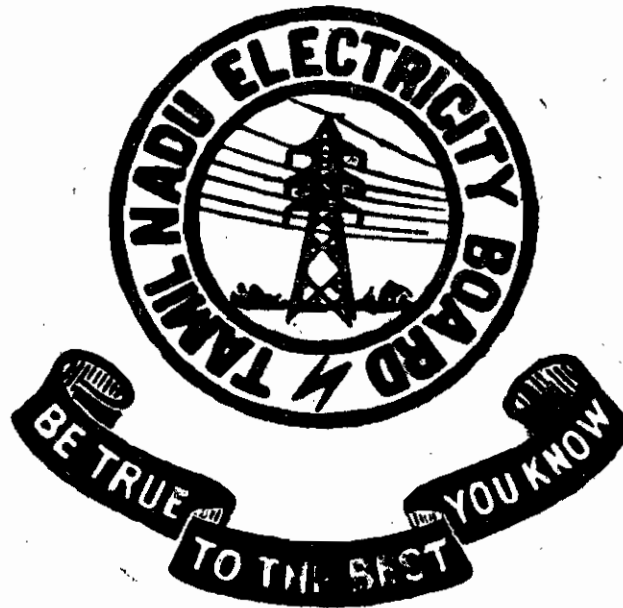

V. Training :

The following special programmes were conducted during July '91 :—

1. Six Chemists of Thermal Power Stations were deputed for short term course on 'Power Station Chemistry for Chemists' from 22-7-91 to 2-8-91.

2. 43 Engineers of Thermal Power Stations were deputed for Thermal Power Plant Engineers Training Programme conducted by Power Engineers Training Society & Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited jointly from 29-7-91 to 27-9-91.

3. A short term course on Project Management for Thermal Power Stations was conducted at North Madras Thermal Power Project with the assistance of Power Engineers Training Society/ Neyveli from 29-7-91 to 31-7-91. 20 Engineers of North Madras Thermal Power Project and Basin Bridge Gas Turbine participated.

4. A Training Programme on "DP and Domestic Enquiry" conducted at Staff Training College from 3-7-91 to 5-7-91 for Executive Engineers and Accounts Officers.

5. One Personal Assistant and one Assistant Accounts Officer were deputed to 'Orientation course on Labour Laws & Industrial Relations' conducted by Tamil Nadu Institute of Labour Studies from 8-7-91 to 12-7-91.

6. One Executive Engineer was deputed for one day training on "Quality Circle Movements and its Impact" conducted by Madras Productivity Council on 18-7-91.

7. Two Executive Engineers deputed on "Working Capital Management" conducted by Anna Institute of Management from 29-7-91 to 31-7-91.

8. One Assistant Executive Engineer and one Assistant Engineer were deputed for 4 days "Learning & Evaluation Programme on Computers' Education" conducted by Computer Point from 11-7-91 to 14-7-91.

VI. Delegation of Powers :

In B.P. (FB) No. 149 (Tech. Branch) dt. 5-7-91, the Board has delegated powers to Chairman to sanction (i) the estimates for replacement of line materials etc. due to thefts and damages in accidents and (ii) to write off of similar losses upto Rupees one lakh against the existing powers of Rs. 25,000/- and Rs. 10,000/- respectively.

VII. Sanction of leave for class I officers—Delegation of powers to Superintending Engineers :

In B.P. (FB) No. 55 (Sectt. Branch) dt. 22-7-91, the Board has delegated powers to Superintending Engineers to sanction all kinds of leave to class I officers excluding Superintending Engineers and above upto thirty days only with or without additional charge arrangement and without affecting the work.

VIII. Waiver of belated payment surcharge—Powers to Chairman :

In B.P. (FB) No. 164 (Tech. Br.) dt. 12-7-91, the Board has delegated powers to Chairman to waive levy of belated payment surcharge for Government departments if such waiver becomes unavoidable.

