II. HYDRO INFLOWS :

VI. ENHANCEMENT OF FESTIVAL ADVANCE :

In B.P. (FB) No. 47 (Sectt. Branch) dt. 7-9-92, the Board has enhanced the Festival advance amount from Rs. 500/- to Rs. 750/- to all employees of the Board.

VII. PURCHASE OF SURPLUS POWER—ENHANCEMENT OF RATE :

In B.P. (FB) No. 206 (Techl. Branch) dt. 8-9-92, the Board has fixed a rate of Rs. 1.25 per unit with effect from 1-9-92 for purchase of surplus power from private sector windmills, mini/micro hydel stations, cogeneration units, diesel/gas turbines etc. This will not apply to firms whose terms are fixed on individual negotiation.

VIII. OFFICERS AND STAFF POSTED TO HYDRO STATIONS :

In Memo. No. 61227/A1/92-1 dt. 21-9-92 the Board has ordered that in future no leave application will be entertained from those posted to Hydro generation area and if the person does not join duty within the joining time, disciplinary action shall be taken entailing termination of his/her services from the Board.

IX. INTEGRATED OPERATION OF SOUTHERN GRID—OVER—

In B.P. (FB) No. 247 (Tech. Branch) dt. 21-9-92 the Board has ordered collection of compensation charge for overdrawal of power by Andhra Pradesh State Electricity Board which TNEB could not draw from their share of central generation at frequency below 49.5 cycles at the rate of 112 paise per unit minus the pooled cost of generation effective from 1-4-92.

X. RETENTION OF BOARD'S QUARTERS—FIXING OF MARKET RATE :

In memo. No. 46987/O&M (4)/92-1 dt. 25-9-92, the Board has prescribed the method of arriving at the market rate by the Chief Engineer for occupation of Board's quarters beyond three months by the employees of the Board retired/removed from service/transferred and the dependent of deceased employees in all categories.

PROCEEDINGS:

It has been represented for creation of Inspection and Training Cells separately under the control of an Under Secretary for each Cell. In the B.P. cited, the Board has ordered that the present Under Secretary (Organisation and Methods) shall give training in the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Office Manual to all the staff in the offices of the Chief Engineer (Distribution) and Distribution Circles under their control in addition to his present work. At present the Organisation and Methods Cell deals with all matters relating to sanction and continuance of posts besides attending to inspection works in the offices of the Chief Engineer (Distribution) and five branches at headquarters. Besides this the Organisation and Methods Cell has now been entrusted with conducting studies to standardise the Man Power requirement in the Thermal and Hydel Stations. The present staff in the Organisation and Methods Cell find it very difficult to do justice to their work as most of their time is spent on examining the proposals on staff, inspection of various offices, preparation of inspection notes etc., They are not in a position to attend to the Training part of their work and to devote more time in conducting studies for standardisation of requirement of Man Power. In the above circumstances, it has now been decided to strengthen the Organisation and Methods Cell with additional staff.

2. In pursuance of the above decision, sanction is hereby accorded for creation of the following posts for a period of one year from the date of utilisation :—

3. The incumbent of the posts sanctioned in para 2 above are eligible to draw the usual pay, Dearness Allowance, House Rent Allowance, City Compensatory Allowance and other allowances admissible as per orders in force.

4. The Under Secretary will also be eligible to draw the cash allowance of Rs. 150/- (Rupees one hundred and fifty only) in lieu of resident Office Helper.

5. The Under Secretary shall be designated as Under Secretary/Organisation and Methods-II.

6. He will work under the direct control of Secretary.

7. The existing Under Secretary/Organisation and Methods and the newly sanctioned Under Secretary shall co-ordinate in all matters relating to Organisation and Methods.

8. The newly created Under Secretary/Organisation and Methods-II shall be in-charge of inspection works, giving training in Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Office Manual to all the staff in the offices of the Chief Engineer/Distribution and Distribution Circles under their control and all general matters relating to office procedures.

