VI. Training :

The following special programmes were conducted during March '91:

- (1) 10 days Induction Training Programme conducted at Staff Training College for newly recruited Assistant Engineers from 11—3—91 to 21—3—91.
- (2) Six days training programme on Fire Fighting conducted at Tamil Nadu Fire Service State Training School from 18—3—91 to 23—3—91 for 25 persons from Mettur Thermal Power Station, Ennore Thermal Power Station and Multi-storeyed Building.
- (3) One Assistant Executive Engineer deputed to USA to undergo a comprehensive training on Gas Turbine Generators for two weeks from 18—3—91.

VII. LT agricultural - water pumped out for agricultural purpose used for drinking purpose—treated as not violation :

In circular Memo. No. 30/SE/IEMC/PO(T)/Tariff 1(3)/91-2 dated 7—3—91, it has been clarified that the water pumped out from wells having agricultural service connections if used for drinking purpose by the villagers, it need not be treated as violation so long as there is no sale of water by the well owner. All cases where such compensation charges have been made but not collected may be withdrawn. No refund of amount paid need be made. Balance claim if any may be withdrawn.

VIII. Rectification of pay anomaly :

In B. P. Ms (Ch) No. 84 (Adm. Branch) dt. 8-6-91 and Memo. No. 092914/800/E4/A1/88-2 dt. 12-3-91, detailed instructions in regard to rectification of pay anomaly of senior employees on par with juniors when seniors draw incentive increment for passing test/acquiring special qualification while on prervised scale and the juniors draw it in revised scale has been issued.

IX. Withdrawal of ceiling limit for purchase of materials :

In B.P. (Ch) No. 48 (Tech. Branch) dt. 1-3-91, the monthly ceiling limit fixed for the circle Superintending Engineers in the purchase of materials has been withdrawn subject to the condition that the annual financial allotments are not exceeded.

X. Purchase of items under imprest—Limit for individual items—enhancement :

In B.P. (FB) No. 17 (Sectt. Branch) dt. 8-3-91, the Board has enhanced the limit of payment of petty bills by imprest holders fixed at Rs. 25/- to Rs. 50/-. The maximum limit in individual cases that can be met from imprest by the imprest holders or with proper sanction shall be limited to Rs. 100/- by all imprest holders in TNEB on a uniform basis.

XI. Increase in quantum of power cut :

In G.O. (Ms) No. 418 (PWD) dt. 14-3-91, the Government has enhanced the power cut on HT industries with a permitted demand of 130 KVA and above to 30% on both energy and demand subject to a minimum quote of 130 KVA.

Oxygen plants, freezing plants, cold storages of sea food industries, liquid nitrogen plant of Tamil Nadu Co-operative Milk Producers' Federation Ltd., Salem, Reller Flour Mills and liquid nitrogen plant of Kamarajar District Co-operative Milk Producers' Union Ltd. Sulakkurai shall be subjected to 15% cut on both demand and energy.

XII. HT Industries — R & C — Bulking and transfer of quote :

In Memo. No. SE/IEMC/EE2/A1/FPC GI/D 1036/91 dt. 14-3-91 detailed instructions in regard to bulking/transfer of power quota among HT industries functioning under the same management has been issued.

XIII. Stores—Adjustment of excesses/shortages of materials—Delegation of powers :

In B.P.(Ch) No. 3 (Accts. Branch) dt. 12-3-91, the Board has delegated full powers to all Chief Engineers of Distribution, generation, construction and projects for adjustments of excesses or shortages of materials of likenature.

XIV. Agricultural applicants—Extension of time beyond 90 days' for entering readiness :

In Memo. No. Addl CE/IEMC/EE3/AEE2/636/91 dt. 22-3-91, it has been stipulated that Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles may grant extension of time upto one year from the date of expiry of the initial 90 days' notice period to the agricultural applicants to report their readiness. This extension may be in spells but should not exceed one year.

XV. Permanent retention of temporary posts :

In B.P. (FB) No. 18 (Sectt. Branch) dt. 25-3-91, the Board has issued orders in regard to making permanent the temporary posts which are continued from time to time.

XVI. No objection certificate for effecting services in poramboke lands :

In Memo. No. Addl CE/IEMC/EE3/AEE2/645/91 dt. 30-3-91, it has been instructed that the procedure of obtaining no objection certificate from Revenue Authorities for effecting supply to houses/buildings constructed in poramboke and other departmental lands should be followed.

XVII Delegation of powers to Chief Engineers/Superintending Engineers for sanctioning conveyance advance :

In B.P. (FB) No. 19 (Sectt. Branch) dt. 25-3-91, the Board has delegated powers to Chief Engineers of Distribution Region and Superintending Engineers to sanction conveyance advance upto Rs. 80,000/- in individual cases subject to the conditions stipulated in the B.P.

XVIII. State award 1989 to TNEB as a best employer for physically handicapped :

TNEB has been selected for "State Award 1989 Rolling cup" and State Award Merit certificate as best employer for physically handicapped. These awards were presented by His Excellency the Governor of Tamil Nadu at a function held at Valluvar Kottam, Madras on 24-3-91 and were received by Thiru K.N. Rathinavelu, Secretary/TNEB.

ESTABLISHMENT—Rectification of Pay Anomaly to Senior Employees on par with Juniors when Seniors draw incentive increment for passing test/acquiring Special Qualification while on pre-revised Scale and the Juniors draw it in revised scale—Orders—Issued.

