#### II. Hydro inflows:

#### VI. Special priority for domestic supply of Board employees:

In Memo.No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE2/D 925/91 dt. 3—1—92, the Board has ordered that special priority may be accorded to Board employees if they apply for domestic service connections in their name and for the houses owned by them.

#### VII. Supply to 22/11 KV metering sets by consumers — Acceptance:

In Memo No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE 1/D 241/91 dt. 3—1—92, the Board has extended the time upto 30—6—92 for accepting metering sets of 22/11 KV from consumers subject to the conditions stipulated in Memo. No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE 1/726/91 dt. 12—9—91.

#### VIII. Illegal restoration of disconnected service — Assessment:

In B.P. (FB) No. 5 (Tech. Branch) dt. 4—1—92, the Board has ordered that the following text may be added in the schedule Part-I of Terms and Conditions of Supply under the heading "Violation and Theft of Energy" at the end of clause 9.03.

"The extra levy for illegal restoration of supply to a disconnected service may be calculated as follows:—

Units recorded by the meter during the period of disconnection x Highest LT tariff rate x 3".

#### IX. Extension of time for merger of services:

In B.P. (FB) No. 6 (Tech. Branch) dt. 4—1—92, the Board has given time upto 30—6—92 for merger of services of consumers coming under clauses 8.01 and 8.02 of Terms and Conditions of Supply.

#### X. Development charges for street lights in rural areas :

In Memo. No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE2/D 945/92 Dt. 23—1—92, the Board has ordered that development charges towards provision of street lights in Village Panchayats and Town Panchayats need not be collected wherever the cost have been provided by the Revenue authorities.

#### XI. Stores-Purchase-Adoption of Govt. order:

In B.P. (FB) No. 13 (Techl. Branch) dt. 20-1-92, the Board has ordered the adoption of Severnment Order Ms. No. 330 Finance (BPE) Department dt. 3-5-91 without any modification.

#### XII. Reduction of demand cut from 20% to 10% on HT industries :

In G.O. (Ms) No. 106 (PWD) dt. 27—1—92, the Government has reduced the demand cut on HT industries with a permitted demand of above 130 KVA from 20% to 10% from 27—1—92. The demand cut on oxygen plants, Roller Flour Mills, Freezing plants, cold storage of sea food industries and liquid nitrogen plants at Salem and Sulakkarai will continue at 10%.

## XIII. Electricity tariff—Amendment to Schedule to Tamil Nadu Revision of Tariff rates on supply of Electrical Energy Act 1978:

In G.O. Ms. No. 102 (PWD) dt. 24-1-92, the Government have decided that following the hike in coal prices, the tariff for all categories of consumers except domestic, agriculture and huts be stepped up with effect from 1-2-92.

#### Proceedings:

As per Sub-rule 2A of Rule 3 of the I.E. Rules 1956, persons employed in Generating Stations of 100 MW and above and associated Sub-stations should have been trained in a recognised institute approved by Central Electricity Authority. The institute that has to be recognised permanently by Central Electricity Authority should be a full-fledged one with all facilities by way of providing good buildings for the Institute, Hostel, Workshops etc. During the inspection of the existing Thermal Training Institute at Ennore by Central Electricity Authority in November '88, the Central Electricity Authority had pointed out that the existing facilities do not conform to the desired standards and have requested to construct suitable buildings to accommodate the Institute, Hostel, Workshop etc. Only provisional recognition has been granted by Central Electricity Authority upto March '93 on the condition that the new Institute Complex at the proposed site of the New Power Project should be ready by that time. The permanent recognition will be accorded after the new complex is completed and inspected by them. The consultants of Human Resource Development appointed by Tamil Nadu Electricity Board also recommended to provide Hostel facilities Toilets, Water Cooler etc., for the Thermal Training Institute.

After careful consideration of the above, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board approves the proposal of costruction of new buildings for Institute, Hostel and Workshops for the Thermal Training Institute at North Madras Thermal Power Project (Vallur Camp), at a total cost of Rs. 2,18,35,000.00 (Rupees Two Crores Eighteen Lakhs and Thirty Five Thousands only) as detailed below.