ORDER :

In the Government Orders first to sixth read above orders were issued for the grant of age, educational, fee and other concessions to the repatriates from East Pakistan, Burma, Sri Lanka, Vietnam and East African Countries of Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania while making recruitment to various posts in the Tamil Nadu State and Subordinate Services.

2. In their letter seventh read above, the Government of India have ordered that the age and fee concessions allowed to displaced persons from erstwhile East Pakistan (now Bangladesh) and repatriates from East African Countries Vietnam and West Pakistan extended upto 31-12-1988 will continue upto 31-12-1989 and discontinued thereafter and in respect of the repatriates from Burma and Sri Lanka, the concessions will continue upto 31-12-1990 and 31-12-1992, respectively. Public Services—Reservation of appointment in Public Services—Provision of separate reservation of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes—Fixation of 1% turn for Scheduled Tribes in communal roster—Orders Issued.

Read :

G.O. Ms. No. 1090, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department, dt. 22—6—1990.

ORDER :

In the Government order read above, the Government have ordered a separate reservation of 1% for Scheduled Tribes in Public Services and educational institutions out of the present reservation of 32% available for Open Competition.

2. According to the existing rule of reservation laid down in Rule 22 of the General Rules for Tamil Nadu State and Subordinate Services, the unit of selection for appointment for the purpose of the rule is fifty of which 9 vacancies are reserved for the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, 15 for the Backward Classes and 10 for the Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities and the remaining sixteen are filled on the basis of merit. At present as per the existing General Rule 22 and Schedule III to the above rule only 50 point roster is followed. The 1% reservation for Scheduled Tribes ordered in the Government order read above cannot be accommodated in the 50 point roster in each rotation. It has, therefore, been decided that the existing unit of 50 prescribed in rule 22(a) of the General Rules be revised into 100 so as to accommodate 1% reservation for Scheduled Tribes. As the 1% separate reservation of Scheduled Tribes has been taken from 32% reservation available for Open Competition, the Government have decided that the 51st turn in the unit of 100 may be reserved for Scheduled Tribes. They accordingly direct that the 51st turn be reserved for Scheduled Tribes as indicated in the annexure to this Government order.

The Regional Engineering College was kind enough to spare about 3 acres of land for Staff Training College Project under 90 years of lease to Tamil Nadu Electricity Board. The above land is adjacent to Regional Engineering College/Trichy and has been taken over by Tamil Nadu Electricity Board. While functioning of the proposed Staff Training College at Thuvakudi, the technical assistance towards lecture, laboratory, computer study, library etc. can also be availed from Regional Engineering College for better performance with their co-ordination. The Head of the Department of Civil Engineering, Regional Engineering College/Trichy has given the consent to undertake the consultancy work for the proposed Staff Training College Project at the rate of 2.5% of the total cost of the project which includes estimation and asthetic view.

The tentative estimate cost for the newly proposed Staff Training College at Thuvakudy, Trichy with amenities as per the requirement works out for a total built up area of 27,200 sq. ft. adopting the rate of Rs. 200/- per sq. ft. to Rs. 54,40,000/-. Taking into consideration of the above tentative cost, the quantum of service charges payable for the consultancy work to Regional Engineering College works out to Rs. 1,36,000/-. This includes service charges for preparing plan, layout, estimation, landscape asthetic view, detailed drawing etc. till the completion of the project well within the stipulated period. This is a framed structure in order to cater the requirements within the available limited area. The facilities available at the Irrigation Management Training Institute situated adjacent to the proposed Staff Training College are to be adopted in the design.

After consideration of the above, approval is hereby accorded for the payment of the consultancy charges to Regional Engineering College/Trichy at the rate of 2.5% on the cost for the establishment of the newly proposed Staff Training College at Thuvakudy, Trichy.

The proposal for providing borewell, construction of pump room, compound wall if necessary, formation of approach roads, landscaping arrangement, sanitary arrangement and other infrastructures can be carried out by Tamil Nadu Electricity Board under separate sanction.

