II. Hydro Inflows :

Proceedings :

The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board hereby directs that the orders issued in the G.O. read above, a copy which is annexed to this B.P. shall be adopted to Board's Service. Consequently, the reservation of vacancies provided for Physically Handicapped persons, need not be made in respect of recruitment to the posts in Class I and Class II Services and for recruitment by transfer/promotion to any category.

Social Welfare—Welfare of Physically Handicapped—Public Services—Tamil Nadu State and Subordinate Services—Reservation of vacancies for Physically Handicapped persons—Certain Clarifications sought for by Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission—Orders—Issued.

2. G.O. Ms. No. 983, Personnel and Administrative Reforms (Per. P) Department, dated 7-10-86.

Order :

In Government Order first read above orders were issued to the effect that three percent of vacancies/seats shall be reserved in all State Public Services/Educational Institutions, under all kinds of managements (like Government local bodies and aided managements, including Universities where the rule of reservations applicable for Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes and Backward Classes). Based on the above orders General Rule 22 has been amended in the Government Order second read above.

2. The Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission has now sought for clarification whether the reservation of 3% vacancies for Physically Handicapped persons will be applicable to the Executive posts, for which physical standards have been prescribed and whether the reservation of 3% vacancies for Physically Handicapped Persons should be made applicable in the case of recruitment by transfer/promotion.

3. The Government after careful examination direct that the reservation of 3% vacancies for physically handicapped persons should be made applicable to the Executive posts in respect of C & D categories and that the individuals selected for C & D categories of posts should be asked to produce a certificate of physical fitness from the Medical Board to the effect that their handicaps will not affect the performance of the job to which he/she has been selected, before appointment. In respect of executive posts under A & B categories no reservation need be made to physically handicapped persons.

4. The Government also direct that the reservation of 3% vacancies for physically handicapped persons need not be made applicable in the case of recruitment by transfer/promotion as it would amount to giving double preference to these candidates and it would amount to their scoring over normal persons.

Sub : FUNDS—General Provident Fund (Tamil Nadu)—Temporary Advance/Part-Final withdrawal—Sanction — Instructions—Issued.

The attention of Departments of Secretariat and Heads of Departments is invited to the existing provisions under Rule 14 (1) of General Provident Fund (Tamil Nadu) Rules, pertaining to sanction of temporary advance to the employees, wherein it has been clearly laid down that a temporary advance shall not except for special reasons exceed half of the amount at credit in the account of the subscriber and only in special circumstances an advance upto three fourth of the balance at credit can be sanctioned.

2. In practice it is noticed that authorities competent to sanction temporary advance, sanction three fourth of the balance at credit almost in all cases in a routine manner. As the General Provident Fund scheme is meant as a welfare measure in the interest of Government employees and their family, frequent heavy withdrawals from General Provident Fund will defeat the very purpose of the scheme.

3. In the light of the position explained above the following guidelines are issued for strict adherence for sanction of withdrawals from Provident Fund :—

1. The provisions in General Provident Fund (Tamil Nadu) Rules should be scrupulously followed and the authorities competent to sanction General Provident Fund to various categories of Government employees, should exercise utmost restraint while sanctioning temporary advance and in no case the temporary advance shall exceed 50% of the amount at credit.
2. The Government also like to reiterate that part-final withdrawals should not on any account be allowed to those who have not completed fifteen years of service. The proposals from various Government Departments recommending relaxation of General Provident Fund (Tamil Nadu) Rules for sanctioning withdrawals from Provident Fund will not be entertained hereafter.

Amenities—Mettur Thermal Power Station—Running of Canteen on Co-operative basis by the employees of Mettur Thermal Power Station—Permission Accorded.

Proceedings :

The Chief Engineer/Mettur Thermal Power Station has sent a proposal to run canteen on Co-operative basis by the employees of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board as the present arrangement of leasing the canteen on contract, does not cater to the needs of the employees of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board at the Thermal plant.