Proceedings :

According to Regulation 6 (2) of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Revised Scales of Pay (Workmen) Regulations 1989 contained in (Per.) B. P. (FB) No. 57 (Sec. Br.) dated 5-8-89/ Regulation 6 (2) of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Revised Scales of Pay (Officers) Regulations 1989 contained in (Per.) B.P. (FB) No. 60 (Sec. Br.) dt. 24-8-89, in cases where an Employee, who had drawn incentive increment in the pre-revised scale and drawn more pay than his Junior prior to 1st December 1988 draws less pay than his Junior in the revised scales of pay, consequent on the sanction of incentive increment in the revised scales of pay to the Junior for acquiring the same/higher/Special Qualification after introduction of revised scales of pay, then the pay of the senior shall be stepped-up to the level of the Junior from the date from which the junior draws such higher pay.

2. The position obtaining prior to 1—12—88 with regard to rectification of pay anomaly to a senior on par with the Junior, when the Junior draw higher pay consequent on the grant of incentive increment for passing a test/acquiring a special qualification in the revised scale was that for certain class of employees and during certain periods, pay anomaly in such cases was rectified and this was not adopted in all cases uniformly. Many representations have been received for allowing rectification of pay anomaly in all cases of the above kind falling prior to 1—12—88 uniformly. The matter has been examined.

3. After careful consideration, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board directs that when the senior employees draw incentive increment for passing a test/acquiring a special qualification in pre-revised scales of pay (i. e. 1974 scales or the 1979 scales) and the junior to such senior employees drew incentive increment for passing the same test/acquiring the same special qualification after fixation of his pay in a succeeding revised scale of pay and thereby the junior happens to draw pay more than the senior, then the pay of the Senior shall be fixed notionally on par with the Junior. In some cases the eligibility for the incentive is from the date next to the date of passing the test/acquiring Special Qualification, and in some other cases, the eligibility for the incentive is from the date of promotion. Rectification of pay anomaly shall be allowed notionally from the date next to the date of passing the test/Examination by the Junior or from the date of promotion of the Junior as the case may be. Rectification of pay anomaly in such cases shall also be made subject to the following conditions :—

- (i) Both the junior and senior should have acquired equally the same test qualification special/higher qualification and the same incentives granted including for Family Planning Operation etc., after entering into the Board's Service.
- (ii) The Senior should have acquired the qualification much earlier than the Junior when the rate of increment was less.
- (iii) The quantum of incentive for acquiring the qualification is the same when both the Junior and Senior acquired the qualification i. e. "One increment or two increments etc. for acquiring a particular qualification. In other words, if when the senior acquired the qualification, the incentive was one increment and the same was raised to two increments when the junior acquired the qualification, then the senior has no right for pay parity with the Junior.
- (iv) Rectification of pay anomaly in these cases shall be done subject to satisfying the guidelines issued in Memo. No. 027939—G1/88—1/dt. 8—5—88.
- (v) As the pay anomaly in these cases are generally due to the fact that the incentive granted to the senior in the pre-revised scale got merged in the revised scale of pay fixation, rectification of anomalies in such cases shall be made by invoking the provision in Regulation 48 of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulations.
- (vi) The pay anomaly of the Senior shall not be considered if the Pay of the senior is not deflated by circumstances like going on leave on loss of pay, imposition of penalty, revised scales pay fixation with comparatively lesser service weightage, etc. and the pay of the Junior is not inflated by circumstances like grant of additional incentives, revised scales pay fixation with comparatively higher Service Weightage etc.

IMPREST—Purchase of Miscellaneous items under imprest—Limit for individual petty items of expenditure—Enhancement to Rs. 50/- —Orders issued.

(Per) B. P. (FB) No. 17.

Proceedings :

At present, petty bills are to be paid by imprest holders on their own responsibility upto Rs. 25/- without precheck by Audit excepting in the case of payment of Railway freight. According to para 358 of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Manual, the Superintending Engineers of a Circle may, by a general order, permit payment from their imprest by Executive Engineers upto

Rs. 100/- by Assistant Engineers upto Rs. 100/- and Assistant Engineers upto Rs. 50/- in each case without precheck by Accounts Branch and such payments should be as few as possible; circumstances of such payments being recorded on the vouchers. Detailed bills/vouchers are not sent along with each Petty Cash Book Statement for precheck by Audit and sub vouchers for individual payment exceeding Rs. 100/- alone are included in the recoupment contingent bill. In such cases of payment, the Counter Signature of next higher authority or controlling authority is required for admission of claim by the Audit.

2. Consequent on the increase in prices of all commodities, the question of enhancing the limit of imprest on payment of petty bills by imprest holders on their own responsibility was engaging the attention of the Board. After careful examination, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board hereby directs that :-

(i) The present limit of payment of petty bills by imprest holders on their own responsibility fixed at Rs. 25/- excepting in the case of payment of railway freight as per para 358 (4) of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Manual shall be enhanced to Rs. 50/- (Rupees Fifty Only).

(ii) The maximum limit of expenditure in individual cases that can be met from "imprest" by the imprest holders on their own responsibility or with proper sanction shall be restricted to Rs. 100/- (Rupees One hundred Only) by all imprest holders in the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board on a uniform basis.

(iii) In urgent cases where the Petty payments exceeding Rs. 50/- (Rupees Fifty Only) is met from imprest shall be supported by a sanction order as per powers allowed to each imprest holders and the copy of such sanction order should be enclosed with the recoupment bill for admission of such claim.

