#### I. Generation Particulars :

The maximum grid demand and consumption during June '92 were 3500 MW on 25—6—92 and 73.529 MU on 26—6—92 respectively. The average grid consumption in June '92 was 67.880 MU per day

#### II. Hydro Inflows :

The hydro inflows in June '92 were 1074 MU against 793 MU in June '91 and against the ten year average of 446 MU. The inflows during July '91 to June '92 were 3999 MU against 3289 MU during the same period last year and against the ten year average of 3001 MU.

The monthwise inflow equivalent in MU for the past ten years is furnished in Annexure-II.

**VI. Power Forecast for July '92 to June '93 :**

The unrestricted requirement of power for the period July '92 to June '93 is estimated at 25518 MU while the availability at 23801 MU leaving a deficit of 1717 MU (4.70 MU per day).

The monthwise projected requirement and availability are furnished in Annexure IV.

**VII. Overhaul Programme :**

The overhaul programme of thermal sets during the period July '92 to June '93 is furnished in Annexure V and in chart.

**VIII. Training :**

The following special programmes were conducted during June '92 :—

(1) Two Executive Engineers deputed for Simulator Training in O&M Receiving Stations conducted by M/s. Tata Projects Limited, Bombay from 15-6-92 to 26-6-92.

(2) Two Assistant Executive Engineers deputed for the course on "Computer Modelling of Water Resources Systems" conducted by Indian Institute of Technology/Madras from 15-6-92 to 27-6-92.

(3) Two Assistant Engineers deputed for the course on "Power System Protection" conducted by Power Systems Training Institute/Central Electricity Authority/Bangalore from 25-5-92 to 6-6-92.

(4) Twenty officials from Tamil Nadu Electricity Board deputed for the training on "Personal Computers" conducted by M/s. AIMS Computer Services, Madras from 16-6-92 to 20-6-92.

(5) One Executive Engineer deputed to France for the training as Part of Transfer of knowledge in the field of Modernised Distribution Control Centre (DDC) in France.

(6) Training programme on "Materials Management" conducted for Assistant Engineers at Staff Training College/Madras from 24-6-92 to 30-6-92.

(7) Six officers deputed for the training programme on "Pre-retirement Counselling" conducted by Anna Institute of Management from 3-6-92 to 5-6-92.

(8) Eight Personnel Clerks of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board deputed for the training programme on 'Productivity Orientation Programme for Personal Secretaries' by Anna Institute of Management from 3-6-92 to 5-6-92.

#### **XI. Government of India's Meritorious Productivity Award for Ennore Thermal Power Station for 1990 :**

The Board in B.P. (FB) No. 140 (Tech. Branch) dt. 2-6-92 has sanctioned the distribution of Rs. 2.0 lakhs received from the Government of India to the staff for Ennore Thermal Power Station towards the Meritorious Productivity Reward for the calendar year 1990.

#### **X. Delegation of powers to Chief Engineers (Distribution) and Superintending Engineers (Distribution) :**

In B.P. (Ch.) No. 106 (Tech. Branch) dt. 1-6-92, the Board has delegated powers to CEs (Distribution) and SEs (Distribution) in regard to purchase of stores as below :—

1.	To procure stores materials during 1992-93 under each Purchase Order not exceeding Rs. 75,000/- but limiting the total value of such purchases to the budget allocation.
2.	To procure grills for RCC poles without monetary limit during 1992-93.
3.	To arrange transport of line materials through contractors if necessary during 1992-93.
4.	To procure nine items of line materials upto 31-3-92 following institutional priority.
5.	To procure seven items of stores by exercising powers vide B.P. (FB) No. 17 (Accts. Branch) dt. 5-8-91.
6.	To procure 11 KV strain disc hardwares upto 30-9-92.
7.	To procure 4' x 40W tube lamps for use in Offices and substations upto 30-6-92.
8.	To procure chokes for use in offices and substations for 1992-93.

9.	To procure C type Boxes during 1992—93 from priority institutions.
10.	To purchase all items of stores not ordered by CE/Materials Management with specific approval of CE (Distribution).
11.	To procure 67 items and 10 items meant for Madras Electricity Distribution Circles by the respective Superintending Engineers during 1992—93.

**xi. Ennore - Grant of Annual Thermal Incentive Bonus :**

In B.P. (Ch.) No. 86 (Sectt. Branch) dt. 5—6—92, the Board has sanctioned Annual Thermal Incentive Bonus to the Officers and workmen of Ennore Thermal Power Station for the year 1991—92 for achieving the annual average output corresponding to 4165 KWh/KW.

**xii. Thermal Power Stations - Stagnation - Upgradation of posts :**

In B.P. (FB) No. 15 (Adm. Branch) dt. 8—6—92, the Board has issued orders upgrading certain posts in order to relieve stagnation in the R. W. E. cadre in thermal power stations of Ennore and Tuticorin.

**xiii. Tariff for Agriculture :**

In G.O. Ms. No. 794 (PWD) dt. 2—6—92, the Government has ordered a tariff rate of Rs. 100/- per HP per annum in respect of farmers other than small farmers effective from 2—6—92.

**xiv. Sanction of additional load/installation of air compressors in agricultural services without applying name transfer :**

In Memo. No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE2/D84/92 dt. 9—6—92, the Board has ordered that for sanctioning additional loads and installation of air compressors in agricultural services, legal proof of ownership need not be insisted and it is enough if the applicant produces a certificate from the Tahsildar that he is the actual enjoyer of the land and furnishes an indemnity bond.

**xv. Incentive for persons in Hydro Stations :**

In B.P. (FB) No. 162 (Tech. Branch) dt. 22—6—92, the Board has sanctioned incentive for persons working in certain hydro stations with effect from 1—12—92.

**xvi. Extension of time for merger of services :**

In Memo. No. 636/IEMC/EE (T)/Tariff I (2)/91-3 dt. 23—6—92, the Board has extended the time upto 30—6—93 for merger of services of certain consumers.

**xvii. Power Engineers Hand Book—Financial assistance by Board :**

In B.P. (FB) No. 18 (Adm Branch) dt. 24—6—92, the Board has sanctioned Rs. 3.0 lakhs as assistance to TNEB Engineer's Association for publication of Power Engineers Hand book.

**xviii. Windfarm - Cash award :**

The Board in B.P. (FB) No. 156 (Tech. Branch) dt. 19—6—92 has issued orders for disbursement of Rs. 75,000/- received from the Government of India/Department of Non-conventional Energy Sources for each of the years 1989-90 and 1990-91 towards the first prize for best capacity utilisation in windfarm projects as below :—

(a) Rupees one lakh for providing common facilities for the maintenance staff of Windfarm like water coolers, indoor game materials in each windfarm.

(b) Rs. 50,000/- to be distributed for the O & M and construction circles employees of the Wind Energy Development Cell.

**xix. Energisation of pumpsets during 1992-93 :**

Based on Government Order Ms. No. 875 (PWD) dt. 19—6—92, the Board in Memo. No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE2/D 105/92 dt. 30—6—92 has issued working instructions in regard to energisation of 40,000 pumpsets during 1992-93.

**xx. Promotion—Employee against whom DP is pending :**

In Memo. No. 12146/P1/92-1 dt. 26—6—92, the Board has instructed that the authority should not leave a section of employees without consideration for promotion just for the reason that DPs are pending against them.

In the references cited instructions were issued to all the Departments of Secretariat/ Heads of Departments to send proposals for the disconnection of the Government telephone provided at the residence of Officers under their administrative control (who are due to retire) at the first week of the month of retirement of the Officers concerned.