IX. R&C—HT Industries—Condonation of violation in exceeding the demand quota upto 10% :

In Memo. No. IEMC/EE2/A1/FPCGI/D 1054-1/91 dt. 9-7-91, the Board has issued orders in case of HT Industries exceeding the demand quota upto 10% as below :—

(a) The excess demand upto 10% in case of HT industries other than those covered under clause 6 (iii), (iv), (v) and (xv) of R&C order may be condoned and the excess demand charged at thrice the normal tariff rate.

This facility is permitted for first two occasions in a month. For third time in the same month the service shall be kept disconnected for 7 days besides charging the excess demand at thrice the normal rate.

These instructions will apply only upto 30th September '91 and thereafter the instructions in Memo. No. IEMC/EE2/A1/F PC GI/D 1054/91 dt. 18-5-91 will have to be followed.

X. Collection of development charges :

In Memo. No. Addl CE/IEMC/EE3/AEE2/752/91 dt. 15-7-91, it has been clarified that the development charges may be collected even in the case of conversion of service from single phase to three phase in LT non-power services also.

REGULATION—Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Employees' Discipline and Appeal Regulations—
Regulation 8 (b) —Amendment—Issued.

(Permanent) B.P. (Ch.) No. 170, (Secretariat Branch) Dated the 29th June 1991.

Proceedings :

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 79 (c) of the Electricity Supply Act, 1948 (Central Act 54 of 1948), the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board hereby makes the following amendment to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Employees' Discipline and Appeal Regulations :

AMENDMENT

In the said Regulations, in Regulation 8, in sub-regulation (b), for the sub-para, the following sub-para shall be substituted, namely :

"After the enquiry or personal hearing referred to in clause (b) has been completed and if the authority competent to impose the penalty specified in that clause is of the opinion on the basis of the evidence adduced during the inquiry, that any of the penalties specified therein should be imposed on the person charged, it shall, before making an order imposing such penalty, furnish to him a copy of the report of the inquiry or personal hearing or both, as the case may be, and call upon him to submit his further representation, if any, within a reasonable time not exceeding fifteen days. Any representation received in this behalf within the period shall be taken into consideration before making any order imposing the penalty, provided that such representation shall be based on the evidence adduced during the inquiry only. It shall not be necessary to give the person charged any opportunity of making representation on the penalty proposed to be imposed".

Memorandum (Per) No. 29671/O&M Cell (3)/91-2 (Secretariat Branch) dated 1-7-1991

Sub : Establishment—Tamil Nadu Electricity Board—Suppression of Stores Inspection Staff ordered—Orders kept in abeyance till further orders.

Ref : (Per) B. P. (Ch) No. 159 (S. B.) dated 19-6-91.

The posting of officers in the three posts of Stores Controllers sanctioned in the above Board's Proceedings will be made only after the workload revision agreements are concluded. Therefore, it is necessary to maintain the status-quo till then. However the appointment of a separate Superintending Engineer and operation of a separate circle is not necessary. In order to utilise them more effectively, the available Engineering and Stores staff under the Circle have to be distributed among the Regional Chief Engineers. In that event, the establishment posts consisting of One Superintendent, One Assistant, One Junior Assistant, One Record Clerk and One Typist will become redundant and will be kept in abeyance.

The posts of two typists and two Assistants available in the Surprise Inspection Squads and the posts of two Typists and One Assistant available in the Stores Inspection Wing also will have to be suppressed. Instead we may have to sanction one Typist and one Junior Assistant/Assistant in each Regional Chief Engineer's office along with the distribution of the Engineering and Stores men to Regional Chief Engineers.

Proceedings :

In the B.P. 1st cited, supervisory special pay as detailed below have been sanctioned.