3. Necessary amendment to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Manual will be issued separately by the Chief Financial Controller, Board Office Accounts Branch.

Ref : From Chief Financial Controller letter No. 00012/CAC/89 dated 22-5-89 addressed to all Chief Engineers and Supdg. Engineers.

The delays in sanctioning Temporary Advance, Part final withdrawal etc. are brought to the notice of the Board. The matter has been examined carefully and found that such delays can be avoided, had the guidelines been followed scrupulously. Hence the following guidelines of Accounts Manual for Personnel Accounting issued in the reference cited are reiterated for strict observance :—

(i) PARA

- 8.20 An employee-wise subsidiary ledger either in card form or in ledger form shall be maintained in form No. P A3.
- 8.21 The balances at the end of every month in the individual G.P.F. account of employees shall be totalled up and tallied with the balance of G.P.F. as shown in account No. 57.120 in the Main Ledger.
- 8.22 Advances and part final withdrawal sanctioned against Provident Fund balances shall also be accounted in the same General Provident Fund account No. 57.120.

His Provident Fund Card shall also be transferred. The fact of journalisation shall be recorded in Last Pay Certificate.
- 8.24 The transferee shall also pass a Journal entry as indicated in Annexure I(6) and record the fact in Last Pay Certificate.
- 8.32 When an employee is transferred from one circle to another the outstanding balance recovered from him shall also be transferred through a Journal as indicated in Annexure-I(5) and (6).
- 8.45 The fact of Journalisation shall be recorded in Last Pay Certificate. No separate advice and acceptance is necessary.
- 8.46 The transferee unit shall also pass a Journal entry as indicated in Annexure I(11) and record the fact in Last Pay Certificate.

In the memoranda cited, instructions were issued setting out the procedure for grant of special casual leave to the office bearers of Unions for attending periodical meetings before Board's officials and conciliation meetings before Labour Department officials besides other discussions held on the initiative of the management. Certain clarifications have been raised as to

whether special casual leave to be granted for the purposes mentioned above can be combined with Earned leave/Unearned leave on Medical certificate etc. and whether permission can be granted in between special casual leave and Earned leave/Unearned leave on Medical certificate etc.

2. The matter has been examined and the following clarifications are issued.

3. As per the existing instructions in the memoranda cited, the competent authority to grant casual leave shall grant special casual leave also for the purposes mentioned in para 1 above. Hence, the procedure followed for grant of casual leave shall equally apply to grant of special casual leave. As per the existing procedure, ordinarily casual leave cannot be availed of in combination with any other kinds of leave.

4. It is observed that in certain cases, the special casual leave has been prefixed or suffixed or combined with Earned leave/Unearned leave on Medical certificate etc., which is highly irregular. It should, therefore be ensured that henceforth special casual leave shall not be prefixed or suffixed or combined with any kind of leave such as Earned leave/Un-earned leave on Medical Certificate etc., and these instructions shall be scrupulously followed without any deviation.

In the Board's Proceedings cited, orders were issued permitting an employee promoted or appointed to a higher post to exercise option electing a method of pay fixation to fix his pay in the higher post, prescribing also a time limit of one month from the date of promotion or appointment for giving the option declaration.

2. It has been brought to the notice of the Board that certain employees promoted or appointed to higher posts plead that they are not aware of the orders permitting the option and hence fail to exercise option within the time resulting in monetary loss to them. They subsequently represent for acceptance of the belated option, which could not be accepted. Therefore, it has been decided that in the order of promotion/appointment itself, communication may be given to the employees to exercise option electing on or the other method of pay fixation on promotion/appointment to the higher post within one month from the date of promotion/appointment.

3. Accordingly, it is hereby ordered that an Option Format as in the Annexure to this memo. shall be enclosed with the order of initial promotion or appointment of an employee to the higher post and he should be requested to return the Option Format duly filled in within one month from the date of promotion or appointment. He should also specifically be informed that if the Option Format is not received within the above said period of one month, his pay in the higher post will be fixed under the method mentioned in para 1 (i) of the Option Format, if he is an ordinary grade employee/Selection Grade employee carrying a lower scale of pay or under the method mentioned in para 1 (iii), if he is a selection Grade employee and the Selection Grade scale and higher post scale are identical.

Appeal under Clause 15 of the Letters Patent against the Order of the Honourable Mr. Justice Nainar Sundaram dated 16—3—87 and made in the exercise of the Special Original Jurisdiction of the High Court in Writ Petition No. 1476 of 1987 presented under Article 226 of the Constitution of India to issue a Writ of Certiorari calling for the concerned records from the first respondent pertaining to circular No. 10202/VC/83-4, dated 12—7—83 issued by the respondent and quash the impugned order.

ORDER :— This Writ Appeal coming on for hearing on this day upon acruing the Grounds of Appeal, the Order of The Honourable Mr. Justice Nainar Sundaram dated 16—3—1987 and made in the exercise of the Special Original Jurisdiction of the High Court in Writ Petition No. 1476 of 1987 and all other papers material to this case and upon hearing the arguments of Mr. T. Fenn Walter, Advocate for the Appellants and of Mr. K.P.H. Thulasiraman, Advocate for the Respondent, the Court made the following order :—

(Judgement of the Court was delivered by the Honourable the Chief Justice).

