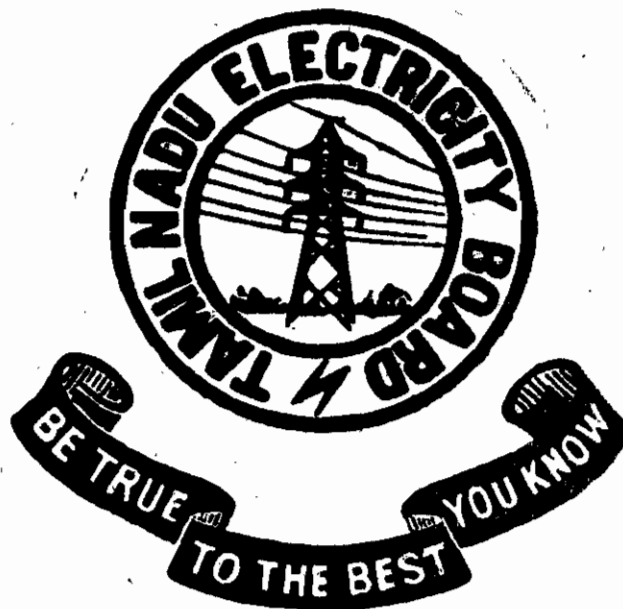

**VI. Training :**

**VII. Payment of ex-gratia to the employees :**

In B.P. (FB) No. 1 (Sectt. Branch) dt. 5-1-91, the Board has sanctioned payment of a lumpsum exgratia amount of Rs. 450/- to the employees who draw a salary (Pay plus DA) exceeding Rs. 2,500/- during the accounting year 1989-90 and who had not received any bonus/exgratia. This will apply only to the employees who are in service on the date of this order.

**VIII. Out of turn priority for LT industrial applicants :**

In B.P. Ms. (FB) No. 1 (Tech. Branch) dt. 4-1-91, the Board has ordered that in the case of LT industrial applicants who come forward to bear the entire cost of extension including cost of distribution transformers, improvements etc. and service connection charges in full and to whom effecting supply as per norms is feasible within three months from the date of payment of entire cost, the cost may be collected in one lumpsum and supply effected within a period of three months by giving out of turn priority.

**IX. Grant of Pongal prize amount to Pensioners/Family pensioners :**

In B.P. (Ch) No. 5 (Sectt. Branch) dt. 10-1-91, the Board has ordered payment of Rs. 100/- to Pensioners/Family pensioners as Pongal prize.

**X. Increase in quantum of ex-gratia amount for funeral expenses :**

In B.P. (FB) No. 5 (Adm. Branch) dt. 11-1-91, the Board has ordered enhancement of the exgratia grant of Rs. 200/- to Rs. 300/- for meeting the funeral expenses of the deceased Board employees who had put in a continuous service of atleast two years and pay not exceeding Rs. 1700/- per month. In case of Class III & IV services, the amount should be paid irrespective of the length of service and pay last drawn.

**XI. Connecting up additional loads in LT industrial services :**

In Memo. No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE1/32/91 dt. 22-1-91, the Superintending Engineers have been delegated with powers to permit connecting up of additional loads in LT Industrial services based on the Tongtester readings.

**XII. Reconnection of dismantled agricultural services :**

In Memo. No. X/CFC(R)/ASI/2380/88-18, dt. 29-1-91, the time for acceptance of arrears with interest from disconnected and dismantled agricultural services on or after 1-4-79 has been extended upto 30-6-91.

**XIII. Hut services — Extension of scheme to Jawahar Velai Vaaippu Thittam (J.V.V.T.) :**

In Memo. No. SE/RE & I(D)/RE2/E/D 607/90, dt. 25-1-91, the Board based on Government orders has extended the one light for one hut scheme to such of those houses constructed under Jawahar Velai Vaaippu Thittam under normal priority within the overall target fixed for the year.