In the B.P. cited, the Board sanctioned a monthly Medical Allowance to the employees of the Board. It was ordered that the scheme for re-imbusement of medicines purchased by the employees based on the certificate furnished by the Medical Officers should be retained and that a monthly medical allowance of Rs. 15/- (Rupees fifteen only) per month should be sanctioned for those employees who wish to opt out of the medical re-imbusement scheme. According to the orders in para 3 of the B.P. cited, the option should be exercised on or before 25—9—89 which was subsequently extended upto 20—4—90 in Memo. (Per) No. 6634/N2/90-1, (S.B) dt. 12—3—90.

2. The time limit prescribed above would apply to the existing employees as on the date of the order viz. 18—8—89. There is no specific provision with regard to the persons appointed to the Board's service after 18—8—89. For the persons newly appointed to the Board's service, normally Medical Re-imbusement Scheme will apply. However, it is hereby ordered that they will be permitted to opt out of the Medical Re-imbusement Scheme and get the medical allowance of Rs. 15/- per month if they give a specific declaration in this regard within 3 months from the date of joining the Board's Service. If no such declaration is received within the period of 3 months, it will be deemed that they wish to continue under the Medical Re-imbusement Scheme. I request you to refer the G.O. under reference and confirm the following presumptions with regard to exemption of levy of additional Electricity Tax.

(i) The G.O. has been issued on 30-7-92 and as such the exemption from levy of Electricity Tax have to be given effect to from the date of issue of G.O. only.

(ii) This concession is eligible for the new Industries set up on or after 30-7-92 only.

(iii) The Electricity tariff notification issued by Government from time to time indicates that the H.T. consumers covered under H.T. Tariff—I alone are eligible for tariff concession, and as such exemption from levy of additional Electricity Tax is eligible for new industries coming under H.T. Tariff—I connected on or after 30-7-92.

(iv) It is presumed that this exemption from levy of additional Electricity Tax is limited to H.T. supply only.

In para 5 of the B. P. first cited, it has been ordered that in all the cases where the advance for purchase of House/Flat is released in instalments, the sale deed shall be obtained for the undivided share of the land alone. The property shall however, be mortgaged at the appropriate stage for the entire amount of advance sanctioned. It has also been ordered in para 6 of the B. P. cited that in cases of applications for purchase of Ready Built House/Flats from private parties where the applicants make no specific request for release of advance in instalments, the advance shall be released in a lumpsum, as normally done in respect of purchase of Ready Built House/Flat. In such cases where the House Building Advance for purchase of a Ready Built House/Flat from private parties is released IN ONE LUMP SUM the sale deed shall be obtained for the land as well as for purchase of House/Flat.

2. Number of employees and some Unions have expressed difficulties in obtaining Sale deed for the land as well as for the purchase of the Flat and requested to permit them to submit the sale deed for the un-divided share of the land alone.

3. The matter has been examined in detail in consultation with the Government. The Government have clarified that in the case of purchase of a flat from the real estate firm, the sale deed for the land alone produced by the individual may be accepted and the property got mortgaged for the entire loan amount sanctioned.

4. After careful consideration, it is hereby ordered that in case, where the Board employee wish to purchase a flat from the real estate firm, the sale deed for the LAND ALONE produced by the individual may be accepted by the Sanctioning Authority hereafter and the property got mortgaged for the entire loan amount drawn by him. In other cases where the owners of the land and the flat are the same, the sale deed for the undivided share of the land and the flat shall be obtained and the property got mortgaged to the Board for the entire loan amount sanctioned.

Allotment of funds as detailed in the Annexure is made for the year 1992-93 for sanction of House Building Advance to the employees of the Board.

2. In respect of fresh cases of purchase of plot and construction/construction, allotment has been made only for 80% of the requirements. As per Rule, formal sanction can be made in such cases upto 25% over and above the provision now made. **THE SANCTIONING AUTHORITIES SHALL ENSURE THAT THE ACTUAL DISBURSEMENT IN SUCH CASES ARE AUTHORISED ONLY UPTO THE LIMIT OF FUNDS NOW ALLOTTED AND THAT ON NO ACCOUNT THE LIMIT IS EXCEEDED.**