The appellant filed Writ Petition No. 1476 of 1987 seeking a writ in the nature of certiorari after calling for the concerned records pertaining to circular No. 10202/VC/-1/83-4 dated 12-7-1983 issued by the Chairman, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, Madras, and to quash the said circular. A learned Judge of this Court dismissed the writ petition vide order dated 16th of March, 1987. Hence this appeal.

2. Learned counsel for the appellant submitted that the impugned circular issued by the Chairman amounted to addition of misconducts in the mis-conduct enumerated in the Standing Orders of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, and since the circular was not covered by clause (vi) of Standing Order 30 of the Standing Order, the Chairman could not issue the circular without getting the Standing Orders modified. The learned counsel submitted that the circular issued by the Chairman was unfair labour practice and amounted to victimisation legitimate trade union activities. Reliance has been placed by the learned counsel for the appellant on **Glaxo Laboratories (I) Ltd., v. Labour Court, Meerut & others.** (1984 1 LLJ. 16).

3. On behalf of the Electricity Board it has been submitted that the impugned circular was issued by the Chairman in exercise of his powers to maintain discipline in the Board, and in the absence of any malice on his Part, the same could not be questioned. Learned Counsel for the respondents has also submitted that the circular did not amount to modification of the Standing Order and that the Chairman had reasonable justification for issuing the same. Learned counsel went on to submit that the judgement in Glaxo laboratories case (supra) has no relevance and that the case is covered by the judgement of the Division Bench of this Court in **P. K. Kesvan Nair and another v. Chief Engineer (Personnel, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Madras** (W.A. Nos. 703 and 704 of 1987 decided on 9-9-1987) and **K. Venkataraman and another v. The Regional Chief Engineer (Distribution) Tamil Nadu Electricity Board and another** (W. A. Nos. 1194 and 1195 of 1986 decided on 7-10-1987).

4. The argument which has been raised before us by the learned counsel for the appellant was canvassed before the Division Bench in W.A. Nos. 703 and 704 of 1987. The challenge in those writ appeals precisely was to the circular dated 12-7-1983 and the ground of challenge was the one as raised before us. Before the Division Bench also reliance had been placed on Glaxo Laboratories case (supra) The Division Bench, after considering the arguments raised before it, found that the decision in Glaxo Laboratories case had no relevance because the question as to whether conduct contrary to the norms specified by the employer would be a mis-conduct by virtue of the norms being specified and whether such embargo of doing certain acts qua employees was lawful and reasonable, did not fall for consideration before the Supreme Court in Glaxo Laboratories case. The Bench, after detailed discussion, found that no fault could be found with the circular issued by the Chairman and consequently the circular (impugned herein also) was upheld.

5. In a Division Bench Case in W. A. Nos. 1194 and 1195 of 1986 **K. Venkataraman and another v. The Regional Chief Engineer, (Distribution); Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, Madras** once again the challenge was to the validity of the circular issued by the Chairman of the Electricity Board dated 12-7-1983. The Division Bench noticed that the directions contained in the circular were not confined to the Members of any particular trade Union but were intended for all the employees of the Electricity Board. The Bench considered the question whether the direction contained in the circular was reasonable or not, and relying upon the judgment of the Supreme Court in **S. A. Kini and another v. Union of India and others** 1985 (2) L.L.J. 421 case to the conclusion that the Chairman's circular dated 12-7-1983 was a reasonable one. The Bench also repelled the argument that the circular dated 12-7-1983 offended any of the provisions of the Standing Orders or any other law and hold that the circular dated 12-7-1983 did not contravene any provision of law.

6. Both the judgments given by the Division Benches noticed above have upheld the validity of the circular dated 12-7-1983 and repelled the arguments which have been raised before us also. We are in respectful agreement with the view taken by the Division Benches in the aforesaid judgments.

7. Learned counsel for the appellant contended that since the members of a trade union have a right to make collections by way of donations from any person, the circular offends against those legitimate trade union rights. Such an argument was also raised on behalf of the appellants in W. A. Nos. 1194 and 1195 of 1986 noticed (supra) and was repelled in paragraph 8 of the judgment.

8. In view of the settled law by this Court, we find that no fault can be found with the circular dated 12-7-1983, and consequently the writ appeal fails and is dismissed. No costs.

Proceedings :

In the G. O. cited, the Government have issued Orders introducing "Foreign Service Card" in respect of Government Servants deputed to other Organisation on Foreign Service. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board has also decided to introduce "Foreign Service Card" in respect of the employees of the Board deputed to other Organisations on Foreign Service.

2. Accordingly the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board directs that the "Foreign Service Card" the format which is annexed shall be adopted and enclosed as Annexure to the terms and conditions of deputation issued in respect of all employees of the Board deputed to Foreign Service. The methods of sending the Service Books of the individuals to the Board Office, Audit Branch shall be dispensed with.

3. The Heads of Offices should fill up the particulars required in page 1 and Part I of Page-2 in the Foreign Service Card after duly verifying the Service Books of the deputationists and send the same to Board Office, Audit Branch along with the proceedings containing the terms and conditions of deputation of the employees of the Board. The Board Office, Audit Branch in turn, will communicate the rate of leave salary and Pension Contribution to the foreign employers by filling in Part-I of Page-4 and forward the Service Card to the Heads of Offices for safe custody.

4. As soon as the period of deputation is over, the Heads of Offices should forward the Service Card to the foreign employer with a request to fill in Parts-I and II of Page 3 and return the same to the Parent Office. On its receipt from the foreign employer, the Heads of Offices should complete Part-II of Page-2 of the Service Card and forward it along with the Service Book to the Board Office Audit Branch. The latter will in turn complete either Part-II of Page-4 or Part-III of Page-5 and return the same to the Heads of Offices concerned.