- (i) All the billing Assistants in the Revenue Unit be paid a supervisory special pay of Rs. 20/—per month.
- (ii) Non-billing Assistant be paid a supervisory special pay of Rs. 15/— per month.
- (iii) The Leave Reserve Assistant shall also be paid a supervisory special pay, of Rs. 20/- or Rs. 15/- as the case may be depending upon the work of billing or non—billing work attended to by them.

2. Consequent on the introduction of card billing system, the billing etc., has been taken away from Revenue Branch and that Billing, Assessment and Collection are being attended to by card billing staff. The Assistants in the Revenue Branch are no longer doing any supervision work since the introduction of card billing system. The supervisory special pay now being paid to the Assistants in the Revenue Branches is not therefore justified.

3. The question of continuing the supervisory special pay further, has been examined considering the position stated in para 2 above. In fact the supervisory special pay granted should have been recovered from the employees concerned. However as a gesture of good will, no recovery is made. It is hereby ordered that the supervisory special pay now being paid as indicated in para 1 above, **be withdrawn with effect from 1—7—91.**

4. The Superintending Engineers shall send a confirmatory report in this regard to the Chief Engineer/Personnel.

3. In regard to Central Excise cases before the Collector Central, Excise (Appeals), Excise Authorities, at Coimbatore, Salem, Madurai and Trichy other than CEGAT Madras, Southern Region, Madras, the Legal Adviser or the Legal Officer of the Board will appear before them. In this connection the orders issued in letter No. 29521/LC3/91-1 dt. 3-5-1991 may be seen.

4. In case, if any difficulty is experienced in regard to appearance of Government Pleaders in the Labour Courts, the Chief Engineers concerned may engage local Advocates to attend Labour Court cases on the same rates of fees which are payable to the Board's Standing Counsels for the appearance before the Labour Courts.

5. In regard to Labour Court cases in all Regions if any difficulty is experienced in regard to appearance of Board's Standing Counsels/Government Pleaders or the local Advocates as the case may be, then advance intimation may be given to the Legal Cell in the Board so as to enable the Legal Cell to make alternative arrangement.

Sub: Economy in travel expenses etc. of tours undertaken by V.I.Ps. including Ministers and other dignitaries—Instructions issued—Reiterated—Regarding.

Instructions have been issued in the Government Orders first and second read above regarding expenditure to be incurred by Heads of Departments, State Public Sector Undertakings/Boards on Government's functions chaired by V.I.Ps.

2. Further instructions have been issued in the letter third read above regarding economy in expenditure to be followed in making arrangements when the Chief Minister/Ministers participate in Government functions/functions organised by Government Departments/Undertakings. It has also been directed in the letter third read above that the Government functions in which the Chief Minister participates in a district the authorities arranging the function may incur expenditure upto a ceiling of Rs. 75,000/- per function towards construction of dies/rostrum, P.A. system, Podium, furniture etc. In spite of all these instructions, instances of extravagant and wasteful expenditure being incurred by the Heads of Departments, District Authorities and Public Sector Undertakings in making arrangements during the functions attended by Ministers, V.I.Ps. and other dignitaries have been brought to notice of the Government.

3. It has also come to the notice of the Government that the instructions is circumvented by involving many agencies and making each agency pay less than the ceiling. Advertisement expenditure is often treated as outside the ceiling.

4. I am, therefore directed to request that the instructions issued in the references cited should be scrupulously followed. It is also clarified that the District authorities arranging the Government function in which the Chief Minister participates should incur expenditure upto a ceiling of Rs. 75,000/- only per function including all items. Expenditure on advertisement should be part of this ceiling amount.

**CENTRAL BOARD OF IRRIGATION AND POWER
RULES GOVERNING "CBI & P JAWAHARLAL NEHRU BIRTH CENTENARY YEAR
RESEARCH AWARDS"**

Preamble

1. These awards have been instituted by the CBIP during Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru Birth Centenary Year and will be awarded each year for outstanding research contributions in the field of Water Resources/Power Engineering Technology, Utilisation, etc.