3. Attention of the sanctioning authorities is invited to the Board's Memorandum No. 37077/E2/86-2, dt. 16—6—1986 wherein instructions have been issued among other things regarding assigning of priority number which are to be followed scrupulously. **Only THE APPLICATIONS THAT ARE IN A COMPLETE SHAPE ARE ENTERED IN THE PRIORITY REGISTER AND ALLOTMENT OF FUNDS ARE SOUGHT FOR ONLY FOR SUCH APPLICATIONS.** The sanctioning authorities are therefore informed that in respect of the funds allotted in Annexure to this Memorandum, sanctions shall be issued as per House Building Advance Rules IMMEDIATELY and speedy action taken to clear the pending applications and utilise the amounts fully. The sanctioning authorities are requested to pursue the House Building Advance cases closely and see that the time stipulated for construction is kept-up by the loanee employees and the amount allotted are utilised fully without any lapse.

4. If any applicant is not willing to avail the House Building Advance, necessary undertaking may be obtained from the applicant and the amount allotted should be surrendered immediately duly cancelling the application. If the applicant cancels his application on his own, the allotment made in such cases also should be surrendered immediately. Similarly, in cases where the House Building Advance could not be sanctioned immediately due to pendency of Disciplinary Proceedings (as defined in Rule-1 (iii) of House Building Advance Rules, which has arisen after assigning priority number) the fund obtained in respect of such cases should also be surrendered immediately. The applications, in such cases should not, however be cancelled. As and when the Disciplinary Proceeding is cleared and the applicant becomes eligible for sanction of House Building Advance, fund required for such cases may be intimated to this Office and allotment obtained.

5. The sanctioning authorities should closely pursue the indents made by them and if the same is not included in a subsequent allotment made or if there is any discrepancy in the allotment made, the matter should be reported to Board Office Secretariat Branch immediately.

6. The sanctioning authorities are requested to notify in the Notice Board in their offices on 10th OF EVERY MONTH; the information about applications which have been sanctioned upto a specific date. The notification should also indicate upto which priority number in the priority Register, advances have been sanctioned. This notification should be displayed on the Notice Board for a MINIMUM PERIOD OF FIVE DAYS.

7. It is also informed that in the case of purchase of Ready Built House/Flats/Additional House Building Advance, applications received UPTO 30—6—92 which are in complete shape shall be considered now and sanction orders issued. A clear copy of the sanction order should be SENT ALONG WITH THE REQUISITION for allotment of funds for the same. Of late it is noticed that, in cases of H.T. Industries, which reduce their existing sanctioned demand, certain Superintending Engineers follow the mode of calculation of demand quota indicated in the reference 1 & 2 cited and fix demand quota based on the base demand recorded against the original sanctioned demand. The mode of fixing demand quota contained in the reference cited, was ordered under a specific context, when representations for reduction of demand were received enmasse during 10/85, consequent on introduction of revised billing of Maximum Demand charges and hence the same may not be relevant now.

2. In view of the above, the following orders are now issued, in partial modification of the orders issued in the references cited:—

On receipt of application from a H.T. consumer for reduction of the contracted demand, the Superintending Engineer/Electricity Distribution Circle shall immediately make a reference to this office irrespective of whether the consumer has been given special quota based on his original contracted demand or he has been given quota with reference to the base demand. The Board will inform the Superintending Engineer/Electricity Distribution Circle of the revised quota with reference to the reduced contracted demand proposed. Only on receipt of Board's orders refixing the quota, the Superintending Engineer/Electricity Distribution Circle shall issue orders towards reduction of the contracted demand and the revised quota will take effect from the date of effecting reduction in contracted demand.

In the D. O. letter cited under reference, a list of 1655 Adi-Dravidar colonies said to be un-electrified, as received from Government was sent to the field officers for conducting necessary survey.

2. From the Survey conducted, it emerged that out of 1655 Adi-Dravidar colonies, identified by the Government for provision of street lights, only 1652 are in Board's areas. Out of this, only 394 Adi-Dravidar colonies are yet to be provided street lights, against which applications have been received only in respect of 74 colonies. The circlewise list of these 74 colonies is enclosed. It is presumed that these applications would have been included in the Special Self Sufficiency Scheme of street lights.