5. All Heads of Offices should handle the "Foreign Service Card" with care like the Service Book, and they should maintain a Register to keep a watch over their movement till a claim satisfaction Certification is issued by the Board Office Audit Branch.

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 70(a) of the Electricity (Supply) Act 1948: (Central Act 54 of 1948), the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board makes the following amendment to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Employees' Travelling Allowance Regulations.

Amendment

In the said Regulations, after Regulation 39 the following shall be added as Regulation 39-A, namely—

"39.A. Reimbursement of transport charges at Delhi and other State Headquarters outside Tamil Nadu by the employees on Tour.

The employees of the Board visiting Delhi or other State Headquarters outside Tamil Nadu for official purpose may be permitted to claim the actual transport charges, if any incurred by them during their stay there along with their other Travelling Allowance claims, subject to the following conditions:—

- (i) If Car is provided by the host Government or Electricity Board at Delhi or other State Headquarters outside Tamil Nadu, no transport charge will be admissible.
- (ii) If the employee uses the Board's Car available at Delhi, no transport charge will be admissible.
- (iii) If the employee uses the Tamil Nadu House Car, he should produce the cash bill issued by the Reception Officer, Tamil Nadu House, Delhi, with the following certificate:

"Certified that the trip was undertaken for official purpose only."
- (iv) If a private Taxi is engaged, the claim should be supported by the following certificates:
 - (a) Certified that at Delhi Board's Car or the Tamil Nadu House Car is not available and Car is not provided by the host Government or Electricity Board and that at the other State Headquarters outside Tamil Nadu, Car is not provided by host Government or Electricity Board;
 - (b) Certified that the trip was undertaken for official purpose only;
 - (c) Certified that the rate at which taxi charge is claimed in the bill is in accordance with the current rates prevailing in Delhi/other State Headquarters outside the Tamil Nadu.
- (v) The actual transport charges payable shall be limited to a ceiling of Rs. 30/- per day in the case of transport by Taxi and Rs. 15/- per day in the case of transport by Auto-rickshaw.
- (vi) If more than one employee travels in the same vehicle, the claim of the actual transport charges will be restricted to one employee only."

I am to invite your attention to Paragraph 3 in the Board's Proceedings cited ordering for payment of Additional Dearness Allowance to all employees of the Board with effect from 1—7—90.

2. In the Government Order second cited, it was subsequently ordered by Government that in respect of cases of employees of Public Sector Undertakings/Boards who were drawing pay above Rs. 3500/- per mensem the amount of Additional Instalments of Dearness Allowance fell due from the 1st July 1990 onwards should not be paid in cash but should be deposited as small savings in National Savings Scheme/National Savings Certificate. But in the case of such of those employees drawing pay above Rs. 3500/- p.m., no recovery on account of instalments of Dearness Allowance falling due with effect from 1—7—90 shall be made during the last 4 months of the service of the employees.

3. In view of certain practical difficulties involved in depositing the Additional Dearness Allowance in National Savings Scheme/National Savings Certificate the Government have been addressed for permitting the Board, to credit this Additional Dearness Allowance into the respective General Provident Fund Account of the employees of the Board with effect from 1—3—91 instead of in National Savings Scheme/National Savings Certificate.

4. I am therefore to request that in respect of employees of the Board drawing pay above Rs. 3500/- p.m. the Additional Dearness Allowance may be claimed from the salary for the Month of March, 1991 onwards, but shall not be paid to the employees. The deductions thus made may be credited to "Account Code No. 44.416. Addl. D.A. impounded". This order need not be made applicable in respect of the employees drawing pay above Rs. 3500/- per mensem in the last four months of their service.

PENSION—Liberalised Pension Formula—Extension of benefits to retired Board employees who were in receipt of Pension on 1st October, 1979—Ready reckoner for qualifying service beyond 30 Years—Orders—Issued.

Proceedings :

In the Board Proceedings cited, the Board has issued orders extending the liberalised Pension formula to the retired Board-employees who were in receipt of Pension on 1st October, 1979. The Government in the reference second cited, have issued a ready reckoner in respect of Pensioners who were in receipt of Pension on 1st October 1979 in whose cases the earlier ready reckoner to which they have opted has not taken note of their length of qualifying service beyond 30 Years. It has been decided to adopt the Government orders in the Board also.

2. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, accordingly, directs that the ready-reckoner annexed to this order be adopted for revision of Pension under Liberalised Pension Formula in respect of Pensioners who were in receipt of Pension as on 1st October, 1979 and who have put in qualifying service of more than 30 Years, in whose cases the earlier ready reckoner to which they have opted has not taken note of their length of qualifying service beyond 30 years.

3. The recomputation of Pension shall be subject to the conditions stipulated in the Board Proceedings first cited. The formula for different periods takes into account the various factors mentioned in the Board Proceedings cited. Table II-A to II-F cover the period corresponding to the period in Table II of the Board Proceedings cited and similarly the other tables correspond to the periods in Table III to VIII respectively of the Board Proceedings cited. As the table I of the Board Proceedings cited is one of the general applicability to all Pensioners who retired prior to 1st July 1960, no further revision is contemplated. Pensioners who retired during the period from the 2nd October 1970 to 30th September 1979 with a qualifying service of 51 Six monthly periods and more shall also get their Pension revised based on the Table V—Part II to VIII as indicated in the Annexure.