Nature of Award

2. There will be 4 Research Awards. Each award will be of the value of Rs. 5,000/- and will be made annually for notable and outstanding research contributions applied for fundamental in the harnessing of the Power/Water Resources (including Irrigation, Flood Control and allied subjects) of the country for the benefit of its people. Of the four Awards two will be for Research contributions in the field of Power Engineering Technology, Utilisation etc., while the other two will be for research contributions in Water Resources Development and Utilisation including Irrigation, Flood Control and allied subjects (i. e., Pollution Control, Conservation, etc.).

Purpose

3. For recognising outstanding Research work in engineering technology, utilisation, etc., in the field of power/water resources.

Eligibility and Selection of Awardee

4. Any Engineer/Scientist or any individual of India engaged in the field of water/power resources development/utilisation will be eligible for the award, provided the contribution of the person is not less than 5 years in the field of Research.

5. The award will be bestowed on a person who, in the opinion of the Selection Committee constituted by the Board, has made conspicuously important and outstanding research contributions to power/water resources development of the country in the preceding 3 years of the award.

6. The award will be made on the basis of contributions made primarily by work done in India. The criteria for selection of the paper/contribution for the award will be the following:

- (i) Important additions modifications or improvements to the available design criteria.
- (ii) Important contribution to present day knowledge of physical phenomenon or behaviour of relevance to engineering practice.
- (iii) New approach or methodology for utilisation or development of new technology or new techniques for solving problems in applied engineering technology.
- (iv) Specific contribution made in the following fields:
 - (a) Investigation Methods
 - (b) R & D Management
 - (c) Standardisation
 - (d) Project Monitoring
 - (e) Software Development
 - (f) Planning
 - (g) Protection
 - (h) Development
 - (i) Management
 - (j) Conservation
 - (k) Pollution Control

Nominations

7. (a) Names of candidates may be proposed by any Member of Board or Secretary to Government in the Irrigation and Power Departments of the State/Government of India or Chairmen of State Electricity Boards, Vice-Chancellors of Universities, Directors of I.I.T's., I.I.Sc., Directors of the Research Stations or Laboratories or Principals of Engineering Colleges.

Each such nomination shall be on the basis of proforma enclosed accompanied by detailed statement of work and contribution of the nominee by the sponsor, and a critical assessment report bringing out the importance of the significant R & D contributions of the nominee made during the preceding three years. The nominations along with copies of work assessment reports will be received by Member Secretary, Central Board of Irrigation and Power before a specified date of every year.

(b) A candidate once nominated should be considered for a total period of 3 years if otherwise eligible unless revised nomination is received. Once such nomination is received, the Member Secretary, CBIP, may correspond directly with the candidate for supplementary information, if necessary.

(c) Nominations will be generally called for in April each year and such of the nominations received upto end of August will be considered each year along with those received earlier for the previous year awards. However, there is no need to wait for the call for nominations for sending the nominations to CBIP.

Selection Committee

8. On receipt of nominations, the Member Secretary of the Board shall circulate the list of nominees along with the detailed statements of work and attainment of each candidate to members of the Selection Committee.

9. If a member of the Selection Committee has sponsored any candidate or if a nominee is from his Organisation/Institution for the award, he should not be a member of the committee but should stand down during its consideration by the committee.

10. The bestowing of the award for any year may be withheld. If in the opinion of the Board, sufficiently meritorious candidates are not forthcoming in any year, the Board may withhold the selection for the award during that year.

Presentation

11. The awards will be given at a formal presentation ceremony to be arranged by the Board.

12. The recipient may give an address on the subject in which he had made notable contributions at any of the R&D Sessions of the Board or have a report published in the CBIP "Irrigation and Power" Journal as mutually agreed.