2. In spite of these instructions many Departments of Secretariat as well as the Heads of Departments send proposals for disconnection of the telephones of retiring Officers only after the date of retirement of the Officers. Therefore, the telephones could not be disconnected on the dates of retirement of Officers. Consequently, the Government Telephones continue to work at the residence of the retired Officers without proper sanction order and the Departments of Secretariat/Heads of Departments in which the Officers were working before their retirement have to face the burden of collecting the rental and Call charges from the retired Officers for retaining the Government Telephone at their residence after their retirement, which result in embarrassment between the Government and the retired Officers.

3. All the Departments of Secretariat/Heads of Departments are, therefore, requested to send proposals for the disconnection of the Government Telephones provided at the residence of Officers under their control who are due to retire, at the first week of the month of retirement of the officers concerned (i.e., if an Officer is due to retire on 30-12-91 proposals should be sent before 7-12-91). In the case of transfer of Officers outside Madras city also the departments of Secretariat/Heads of Departments are requested to send proposals for disconnection of the Government telephones provided at the residence of the transferred Officers immediately on transfer.

Sub : Establishment — Request transfer from one Station to another—One Circle to another — Clarifications issued.

Transfer of employees from one Station to another and from one Circle to another as per their requests is being considered as per the existing guidelines.

2. The employees who apply for transfer from one Station to another within the Circle, also apply for transfer from one Circle to another. The competent authority in the former case is the concerned Superintending Engineer, and the competent authority in the latter case is the Chief Engineer/(Personnel).

3. It is observed that in considering two transfers one after the other as above, based on such requests, not only the condition of one year stay in a Station on duty is not satisfied, but also the requirement that no other request application should be pending and even if any request application pending, it should be in cancellation of earlier request is also not followed.

4. The above procedure is not correct and should be stopped forthwith.

5. In order to avoid such frequent transfers and dislocation in work it is hereby ordered that the employees can either apply from one Station to Station within a Circle or from one Circle to another duly cancelling their earlier request if any. Such cancellation of earlier requests should invariably be noted in the request transfer application against the column provided therefor in the format.

6. The Superintending Engineers are therefore requested to ensure that the above information is furnished in the request applications without omission while forwarding the request transfer applications to this office as otherwise incomplete application will be returned without consideration.

7. These guidelines are applicable to the request transfer applications pending to be considered as on date.

#### Proceedings :

In the B.P. under reference, orders were issued for the upgradation of posts by reviewing the level of stagnation of promotion to certain categories of staff in Regular Work Establishment case in Projects, Hydro Investigation, Basin Bridge Power House and Protection and Communication Circles.

2. It has now been further represented by the unions that promotional opportunities of Regular Work Establishment workmen are also quite low in Thermal Stations who are without promotion for a long time in these areas as compared to their counterparts in the Distribution Circles where the posts are sanctioned with reference to workload settlement which cause scope for normal promotion for them.

3. The matter has been examined and the following orders are issued :

(i) The categories which have no line of promotion like Sanitary Workers, Gardener, Watchman, Inspection Bangalow Warden etc. have been excluded from the purview of this proposal. The Driver category and the category for which state is the unit and the minimum qualification is a Diploma in Elect. Engg have also been excluded from the purview of this proposal.

(ii) Not more than 75% of the utilised posts in Regular Work Establishment categories subject to fulfilling the number of years of service as indicated in (iii) below shall be upgraded temporarily, abolishing an equal number of posts in the lower category for a period upto the date of continuance respectively.

(iii) The upgraded posts should be filled by promotion of the existing employees with reference to their seniority only, subject to fulfilling the number of years of service as indicated below :

1.	Helper and equivalent	15 years (fifteen)	15 years (fifteen)
2.	Wireman and equivalent	15 years (fifteen)	18 years (eighteen)

4.	Foreman II Gr. and equivalent	16 years (sixteen)	26 years (twenty six)

(iv) The incumbent in a particular post should satisfy the requirement of the minimum service in the present category and also the total service indicated in columns 3 and 4 respectively.

(v) If the number of eligible workers are actually less than 75% of the utilised posts, only the number of posts required to accommodate the eligible workers should be upgraded.

(vi) Workers even though they have put in the number of years of service as per the above instructions, should not be promoted against the posts, to be upgraded if they have taken lower ranking in the present circle on transfer from other circle. In such a case, he will be considered for upgradation when his immediate junior gets promoted to the upgraded post.

(vii) On promotion to the posts to be upgraded they will continue to do the same work as they have been doing hither to. In the case of Helpers, they shall be upgraded as Senior Helpers and they shall continue to do the same work as done before. In the other categories wherever upgraded, they shall have the designation of higher posts such as Fitter I Grade, Fitter II Grade etc., and wherever the higher categories do not convey the type of work done in lower categories the same shall be indicated within brackets after the name of the higher post eg. Foreman II Grade (Welding) so that on upgradation the workmen getting promotion will continue to do the same work. An undertaking in this regard should also be obtained from the individuals who are upgraded consequent on these orders to the higher categories to the effect that they continue to do the same work after promotion.

(viii) When the incumbent of the upgraded post gets his regular chance of promotion in future in the category equivalent to the upgraded category, the post now upgraded shall be downgraded automatically since the upgradation is considered only for the persons who are stagnating for want of promotion. Likewise, if the incumbent of the upgraded retires, resigns, dies, the upgraded post shall be downgraded.

4. The incumbents of the posts sanctioned will be eligible to draw the usual pay D.A., H.R.A. and other allowances at the rates admissible under the order in force.

5. The expenditure is debitable to "Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Funds—Capital Expenditure—Establishment."

In the reference cited Board has issued instructions that in respect of Class I Officer the Property Return should be filed once in 5 years and as such the Property Return to be filed as on 31-12-1990 should be submitted to Board before 31-5-91. Failure of submitting the same will be viewed seriously as per rules.

During Preliminary Inspection of circle offices by the Administration Inspecting teams it is observed that most of the Class I Officers have submitted their Property Returns and whereas in respect of Class II more than 50% of the officers have not submitted their Property returns for the period ended 31-12-1990 till date.

Hence, all the Superintending Engineers are requested to obtain the Property Return as on 31-12-1990 from all the Class II Officers who have not submitted the same so far before 31-7-92 and intimate the position to this branch. Failure to submit the Property Return within the prescribed time will be viewed seriously as per rules.

I have to state that on a Writ Petition filed by the General Secretary, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Accounts and Executive Staff Union against the Board in Writ Petition No. 687/84 on the file of High Court claiming fixation of pay under Regulation 33 (b) read with regulation 87 and 111 of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulations in respect of appointment to the post of Junior Assistants by internal selection, the High Court has passed orders dismissing the petition on the ground that the benefit of Regulation 33 (b) can be availed only if the appointment is made by way of promotion. In this connection, I enclose a copy of orders of High Court in Writ Petition No. 687/84 for information.

Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, praying that in the circumstances stated therein, and in the affidavit filed therewith the High Court will be pleased to issue a Writ of Mandamus directing the Respondents to fix the scale of pay of the employees mentioned in the Annexure in accordance with regulation 33(b) of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulation read with regulation 87 and 111.

Order: This Writ Petition coming on for hearing on this day upon perusing the petition and the affidavit filed in support thereof the Order of the High Court, dated 23—1—84 and made herein and the Counter affidavit filed herein and the records relevant for the prayer aforesaid; and comprised in the return of the respondent herein to the Writ made by the High Court and upon hearing the arguments of Mr. Venkatraman for M/s. Aiyar and Dolia, and G. Devi, Advocate for the petitioner, and of Mr. R. Muthukumaraswamy Advocate for the Respondents. The court made the following Order:—

## ORDER :

The Petitioner is seeking to expound the cause of employees who are employed as Junior Assistants having been drawn from the regular work establishment of the first respondent Board. The complaint is that the scales of pay of the employees while they were in the regular work establishment were as follows:—

- (i) 260—5—300—10—350—12—410
- (ii) 225—5—250—6—292—8—340
- (iii) 285—10—335—12—395—15—465

The Scale of pay of Junior Assistant is Rs. 265—10—315—12—375—15—465. The respondents have fixed the minimum scale of pay of such employees, when they were appointed as Junior Assistants and the difference between the basic pay drawn by them while they were in the regular work establishment and the minimum scale of pay as Junior Assistants were being treated as personal pay. The contention is that the respondents should fix scale of pay in accordance with Regulation 33 (b) of the Service Regulations of the Board. The appointment of Junior Assistants carries duties and responsibilities of greater in nature therefore such appointment is governed by Regulation 33 (b). Consequently the basic pay of these employees should have been fixed in the appropriate stage in the scale of pay of Junior Assistants.