Establishment—Class III Service—Assessment-cum-Collection Cadre—Passing of Accountancy (Lower Grade)—Sanction of incentive increment to those who passed the Local Fund Audit Test in Commercial Book-Keeping before 22—1—78 and who had not drawn any advance increment—Orders—Issued.

#### Proceedings :

In the B.P. first cited, it was ordered that the Settlement dated 24—8—87 on Bimonthly system of Card Billing of energy charges and collection would come into force from 1—10—1987. Para 18 of the Settlement provides that Assessors appointed after the date of the Settlement should pass Accountancy (Lower Grade) Test for considering their case for promotion to the post of Inspector of Assessment and that they would be given an advance increment from the date of passing the Test. In para 18(iii) of the Settlement it has also been mentioned that those Assessors, Inspectors of Assessment, Revenue Supervisors and Selection Grade Revenue Supervisors, on the date of the Settlement, who had already passed the Test (excepting those who opted from the clerical cadre and had drawn one or more advance increment for passing Tests) would be given an advance increment from the date of the Settlement.

2. In the letter second cited, instructions were issued as regards the eligibility of the advance increment to collection staff. A point has been raised for clarification as to whether such of those Assessors, Inspectors of Assessment, Revenue Supervisors and Selection Grade Revenue Supervisors, who had already passed the Local Fund Audit Department Test in Commercial Book-keeping, which was considered as an equivalent to a pass in Accountancy Lower Grade Test upto 23—1—1978, and who had not drawn any advance increment for passing such test, may be given an advance increment from the date of Settlement.

3. After careful consideration, it is hereby ordered that in respect of Assessors, Inspectors of Assessment, Revenue Supervisors and Special Grade Revenue Supervisors on the date of the settlement on Bi-monthly System of Energy charges and collection if they had already passed the Local Fund Audit Department Test in Commercial Book-keeping before 23—1—'78 (including those who came out successful in 11/77 examination) and or B.Com., degree, their passing of the above Test/Degree Examination shall be considered as equivalent to passing the Accountancy (Lower Grade) for the purpose of grant of an advance increment with reference to the provision in Para 18(iii) of the Settlement on Bi-monthly System of Energy charges and collection provided they had not drawn any advance increment for passing such Test/or degree examination before. However, passing of the Local Fund Audit Department Test in Commercial Book-keeping after 23—1—1978, will not be considered as equivalent to passing of Accountancy (Lower Grade) for the purpose of eligibility of the grant of advance increment referred to above. It is also ordered (in modification of the earlier instructions in this regard) that the 'date of Settlement' referred to in Para 18 of the Settlement shall be taken as 24—8—1987, notwithstanding the fact that Bi-monthly system of Card billing of energy charges and collection was introduced with effect from 1—10—1987.

S. I. Act under section 90 read with section 91-A of the E. S. I. Act, 1948 with effect from 16—2—1989—Orders Issued.

**Order :**

In the letter first read above, the Secretary, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, Madras has submitted an application in proforma 'A' together with the comparative statement of E. S. I. benefits and benefits provided by the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board and has requested for grant of permanent exemption under section 90 read with section 91-A of E. S. I. Act, 1948 in respect of its employees in the Ennore Thermal Power Station, Ennore, Chengai—Anna District based on the benefits provided by the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board in respect of their employees.

2. The Regional Director, E. S. I. Corporation, Madras who was consulted in this matter has agreed for granting of exemption under section 90 and 91A of E. S. I. Act with effect from 16—2—89 in respect of the employees of M/s. Ennore Thermal Power Station, Ennore, who enjoy the same benefits as available to Tamil Nadu Government employees. He has also stated that the casual/temporary/work charged employees will have to be continued to be covered under the E. S. I. Act 1948 from their date of appointment as and when they are employed and contributions are payable in respect of them under the E. S. I. Act, 1948 if they are not entitled to the benefits available to the permanent employees of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board.

3. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board is an undertaking of the Government of Tamil Nadu. The Government consider that the benefits are conferred on the permanent employees of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board in respect of Ennore Thermal Power Station, Chengai-Anna District without collecting any contribution from them and they are enjoying the same benefits as available to the Tamil Nadu Government employees.

4. Accordingly, the Government have decided to exempt the Ennore Thermal Power Station, Chengai—Anna District in respect of its permanent employees from the provisions of the E. S. I. Act, 1948 under section 90 read with section 91-A of the Act with effect from 16—2—89.

5. The following Notification will be published in the next issue of the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette:

### Notification

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 90 read with section 91-A of the Employees' State Insurance Act, 1948 (Central Act ACCDIV of 1948), the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby exempt the permanent employees in respect of the Ennore Thermal Power Station, Chengai-Anna District of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board from the operation of the said Act with effect from 16th February 1989.

During the review of the subjects relating to court matters on 31—12—1990, the Chairman has stated that it will be the responsibility of the officers concerned to ensure that the court cases are fought effectively with the assistance of the Legal Cell. He wanted that month-wise review of the various cases indicating the number of cases won or lost by the Board and the reasons for the failure in courts be furnished. Memorandum No. 10548/SS3/90-23, (Tech. Br.) dated the 30th January 1991

Sub : Tamil Nadu Electricity Board—Fire Protection—Fire Protection Cell—  
Safety and Prevention—Instructions—Issued.

Following Safety Precautions which are considered essential may be ensured in all the Thermal Power Stations, Hydro Stations and Distribution sub-stations :

- (1) Wherever there are cable ducts, they may be filled up with sand right away so that prevention of spread of fire in the event of such an emergency is ensured. This has to be done only outside the building. Wherever it is feasible the same arrangement should be done inside the building also.
- (2) All the cable entries inside the station and to the Control Room may be effectively sealed with brick work or other insulating material or fire proof sealing system so as to prevent stack action and to effectively arrest spread of fire. It is seen that during overhauls etc., the seals are opened and not closed promptly. It should be ensured that in all such cases, the seals should be closed immediately after the work is over.
- (3) All the Air-Conditioning ducts must be provided with fire dampers, preferably automatic, or atleast manual.
- (4) As far as possible no wooden or inflammable material may be used for doors, windows and partitions or ceilings. If they are already provided, they may be replaced with Aluminium Glazed partitions. In Power stations and sub-stations, a few lorry loads of sand should be readily stocked with sufficient number of fire buckets etc., so that the sand could be utilised for fire fighting.
- (5) It may also be ensured that the furniture inside the control rooms in all Generating stations, (Hydro & Thermal), all 230 KV and 400 KV sub-stations, could be of steel. As far as 110 KV SS are concerned, the Chief Engineers may decide the sub-stations which require such attention, depending upon the proximity and importance of the sub-station.

2. Tamil Nadu Electricity Board have a number of Lady Assistant Engineers manning the various sub-stations, Hydro stations and Thermal Stations. Their daily routine involves their moving about in the midst of rotating machinery and other equipments. They are also required to check batteries etc. in the sub-stations. From safety and security point of view, they may be asked to wear over-coats with their plaits effectively secured inside the over coats.

3. Chief Engineers, Superintending Engineers, Executive Engineers and Assistant Executive Engineers as Inspecting Officers, may please ensure that these precautions are taken. Assistant Engineers who are exposed to such dangers may ensure such safety precautions of their own volition.