#### Proceedings:

1. In B.P. first cited, the Board ordered decentralisation of certain works from Central Office to the Divisions and the Executive Engineers were delegated with powers to sanction and pay the personal claims of RWE staff. In the B.P. second cited, the Board delegated powers to the Executive Engineers to pass the bills and draw cheques in respect of personal claims of RWE. In the B.P. third cited the Board has approved enhanced monetary powers of the Executive Engineers to sanction payment of rent upto Rs. 200/- (Rupees Two hundred only) per month in each case for the private buildings occupied by the Board subject to fulfilment of norms as ordered in B.P.Ms.No. 117/dt. 6—3—84.

- 2. Apart from the above existing orders, Chief Engineer/Distribution/Vellore has now sent a proposal to delegate the powers to the Executive Engineers of O&M to pass hand receipts for payment of Rent/Sweeping charges and Water carrier charges by Cheque through field officers.
- 3. The Chief Engineer/Distribution/Vellore has sent a proposal stating that at present Hand Receipts for payment of sweeping, Scavanging and Water carrier charges are prepared by the field offices based on Superintending Engineers sanction and make payment out of imprest-In the case of payment of rent, Hand Receipts are passed by Central Office and Cheques issued to the concerned either direct to the house owner or through the field officers for payment.
- 4. By this arrangements there is avoidable delay in payment due to transit, or want of fund in imprest etc. Such delay creates discontentment among the House owners leading to threat for vacation of buildings. Similarly the Sweepers, Water carriers also complain to Inspecting Officer about the non-payment of the charges payable to them.
- 5. The other Chief Engineers of Distributions have also agreed to the above proposal of the Chief Engineer, Distribution, Vellore Region.
- 6. After careful consideration, the proposal to delegate powers to the Executive Engineers of O&M Divisions to Pass Hand Receipts and to make payment towards Scavanging, Sweeping charges, Water carrier charges and rent etc., to the officers and offices under their control based on the sanctions accorded by the Superintending Engineers of the Circles is considered and approved, to help to speed up the payments and avoid delays.
- 7. The Chief Engineers of Distribution Regions and Superintending Engineers of O&M Circles are directed to adhere to the above instructions and act accordingly. They are requested to acknowledge receipt of the Boards Proceedings.

#### ORDER:

A number of orders have been issued on the system of preferences for purchase of stores by Government Department from Public Sector Undertakings and Small Scale Industries and medium/large scale units in Tamil Nadu. The Secretaries Committee on Public Enterprises discussed the various orders issued by Government from Industries and Finance Departments. The

Committee recommended that a comprehensive order covering all aspects may be issued in supersession of all the orders so far issued on this matter. The committee recommended that the system of Purchase preference in fovour of Public Sector Undertakings for puchase of products manufactured by them should continue. The committee also recommended determination of an order of priority in the purchase from the institution.

- 2. The Government have examined the recommendations of the Secretaries Committees on Public Enterprises and in supersession of the orders issued in the Government orders read above issue the following orders.
- 3. There shall be a system of purchase preference for purchase of stores etc. by Government Departments. Purchase preference implies that a Government Department shall in making any purchase first approach the institutions/State Public Sector Undertakings in the order given in para 4 below:
- 4. The following institutional priority in regard to purchase of Stores, servicing and repairing will be followed:—
  - (a) Jails, Borstal Schools and units of the Jail Department.
  - (b) Units of Tamil Nadu Khadi & Village Industries Board and the units under the Control of the Board.
  - (c) Modern Training-cum-Production workshop at Muttukadu and the Poonamallee Rural Employment Society, Chengalpat.
  - (d) Tamil Nadu State Government Corporations (Public Sectors Undertakings) Production and servicing units of Government Departments and Co-operative Institutions with share capital assistance sanctioned by Tamil Nadu Government.
  - (e) Products manufactured within the State and supplied through SIDCO under its "Market Assistance Scheme".
- 5. The scheme of purchase preference as outlined in paras 3 and 4 above implies that there can be direct approach to these instructions and no tender is required. It may be noted that this will cover only the products manufactured by them and not products merely marked by them, except in the case of SIDCO. No purchase preference will be available for joint Sector enterprises. While effecting such prices, as no tender procedure is contemplated; prices/delivery schedule/quality can be negotiated. This should be done within a reasonable time. In case any department considers that any institutions in para 4 is overcharging it may take up the issue with the concerned administrative department which shall decide the issue in consultation with Finance (BPE) Department.
- 6. Whenever products/services cannot be supplied by instructions listed in (a) to (e) in para 4, above the open tender system shall be followed. In adopting open tender system the price preference as below will operate.
  - (a) Small Scale Units including tiny sector units registered in Tamil Nadu will continue to be given 15 (Fifteen) percent preference viz-a-vis medium/large industrial units and Small Scale Industries units registered in other States.
  - (b) Medium/large scale units located within the State will continue to be given 5 (five) percent price preference viz-a-vis units located outside the State.
  - (c) Co-operative Institutions of Tamil Nadu shall be entitled to a price preference of 5% for products directly manufactured by them viz-a-vis medium/large industries. As against small scale industries they shall be on the same footing.
- 7. In bid evaluation under the open tender system envisaged in paragraph 6, the State Public Sector Undertakings are directed to exclude sales tax but including excise duty for comparision. Price preference shall be given after exclusion of sales tax.
- 8. These orders shall, in addition to Government Departments also apply to purchases made by all local bodies and public sector undertaking and statutory Boards.
- 9. The price preference to small scale Industries, in Tamil Nadu shall be applicable to purchase of articles covered by the rate contracts entered into by the Director General of Supplies and Disposals.