3. The Superintending Engineers/Electricity Distribution Circles are requested to verify the above and arrange to complete erection of street lights in the above colonies and furnish monthwise progress report.

4. The balance colonies may have to be electrified under normal programme in subsequent years as per priority of receipt of applications and subject to availability of funds.
Receipt of applications for these colonies may be reported every month.

“Power Feed Scheme” is in operation in Tamil Nadu Electricity Board area mainly for absorbing the surplus power from private sector cogeneration plants, windmills, mini/micro hydel schemes, diesel/gas turbine sets, as per the terms of the Board's Proceedings first cited. A rate of Re. 1.00 (RUPEE ONE ONLY) per unit was fixed in the B.P. second cited. Some of the private captive wind energy generating consumers requested to enhance the above rate, fixed during 1990—91.

2. After careful consideration, the following is approved by the Board.

In partial modification of orders issued under para-2(i) of the B.P. dated 3—7—90 cited second above, a rate of Rs. 1.25 (Rupee One and Paise twenty five only) per unit is fixed with effect from 1—9—1992 for purchase of surplus power from private sector windmills, mini/micro hydel stations, cogeneration units, diesel/gas turbines, etc.,

3. The above rate will be applicable until further orders and will not apply to firms whose terms for feeding into grid were fixed on individual negotiation.

NORTH MADRAS THERMAL POWER PROJECT—Utilisation of fly ash—Policy decision—Approved.

PROCEEDINGS :

The North Madras Thermal Power Project (NMTTP) envisages installation of 3 Units of 210 MW each under Stage-I. The capacity of the project is proposed to be increased to 2130 MW with 1 x 500 MW in Stage-II and 2 x 500 MW in Stage-III. The requirement of coal for Stage-I is 2.4 Million tonnes per annum and for the Ultimate Stage is 8.0 million tonnes/annum. When Stage-I of the project is completed and commissioned one million tonnes/annum of ash will be generated and this quantity will rise to 3.5 million tonnes/annum when the Ultimate stage is completed.

2. The Ministry of Environment and Forest, New Delhi (MOEF) and the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board (TNPCB) insist that the fly ash produced in the Thermal stations should be utilised beneficially preferably 100%. The Working Group constituted by the Ministry of Energy, Government of India in March 1990 had also recommended major guidelines for efficient use of fly ash. Also number of private entrepreneurs have come forward and approached the Board for setting up plant for manufacture of fly ash based products at North Madras Thermal Power Project. Taking into account all the above aspects, the Board after careful considerations approves the following with regard to utilisation of fly ash at NMTTP/Station.

- (i) Dry fly ash will be supplied free of cost at Power House site to all entrepreneur's who come forward to instal a plant to manufacture bricks, hollow blocks, etc.
- (ii) Initially the dry fly ash will be collected at a common place near the ESP hoppers and the company has to take the fly ash in closed lorries and transport to their respective factories.
- (iii) Simultaneously the Board can lay pipe lines and instal silos, etc., and bring the dry fly ash upto the point of compound wall of the NMTTP from where the entrepreneurs have to lay pipe lines and make other arrangements to take the fly ash to their factories. The probable cost of this is expected to be Rs. 20 Crores.
- (iv) An entrepreneur may require about 5 to 10 acres of land for establishing the factories. Land to an extent of 100 acres in the proposed ash dump area may be reserved for allocating to the entrepreneurs. The land will be allocated on "first come first" basis on lease after assessing capability of each.
- (v) Each entrepreneur may require about 500 m³/day of raw water assuming that 50,000 Tonnes per annum of fly ash will be used. For using 100% of fly ash under the ultimate stage (35 Lakh tonnes/annum) the raw water that will be required by the entrepreneurs will be about 7 mgd. It will not be possible to spare this entire quantity of water by the Board. However raw water to the least extent of requirement will be spared by the Board at intake cost plus expenses to a few entrepreneurs who come forward initially.
- (vi) Power supply can be extended to entrepreneur on priority basis as and when needed on regular terms and conditions in force from time to time.