Following the orders of the Government of Tamil Nadu in G.O. Ms. No. 1035, (Finance) dt. 8-11-67, and Government Letter No. 30606/Pension/89-1, dt. 15-3-89, the Board ordered in (Per) B.P. (F.B.) No. 56, dt. 19-7-89, among others, that the employees who were absorbed permanently in Neyveli Lignite Corporation are eligible for :

- (i) Pro-rata pension and D.C.R.G., based on the length of their qualifying service under Board till the date of absorption.

and

- (ii) Proportionate Pension from the day following the date of absorption.

But according to Para (1)

(iii) of G.O. Ms. No. 1035, dt. 8-11-67 the pro-rata pension, Gratuity etc., admissible in respect of the services rendered under the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board would be disburseable only from the date, the absorptionist would have normally superannuated had he continued in Board's service. It has also been ordered any further liberalisation of pension rules decided upon by Government after the permanent absorption in Neyveli Lignite Corporation would not be extended to them.

2. The Board employees absorbed in Neyveli Lignite Corporation have now represented that,
- (i) they may be sanctioned and paid pension from the date of absorption.
- (ii) The Pension payable shall be recomputed based the revision of pension ordered by the Board from time to time based on the pay commissions recommendations of Government of Tamil Nadu.

3. Based on the above requests of the absorptionists in Neyveli Lignite Corporation, the Chief Internal Audit Officer, have sought certain clarification from the office. The requests of the absorptionists in Neyveli Lignite Corporation, and the clarifications sought by the Chief Internal Audit Officer, have been examined and the following orders are issued :-

Clarifications Sought by C.I.A.O. :

POINT 1: Grant of Pension to the absorptionist from the date of absorption.

The Chief Internal Audit Officer suggested that the request may be examined by the Board Office Secretariat Branch if necessary in consultation with the Government.

The Chief Internal Audit Officer, Audit Branch may be requested to indicate clearly the points on which clarification is to be sought for from Government.

POINT 2: Extension of orders of revision of Pension.

The compilation of the Demand Collection Balance Statement which only can reveal the true arrears position, could not be carried out by the Madras Electricity Distribution Circles for the period from 1—1—1982 to 30—9—1987 in the proper format as per the procedures laid down in this regard. However, subsequently the circles had chosen to submit Demand Collection Balance Statement in a consolidated way i.e. based on the total debits available as per cost journal of the Revenue Branch and the total credits available as per Cash Book maintained in Revenue Branch. This consolidated D.C.B. showed credit balance as on 30—9—1987 in respect of all the Madras Electricity Distribution Circles, which aspect had to be clarified to audit.

2. Further the issue of clearance certificate informing the arrears position by the revenue branches of the Madras Circles to a good number of consumers turned to be incorrect as the consumers had proved with the evidence of receipts or white meter cards, that the arrears exhibited in the certificate had already been settled. This sort of omissions and commissions on the part of Revenue Branches was objected to by the consumers Action Group/Council and appropriate action was sought for, for proper remedial measures.

3. The Superintending Engineers of Madras Electricity Distribution Circles (South, North and Central) were asked to explain the causes leading to the non-preparation of the D.C.B. in complete shape for the period from 1/82 to 9/87 as per procedures laid down and also for the incorrect issue of clearance certificate by the Revenue Branches for the same period i.e. 1/82 to 9/87.

4. The Superintending Engineers of the Madras Electricity Distribution Circles had attributed the following reasons to the non-preparation of D.C.B. and incorrect issue of clearance certificate.

(i) When the pattern of meter readings, assessment and collection had been a new one with effect from 1—1—1982 under Card Billing System, the staff both in Section Office and Revenue Branch could not accommodate themselves to the sudden change over in the absence of adequate staff for all round work in revenue side. The cash book writing originally done at Central Office in Madras Electricity Distribution Circles had to be maintained at Revenue Branch after the introduction of Card Billing i.e. after 1—1—1982, for which no staff was sanctioned for more than a year. The non-writing of cash book resulting in non-distribution of collection records had affected the credit postings. The staff i.e. Junior Assistant /Assistant who had opted to card billing work, had been transferred from Revenue Branch, and the vacancies caused in Revenue Unit due to such transfer, remained unfilled for more than two to three years.