- 10. Since the policy of purchase and price preference will not be effective in the absence of an enforcing mechanism, Government also order that the Industries Commissioner and Director of Industries & Commerce will monitor the implementation of this policy in so far as the Small Scale Industries and other industrial units are concerned including public sector undertakings. Handlooms Handicrafts Textiles & Khadi Department will monitor the policy with regard to Khadi and Handlooms.
- 11. Any unit aggrieved by the implementation of the policy as set out in this order will bring it to the notice of Industries, Commissioner and Director of Industries and Commerce or Handlooms Handicrafts Textile & Khadi Departments as the case may be, who will then get in touch with the Government departments concerned and redress the grievances in consultation with the Finance (BPE) Department.
- 12. In the case of purchase of drugs, orders already issued by Healthy Indian Medicines & Health & Family Welfare Department in G.O. Ms. No. 578 dt. 30—3—90 will continue to operate.

Electricity—Electricity tariff—Amendment to schedule to Tamil Nadu Revision of Tariff Rates on supply of Electrical Energy Act, 1978—Notification—Issued.

#### Order:

Section 4 of the Tamil Nadu Revision of Tariff Rates on Supply of Electrical Energy Act, 1978 (Tamil Nadu Act I of 1979) empowers the State Government to amend by notification, the provision of the Schedule to the said Act which lays down the tariff rates for consumption of electrical energy payable to Tamil Nadu Electricity Board by any a consumer.

- 2. Following the hike in coal prices, the Government have decided that the tariff for all categories of consumers except domestic, agriculture and huts be stepped up as mentioned in the schedule to this order.
- 3. The following notification will be published in an extra-ordinary issue of the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette dated 24-1-1992.

#### Notification

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Tamil Nadu Revision of Tariff Rates on supply of Electrical Energy Act, 1978 (Tamil Nadu Act 1 of 1978), the Governor of Tamil Nadu here by makes the following amendment to the Schedule to the said Act.

2. The amendment hereby made shall come into force on the 1st February, 1992.

#### Amendment

In the said Act, for the Schedule, the following Schedule shall be substituted, namely:—

#### The Schedule

(See Section 3)

Part A - High Tension Supply

#### High Tension Tariff 1:

Registered factories, tea estates, textiles, Railway tractions, fertilisers, Salem Steel Plant. Heavy Water Plant, Caustic Soda, Calcium Carbide, Aluminium and Potassium Chlorate and all other industrial establishments.

Tariff concession for High Tension Industries coming under High Tension Tariff I.

(1) (a) In the case of new High Tension Industries to be set up in the areas other than the Madras Metropolitan areas, the following concessional tariffs shall be charged for the first three years from the date the consumer is given service connection under High Tension Tariff I:-

> For the first year 60 per cent of the High Tension rates For the second year 70 per cent of the High Tension rates For the third year 80 per cent of the High Tension rates For the fourth year Full tariff.

The above concession shall apply to both unit rates and maximum demand charges. This concession shall not however, be applicable to an industry set up before the 3rd May 1989. The concession shall not also be applicable to a consumer, who utilises power from his own generating units or makes other arrangements for production purposes and utilises the power supplied by the Board for auxiliary purposes only;

Provided that the High Tension Industries set up in any areas (including Industrially Under-Developed Area, notified as such by the Government) before the 3rd May 1989 which are availing tariff concessions or reduction under High Tension Tariff I as on the 2nd May 1989, shall continue to avail the said tariff concession or reduction until the expiry of the period of five years from the date the consumer is given service connection under High Tension Tariff-I.

