of wind power to the grid and another for import of TNEB power from the grid will be installed by the Board on the HT side at the cost of the private party. The meters and the meter boxes will be sealed by the Board.

(vi) Depending upon the capacity of the windmills proposed, necessary kiosk or sub-station facilities have to be provided by the parties at their cost.

(vii) In case where the consumption of the windmills is more than the generation during a particular month, it will not be carried forward and billing will be done on appropriate tariff. Necessary security deposit towards this will be collected from the party before effecting supply to the windmill.

(viii) Starting current of the windmill should not exceed the full load current of the machine and necessary current limiting devices like thyristors during starting should be provided.

(ix) Capacitors of sufficient rating should be provided at the windmill itself to compensate the low power factor of the machine and should be cut in automatically, such that the power factor is maintained always above 0.8 and to control the voltage regulation within 12% of the rated voltage at the point of supply.

(x) The windmills should cut out automatically when the grid supply fails.

(xi) The Board will not relax the staggering of loads (by giving two phase supply during peak load periods/particular hours in a day) to the feeders in which the windmills of the private parties are installed.

(xii) The Board will undertake the interfacing work of the private windmills after collecting the estimated amount from the private parties and execute it as a deposit contribution work.

(xiii) The maintenance of the windmills and the equipments including the transformers, protection equipments etc. has to be done by the private parties themselves, whereas the HT lines will be maintained by the Board at its cost.

From the survey conducted by the various Superintending Engineers (Distribution) Circles it emerged that out of 1001 SC/ST colonies identified by the State Government for provision of package of benefits, 972 colonies are in the Board's area. 29 colonies come under the three Rural Electric Co-operative Societies at Thirumayam, Kumbakonam and Vandavasi. 43 colonies in Board's area are reported to be uninhabited/unidentifiable. The list of habitations in the designated 1001 colonies pertaining to the respective Electricity Distribution Circles are enclosed herewith.

2. In regard to erection of street lights, it has been decided to take up only the 140 virgin colonies, where at present there is neither street light nor hut service, 700 lights will have to be erected in these colonies within the overall target of 20,000 lights. In regard to effecting of hut services in these colonies, in accordance with the decision taken at the meeting taken by the Chief Secretary on 11-8-'89, the number of hut services to be given during the year under the Action Plan for SC/ST will be limited to 20,000 against 23,000 huts in the 972 colonies in Board's area.

3. In view of the decisions mentioned above, the target fixed for the various Electricity Distribution Circles for electrification of street lights as well as huts has to be revised. Accordingly, revised circlewise targets for the hut service electrification and revised circlewise targets for street light electrification are given in the appended annexure I and II.

4. As decided at the Chief Engineer's (Distribution) meeting held at Madras on 26-8-89, top priority (overriding priority) should be given for providing street lights and hut services under the Action Plan and competent sanctioning authority for the above services may be empowered to give special priority for extending the street lights and hut services in these SC/ST habitation during this year alone (1989-'90) as a special case.

5. The Superintending Engineers/Distribution Circles may be requested to take immediate remedial action to complete the erection of five street lights in each of the virgin colonies pertaining to their Electricity Distribution Circles, target fixed under the Action Plan before 31-12-'89. All hut services have to be effected positively before 31-1-'90.

6. The Government in Adi-Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department, has already been requested to ask the Local-bodies to submit separate application for provision of street lights in the identified SC/ST colonies. A copy of the letter sent to the Government in this regard is enclosed. Therefore the Local-bodies may be contacted and application may be obtained.

7. In respect of hut service connections also the Government have been requested to instruct through the District Collectors the officers in-charge of the programme to persuade the Hut dwellers to submit necessary applications. The hut dwellers may be contacted and necessary applications may

be obtained from them and connections may be given up to the revised target fixed based on the seniority of application in these colonies. The other conditions stipulated for extension of hut services is unaltered.

8. A fresh survey of the un-inhabited colonies may be conducted again in consultation with the Local officials of the Revenue Department and it may be confirmed that the particulars already given are correct.

9. As regards furnishing of progress reports, the no. of street lights and no. of hut servicee energised colonywise/districtwise under the designated SC/ST habitations may be furnished separately while furnishing in the 20 point Monthly progress in a separate sheets, so as to send a special report to Government from time to time.

This has reference to D. O. letter cited under reference (2) above.

2. The list of 1001 SC/ST colonies as given by the Government in letter cited under ref. (1) has been verified and it is seen that 972 colonies are in Board's area and 29 colonies pertaining to the three (3) Rural Electric Co-operative Societies. Out of these 972 colonies, 43 colonies are reported to be uninhabited or unidentifiable leaving a balance of 929 colonies where electrification works have to be carried out. Two statements showing the position on availability of street lights, hut services and house connections in these colonies are enclosed.

3. Out of 972 colonies, 140 colonies do not have either street lights or hut services. If each of these colonies is to have a minimum of five (5) street lights, 700 street lights will have to be erected.

4. As regards hut electrification, 22,600 huts have to be provided with power connection in these 929 colonies and a sum of Rs. 105.00 lakhs would be required for this work.

5. The annual target for 1989-90 for street lights is 20,000 and for huts is 40,000. Against these targets, 14,108 street lights and 14,398 hut services have already been effected upto the end of August, 1989. All the 700 street lights are proposed to be effected within the budget provision. Out of the 22,600 hut services required in the colonies, it is proposed to connect only 20,000 services within the Board's budget as per the decision taken at the meeting taken by the Chief Secretary on 11-8-89 (para 6 of the minutes). However as already stated in D. O. letter cited under reference (2) erection of street lights and connection to hut services in areas other than the now designated 929 colonies will get reduced by the same manner as is being allotted to these colonies unless additional funds are made available by the Government.