ORDER :

In the G.O. first read above, orders were issued prescribing necessary guidelines on suitable procedures to be followed by the Public Sector Undertakings in order to exercise utmost economy in the purchase, maintenance and utilisation of vehicles. Among others, it was indicated that the consumption of fuel per vehicle owned and used by the Corporations/Boards should be limited to specific monthly ceiling depending on the type of vehicles and its normal area of operation and that the ceilings laid down for Government vehicles may be taken into account. The Chief Executive Officer of each Corporation should compute the normal quota and the reserve for each vehicle at 10% of the normal quota for every year. While the normal quota will be allotted per vehicle for each month, the Corporation may pool the reserve quota centrally and allocate the reserve quota based on need to different vehicles. The total of the normal quota plus the reserve allocation if any, shall be the operational ceiling for each vehicle. It was also instructed that suitable arrangements should be made to ensure that this ceiling is not exceed on any account. In order to ensure that the ceiling on fuel consumption is strictly adhered to by the vehicle using officers and payment for fuel consumption in excess of the operational ceiling is strictly avoided, the Corporations/Boards were also requested to maintain a pass book for fuel consumption in respect of each vehicle as is being done in respect of Government vehicles.

2. In the order second read above, Government have issued orders prescribing revised ceiling for Government vehicles to effect 20% cut over the ceiling in 1989-90, as a measure of economy in the expenditure in view of the shortage of petrol and diesel.

3. The Government have felt the need for similar economy measure in the case of motor vehicles belonging to the State Public Sector Undertaking/Boards. Therefore the Chief Executive Officers of all State Public Sector Undertaking/Boards are requested to ensure that a cut of 20% over the ceiling in 1989-90 or actual consumption in 1989-90 whichever is lower shall be given effect to for the year 1990-91 consumption of fuel with immediate effect. Taking note of the increase in fuel price, it is considered that in any case the Corporation/Boards should ensure that the Budget allocations on fuel for the year 1990-91 may be so altered that it should not exceed the actual expenditure of the last year viz. 1989-90. This will not apply to buses operated by Transport Corporation for which separate fuel restrictions are being organised by Transport Department.

4. The Chief Executive Officers of the Public sector Undertakings/Boards are requested to bring the contents of this G.O. to the notice of the Board of Directors at the earliest opportunity.

Sub : Installation of captive generator sets in High Tension and Low Tension services—Giving permission/consent to the applicants for installation—Avoidance of delay—Instructions issued.

In the meeting held by the Secretary, Industries Department on 30—10—90, it has been decided that the permission for the installation of captive generators must be given within two months from the date of application, by both the Chief Electrical Inspectorate and Tamil Nadu Electricity Board the period running concurrently.

As per B.P. cited under reference (i) Superintending Engineers (Distribution) Circles are delegated with powers to grant permission to the consumers for installation of Diesel Generators subject to the conditions stipulated therein.

As per the B.P. cited under reference (ii), Executive Engineer's (Distribution) are empowered to give consent for installation of captive generator sets upto 130 KVA in L.T. service connections and the consent letter shall be issued as per the given format, on receipt of application from the applicants as per instructions issued in Memo. No. SE/RE/G/6057-2/87, dated 29—8—87.

In view of the decision taken vide para 1, it is hereby instructed that the consent/permission for the installation of captive generators be issued to the applicants by the Executive Engineers/Superintending Engineers as the case may be, within a maximum period of 15 days from the date of receipt of application in this regard. A copy of this consent letter/permission may be sent to the Chief Electrical Inspector to Government.

The usage of the generating set shall be permitted without any delay immediately on receipt of the safety certificate from the Chief Electrical Inspector to Government and compliance of the conditions set forth in the consent/permission letter.

A Fortnightly report with the details of the requests received from the consumers and prospective consumers for the installation of captive generating sets and the consent/permission accorded for the request shall be sent by the Superintending Engineers to the Chief Engineer (Distribution) of the region.

The Chief Engineers (Distribution) of the region are requested to review the above report once in fortnight and ensure that the time limit is kept up in according permission for the installation of captive generator sets.

Sub : Electricity Connecting up of additional loads in industrial services who ready as on 31—12—90 - Fixing availability of Distribution Transformer capacity based on Tong Tester readings - Instructions - Issued.