2. A counter affidavit has been filed opposing the application of Regulation 33 (b) and contending that the method adopted by the respondents is perfectly legal and valid. It is pointed out in the counter affidavit, that appointment to the post of Junior Assistant and certain other posts were being made only by direct recruitment in accordance with Regulation 92 (Annexure I). The petitioner union and certain other unions represented that certain workmen in the regular work establishment were qualified for recruitment to the post of Junior Assistant and similar other posts and the statutory direction to only adopt the method of direct recruitment was causing hardship to such employees. The board conceded the demand and in B.P.Ms. No. 1703, dated 29—11—1975 permitted appointment of candidates by what is called internal selection, for a period of two years. In other words, the internal selection was in the place of direct recruitment. Later on the said method of internal selection was incorporated in the regulations by B.P.Ms.No.86 dated 8—3—1982. It was made clear that internal selection shall be deemed to be direct recruitment for all purposes including the purpose of application of the rule of reservation, Regulation 92 has been amended making it clear that internal selection is deemed to be direct recruitment and not promotion attracting the fixation of pay under Regulation 33(b). This amendment however came into force only with effect from 8—3—1982. But it cannot be ignored that even before the amendment of the Regulation B.P. Ms. No. 1703 dated 29—11—1975 and the memorandum of the Board dated 27—8—1976 had made the position clear by asking candidates to give the following undertaking :—

- (i) that candidates should give an undertaking in writing before appointment by internal selection that they will relinquish their rights for promotion in their former ministerial or in Regular work Establishment/Temporary work Establishment cadre, as the case may be, and
- (ii) that they will accept the minimum of the time scale of pay of the post in which they are to be appointed by internal selection subject to any protection of loss in emoluments that may occur at the time of initial appointment by internal selection by grant of personal pay”.

The contention in the counter affidavit is that the appointment by internal selection cannot be equated to promotion and therefore Regulation 33 (b) is not attracted. It is also pointed out that in connection with the fixation of pay of such employees, the following terms were agreed upon in the wage revision settlement reached before the Commissioner of Labour, Madras :—

“In the Internal Selection appointments, the basic pay that would have been drawn by the employee, from time to time in the previous post, if such pay is higher, will be protected from time to time in the present basic pay by the grant of personal pay such time the basic pay in the present post is equal to or more than the basic pay in the previous post or till such time he is promoted to a higher post, whichever is earlier. This benefit will be effective from 1—12—1984. In the case of employees who were appointed through Internal selection prior to 1-12-1984 and who had not been promoted to a higher post as on 30-11-1984, this benefit will be allowed with effect from 1-12-1984 without any back wages prior to 1-12-1984.”

In pursuance of the said settlement B. P. Ms. (F.B.) 95 dated 20—11—1985 was issued. By this proceedings, therefore, if the basic pay admissible to an employee appointed by internal selection is less than the basic pay that would have been drawn by him in the previous post, had he continued in the previous post, the said proceedings gave protection to the extent of the difference by allowing the same as personal pay. The said protection was allowed till the basic pay in the post to which he is appointed by internal selection become equal to or more than the basic pay in the previous post or till his promotion to a higher post, whichever is earlier. In view of this statement in the counter affidavit, I do not think that the petitioners can have any grievance.

3. However Mr. Venkataraman, learned counsel for the petitioner argued that if the regulations are taken as a whole, the appointment by internal Selection is nothing but a promotion. The regulation 87 (9) defines promotion as "Promotion means the appointment of a member of any category in a clause of service to a higher category in that clause or any higher clause service". The regular work establishment posts come under Division IX of Annexure-1 prescribed by Regulation. The Junior Assistants are coming under Division VII-A Category 3 of the annexure. Therefore it is sought to be contended that the appointment is only by promotion though called as internal selection. This argument cannot be accepted.

We have already noticed that is only on the request of the unions that instead of making direct recruitment, the method of internal selection was adopted. The post of Junior Assistant is an initial level post. The only method prescribed for appointment was by direct recruitment. There was no provision at all for promoting any feeder category employees to the post Junior Assistants. Normally when a post can be filled up by promotion, the feeder posts are shown in the rule or regulation. Being an initial level post the regulation did not specify any feeder category posts. The existing employees in the regular work establishment belonging to a different cadre were recruited only by way of direct recruitment. In as much as the recruitment was from the employees of the board it was called internal selection. Further they have already executed certain undertakings before they were permitted to be recruited internally. The contention of the petitioners that their appointment to the post of Junior Assistants is by way of promotion cannot therefore be accepted either on the basis of the regulations or on the basis of the fact situation.

4. It is not disputed before me that the benefit of Regulation 33(b) can be availed of only if the employees had been appointed to the post of Junior Assistants by way of promotion. Consequently, the writ petition fails and it is dismissed. There will however be no order as to costs.

In the following B.Ps., options were allowed to the employees of the Board to choose one or the other method of fixation of pay on their promotion or appointment to higher posts:—

- (1) B.P.Ms. (F.B) No. 11 (S.B), dt. 12-2-87
- (2) B.P.Ms. (F.B) No. 33 (S.B), dt. 13-4-87
- (3) B.P.Ms. (F.B) No. 52 (S.B), dt. 24-6-87
- (4) B.P.Ms. (CH) No. 163 (S B), dt. 13-6-88

The Board Proceedings mentioned above also contained clauses that if the employees did not give any declaration choosing a method of fixation of pay within the prescribed time limit, pay fixation should be made under a particular method.

2. It has been brought to the notice of the Board that in some cases, the method of pay fixation, specifically chosen by the employee, is not advantageous and the concerned employees came to know of this only later. It has also been represented that the Orders/Circulars issued by the Board seldom reach the workers employed in field and they would come to know of them only when they visit headquarters and by this time, the time-limit prescribed would be over and hence they are deprived of the benefits allowed in the general orders issued by Board. In these circumstances, it has been represented that another chance may be given for choosing an advantageous method of pay fixation by revising the option already exercised.

3. In Board's Memo No. 75406/P1/90-1, (Secretariat Branch), dated 19-2-91, and option format was prescribed and it was ordered that it should be enclosed with the order of initial promotion or appointment of an employee to a higher post and he should be requested to return the format duly filled in within one month from the date of promotion/appointment. After the issue of this order, a plea for revision of option will not be justified.

4. It is hereby ordered that the employees to whom the orders in the Board Proceedings cited are applicable and who were promoted or appointed to higher posts prior to 19-3-91 and who had either given a declaration choosing a method of pay fixation or pay fixation was made under a particular method as they had not given any declaration shall be permitted to exercise revised option, if they so desire, within a period of three months from the date of issue of this order.

**Proceedings :**

The Thermal Training Institute at Ennore is proposed to be shifted to Vallur Camp at North Madras Thermal Power Project with modern amenities and hostel accommodation which has been approved in (Permanent) B.P. (FB) No. 8 (Technical Branch) dated 6—1—1992. Regular courses are being conducted at the Thermal Training Institute/Ennore for training the Engineers and Technicians as per the syllabus prescribed by the Central Electricity Authority. The Central Electricity Authority is recommending the use of the Training Simulators for the hand-on training.