6. As regards colonies coming under the Rural Electric Co-operative Societies, the Collectors concerned, may be requested to take appropriate action on providing street lights and hut services. T.N.E.B is also communicating the list of the related colonies to the three Rural Electric Co-operative Societies.

7. It is to be reiterated that for effecting the street lights, the Local-body concerned has to make necessary application and for hut services the hut dwellers concerned. The District Collectors may be requested to instruct the officers incharge of implementing the programme to instruct the Local bodies to make a separate application to T.N.E.B. for provision of street lights in the Action Plan areas and to persuade the hut dwellers to furnish necessary application for effecting hut service connection.

Proceedings :

1. Tamil Nadu Electricity Board had sent proposal for expansion of North Madras Thermal Station with 2 x 210 MW under stage II during June 1988 and proposal for establishment of a 3 x 210 MW Cuddalore Thermal Power Project in February 1987. Both the projects are awaiting techno economic clearance from the Central Electricity Authority, for want of the following :

- Clearance from the Department of Environment.
- Coal linkage.

However it is to be mentioned that Government of India have informed that it is not possible to provide coal linkage for these projects during the 8th plan period (1990-95).

2. Now, the Central Electricity Authority (CEA) has included 2 x 500 MW in North Madras Thermal Power Project (NMTTP)—Stage II and first unit of 2 x 500 MW in Cuddalore T.P.P. as the list of Projects earmarked for Commissioning during the 9th Plan period. The Chairman CEA has requested revision of capacity of N.M.T.P.P.—Stage II and Cuddalore T.P.P. as 2 x 500 MW each based on a study conducted by M/s. Rail India Technical & Economic Services (RITES).

3. The working group on power for formation of 8th plan constituted by the State Planning Commission has recommended use of 500 MW units in place of 210 MW units in N.M.T.P.P.—II stage and Cuddalore T.P.P., after studying the comparative costs/performance of typical 210 MW and 500 MW units.

4. The Board, after careful consideration of the issues involved hereby approves the proposal of Chief Engineer/Planning for accepting the suggestion of C.E.A. and to revise the capacity of both the projects—North Madras Expansion as well as Cuddalore, as 2 x 500 MW each.

The target under this scheme may be restricted to 50% of the target fixed for the divisions. If there are not enough applications in the division to achieve the target of 50% limit, the Superintending Engineers may reappropriate the target of 50% among other divisions and the Circle target of 50% should be kept up. Notices may be issued accordingly.

The date of expiry of the 45 days' notices should be 31—1—90 (i.e., the notices should be issued on or before 15—12—89) so that all the ready cases are effected service connections on or before 31—3—90.

In the Circular memo. (5) cited, instructions were issued that the Belated Payment Surcharge/interest shall be waived in respect of the agricultural consumers in the 'Non-paying area' (Resistance area), if they clear the entire arrears of C.C. charges due prior to 1-4-79 and also the arrears arising after 1-4-79 either in one lumpsum or in instalments before 30-9-1989.

2. The Government of Tamil Nadu have now extended the time for payment of arrears of C.C. charges by both categories of agricultural consumers mentioned in para (1) above from 30-9-1989 to 31-12-1989. The Superintending Engineers are therefore requested to permit such of the agricultural consumers who are still paying their arrears under 1+1 formula and the agricultural consumers in the 'Non-paying area' (Resistance area), who did not pay at all the arrears as on 1-4-1979 and also the arrears arising after 1-4-1979 to pay their entire arrears of C.C. charges till 31-12-1989 either in one lumpsum or in instalments and waive the Belated Payment Surcharge/interest to such of the agricultural consumers who have paid the entire arrears before 31-12-1989.

The Superintending Engineers are requested to give wide publicity to the extension of time for payment of arrears of C.C. charges till 31-12-1989.

As per Government Order and the Board's Proceedings cited, the street-lights in Municipalities and Municipal Townships have been handed over to the respective Municipalities/Townships on 15-9-89 for future maintenance by them. The decision was taken before handing over of street-lights to the effect that the staff required for street-light maintenance will be appointed by the Municipalities and Municipal Townships and the spares required will be procured by them.

2. The Government has since informed that it will take some time for the Municipalities and Municipal Townships to appoint the required personnel and to procure the spares for replacements and requested the Board that the existing arrangement to replace/repair works in the maintenance of street-lights in Municipalities and Municipal Townships utilising the spares available with TNEB may be continued for two months.

3. The Director of Municipal Administration has requested that suitable training may be given to the personnel appointed by them for maintenance. The following instructions are therefore issued.

(i) The Maintenance of street lights in Municipalities and Municipal Townships may be done by the Board's staff as was done prior to 15-9-89.

(ii) The available spares like tube-lights, chokes, starters etc., in stores may be utilised for the necessary replacements.

(iii) The cost of these spares may be charged to the respective Municipalities/Municipal Townships as was being done earlier i.e., even for items supplied to the Municipalities and Municipal Townships even after 14-9-89.

(iv) If the spares are exhausted in the stores, the respective Municipalities/Municipal Townships may be requested to supply the spares for replacement.

(v) The above maintenance may be done upto 31-12-89.

(vi) Necessary training to the personnel appointed by the Municipalities/Municipal Townships in the maintenance of street-lights may be given during the period upto 31-12-1989.