Sub : Retreading/Recapping of tyres approval of rates for the period from 1—4—92 to 31—3—93 orders communicated.

The list of firms with approved rates for retreading/recapping of tyres both conventional/precured for the year 1992-93 received from the Director/Tamil Nadu Motor Vehicle Maintenance Department/Madras-83 is herewith enclosed.

The vehicle using officers are requested to ensure that the tyre retreading works are entrusted to private firms at the rates approved as shown in the Annexures I & II.

In places where no retreading/recapping tyre unit of the approved companies exist, the work of retreading recapping should be entrusted to the tyre units approved in nearby districts.

The to and fro transportation charges for entrusting the tyre for retreading/recapping will be borne by the respective tyre retreading agency.

To avoid any hardship to the retreading firm the payment may be arranged with in 30 days on receipt of the bills.

Any undue delay in completing the tyre retreading/recapping work within the stipulated time of seven days for both under conventional and precured process may be brought to the notice of the Director/Tamil Nadu Motor Vehicle Maintenance Department with a copy to the Superintending Engineer/Materials Management-II for taking suitable action against the firm.

The tyres retreaded shall serve the kilometres noted below :—

	Conventional	Procured
1. Tyre of light vehicle	16,000 KMs.	20,000 KMs.
2. Tyre of Heavy vehicle	20,000 KMs.	25,000 KMs.

If the performance of the tyre is not satisfactory the defects shall be rectified at free of cost/transport or proportional cost refunded by the firms.

The rates for retreading/recapping of various sizes of tyres and repair charges in each district are shown in the Annexures I & II. The rates are NETT and inclusive of all taxes, surcharge, etc., and will be effective till 31—3—1993.

The rates approved for private tyre retreading firms are made applicable to State Transport Undertakings in the respective districts.

"No objection certificate" from State Transport Undertakings before entrustment of tyre retreading/recapping both under conventional/precured process with the private firms need not be obtained.

The vehicle using officers shall decide the process (conventional/precured) for even first retreading/recapping of tyres.

The above are communicated to the field for their information/guidance and strict adherence.

A Statement showing the Electricity Distribution Circlewise target for Extension of supply to Street—light locations under the normal programme for 1992—'93 is forwarded herewith.

2.0. This target shall be for energisation street lights in Municipalities, Municipal Townships, Tamil Nadu Housing Board colonies and Tamil Nadu Urban Development Programme Areas.

2.1. The street lights under the normal programme shall be effected in the following order :—

- (i) All those locations which involve erection of fittings only may be cleared first.
- (ii) Cases involving erection of fittings and additional third or fifth conductor may be taken after consideration of the cases under (i) above.
- (iii) All locations where poles are to be erected, lines strung and fittings erected will be taken up after (i) and (ii)

3.0. The street lights under the Deposit Contribution Works category shall be effected outside the normal target under top priority.

4.0. The applications for street lights in Village panchayats and Town panchayats have to be assigned under the Special Self Sufficiency Scheme to the extent feasible.

5.0. The progress on energisation of street lights under the normal programme shall be furnished along with the 20 Point Programme Progress. The target is tentative at 15,000 locations based on the figures furnished by the Superintending Engineer/Electricity Distribution Circles and the total target for the year is 20,000 locations.

CHAPTER IV—REVISED PROJECT ESTIMATES

4.10. In case of major and medium projects which have been approved the Planning Commission and where the revised estimates of the Project have increased by more than 15% of the original estimates, excluding escalation due to price rise, or where there is change in scope will be required to be furnished to CWC for examination in the same way as new major and medium schemes irrespective of the fact whether the revision is due to change in scope or not. The procedure for scrutiny for such revised project estimates shall be same as outlined in the proceeding chapters.

4.11. In respect of revised project estimates where there is no change in the scope and where the cost excluding escalation due to price rise has not changed by more than 15%, the State Government need not forward a detailed estimate for examination at Centre. For such projects the State Government should send to CWC an excess note after obtaining the concurrence of the State Finance Department giving the abstract of cost under major sub head indicating the excess cost over the sanctioned cost and giving reasons thereof. The note will include the salient features of the project as originally proposed and as being executed at site. The CWC will examine such estimates broadly and send its views to the Advisory Committee for consideration and recommendation of the Planning Commission.