On a review of the achievement of the target in connecting of additional loads in industrial services, it is observed that the proportionate target has not been achieved during the period 1—4—90 to 30—11—90. Number of parties are reported to be ready to avail supply. It is desirable that the additional loads of applicants who have reported their readiness are connected early. In order to speed up the effecting of additional loads in existing industrial services, the availability of Distribution Transformer capacity shall be fixed based on the Tong Tester readings. The following instructions are issued in this regard.

1. The availability of capacity in Distribution Transformer for connecting additional loads which are ready as on 31—12—90 shall be assessed based on Tong Tester readings.
2. The Tong Tester readings shall be taken in the Distribution Transformer concerned during the peak hour period prevailing for the Distribution Transformer on two consecutive days.
3. The Tong-Tester readings shall be taken/personally by the Junior Engineer's/Assistant Engineer's and the Assistant Executive Engineers shall exercise 100% check.
4. The voltage regulation on the L. T. lines should be as per norms.
5. The priority of connecting the additional load shall be as per the readiness priority incident on the particular Distribution Transformer.
6. After assessment of the availability of Distribution Transformer capacity, the feasibility proposal for connecting up of the additional loads which are ready and are incident on this Distribution Transformer may be evolved and submitted to the Superintending Engineer/Circle by the Executive Engineer's.
7. The feasibility report for connecting the additional loads on the Distribution Transformer as per the above guidelines shall be approved by the Superintending Engineers of the Distribution Circles.
8. The above procedure is applicable only for the ready cases as on 31—12—90 and all feasible cases shall be connected before 31—3—91 after follow up all other formalities.

Sub : Electricity—Out of turn priority for L.T. industrial applicants who come forward to bear the entire cost of extension including improvements—Approved Working Instructions—Issued.

Ref : (Per.) B.P. Ms. (FB) No. 1, dated 4th January 1991.

In Board's Proceedings cited under reference, orders have been issued for effecting supply to L.T. industrial applicants who come forward to bear the entire cost of extension including cost of Distribution Transformers, Improvements etc., and Service connection in full, within a period of three months from the date of payment by giving Out of turn priority.

The following Working Instructions are issued.

1. Applications for L.T. industries under this scheme may be continued to be received and registered in the Office of the Assistant Executive Engineer. Along with the application a consent letter stating that applicants are willing to pay the full cost of entire extension (which includes cost of Distribution Transformer, Improvement and full service connection charges) may be obtained from such of the applicants who are desirous of availing this facility. An undertaking shall also be obtained that they agree to the condition of the Board that the Board reserves the right to tap the lines and Distribution Transformer laid for the applicant, for extending supply to other applicants without the consent of the applicant, inspite of the cost borne by him for the Lines, Distribution Transformer etc and that he will not be entitled to claim any refund on this account of tapping.

2. The applications may be registered initially along with other L.T. industrial applications, but subsequently transferred to the special priority category, if supply is assessed to be given within a period of three months after payment.

3. The applications received with consent letters and undertaking as above shall be processed immediately. The Technical feasibility as per norms shall be evolved after taking into consideration earlier applications, the loads of which are incident in the same feeder/Distribution Transformer.

4. The Feasibility Report along with estimate inclusive of service connection charges shall be submitted by the Junior Engineer/Assistant Engineer within 15 days to the Assistant Executive Engineer.

5. The Feasibility Report and Estimate on receipt, shall be scrutinised by the Assistant Executive Engineer. If the estimate is within powers of sanction of the Assistant Executive Engineer, he shall retain the estimate with him and submit the Feasibility Report only to Executive Engineer within one week of its receipt. If the estimate amount is beyond his powers, he shall submit both the Feasibility Report and Estimate to the Executive Engineer.

6. The Executive Engineer on receipt of the Feasibility Report shall scrutinise and assess whether the supply can be effected within a period of three months after payment of all costs by the applicant.

If supply can be effected within three months, he shall arrange for the sanction of the estimate from the respective competent authority (i.e.) Assistant Executive Engineer, Executive Engineer or Superintending Engineer, Chief Engineer (Distribution), as per powers of sanction vested with the above officers.