There are two types of Training Simulators. One is a Replica Simulator and other one is the c.r.t., (cathode-ray tube) based Simulator. In the Replica type the equipments, instruments, switchboards, panel boards are identical as that of the actual plant. However, the plant is mathematically modelled and is residing at the memory of the computer of the Simulators.

In case of c.r.t. based Simulator the Instruments, Control Panel, Switch Board are software based and are simulated in the c.r.t. screen by means of graphics. As in the Replica Simulator here also the plant is mathematically modelled and is available at the memory of the computer of the Simulator.

There is no difference in the functioning and scope of application of these two type of Training Simulators.

**The c.r.t. based Simulator is less costlier, easy to install and maintain and requires less space.** The c.r.t. based Training Simulator can be adapted for training 60 MW, 110 MW, 210 MW and 500 MW Units of our Thermal Power Stations with change only in the software. The hardware remaining the same.

A detailed specification is being evolved by the Committee which had been constituted for this purpose. However, Skeleton specification for the c.r.t. based Simulator is as follows with its tentative costs.

Along with the Board's Memo. cited, a copy of the order of the High Court in W.M.P. No. 5203 and 5204 of 86 and W. M. P. No. 7873 and 7874 of 86 in W. P. Nos. 3402 and 3403 of 86 was communicated to the Officers of the Board. According to the orders of High Court referred to above, promotions in the Board should be effected without reference to the guidelines issued by the Board in B. P. Ms. No. 155 (SB) dt. 27—4—1984 which are the subject matter of controversy, but promotions should be effected purely on the statutory regulations, embodied in Regulation 98 and Regulation 106 (c) of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulations.

2. During the discussions held with the Unions it was represented that in many cases when disciplinary proceedings are pending against employees they are not considered for promotion and by this the provision in Regulation 106(c) of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulations are not being followed. The instructions already issued in the matter referred to in para 1 above are quite clear that the promoting Authority can consider and promote temporarily to a higher post an employee against whom Disciplinary Proceedings is pending if he is otherwise found suitable. Therefore an Authority should not leave a section of employees without consideration for promotion just for the reason that Disciplinary Proceedings are pending against them. The Chief Engineers, Superintending Engineers and other Officers of the Board are requested to follow the instructions already issued referred to in para 1 above in the matter and not to give room for any complaint in this regard.

**Proceedings :**

In pursuance of a Memorandum of Settlement under Section 18(1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 signed on 31—7—1989, orders were issued in (Per.) B.P. (FB) No. 57 (S.B.) dated 5—8—1989 revising the scales of pay, rates of dearness allowance, house rent allowance etc. applicable to the various categories of workers of the Board as covered by the above Settlement with effect from 1—12—1988. It was agreed to by the parties to the Settlement on revision of scales pay and allowances that the terms of the Settlement on revision of scales and allowances would be in force for a period of four years from 1—12—1988. The terms of the said Settlement will expire on 30—11—1992. Apart from the orders in the Board Proceedings mentioned above, orders were also issued in (Per.) B P. Discussion and Settlement in this regard are not yet over. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board has decided that based on the above agreement discussions and Settlement on revision of work allocation and Staff pattern of field staff and Stores staff be completed first and thereafter, discussions on ensuing revision of scales of pay, dearness allowance, etc. and also discussions on revision of work allocation and staff pattern on revenue accounting staff and assessment and collection staff shall be taken up following the same procedure as followed in the Wage Revision discussions of 1988.

3. Accordingly, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board directs that discussions with the representative of the employees regarding revision of Pay scales, allowances, etc. and revision of work allocation and staff pattern of revenue accounting and assessment and collection staff be held after the conclusion of discussion and Settlement on revision of work allocation and staff pattern of field staff and stores staff. #### Proceedings :

At present, the Chief Engineer/Hydro Projects, Bhavani is looking after the works relating to Sathanur Hydro Electric Project, Lower Bhavani Right Bank Canal Hydro Electric Project, Punachi Micro Hydel Project, Civil maintenance works of all hydro stations and special works relating to Kadamparai Power House. The works relating to Punachi Micro Hydel are in the final stages. Consequent on the fire accident in Kadamparai Power House during October'89, the re-eraction of civil structures relating to the generator transformer cavern of units 3 and 4 are under progress. During renovation works of Kadamparai Power House, it was noticed that there was a buckling of steel liner in the pressure tunnel No. 1. This is the first occasion such an occurrence has happened in the pressure tunnel and only when this repair work is completed, it will be possible to start the Unit-I of Kadamparai Power House which is otherwise ready in all respects for operation. The repair works relating to buckling of penstock is under progress. Recently, a leakage has been experienced in the Kodayar pipe tunnel between surge shaft and valve power house. In order to arrest the leakage, it is proposed to take up grouting and epoxy treatment. As this work is also to be completed within the shortest time possible, as about 100 MW of generation will not be available during this period, it is necessary that experience of the senior officer who had been associated with this project is available for supervising the works. It is therefore considered necessary to re-employ Thiru V. Ananthasamy, Chief Engineer/Hydro Projects, Bhavani who is retiring on 30—6—1992 for a period of four months from 1—7—1992 F.N.

(FB) No. 60, Secretariat Branch, dated 24—8—1989, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board considered the question of revision of the rates of Dearness Allowance from 1—7—91 in respect of the employees drawing pay above Rs. 3,500/- p.m. and from 1—1—92 for all the employees.

2. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board sanctions the revised rate of Dearness Allowance to the employees as follows :—

1st July 1991	Above Rs. 3,500/-	— 45 per cent of pay subject to a minimum of Rs. 2,100/-p.m.

Regarding sanction of additional instalments of Dearness Allowance to the employees drawing pay above Rs. 3,500/- p.m. the amount of additional instalments of Dearness Allowance falling due from the 1st July 1991 and from 1st January 1992 onwards shall not be paid in cash, but instead, it shall be credited to their respective Provident Fund Accounts. The details of admissibility of revised Dearness Allowance for the employees drawing pay above Rs. 3,500/- p.m. and the amount to be credited to the respective General Provident Fund Account are shown in the Annexure-I to this order. But, no additional instalments of Dearness Allowance falling due with effect from 1st July 1991 and from 1st January 1992 shall be credited to the General Provident Fund Account in respect of the employees during the last four months of their service before retirement.

3. In respect of the employees drawing pay upto Rs. 3,500/- p.m., the Board has decided that the arrears due on the additional instalments of Dearness Allowance sanctioned from 1st January 1992 to 30th April 1992 will be credited to their respective General Provident Fund Accounts instead of paying in cash. The amount of additional instalments of Dearness Allowance will be paid in cash from May 1992 onwards. The details of admissibility of revised Dearness Allowance for employees drawing pay upto Rs. 3,500/- are shown in the Annexure-I to this order. In respect of employees for whom no General Provident Fund subscription has so far been recovered, the arrears shall be credited as and when General Provident Fund Account is opened.

In respect of those who have already retired from service, the arrears of Dearness Allowance consequent on the revision ordered in this order shall be paid in cash.

4. The arrears of Dearness Allowance to be credited to the respective General Provident Fund Account from employees, those drawing pay upto Rs. 3,500/- p.m. and above Rs. 3,500/- p.m. shall not be taken into account for sanction of either temporary advance or part final withdrawal and will be released only at the time of retirement.

5. For the purpose of calculation of revised Dearness Allowance, the basic pay including Personal Pay, if any, shall be taken into account. In cases, where the pay plus Personal Pay of employees fall between the two pay ranges indicated in column (1) in Annexures I and II to this order, the revised Dearness Allowance shall be worked out at the specified percentage rates. The revised Dearness Allowance shall be rounded to the nearest rupee.