4. The increase in Pension due to this revision shall be taken into account for the purpose of Dearness Allowance on Pension from 1st October, 1979.

5. These categories of Pensioners Viz., those who opted for earlier ready reckoner have to apply for revision within six months from the date of issue of this Board Proceedings and to receive pension based on ready reckoner.

6. The Chief Internal Audit Officer will recompute the Pension and authorise payment of revised pension in respect of those pensioners who apply for revision of Pension based on ready reckoner.

7. Each Pensioner who was in receipt of Pension as on 1st October, 1979 with net qualifying service of more than 30 years and retired between 1st July 1960 and 1st October 1970 and those who retired with more than 51 Six monthly periods and retired between 2nd October, 1970 and 30th September, 1979 and opted for the ready reckoner annexed to B.P. Ms. (FB) No. 77, (Secretariat Branch), Dated 15-9-1984 shall apply for recomputation of pension in the prescribed form along with documentary proof to show the date of retirement and the net qualifying service to the Chief Internal Audit Officer. In case documentary evidence are not available with the Pensioner, he/she has to submit the application in the prescribed form to the head of the office in which he/she last served to certify the net qualifying service. The application along with the certificate will be forwarded by the head of the Office to the Chief Internal Audit Officer for further action. The Pensioners who originally opted for ready reckoner and subsequently got their pension, revised as per actual calculation with reference to Board's Letter No. 25378/N1/86-6, Dated 17-2-1987 are not eligible for recomputation.

8. In cases where pensioner who was alive on 1st October 1979 and opted for ready reckoner appended to B. P. Ms. (FB) No. 77 (Secretariat Branch), Dated 19-5-84 but died subsequently, his/her legal heirs are entitled to life time arrears with effect from 1st October 1979 till the date of the Pensioner's death. For this purpose, the legal heirs may also apply to the Chief Internal Audit Officer (in the prescribed form intended for the pensioners with suitable modifications) with documentary proof showing (i) the date of retirement, (ii) the date of death and (iii) the net qualifying service of the pensioner, if available with them. Otherwise, they have to apply through the head of the office in which the Pensioner last served to enable the head of the Office to certify the net qualifying service and to forward the application to the Chief Internal Audit Officer. The Chief Internal Audit Officer will then refix the Pension of the late Pensioners with reference to the ready reckoner and make the payment of life time arrears to legal heirs.

Instances have come to the notice that the water pumped out from the agricultural services is used for drinking purposes by the villagers living nearby the agricultural service connections. Such utilisation of water takes place due to scarcity of drinking water in the area due to drought and other conditions and that no sale of water is indulged in by the agricultural consumers.

The matter has been examined and the following instructions are issued :

The water pumped from wells having agricultural service connections, if used for drinking purpose by the villagers due to scarcity of drinking water in the area, it need not be treated as violation, so long as no sale of water is indulged in by the service owner or his representatives.

In view of the above, in all the cases where compensation charges have been levied and not collected so far, the compensation charges levied may be withdrawn. In cases where the compensation charges have been paid in part, no refund of the amount paid be made. However, balance claim if any may be withdrawn.

Tamil Nadu Electricity Board after careful consideration approves the proposals of Chief Engineer/Civil Designs for close monitoring of the leakages in Water Conductor System of kadamparai Power House and to do rectification if any required and accordingly the following orders are issued.

(1) The Water Conductor System already pressurised, to be continued under pressure till recommissioning activities of Unit I is completed by having a close monitor on the leakage through all the 3 adits especially Adit II. However if any appreciable increase in leakage is noticed the whole operation may have to be stopped and the system shut down after obtaining the consent of the Member (Generation).

(2) After commissioning of Unit I (which is programmed by the middle of March 91) the Water Conductor System is to be dewatered and a thorough inspection of the entire Water Conductor System is to be made.

(3) M/s. Southern Structurals Limited, Madras is to be deployed to carryout thorough inspection and rectification works required in Pressure Shafts I and II.

(4) The work of Inspection and rectification of Pressure Shafts I & II as in item 3 above is to be taken up by Chief Engineer/Pykara Ultimate Stage H. E. Project and Thiru A. Baliga, Asst. Executive Engineer/Mechanical is to be specifically posted incharge of this work.

(5) M/s. Jessop and Company Ltd., Calcutta and M/s. Tungabhadra Steel Products Ltd., Tungabhadra Dam are to be addressed to send their experts during the shutdown period to have a detailed inspection of Head Race Surge Shaft Gates and suggest rectification works.

(6) Chief Engineer/Research and Development, Madras is to see that all the generation staff of Kadamparai under his control are fully involved in the maintenance operation and inspection of pressure shafts and rectification of Head Race Surge Shaft Gate Works.

(7) Detailed Inspection of Head Race Tunnel is to be conducted by the Generation Staff and defects/leakages if any to be identified and necessary rectification works to be taken up.

The uniform rates for scrap materials were last fixed during the year 1973 and communicated in Chief Engineer's Memo. No. X/Stores/F122/Vol. VI/JSA/No. 150 dt. 19—4—1973. The absence of periodical revision of uniform rates for scrap materials will result heavy accumulation of debit balance under variance account. As such to overcome this situation, the list of 129 Nos. of Scrap materials was communicated in this office letter cited with the request to furnish the rate of scrap materials based on the latest auction sale at Circle level.