At the initial stages of the introduction of Card Billing System (i.e.) from 1—1—1982 the basic records of Debit (i.e.) Meter Card Registers had not been maintained in the Section Offices for nearly a year which has affected the Debit postings.

5. The change over from the cycle-wise pattern of reading and billing to sector-wise and the maintenance of records in Section Offices different to that of the same maintained in Revenue Branch had also affected the posting of consumer ledger leading to many handicaps in the preparation of DCB and issue of clearance certificate.

6. The non-writing of cash book and the non-posting of consumer ledger in the revenue branch due to dearth of staff and change over from cycle-wise to sector-wise had very much handicapped the works in Revenue Branch in general. Though the cash book writing was brought upto date subsequently i.e. during 1988 and the consumer's ledger was posted with available records, the balancing of ledgers could not be carried out since there had been many omission of entries both in respect of debit and credit for a good number of services due to non-availability of basic records like Meter Card Registers/Green Meter Card and collection records viz. ARC and PCB, both in section office as well as in Revenue Branch. The basic and original records could not be traced and made available for posting at this distant date.

7. Such incomplete postings disabled the work of balancing and furnishing the correct arrears position both from the point of view of compilation of DCB as well as issue of clearance certificate. In this connection, the Superintending Engineers have further added that when there is a credit balance without being able to account further credits individually to a good No. of consumers due to non availability of collection records, it will not be proper and justifiable to demand the arrears from such of those consumers against whom the ledger shows incomplete postings. It will be also quite improper and unreasonable to expect the consumer to produce the white Meter Card/receipts at such a distant date for the back period.

8. The Superintending Engineers of Madras Electricity Distribution Circles/South, North and Central had proposed that the DCB could be prepared in a consolidated manner for the period from 1/82 to 9/87 taking into account the debit as per cost journal already furnished for those period and the credit as per cash book already written for those period duly counter-checked with Mail Transfer figure.

9. The difference between the demand and collection as prepared on those lines will show credit balance. But, care will be taken to ascertain the known arrears in respect of Government Departments, Local Bodies, Disconnected Services for which action already taken under RD/RR Act, Agricultural Services, services involved in Court cases and other cases where the arrears could be fully ascertained based on original records. The arrears list will be prepared for known and definite arrears and the amount arrived at accordingly will be debited to 092 Billing Suspense together with an amount representing the difference between the consolidated debit and credit for the period from 1-1-82 to 30-9-87 by putting a consolidated journal entry so that the opening balance as on 1-10-87 will represent the known arrears only for which action will be taken to pursue the realisation of arrears vigorously.

10. The then Chief Engineer and Special Officer/Distribution (Madras) had studied the proposal and recommended for its implementation. He has also categorically stated that in view of the many handicaps experienced during the past period, there is no other go except to accept the above proposal as the best solution, as a sort of remedial measure not only in the matter of compilation of DCB but also in connection with the issue of clearance certificate by the revenue branches of Madras Circle.

11. The Board carefully examined the proposal of the then Chief Engineer and Special Officer/Distribution (Madras) as detailed below :

(i) To prepare the consolidated Demand Collection Balance Statement for the period from 1-1-82 to 30-9-87 duly taking into account the opening balance as available as on 31-12-1981, subsequent monthly cost journal and cash book figures, furnished to the Central Office of the Circles for the period from January 1982 to September 1987.

(ii) The Revenue Branch will take care to check the cash book figures with that of the amount available as per Mail Transfer.

(iii) The Central Office (Revenue Co-ordinating Section) of the Circles will also counter check the cost journal figures and cash book figures now furnished by the Revenue Branch for the above period, with that of the same available as per Monthly Accounts already sent to Headquarters.