**Proceedings :**

At present, a monthly Thermal Incentive Allowance Scheme is in existence in the Ennore Thermal Power Station from the year 1978-79 subject to the achievement of the target as prescribed in the Board Proceedings first cited. Discussions were held with the Unions regarding introduction of an Annual Thermal Incentive Bonus Scheme in the Ennore Thermal Power Station and for making certain changes to the Annual Thermal Incentive Allowance Scheme already available in the Ennore Thermal Power Station and Tuticorin Thermal Power Station and based on the understanding reached, summary records of discussions were signed on 20th July, 1989 with the two Unions recognised under the Code of Discipline and five centrally affiliated Unions. It has been agreed that a settlement under Section 12 (3) of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 may be signed before the Commissioner of Labour, Madras on this issue. Signing of this settlement is likely to take some more time. Pending signing of settlement, Annual Thermal Incentive Bonus to the employees of Ennore Thermal Power Station was granted for the years from 1987-88 to 1990-91. Proposal has been received for payment of the Annual Thermal Incentive Bonus to the staff of the Ennore Thermal Power Station for the year 1991-1992.

2. Sub: Electricity—Electricity Taxation on consumption—Levy of 4% tax—Exhibition in Pre-receipt and collection statement need not be insisted.

Ref: This office Lr.No.CFC/Rev./CB/F.41/24/92- dated 10-4-1992.

In the reference cited, orders were issued to furnish the 4% Electricity Tax amount in the Pre-Receipt and collection statement. The Unions have represented that this involves heavy burden on the work load to the Assessors, since the Electricity Tax element is already furnished in the White Meter Card, Green Meter Card and the Meter Card Register.

2. The matter was re-examined and it is felt that the tax amount need not be furnished in the pre-receipt and collection statement by the Assessors.

3. Accordingly, the Assessors need not furnish the tax amount in the pre-receipt and collection statement. However, furnishing the Electricity Tax in the White Meter Card, Green Meter Card and Meter Card Register have to be continued to be furnished by the Assessors. The remittance of Electricity Tax based on the L.T. consumers ledger total as hitherto done has to be continued.

Sub : Electricity—Measurement of Earth Electrode resistance at Sub-stations—Reg.

Ref : Code of Technical instructions—1990.

In para 9-06-01 of the code of Technical instructions it has been stipulated that both combined earth resistance and individual earth resistance of sub-station earth's should be measured monthly at all stations by O & M staff and half-yearly by MRT Staff.

Further in Table 10 Power Transformers maintenance schedule (Page No. 56) It has been mentioned that measurement of resistance of all earth pits both individual and combined should be done quarterly.

In consideration of the difficulties experienced by the field in getting total shutdown in a Sub-station either monthly or quarterly, it has been decided that measurement of the earth resistance in the earth pits individually as well as combined be done once in six months or as and when total shutdown is available for carrying out Maintenance/Improvement works in the sub-station.

Sub : Manufacture of R.C.C. Pole—defects to be rectified in the pole casting yards—Instructions—Issued—Reg.

Ref : Memo. No. SETA/ETAM/F. 145/D. 348/85 (Tech. Audit) dt. 18-7-85.

Detailed instructions have been issued to ensure quality in Manufacture of RCC Poles in the memo cited. In spite of these instructions, the defects mentioned therein continued to persist. This was noticed during intensive technical examination of works in certain R.C.C. Yards. In addition to the instructions issued in the memo cited, further defects are also observed which are detailed below (during technical examination of the RCC Yards).

**(i) Proper size and hard broken stone (jelly) not being used :**

In the specification, it is mentioned as 50% of hard broken stone shall be of 20 mm size and the rest 50% of 12 mm size. But in most of the RCC yards, both the sizes of the stones are mixed and stored in one lump. Also there is over size metal more than 20 mm and under size metal less than 10 mm being used. Hence, 12 mm size metal and 20 mm size metal should be stored separately, for ensuring use of correct percentage of metal. Also the over-size and under size of metal is to be avoided.

**(ii) Sand and its bulmage :**

In most of the RCC yard, bulmage of sand is not measured. In certain yards, this factor is not considered and in certain other yards, the percentage of bulmage in sand is only assumed. Both the practices are not in order. Bulmage of sand is to be measured, whenever there is

concreting before commencement of work, preferably using a measuring jar. Wherever there is no AE/JE/Civil, this procedure of measurement of bulkage must be taught to the Foreman/Maistry available at the yard. The measured bulkage is to be noted in the Cement log book.

**iii) Correct quantity of cement :**

Quantity of cement used for pole casting is based on approximate weighment. For example, when 46 Kg. of cement is required for 7.5 m RCC pole, 4 Kg. of cement is removed from 50 Kg. bag by approximate method. Only correct quantity of cement will ensure good quality and so a weighing machine must be used for using correct quantity of cement. A weighing machine of suitable capacity will have to be provided for each RCC yard.

**(iv) Bottom plate in the form box :**

In certain yards, bottom plate of the form box is available, but these are not being used. In certain other yards, bottom plate of the form boxes are not available. If bottom plate is not fixed to the form box, the finishing of the pole on its bottom side will not be good and chances for cement slurry going waste is much. Therefore bottom plate must be ordered wherever not available and used in all RCC yards.

**(v) Testing of concrete mix as well as poles :**

In order to know the quality of concrete mix, concrete cubes shall be tested as given in IS 456-1978 Code of practice for plain & re-inforcement concrete (latest edition). Similarly the strength of the poles can be known only if it is tested. As per ISS 1 Pole out of 500 poles must be tested upto destruction. Efforts will have to be taken to provide test bed in all RCC yards. Alternatively poles can be tested in neighbouring yards, in case provision of test bed in each yard works out to be costlier.

The Chief Engineers of Distribution Region are requested to impress upon the Superintending Engineers of their Distribution Circles in regard to the rectification of the defects noticed in the pole casting yards and ensure that the quality of poles is maintained. The rectification of the defects may kindly be arranged to be carried out by 30-9-92 and report sent to Chief Engineer/Research & Development, Madras.

**Proceedings :**

In order to achieve the targets for effecting new service connections of various categories during 1992-93 and to take advance action for procurement of stores materials, the

following powers are delegated to the Chief Engineers/Distribution and Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles, as detailed below:—

The Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles are permitted to exercise powers of purchase of maximum value of each P.O. limited to Rs. 75,000/- for procurement of stores materials during the year 1992-93. However, the total value of all the purchase orders placed by Superintending Engineers/Distribution Circles, during the year 1992-93 should not exceed the financial allotment made to them for the year, 1992-93.

2. In regard to procurement of grills for R.C.C. Poles the Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles are empowered to procure them without monetary limits during the year 1992-93 subject to the condition that R.T.S. rods received from steel suppliers are utilised fully for departmental manufacture of grills.

3. The Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles are permitted to arrange for transport of all the line materials required to achieve the target through contracts, if found necessary, during the year 1992-93.

4. Since, M/s. Tansi are unable to supply some of the line materials against the present running contract with M/s. Tansi which expires on 15-8-92, and in order to achieve the various targets for 1992-93, the Chief Engineers/Distribution and Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles are empowered to procure the following nine items of line materials upto 31-8-92 by following institutional priority ordered in G.O.Ms No. 330, Finance (BPE) Department dated 3-5-1991 and adopted without modification in permanent B.P.(FB) No. 13 (Tech. Branch) 20-1-1992.

5. The Chief Engineers/Distribution are permitted to procure the following seven items of stores only by exercising the powers delegated to them in (Pt.) B.P.(FB) No. 17 (Accounts Branch) dated 5-8-91 and its amendments.

- (ii) Fuse units and cut-outs.
- (iii) Form Boxes.
- (iv) H.G. Fuses.
- (v) Earthing Devices.
- (vi) L.T. Open type fuses.
- (vii) Back clamps, stay clamps and special clamps of all sizes.