2. The Superintending Engineers of the Circles have sent the rates of scrap materials in response to the reference referred to and based on the reports received a consolidated list of revised rate for 136 items of scrap materials is communicated so as to have a uniform rate to be adopted for all the scrap materials.

3. The concept of Standard rate for all the scrap materials is applicable to all Accounting units such as Distribution Circles, Generation Circles, Construction Circles, Project Circles and Workshops Circles etc. Hence the Standard rate for the scrap materials must be adopted by all the Superintending Engineers.

Bulking/Transfer of power quota among High Tension industries functioning under the same management is permitted as per the instructions contained in the references cited above.

2. In continuation of the above, the following instructions are issued :

- (1) The H. T. Industries which enjoy/apply for the transfer/bulking of power quota facility shall not be exempted from being levied the minimum charges, stipulated in clause 18.02 of Terms and Conditions of Supply, like any other industry, in case their recorded demand is less than 20% of sanctioned demand.
- (2) While permitting bulking/transfer of power quota to H.T. industry under the same management, a specific condition should be stipulated in such sanctions, that the transfer of quota sought for by the consumer and permitted by the Board shall be without prejudice to the condition vide para 3 of clause 18.02 of Terms and Conditions of supply, which reads as follows :
"Where the Restriction and Control orders are applicable, the maximum demand charges will be for the actual recorded demand irrespective of the sanctioned demand and also subject to the minimum charges leviable for the service had the recorded demand been 'nil'. The maximum demand charges shall constitute the minimum monthly charges, if the demand recorded is nil, where the Restriction and Control orders are applicable, the minimum shall be 20% of the rate fixed for Maximum Demand in the Tariff Notification"

In other words, the Maximum Demand charges to be levied shall be on the actual recorded demand or 20% of the sanctioned demand whichever is higher (irrespective of whether the maximum demand recorded is nil or otherwise).

- (3) The Chief Engineers (Distribution) of all Regions and the Superintending Engineers of all Electricity Distribution Circles are also informed that in cases where bulking/transfer of quota has been permitted already from a H.T. Industry, which is liable for payment of the extra levy of 3 paise per unit over and above the normal tariff as per tariff notification to continue to avail supply at 11 KV instead of at 33 KV or EHT voltage, such transfer of quota shall be stopped after giving a 3 months' notice to the consumer immediately. Till the notice period is over, the transfer in such cases may be continued to be permitted with the specific condition that the extra levy of 3 paise per unit shall be levied also for the quota sought to be transferred to other sister uni's and after this condition is agreed to the consumer.

The Chief Engineers (Distribution) of all Regions and Superintending Engineers of all Electricity Distribution Circles are also requested to furnish the details of the category of cases in para 3 above, in case, such cases are there in their respective Regions/Electricity Distribution Circles.

Government in G.O. Ms. No. 418 PW Dated : 14-3-1991 have announced Power cut of 15% on energy retaining 15% cut on demand on H.T. Industries with a permitted demand of above 130 KVA of Oxygen Plants, Roller Flour Mills, Freezing Plants, Cold Storage of Sea Food Industries and Liquid Nitrogen Plants (at Salem and Sulakkarai) and a cut of 30% on both demand and energy on all other H.T. Industries which are presently under power cut with a permitted demand of above 130 KVA. This power cut is to be given effect from 18-3-1991.

Consequent on the above, following instructions are issued :

1. Superintending Engineers shall arrange to take meter reading and reset M. D. Indicators in Board's and consumer's trivector meters, wherever available on 18-3-91.
2. Revised quote for industries for whom quota is regulated as per base consumption may be fixed by the Superintending Engineers and quota issued immediately.
3. H.T. Power intensive and continuous Process Industries may be permitted to work 5 or 6 days a week but not exceeding 21 days a month or 21 days continuously in a month without cut on demand but not exceeding permitted demand.
4. H. T. Steel Rolling and other Non-continuous process H.T. Industries may be permitted to work 4/5 days a week but not exceeding 18 days in a month or 18 days in a month continuously without on demand but not exceeding the permitted demand.
5. However, H. T. Industries who are already working under restricted days may be permitted revised number of working days as above without waiting for their request.
6. Transfer of demand quota already permitted among sister concerns may be continued under present level of cut also until and unless such request of transfer is withdrawn by the consumer.
7. Computer print outs indicating revised quota in respect of H. T. industries to whom computed quota, additional off peak night quota have been permitted by head quarters are being communicated separately. Till such time normal quota and additional night quota under the present cut for above such industries may be permitted temporarily as follows by the Superintending Engineers themselves forthwith.

Order :

In view of the failure of generator transformer at Madras Atomic Power Project leading to shut down of Unit-1, shortfall in generation at Ramagundam Super Thermal Station, poor supply of coal to Thermal Stations and increase in the consumption, the power position of the State has become critical. The Government have examined the power position and decided that power cut on all High Tension industries with a permitted demand of above 130 KVA shall be increased to 30% on both demand and energy and the cut on Oxygen Plants, Roller Flour Mills, Freezing Plants, Cold Storage of Sea Food Industries and Liquid Nitrogen Plants with a permitted demand of above 130 KVA shall be increased to 15% on energy from the present level of 10%, retaining the demand cut at the present level of 15%. The power position will again be revised by the end of April 1991.

2. The following notification shall be published in an extra-ordinary issue of Tamil Nadu Government Gazette dated 14-3-91.