4.12. In so far as preparation of cost estimates is concerned the estimates may be framed on the basis of local schedule of rates for items covered by the schedule and for others an analysis of rates will be prepared as per the guidelines issued by CWC and in case of any doubt on the viability of rates of any items a certificate of the State Chief Engineer on the reasonability of the rates shall be taken as final and acceptable.

4.13. The rate of escalation due to price rise shall be based on the studies made by the Construction Planning and Management Unit of CWC from year to year.

The Central Electricity Authority has been according techno-economic approval to Power Projects covering Thermal and Hydro generation schemes and Transmission and Distribution works. After CEA's clearance, the investment approval is accorded by the Planning commission in respect of State Projects. For the projects in the Central Sectors, the Govt. of India accords expenditure sanction after clearance by the Expenditure Finance Committee/Public Investment Board/CEA as applicable.

2. The requirement of funds for the project vis-a-vis the purposes thereof is discussed during the Annual Plan discussions in the CEA and Planning commission. In case the Project costs exceed the approved cost by more than 15-20% Revised estimates are insisted upon to keep a check on the expenditure and analyse the reasons for revision.

3. The Revised cost estimates are framed by the State Electricity Boards/Power Generating companies and forwarded to CEA for approval. It has been observed that in many of the cases the increase in cost is very high as compared to that of the original estimates. Consequently, the techno-economic viability of the scheme gets seriously affected and it becomes difficult for CEA to approve the Revised cost estimates.

4. You would kindly appreciate that there is an urgent need to exercise strict control over expenditure being incurred over the project vis-a-vis the sanctioned cost. This would require close and constant monitoring of construction activities and financial expenditure on the project by the top management, so as to minimise the cost and time over-runs.

5. In order to enable quick appraisal of the Revised cost estimates in CEA, I would request that the following procedures may please be adopted for preparation and submission of the Revised cost estimates ;

- (i) For the works which have already been completed, and for the material already received, the actual cost incurred should be incorporated in the Revised cost estimates.
- (ii) For the balance of material and works, the costs should be on the basis of orders placed. In case orders for certain materials have not been placed, the prevalent market rates should be adopted.
- (iii) The establishment charges in the case of Revised cost estimates should be on the basis of actuals upto the time of preparation of Revised cost estimates and for the balance period on the basis of projections. The establishment charges in RCEs should not be based as a percentage of the revised cost of works.
- (iv) In so far as preparation of Revised Cost Estimates of civil works of Hydro Projects is concerned, the same may be framed on the basis of guidelines issued by the Central Water Commission. (Copy enclosed).
- (v) The increase in the estimated cost over the sanctioned estimates should be computed under the following five heads. Detailed reasons for such increases should also be given.
 - (a) Cost increase due to exchange rate variation (if application)
 - (b) Cost increase due to escalation of prices of material, equipment and labour;
 - (c) Cost increase due to inadequate provisions/new items;
 - (d) Cost increase due to change in quantities/scope/design parameters; and
 - (e) Cost increase due to other reasons (to be specified).
- (vi) In case the time gap between the techno-economic approval of the scheme by CEA and actual start of work on the project is three years or more, the scheme with the Revised Cost Estimates should be submitted to CEA for fresh techno-economic approval before starting the works.
- (vii) Where expenditure much in excess of the approved cost of a project has been incurred without getting the approval for the Revised Cost Estimates, the Head of the Deptt./Project would have to satisfy himself about the reasonableness of the same, as CEA would not be able to examine such fait accompli Revised Cost Estimates.

4. You would kindly appreciate that the time taken in examination and clearance of RCEs would depend upon the extent of details/information provided in the Revised Cost Estimates. I would, therefore, request you to kindly ensure that the RCEs are prepared with due care and adequate details are covered so as to minimise frequent back references/correspondence etc. as also frequent revisions.