6. The Chief Engineers/Distribution and Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles are permitted to procure 11 KV Strain disc hardware upto 30-9-92 to meet their requirement after taking into account supplies expected against orders placed by Chief Engineers/ Materials Management.

7. The Chief Engineers/Distribution and Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles are empowered to procure 4'×40W Tube lamps as and when required for the minimum needs for new streetlight fittings for use in offices and sub-stations, upto 30-6-92.

8. The Chief Engineers/Distribution and Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles are empowered to procure chokas only for use in offices and sub-stations for the year 1992-93.

9. The Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles are empowered to procure 'C' type boxes during 1992-93 from the priority institutions only by following the usual purchase procedure.



10. The Superintending Engineers of Distribution circles are permitted to continue to purchase as per B.P.Ms (Ch) No. 109, (Technical Branch) dated 17-5-1983, 67 items and 10 items meant for Madras Electricity Distribution Circles/North and South, 5 items as per B.P.Ms. (Ch.) 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**High Tension Steel Industries—According of load sanction/issue of technical feasibility to new and existing Steel/Steel Rolling Mill/Alloy Steel Casting Industries—Collection of 10% of the cost to co-finance creation of generating capacity—Orders issued.**

The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board has decided that load sanction/feasibility to High Tension Steel/Steel Rolling Mill/Alloy Steel Casting Industries requiring a demand of above 5 MVA may be accorded for extension of supply subject to technical feasibility and subject to the condition that they accept to co-finance 10% of the cost of creating generating capacity required to feed that portion of the demand which is in excess of 5000 KVA.

2. In accordance with the above decision of the Board and in partial modification to the instructions already issued in the Board's Proceedings cited, the following instructions are issued in respect of steel industries :—

- (i) Applications from Steel/Steel Rolling Mill/Alloy Steel Casting Industries requesting demand of above 5000 KVA may be processed and load sanction accorded towards extension of supply provided they accept to co-finance 10% of the cost of creating Generating capacity required to feed that portion of the demand which is in excess of 5000 KVA
- (ii) Application from Alloy Steel/Alloy Steel Casting Industries requesting demand upto 5 MVA may be processed and load sanction accorded towards extension of supply on par with the Steel/Steel Rolling Mills Industries as per the present existing policy and no cost towards co-financing may be collected for such loads upto 5 MVA
- (iii) The above policy in respect of the Steel Industries, will apply, also to the existing industries of such category when they apply for additional demand. The cost towards co-financing the generating capacity, need not be collected for such additional demands, in cases where the existing demand together with the additional demand asked for is 5000 KVA and below. In cases, where the existing demand is 5000 KVA and below which together with the additional demand asked for exceeds 5000 KVA, the cost towards co-financing the generating capacity may be collected for that portion of the demand which is in excess of 5000 KVA.

3. The 10% cost to be collected from such industries to co-finance the cost of creating generating capacity shall be at the rate of Rs. 3000/- per KVA of that portion of the demand which is in excess of 5000 KVA. This charge shall be apart from other charges (viz) Development charge etc., to be paid by the applicant as per rules in force and shall be collected along with the Development charges before taking up the work for extension of supply.

4. The orders issued as in peras 2 & 3 above shall come into force with effect from 28-4-92 and the same shall apply to the cases for whom feasibility or load sanction are to be accorded from 28-4-92 onwards. The charge towards co-financing the cost of creating generating capacity required to feed the load may not be collected in respect of cases for whom feasibility of power supply or extension of power supply, as a matter of policy, has been already approved by the Board.

#### Proceedings :

As per item No. 5 of B. P. Ms. (FB) No. 166, Technical Branch, dt. 19-4-86, Chief Engineer/Hydro Projects, Pollachi was the registration authority and Superintending Engineer/Hydro Projects/Electrical/Madras and Superintending Engineer/Civil/Kadamparai Pumped Storage H.E.P. were the Registration Officers for supplies and works contracts respectively.

Consequent to the closure of Kadamparai Project circle the Post of Chief Engineer/Hydro Projects/Minparai/Pollachi and Superintending Engineer/Civil/Kadamparai Pumped Storage H.E.P. have become defunct from 31-7-90 and the above posts of that circle are not in existence for monitoring the activities of the Registered Contractors, to monitor the Vendor rating, to take action to black list erring contractors, to watch the annual Balance sheet, solvency, annual Income Tax clearance Certificate, Sales Tax certificates, renewal of registration etc.

Meanwhile, a new project circle was sanctioned by the Board for the works of Pykara Ultimate Stage Hydro Electric Project, Maravakandy Mini Hydro Electric Project, Parsons Valley etc. with Head Quarters at Masinagudi, headed by C.E Pykara Ultimate Stage H. E. P and S.E./Hydro Projects/Masinagudi in the Nilgiris District and the Superintending Engineer/Civil & General/Kadamparai and Chief Engineer/Hydro Projects, Minparai (Pollachi) posts are not renamed as Superintending Engineer/Hydro Projects Masinagudi and Chief Engineer/Pykara Ultimate Stage H.E.P. Hence, the Officers in the above new posts are neither competent to watch the above nor to renew the Registration of the defunct circle Contractors. Therefore the registration of all the contractors who had Registered in the defunct Kadamparai Circle become automatically ceased and no longer valid.

Pykara Ultimate Stage H. E. Project situated in Mudumalai Sanctuary area is the only Project where Ministry of Environment, District Collector and Forest Department had stipulated. Environmental and special conditions while clearing the Project and insisted that free supply of fuel at 5 Kg/Family/day should be issued to the contract labourers of the Project at Board's cost. Considering the Environmental ecology, the Collector of Nilgiris has imposed restrictions on the movement of the Private vehicles, lorries (via) Kallhatti road in the Reserve Forest area. In view of the above stringent environmental stipulations and to minimise the fuel expenditure to the barest minimum, new registration is to be given by Superintending Engineer/Hydro Projects/Masinagudi with approval Chief Engineer Pykara Ultimate Stage H. E. P. for a very minimum number of contractors only, restricting the validity of registration to one year to have proper control and also to fulfil the conditions of Ministry of Environment and Forests.

In addition, with a view to enable the ongoing works to be completed and to take up urgent and immediate works of the Projects under the control of Superintending Engineer/Hydro Projects/Masinagudi Circle to keep up the target dates, Superintending Engineer/Hydro Projects/Masinagudi and Chief Engineer/Pykara Ultimate Stage H.E.P., have registered the following five contractors purely on temporary basis for a period of one year, who were executing works in this circle with registration in the defunct Kadamparai circle and Lower Mettur H.E.P. Circle and who possessed good solvency, vendor rating, local man power etc. and requested for ratification of Board for the same.

**Order :**

The Government have introduced the scheme of free supply of electricity to all agricultural farmers in the State of Tamil Nadu with effect from 1-8-90. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board is incurring huge financial loss on account of implementation of the scheme. In order to sustain the financial position of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, the Government have been examining for some time the question of levy of minimum tariff on agriculture sector. Meanwhile, the Union Minister for Power has suggested for having national minimum agricultural tariff at 50 paise per KWH. The Government, after detailed examination of various aspects, have decided that a flat electricity tariff rate of Rs. 100 per H.P. per annum in respect of the agricultural pumpsets, excepting small farmers, may be introduced with effect from 2-8-92 and that this levy may be made collectable in two six monthly instalments.

2. Accordingly, the following Notification will be published in an extraordinary issue of the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette, dated 2-6-92.

**Notification**

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Tamil Nadu Revision of Tariff Rates on Supply of Electrical Energy Act, 1978 (Tamil Nadu Act 1 of 1979), the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby makes the following amendment to the schedule to the said Act.