(iv) The Revenue Branch will prepare a schedule of arrears prevailing as on 30-9-1987 for the following categories.

- (1) Arrears in respect of Government Departments both Central and State.
- (2) Arrears in respect of Local Bodies inclusive of over head tanks.
- (3) Arrears in respect of Agriculture Services.
- (4) Arrears in respect of Disconnected Services for which action taken or to be taken under R.D./R.R. Act.
- (5) Arrears in respect of services involving Court cases.
- (6) Arrears in respect of all other cases where the revenue units can firmly establish the correctness of the arrears with basic records available for assessment and collection.

The Schedule to be prepared will contain the details viz., (1) Service No. (2) Name of the consumer (3) Tariff applied (4) Amount of arrears (5) Nature of arrears (6) Period of arrears (7) Whether disconnected or alive (8) Action taken for realisation (9) Remarks.

(v) The difference between the total debits and total credits as prepared as per item (i) plus the amount of known arrears to be prepared as per item (iv) will be debited to 092 Billing Suspense account so as to bring out the known and definite arrears as opening balance as on 1-10-1987.

(vi) It is nearly 4 years since the bi-monthly billing came into force and collections would have been received against the known and definite arrears. Such collections may be noted in the schedule against the respective services so that it will be helpful in the matter of follow-up action to be taken up further in realisation of arrears in general.

(vii) The Superintending Engineers will ask the Revenue Branches to issue clearance certificates only for the period after 1-10-87. The issue of clearance certificates for the previous period (i.e.) 1-1-82 to 30-9-87 need be insisted upon only in respect of known and definite arrears.

(viii) The Superintending Engineers will ensure that the postings of Debit, Credit and balancing of ledgers have been carried out without omission on or after 1-10-87, so as to facilitate the 092 reconciliation work as well as the compilation of D.C.B. and also issue of clearance certificates to the consumers informing the correct and true arrears position.

(ix) The compilation of D.C.B. from 1-10-87 onwards will be prepared and submitted to headquarters in a pucca manner as per procedures and formats laid down for the preparation.

12. The Board accepts the above proposals and directs that the proposal contained in para 11 above shall be implemented forthwith.

13. The Superintending Engineers will take due care and instruct the officers concerned to take all possible and effective steps to maintain proper accounts in Revenue Branch after 1-10-87.

14. The receipt of this may be acknowledged to Deputy Financial Controller (Revenue), Office of the Chief Financial Controller. The action taken may be reported on or before 30-9-91.

Sub: Research and Development—Replacement of open type fuse unit by moulded case circuit breakers (M.C.C.B.) in L.T. distribution system—Orders—Reg.

The Research and Development Wing took up a detailed study on the usage of proper type of moulded case circuit breakers (M.C.C.B.) in place of open type fuse units in the L.T. side of distribution transformers.

The study has revealed that M.C.C.B. is superior to open type fuse unit as indicated below.

- (1) By providing M.C.C.Bs. in the L.T. Distribution network it gives protection on L.V. side of the distribution transformer for eliminating the rate of failure of distribution transformer, against over load and short circuits and also protection against Surges.
- (2) Maintenance free throughout its life.
- (3) Compact, Smaller size and lighter weight.
- (4) Highly dependable
- (5) Provides reliable and effective protection.
- (6) Safety for operating personnel.
- (7) Easy for installation
- (8) Wide range of current rating upto 1200 A with interchangeable plug settings.

Rural Electrification Corporation, New Delhi has also issued specification for L.T. Circuit Breakers (REC Specification 18/1981 (Rev) dt. 30—11—82) for protection of distribution transformers.

In view of the above, it is decided to introduce the M.C.C.B. in place of open type fuse units in distribution transformers.

In the first phase, the M.C.C.Bs will be provided in Urban areas where the distribution transformer capacity is 250 KVA and above.