7. In all sanctions to be accorded under this scheme, a special condition may be added to the effect that "Board reserves the right to tap the lines, Distribution Transformer etc laid for the applicant to other parties without his consent and the applicant is not entitled for any refund on this account".

8. The Executive Engineer will be the authority to assess the feasibility of supply within three months and to send necessary communications to the applicants to pay the cost, Earnest Money Deposit etc. On sanction of the estimate, the Executive Engineer shall send communica-

tion to the applicants under Registered Post Acknowledgement Due informing him about the feasibility of supply within three months from the date of payment of cost of extension, (which includes cost of Distribution Transformer, Cost of Improvements and full Service connection charges) and the Earnest Money Deposit amount as applicable for L.T. power loads. The applicant shall be asked to remit the cost, with E.M.D. and also to execute the agreement, within one month from the date of the receipt of the communication, failing which his application shall be cancelled. Copy of sanction of estimate may also be sent to the applicant along with consumer.

9. In the agreement to be executed, the special clause regarding Board's right to tap the Lines, Distribution Transformer etc for extending supply to other parties without the consent of the applicants may be included. Non-entitlement of the consumer for refund of cost on this account may also be specified.

10. The cost of extension and the Earnest Money Deposit shall be paid separately for each by Demand Drafts (for accounting purpose) drawn in favour of Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles.

The work may be taken up on payment of cost and execution of agreement by the applicants. It should be ensured that supply is effected within a maximum of three months. Readiness need not be insisted upon from the applicants under this special scheme.

12. On completion of the works, 90 days notice of availability of supply may be sent to the applicant as per clause 12.01 of Terms and Conditions of Supply. The applicant shall also be informed that EMD will be forfeited if supply is not availed within the 90 days notice period. If the party avails supply, the E.M.D. paid may be adjusted against Security Deposit payable and balance refunded. The procedure outlined in SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE1/D. 10009/90/dated 12-5-90 for adjustment of Earnest Money Deposit may be followed.

13. If he fails to avail supply within the first 90 days notice period, the E.M.D. shall be forfeited. However another three months notice may be given to him to avail supply and if he avails supply within the second notice period, the applicant is liable to pay the monthly minimum charges from the date of expiry of the first 90 days period and fresh Security Deposit.

14. If he fails to avail supply even after second 90 days notice period, his application shall be cancelled. In addition to the E. M. D. the actual cost of dismantling of lines, transport charges, cost of materials that could not be reused may be recovered from the cost of extension etc paid by him and balance amount refunded.

15. If in the assessment made by the Executive Engineer, on effecting supply within three months, it is concluded that supply cannot be effected within three months, the application may be treated under the normal cases and dealt with as per procedure in vogue for category of L. T. industrial applications. The applicant shall be informed accordingly by the Assistant Executive Engineer on receipt of intimation from the Executive Engineer.

16. The Executive Engineer's shall send a monthly report on the cases coming up under this scheme to the Superintending Engineer to review the response from the consumer and to send a report to their Chief Engineers. A report shall be sent every month by Chief Engineer's (Distribution) for their regions to Member (Distribution).

17. Special review of the progress of works executed under this scheme may be made by the Executive Engineer's and Superintending Engineer's once in a fortnight to ensure effecting of supply within the committed period.

Sub : Establishment of Private Windmills Revised instructions to process the applications received from the private entrepreneurs—Issued—Reg.

Ref : (Permanent) B.P. (CH) No. 199 dt. 12—10—1989.

According to the B.P. cited in the reference, the parties seeking permission for setting up private windmills should submit their applications in the prescribed format along with required documents to the concerned Superintending Engineer/Distribution circle.