2. The amendment hereby made shall come into force on 2nd June 1992.

**Amendment**

In the said Schedule, under the heading "Part B—Low Tension Supply", for the entries under the sub-heading "Low Tension Tariff—V", the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—

**Agriculture —**

| 1. Small farmer | : No charge.  |
| 2. Other farmer | : Lumpsum of Rs. 100/- per H.P. of the contracted load, per annum, collectable in two six monthly instalments |

Provided that for farmers having power connection for their pumpsets by payment of the cost of energisation of pumpsets or Rs. 25,000 (Rupees twenty five thousand only), whichever is higher, the rate of tariff shall be Rs. 150/- (Rupees one hundred and fifty only) per H.P., per annum.

**Explanation 1:—** "Small farmer", means a person whose total holding, whether as owner, tenant or mortgagee with possession, or partly in one capacity and partly in another, does not exceed one hectare (two and half acres of wet lands or two hectares (five acres) of dry lands and whose family is solely depended on the income derived from his agricultural land holdings. In computing the extent of land held by a person who holds wet and dry lands, two acres of dry lands shall be taken to be equivalent to one acre of wet land.

**Explanation—II:—** Supply of power shall be given free of charge for bonafide agricultural purpose with a connected load not exceeding 5 H.P. of a small farmer on production of a certificate of eligibility from the Taluk Tahsildar of the Revenue Department. Such certificate shall be renewed once in three years for the continuance of supply of power free of charge.

**Explanation—III:—** Farmers shall be permitted lighting upto 50 watts per 1000 watts of motive power connected, subject to a maximum of 150 watts inclusive of wattage of pilot lamps each of which shall not exceed 15 watt and with not more than 3 lamps (excluding pilot lamps) for lighting the farm or the field around the pumpset. Energy used for radios or other appliances including domestic appliances in the farm houses shall be metered separately and charged for at the appropriate tariff.

Farmers shall be permitted to use the water pumped from the well and stored in overhead tanks for bonafide domestic purposes in the farm house. The farm house shall be in close proximity not exceeding 150 feet from the well

**Explanation IV:—** Extra lighting in agricultural services over the permissible limit shall be charged for, if separately metered, as per Low Tension Tariff—IX if not separately metered, on a flat rate of Rs. 10/- per month per 40 watts lamp (ordinary), larger wattage of lamps in proportion. If fluorescent and mercury vapour lamps are connected, the flat rate shall be enhanced by 50%.

Sub: Sanction of additional loads/installation of air-compressors in agricultural services without applying for name-transfer-Instructions issued.

It is represented that the present owners/enjoyers of the agricultural lands who want to apply for addl. loads/installation of air-compressors could not obtain the death certificate of the service owners and legal-heir certificates from the revenue department due to various reasons and produce them along with name-transfer applications. Hence, the Board officers could not either sanction addl load or accord permission for installing air-compressors under TPDT switch arrangements without effecting name-transfer.

The matter has been examined and the following instructions are issued.

In respect of sanction of additional loads and according permission for installing air-compressors in agricultural services, legal proof of ownership need not be insisted. It should be enough that the applicant, if he is not the original service holder produces a certificate from the Tahsildar to the effect that he is the actual enjoyer of the land referred to in the application and also furnishes a bond indemnifying the Board against any claims by any person consequent on the sanction of the additional load/installation of air-compressor.

Sub : Applications for L. T. domestic and commercial service connections—Registration in Section Office—Avoidance of delay—Instructions—Issued.

1. It is brought to the notice that the LT domestic and commercial applications (other services category) received in Section offices are not registered promptly and there is considerable delay in their registration. The applications are allowed to pile up without any entry in the register. As a result the pendency position of applications in the above category could not be ascertained correctly

2. The very purpose of entrusting the registration of L. T. domestic and commercial (other services category) applications with the Section officers is to cut down delay and speed up the process of effecting service connections. This purpose is not served if the state of affairs mentioned in para (1) is allowed to continue.

3. It is instructed that

- (a) The list of pending applications with date of registration may also be exhibited in the notice Board.
- (b) Acknowledgement with registration number should be given to the applicants.
- (c) The Assistant Executive Engineers of the Distribution shall check and review the receipt and processing of applications in the Sections under their control at least once in a fortnight and ensure that there is no delay in registration of applications. Action will have to be taken against the erring Junior Engineer/Assistant Engineer.
- (d) The Executive Engineers and Superintending Engineers shall also periodically check and review the receipt and processing of applications in the Section Offices during their inspection of the Sections and ensure that the applications are disposed off promptly without giving room for complaints.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 78A of the Electricity (Supply) Act 1948, the Government issued directions in the G.O. read above to the effect that prior approval of the Government should be obtained by the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board (i) for the closure and sale of power generating stations irrespective of their value and (ii) for the sale of its assets where book value exceeds Rs. 10 lakhs.

2. In the letter read above the Chairman, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board has requested the Government to increase the monetary limit of the value of assets from Rs. 10 lakhs to Rs. 100 lakhs in view of the fact that the value of equipments (assets) has increased considerably from 1979 onwards.

3. The Government after careful consideration of the request of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board have decided to raise the book value of assets for sale from Rs. 10 lakhs to Rs. 25 lakhs only. They accordingly, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 78A of the Electricity (Supply) Act 1948, direct that prior approval of the Government should be obtained by the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board for the sale of its assets whose book value exceeds Rs. 25 lakhs.

Where 'B' + 'C' is more than the prescribed limit, but 'B' alone is **not** more than the prescribed limit, the energy charges for 'A' + 'B' shall be billed under the H. T. Tariff I and the energy charges for 'C' shall be billed under the H. T. Tariff-VII from 1-12-1982 to 14-8-85 provided a separate meter is installed to record the residential consumption with the permission of the Board, otherwise, the entire consumption pertaining to the excess load (lighting and non-industrial shall be charged under L. T. Tariff-I or H. T. Tariff-VII whichever is higher and under the L. T. Tariff-VIII from 15-8-85 onwards. (The Maximum Demand charges shall be for all the loads under A, B, C and D i.e. for the maximum demand recorded by the Board's Trivector Meter).

II. The following shall be added as Alternative-IV under para 10 (iv) of B. P. Ms. (F. B.) No. 35 (Adm. Br.) dated 22-7-88.

Where the total lighting and non-industrial loads coming under B, C and D are recorded in a single meter, the energy consumption under such arrangement shall be charged as follows :

A Project report covering the EHT lines and sub-stations included in the T&D Master Plan for the original VIII Five Year Plan (1990-95), but excluding those already covered in the similar Project Report for VII Five Year Plan was prepared at an estimated cost of Rs. 44692.52 lakhs and sent to the Central Electricity Authority (CEA). The CEA has accorded techno-economic approval for the major part of the schemes which did not involve forest clearance. Based on the techno-economic approval, the Union Planning Commission, New Delhi has also accorded investment approval for the project covering works not involving forest clearance, at an estimated cost of Rs. 433.50 Crores in Lr. No. T-26 (3)/2-91-P&E dated 27-2-91. Administrative approval of the Board for the whole scheme not involving forest clearance which was approved by the CEA and Planning Commission, was obtained and communicated in (Permanent) B.P. (FB) No. 131 dt. 11-6-91.

2. Now the CEA, in their Lr. No. 2/TN/14/92/PAC/772-774 dt. 1-5-92 have communicated their concurrence for the scheme to be given under section 31 of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948. A copy of the letter received from the CEA together with Annexure-I is enclosed for reference and record. Details given in the Annexure-II are the same as given in the B.P. No. 131 dt. 11-6-91 and hence the same are not enclosed.