Notification

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 3 of the Tamil Nadu Essential Articles Control and Requisitioning Act, 1949 (Tamil Nadu Act XXIX of 1949), the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby makes the following amendments to the Tamil Nadu Restriction on consumption of Electricity Order, 1976 issued in G.O. (Ms) No. 1111 Public Works Dated 24-7-76 and as amended subsequently.

The amendment shall come into force with effect from 18-3-91.

Amendment

(1) The following shall be substituted as Clause 3(i) in the said Order :

Clause 3 (i) : A cut of 30% on base demand and base energy as defined in clause 7 (i) and (ii) of the said order be applicable to all High Tension Industries with a permitted demand of above 130 KVA provided that all High Tension Industries will be given a minimum quota of 130 KVA.

(2) The Sub Clauses (iii), (iv), (v), (vii) and (xv) of clause 6 shall be substituted as follows:

Clause 6 (iii) : All oxygen plants shall be subjected to 15% cut on both demand and energy.

(iv) : All Freezing plants and cold storages of sea food industries shall be subjected to 15% cut on both demand and energy.

- (v) : The liquid nitrogen plant of Tamil Nadu Co-operative Milk Producers Federation Ltd., Salem shall be subjected to a cut of 15% on both demand and energy.
- (vii) : All Roller Flour Mills shall be subjected to 5% cut on both demand energy.
- (xv) : The liquid nitrogen plant of M/s. Kamarajar District Co-operative Milk Producers' Union Ltd., Sulakkarai shall be subjected to 15% cut on both demand and energy.

The attention of all Chief Engineers/Distribution Region is invited to the references cited above.

A quantity of 30 Nos. sick transformers has to be repaired per month per circle against a staff strength of 43 Nos. in each Special Maintenance sub-division as per the workload agreement executed in October 1985 (vide Page No. 1044 of TNEB Gazette/1985). But it is seen that the quantities of sick transformers repaired in most of the circles are much less than the quantity fixed in the workload agreement.

In this connection it is to be pointed out that the Comptroller & Auditor General of India in his audit report for the period ended 31-3-1988 had pointed out that huge expenditure was incurred by the Board by giving contract to outsiders for repair of sick transformers by way of transport cost, excise duty and sales tax which is avoidable. Also the Comptroller & Auditor General had remarked that the target for repairing transformers in Special repair yards was not achieved proportionate to the staff strength deployed for the works.

After discussion with the Public Undertaking Committee, Chairman wanted to take steps to immediately increase the repairing of sick Distribution transformers in Special Maintenance of distribution circles by at least 20%. During the Chief Engineer/Distribution meeting held on 20-9-90, Chairman also desired to fix target for repairing transformers in Special Maintenance taking into consideration seasonal variation in sickness and the present staff strength of repair shops.

Accordingly the target per month per circle for repairing sick transformers in Special Maintenance is now fixed as detailed in the Annexure.

All the Chief Engineers/Distribution/Region are requested to ensure that infrastructure such as space for Special Maintenance sheds, scientific equipments, T&Ps and for full complementary staff are provided in Special Maintenance sections and see that the activities of Special Maintenance section are accelerated to achieve the target fixed now, by June 1991.

The Superintending Engineers Distribution Circles may be instructed suitably and action taken on this reported to apprise Chairman about the performance of repair works.

In the circular memo. cited, the Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles have been delegated with full powers to grant extension of time beyond the initial 90 days' notice period issued by the Executive Engineers to the agricultural applicants to report their readiness.

It has been represented that if a specific time limit for, such extension is prescribed, agricultural applicants would know about the importance of such extension and would not treat it as a routine matter. The Board cannot also afford to keep this issue open indefinitely.

The matter has been examined and after careful consideration, the following instructions are issued in supersession of the orders already issued in this regard :-

The Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles are empowered to grant extension upto one year from the date of expiry of initial 90 days' notice period issued by the Executive Engineers to the applicants of agricultural pumpsets to report their readiness.

The above extension of time may be granted by them in different spells subject to a maximum period of one year irrespective of the reason put forth by the applicants and irrespective of whether the application requesting extension of time is received before or after the expiry of notice period/extended period. Sub : Effecting service connections to houses constructed in Poramboke lands/ Departmental lands—Insisting of No Objection Certificate—Regarding.

Ref : 1. Cir. Memo. No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE2/171/89/ dated 8-6-89.

2. Govt. (PWD) Lr. No. 131295/U2/88/dated 15-2-91.

In the Circular memorandum cited, it has been ordered that production of 'No Objection Certificate' should be insisted upon for effecting supply to service connections to houses/buildings constructed on Government lands/Poramboke lands and lands owned by other Departments.

In view of the representations from public to effect electricity supply to buildings constructed in poramboke lands without insisting 'No Objection Certificate' from Revenue authorities, the Secretary to Government (Public Works Department) was addressed to obtain orders of the Government in this regard.

The Secretary to Government (Public Works Department) in reply (Vide letter cited in reference 2) has stated that the existing procedure of obtaining 'No Objection Certificate' may be continued regarding supply of electricity to the houses constructed in poramboke lands and other department lands.

Hence, it is reiterated that the procedure indicated in Circular memorandum cited may be followed for effecting electricity supply to houses/buildings constructed in poramboke and other department lands.

In this connection, the attention of the Chief Engineer (Distribution), Madras Region is also invited to the instructions issued in this office Lr. No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE2/403/90/ dated 28-7-91 and Lr. No. ACE. IEMC/EE3/AEE2/624/91/ dt. 6-3-91.