Explanation-1: For the purpose of electricity tariff concessions for new industries the term 'new industries' shall mean a new investment by any entrepreneur including by an existing industry in any area other than the Madras Metropolitan areas, provided the assets other than cash, of the existing industry are not transferred and shown as assets of the new industry.

Explanation-2: This tariff concession is applicable for a new industrial undertaking and will not be available for any expansion of the industry within the city, township, municipalities or Panchayat Union limits in which the main industry is functioning;

Provided that in the area comprising the satellite town of Maraimalai Nagar New Town developed by the Madras Metropolitan Development Authority, a consumer will be eligible for the concession once irrespective of whether he has availed of it outside Maraimalai Nagar earlier or not irrespective of whether the industry would be considered a new investment, under Explanation-1 above.

**Explanation-3:** A Low Tension Industry converted into a High Tension Industry is not eligible for the concession.

(b) New Industry to be set up in the areas other than the Madras Metropolitan areas which will work night shift only and existing industry, which is introducing night shift only between 9-30 P.M. of a day and 5-30 A.M. of the next day, shall be given a further concession of forty per cent of the appropriate rate for energy consumed during night shift only for a period of seven months from July to January during the period of five years. This concession shall apply to energy rate arrived at after giving the concession referred to in sub-item (a) for new industries;

Provided that in respect of those having one day shift and one night shift, the night shift concession shall stand reduced from forty per cent to twenty per cent.

**Explanation**: For the purpose of this clause "Existing industry" means an industry which has not completed five years from the date the consumer is given service connection and which is still eligible to the concessional tariff rate.

- (c) New Industries in and around Mettur Township which avail of power only during the irrigation season from the 15th July to the 15th January shall be given a tariff reduction of twenty-five per cent. This concession shall be in addition to the other concessions applicable to the new industries mentioned in sub-items (a) and (b) above. If such industries take power during non irrigation season this concession shall not be applicable.
- (d) (i) In all cases of High Tension Supply under High Tension Tariff-I the connected load under lighting and other non-industrial purposes including appliances but not for resale, must not exceed the prescribed limit as detailed in item (iii) and (iv) below. If any excess under lighting and non-industrial load cannot be segregated or brought within the prescribed limit then the whole consumption in the service shall be charged under High Tension Tariff-VII.
- (ii) The new industries to be set up in the Madras Metropolitan areas shall not be eligible for any tariff concessions.
- (iii) In all contracts for power supply at High Tension Tariff-I the connected load under lighting and other non-industrial purposes including appliances but not for resale must not exceed the following prescribed limits:—

For approved demand upto 1000 KVA

1000 KVA to 2500 KVA

... 15 per cent

1000 KVA 10 2000 KVA

... 150 KVA or 10 per cent whichever is higher

2501 KVA to 5000 KVA

... 250 KVA or 8 per cent whichever is higher

A separate meter shall be installed for this purpose. If the load is within the prescribed limit, the consumption in the service shall be charged at High Tension Tariff-I. Any excess load for lighting and non-industrial purposes above the prescribed limit shall be charged under Low Tension Tariff-IX. The consumer shall utilise the energy for Lighting and non-industrial purposes solely for bonafide purposes of the factory and its industrial activities. The Chief Engineer shall be the final authority in deciding the bonafide nature of these purposes. In the case of supply under High Tension Tariff-I the usage of electricity for bonafide purposes of lighting, heating and power loads in the residential quarters within the factory or estate premises shall be metered separately by the consumer, taking High Tension Supply and paid for to the Board at Low Tension Tariff-I. The Units so metered shall be deducted from the total number of units registered in the main meter of the High Tension Supply for billing purposes.

(iv) If a consumer availing High Tension Supply under this tariff does not for any reasons, utilise the power load for more than thirty days, then the energy utilised in the service for lighting and non-industrial purposes shall be billed under High Tension Tariff-VII.

Due to favourable power position, the Covernment have decided to relax the restriction on demand on all High Tension Industries with a permitted demand of above 180 NVA from the present level of 20% cut to 10%. However, such of those High. Tension Industries (viz) Oxygen Plant, Roller Flour Mills, Freezing Plants, Cold Storage of sea food industries and liquid nitrogen plants at Salem and Sulakkarai will continue to have the demand cut at 19%.