The Eighth Plan Transmission Scheme of Tamil Nadu was techno-economically cleared by the CEA on 14-1-91 for an estimated cost of Rs. 441 crores, excluding IDC of Rs. 132.23 Crs., subject to the condition that TNEB would obtain forest clearance, wherever applicable. The scheme comprises various transmission works, the implementation of which are independent of each other. Investment approval to the scheme after excluding the works which involve forest clearance was considered subsequently in order to avoid delay in implementation of works which do not involve any forest clearance. Accordingly, after excluding the works involving forest clearance, the scheme estimated to cost Rs. 433.5 crores (excluding IDC) was sanctioned by the Planning Commission vide letter No. 1-26(3)/2/91-P&E dated 27-2-91.

2. This is to convey the concurrence of CEA under section 31 of the E(S) Act, 1948, as amended from time to time, to the Eighth Plan Transmission Scheme of Tamil Nadu excluding the works involving forest clearance. The details of salient features and cost estimates are given in Annex I to III.

(a) Project Authorities should make proper organisational arrangement to ensure effective management of the scheme duly conforming to the schedule and cost estimates:

(b) A comprehensive master control PERT network for major works covering firm schedule of supplies and associated resources based fund flow chart should be prepared and furnished to C. E. A.

(c) Any problem in the course of implementation, failures or slippage of serious nature should be brought to the notice of CEA well in advance.

(d) In case the cost estimates of the scheme undergo revision, the revised estimates should be forwards to CEA for approval, giving specific reasons for the revision such as increase in cost due to escalations and change in scope etc.

Sub: Load sanction to consumers availing HT/EHT supply—Inclusion of condition in the load sanction to avoid voltage fluctuations to the T.N.E.B. Grid—Incorporation of the condition in the agreement—Orders issued.

Instructions have been issued in the memo first cited to incorporate the condition specified therein in all the load sanctions accorded by Chief Engineer of Distribution Regions and Superintending Engineer of Electricity Distribution Circles, so as to ensure that the consumer takes precautionary measures to avoid any possible undue voltage fluctuations that may be caused by their loads to the T.N.E.B. Grid.

2. The Chief Engineer (Distribution) Trichy Region in his letter second cited has suggested that the above condition may be ordered to be incorporated in the H.T. agreement also, so as to make the above condition more binding on the part of the consumer.

3. In consideration of the above suggestion, the Chief Engineer of all Regions and Superintending Engineers of all Electricity Distribution Circles are requested that the following condition already mentioned in the memo first cited, shall be included in the H. T. agreement also, in respect of all consumer availing supply at HT/EHT voltage:—

“Adequate precautionary measures like installation of static/Dynamic Compensators and filters etc., shall be taken by the industry to avoid any possible problems of undue voltage fluctuations and harmonics arising out of the loads of the industry in the grid. In case the load sanctioned is found causing such voltage fluctuations and problems due to harmonics in the transmission network, the supply shall be disconnected till the industry carry out necessary corrective measures to avoid such problems”

In the circular Memo cited in reference (2) above, instructions were issued for extension of time for merger of services upto 30-6-92. The Chief Engineer/Distributions were requested to ensure that notices are issued for immediate merger of services into one service connection in the appropriate tariff on or before 30-6-92.

It was informed during the Chief Engineers/Distribution's meeting that there is considerable difficulty in completing the work before 30-6-92.

Hence it was decided in the meeting held on 27-5-92 to extend the time limit upto 30-6-93.

The Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles are informed that the extension of time for merger of services of consumers coming under Clause 8.01 and 8.02 of Terms and Conditions of Supply, is extended upto 30-6-93.

As per instructions issued in the references cited above, Earnest Money Deposit is payable by applicants of power supply both under HT and LT within 30 days of communication to pay the amount and beyond this period, the Superintending Engineers of all Distribution Circles are authorised to grant extension of time of one month.

As frequent representations are received from the parties requesting for the grant of extension of time for a period of more than a month, Chief Engineer (Distribution) Madras has suggested that Chief Engineers may be delegated with certain powers for grant of extension of time for making payment of Earnest Money Deposit beyond the time granted by Superintending Engineers.

The matter has been examined and the Chief Engineers (Distribution) are hereby authorised to grant extension of time of one month beyond the extension of time granted by Superintending Engineers.

If the applicants do not pay the Earnest Money Deposit within this extended period, the application shall be cancelled.

Sub : Energisation of 20,000 numbers on-line/one pole extension agricultural pumpsets during 92-93 under special priority—Instructions issued.

The Government in the G.O. fourth cited have approved that out of the target of 40,000 agricultural pumpsets to be energised during 1992-93, 20,000 pumpsets shall be energised under normal priority programme and balance of 20,000 pumpsets under special priority scheme of **mere service** (on-line category) to the extent to which applications are available and for the balance number of cases, connections shall be effected under the one pole extension category during 1992-93. The Districtwise disaggregated targets already communicated in the memo. cited (3) above have also been approved by the Government. A copy of this G.O. is enclosed.

2. Accordingly, the targets for each division under mere service connection (on-line category) shall be 50% of the division target fixed. In case of short-fall in any of the division, Superintending Engineers can redistribute the target under this category to other divisions without affecting the District targets.

3. The notice period for this category shall be 45 (forty-five) days. 45 (forty-five) days notice for reporting readiness shall be issued in such a way that the expiry date for the 45 (forty-five) days notice shall not go beyond 15-9-92.

4. The readiness of the parties under this category (i.e.) mere service (on line category) shall be reviewed immediately after 15-9-92 by the Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles and if there is short-fall for achieving the target under this category, cases coming under one pole extension may be considered and balance numbers to achieve the target shall be suitably redistributed among the divisions without affecting the District targets.

5. 45 (forty-five) days notice for one pole extension shall then be issued in such a way that the expiry date of the 45 (forty five) days notice shall not go beyond 30-11-92.

6. All ready cases under this scheme should be effected supply on or before 28-2-93 and the total number of pumpsets connected shall not exceed the target fixed under this scheme.

7. All other instructions issued in this office Circular memo. first cited for the implementation of the special programme during 1990-91 may be followed for this year's programme also.

8. The Chief Engineers (Distribution) are requested to programme the service connections for the agricultural pumpsets such that both the schemes, viz., connections coming under special priority envisaged in this Circular memo. as well as connections coming under normal priority are given side by side. The progress of these connections may be reported separately to the Superintending Engineer/Rural Electrification and Improvement (Distribution). All the connections given under this special priority scheme shall be given before 28-2-93 and there shall not be any carryover to next year.

9. The energisation of pumpsets on payment of costs as ordered in G.O. Ms. No. 145 PW, dated 30-1-92 shall be outside target of 40,000 pumpsets fixed for the 1992-93.

10. The Chief Engineers and Superintending Engineers are requested to take immediate action to implement the above scheme.

**Order :**

The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board is energising 40,000 pumpsets in a year subject to availability of funds and by availing assistance from financial institutions like the Rural Electrification Corporation Limited, NABARD and Commercial Banks. Besides energisation of new pumpsets under normal priority, new service connections to pumpsets are given through on-line/one pole scheme.

2. In order to reduce the backlog of pending applications the Government introduced the scheme of providing service connections to those registered applicants on payment of Rs. 25,000/- or the actual cost, whichever is higher in their order first read above. While introducing this new scheme, it was ordered that 50% of the annual target fixed for energisation of pumpsets should be reserved for this new scheme.

3. The Government have subsequently decided that the energisation of pumpsets under the new scheme introduced by the Government with effect from 1-2-92 shall be outside the annual target fixed for energisation of pumpsets. They therefore approve the proposal of the Electricity Board to fix districtwise target for energisation of pumpsets during 1992-93 as in the annexure to this order. They further direct that 20,000 pumpsets shall be energised under normal programme and balance of 20,000 pumpsets under special priority scheme of mere service (on-line category) to the extent to which applications are available and for the balance number of cases connections shall be effected under the one pole extension category during 1992-93.

4. The Government also clarify that energisation of pumpsets on payment of costs as ordered in the G.O. first read above shall be outside the annual target of 40,000 pumpsets fixed for 1992-93.