Future proposals for new L.T. feeders and for replacement of open type fuse units may be made out with provision for moulded case circuit breakers (M.C.C.B.) with the required capacity, on proper sanction from the competent authority and subject to budget provision of the Circle.

instructions were issued in the memo cited, inter alia, for condoning the excess over demand quota upto 5% in respect of H. T. Industries other than those covered under clause 6 (iii), (iv), (v) and (xv) of R & C orders, in para 1 sub para (2).

2. In partial modification of the orders issued, the Chief Engineers/Distribution of all Regions and Superintending Engineers of all Electricity Distribution Circles are hereby informed as follows:

- (i) The excess demand recorded over the quota upto 10% by H. T. Industries (other than those covered under clause 6 (iii), (iv), (v) and (xv) of R & C order) may be condoned and power supply continued by resetting the maximum demand indicator; but it shall be charged at thrice the normal tariff rate for maximum demand (including the penal levy which is at twice the normal rate) each time.
- (ii) This facility is permitted only for the first two such occasions in a month. The violation of demand quota, which is either more than 10% or within 10% but repeated for third time in the same month, shall suffer the routine disconnection for 7 days and shall be charged at thrice the normal tariff rate.

3. The modified instructions issued in this memo. shall apply only upto 30th September '91 and the instructions already issued in the memo cited may be followed thereafter until and unless instructed otherwise.

(1) The builder or promoter of the complex in whose name the supply continues, may be permitted to extend power supply to the individual owners of the flats etc., or to the lessees by installing sub-meters and to collect the cost of consumption of power from them on no profit or no loss basis (i.e. sharing of expenses of consumption of Electricity) and this shall not be treated as unauthorised extension of supply or sale of energy.

(2) In case, the promoter or builder of the complex would wish not to have any stake in the complex after promoting the complex, the service connection originally availed may be permitted to be transferred in the name of an Association or Society that may be formed in the complex and registered and the service agency so formed may be permitted to extend supply to the individual owners of the flats etc., or lessees by installing sub-meters and to collect the cost of consumption of power from them on no profit or no loss basis (ie. sharing of expenses of consumption of electricity) and this shall not be treated as unauthorised extension or sale of energy.

Sub : Civil works—Excavation and blasting—Avoiding over excavation and refilling—Guidelines issued:

1. It has been brought to notice that in certain works, excessive excavation was made resulting in extra expenditure not only for excavation itself but also for refilling to the required level.
2. To avoid such a contingency, the following guidelines are issued for adoption by all the concerned staff and officials:
 - 2.1. Excavation shall be started only after the excavation drawing for the inter-related areas is released by the technical office or the consultant.
 - 2.2. It should be specifically stated in the specification for excavation that the normal blasting should be stopped about one metre away from the side-boundaries of the required excavation. Similarly, normal blasting should be stopped at about one metre above the required bottom level of excavation. For finishing the sides and bottom to the required dimensions and levels, only controlled blasting should be adopted.

It should specifically be stated in the specification that if extra excavation more than the tolerance stipulated has resulted due to indiscriminate blasting adopted by the contractor, the extra excavation will not be paid for.
 - 2.3. If over-excavation has to be done to meet the foundation requirement due to nature of rock like faults, joints and soft pocket, this should be reported to technical office and clearance should be obtained. In such cases, the technical office should examine whether it is economical to re-design the foundation structure to suit the site conditions met with or to do extra excavation and refill it with concrete of appropriate mix. In areas where good rock is met with, extra excavation should be avoided by adopting pre-shearing or pre-splitting method of hard rock excavation.
 - 2.4. Excavation work should generally be awarded to a single contractor for the entire area.
 - 2.5. Only competent and experienced contractor who is well versed with controlled blasting, pre-shearing methods etc. should be awarded with such intricate excavation works.
 - 2.6. During actual excavation, if the site condition seems to vary significantly from the assumption already made, this should be immediately reported back to technical office and work executed according to the final decision given by the technical office.