2. Now a large number of applications for the establishment of private windmills are being received. Further, a separate Circle Viz. Special Officer/Wind Energy Development Cell has been created to promote the wind energy. Therefore, in order to utilise the technical services of the Special Officer/Wind Energy Development Cell, while according permission for the private windmills and also to quicken the process, the following instructions are issued.

(i) On receipt of applications from the private parties, the concerned Superintending Engineer/Distribution Circle will arrange to scrutinise the applications, identify the interfacing arrangements required for connecting it to the grid and forward the applications with his recommendation to the Special Officer/Wind Energy Development Cell, Madurai.

(ii) After scrutiny of the proposals received from the Superintending Engineer/Distribution Circle, the Special Officer/Wind Energy Development Cell/Madurai will forward the proposals to the Chief Engineer/Planning for getting the approval of the Board.

(iii) Simultaneously, the Special Officer/Wind Energy Development Cell/Madurai will prepare an estimate for the interfacing arrangements on deposit contribution basis and send it to the concerned Chief Engineer/Distribution.

(iv) After the proposal is approved by the Board, the Chief Engineer/Distribution shall scrutinise the DCW estimate and accord sanction for the estimate with instructions that the Special Officer/Wind Energy Development Cell may execute the works under DCW basis.

(v) The Special Officer/Wind Energy Development Cell will collect the amount from the private party and execute the various interfacing works. After completion of the works, the Special Officer/Wind Energy Development Cell with the concurrence of the concerned Superintending Engineer/Distribution Circle will arrange for the commissioning of the lines and the windmill. He will also handover the H.T. line to the concerned Superintending Engineer/Distribution Circle for maintenance. The meter reading will be taken by Superintending Engineer/Distribution Circle. He will communicate in the formate the actual generation less local consumption to the Superintending Engineer/Distribution Circle in whose area this consumer wants to utilise the Power. The Superintending Engineer/Distribution Circle, in whose area this industry is located will deduct 2% as Board's commissions and give effect to this reduction.

3. The Superintending Engineers are also requested to accept the payment of arrears with interest from the applicants who were not able to pay before 30-9-90.

4. The Superintending Engineers are further requested to send a list of applications who have availed the above concession during the extended period every month to reach the Chief Financial Controller (Revenue) before 10th of succeeding month in the proforma prescribed in the circular Memo. (4) cited.

5. They are also requested to see that maximum amount of arrears due from the disconnected agricultural services are collected during this extended period.

6. The receipt of this circular Memo. may be acknowledged to the Chief Financial Controller/Revenue.

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Sub : Security of vital installations and Power Houses in Tamil Nadu Electricity Board—Visits—Granting Permisson—Instructions—Issued.

Vigilance Cell has been granting permission for educational visits to the students of workers Education, Schools and Colleges, subject to the conditions specified in the Vigilance Cell memo. first cited and the Superintending Engineers has been allowed to grant permission to a maximum of only two individual visits in a month, subject to the certain conditions mentioned in the Vigilance Cell memo. second cited.

2. Instances have come to my notice that some Superintending Engineers are allowing people to visit in groups Electricity Board installations without Inspector General of Police's permission. This is not a correct procedure. Group visits to Electricity Board vital installations are permitted in Tamil Nadu Electricity Board by Inspector General of Police / Vigilance only and the local Superintending Engineers etc. cannot in anticipation permit persons, who do not have Inspector General of Police's permission letter. In fact, the requisitions to visit vital installations like Ennore Thermal Power Station / Tuticcrin Thermal Power Station / Mettur Thermal Power Station should be forwarded to Inspector General of Police / Vigilance well in advance and they should arm themselves with the permission of Inspector General of Police / Vigilance when they visit such installations. The Superintending Engineers will not please force the Security Co-ordinator (appointed by the Board on deputation) wherever available to allow persons who do not have written permission of Inspector General of Police / Vigilance. The Security Co-ordinators are instructed not to allow any outsiders without written permission as it would amount to Security Breach.

3. All the Superintending Engineers are therefore requested to adhere the above instructions strictly.