2. The above proposal of the Chief Engineer/Mettur Thermal Power Station to run the canteen in the Mettur Thermal Power Station Complex by the staff members of the plant on Co-operative basis has been examined. It is hereby ordered that permission to run the canteen as proposed is granted subject to the following terms and conditions:-

- (1) A nominal rent of Re. 1/- (Rupee One only) shall be fixed for Canteen building.
- (2) No free supply of Electricity will be made. Usual charges shall be levied for the energy consumed by the Co-operative Canteen. Water shall be provided at free of cost.
- (3) No loans, grants and any subsidy will be given by the Board and the proposed managing committee should run the canteen at its own risk.
- (4) The rates of the drinks and eatables shall be specified by the Chief Engineer/Mettur Thermal Power Station at slightly less than the market rate and good quality should be maintained.
- (5) The Canteen should run in all working days without interruption as the Thermal Station is functioning round the clock.

4. The matter has been examined and after careful consideration the Board hereby directs that:

- (i) the women dependants of the employees of the Board who die while in service due to accident during and as a result of their normal duties with a pass in IV Standard and above shall be engaged on consolidated wages of Rs. 500/650/800 p.m. as Office-Helper (Trainee) for a period of three years training to attend to the work of Office Helper.
- (ii) The men dependants of employees of the Board who die while in service due to accident during and as a result of their normal duties with a pass in IV Standard and above shall be engaged on consolidated wages of Rs. 500/650/800 p.m. as Helper (Trainee) for a period of three years training and to attend to the work of Helper.

Regulations—Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulations—Voluntary retirement of employees—Giving weightage of not exceeding 5 years—Regulation 17(gg) of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulations—Amendment—Issued.

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 79(c) of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948 (Central Act 54 of 1948), the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board hereby makes the following amendments to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulations.

Amendments

In the said Regulations, in Regulation 17 for sub-regulation (gg) the following sub-regulation shall be substituted namely :—

“(gg) **Voluntary retirement.**—(a) An employee, who has attained the age of fifty years or who has completed twenty years of qualifying service, may retire from service by giving notice of not less than three months in writing **direct to the** appointing authority with a copy marked to his immediate superior Officer for information. Before giving such notice, he may satisfy himself by means of a reference to such authority that he has completed the required number of years of qualifying service.

Explanation :— The term "appointing authority" means the authority which has the power to make appointment to the post from which the employee wants to retire and includes any higher authority to such appointing authority.

(b) The period of three months notice shall be reckoned from the date of receipt of notice by the appointing authority.

(c) The three months notice may be given before the employee attains the qualifying age or the qualifying service, as the case may be provided that the retirement takes place after attaining the specified age or completing the required number of years of qualifying service, as the case may be.

(d) (i) An employee including an Office Helper/Duffadar and certain categories of Regular work Establishment workmen, for whom the age of retirement is 60 years retiring voluntarily shall be given weightage not exceeding five years, subject to the condition that the total qualifying service including the weightage shall not, in any case, exceed thirty three years or shall not be allowed to take his service beyond his normal date of superannuation, as the case may be. The weightage shall be calculated as specified in the Table below :—

(ii) The weightage given shall be in addition to the qualifying service for purposes of pension and gratuity only and it shall not entitle an employee retiring voluntarily to any notional fixation of pay for purposes of calculating the pension and gratuity. The pension shall be based on the average emoluments drawn during the last ten months prior to the date of such voluntary retirement and gratuity on the actual emoluments on the date of such voluntary retirement.

(e) Notice of voluntary retirement given by an employee shall be accepted by the appointing authority, subject to the following conditions being satisfied, namely :—

(i) that no disciplinary proceedings are contemplated or pending against the employee concerned for the imposition of a major penalty ;

- (ii) that no prosecution is contemplated or pending in a Court of Law against the employee concerned ;
- (iii) that a report from the Vigilance Cell has been obtained to the effect that no enquiry is contemplated or pending against the employee concerned in Vigilance Wings ;
- (iv) that no dues which cannot be recovered from his Death-cum-Retirement Gratuity are pending to be recovered from the employee concerned ; and
- (v) that there is no contractual obligation to serve the Board during the period in which the employee concerned seeks to retire voluntarily.
- (f) The appointing authority shall issue orders before the date of expiry of notice either accepting the voluntary retirement or not. Otherwise, the employee shall be deemed to have been retired voluntarily from service at the end of the period of notice :

Provided that where an employee under suspension or against whom disciplinary or criminal action is pending, seeks to retire voluntarily, specific orders of the appointing authority for such voluntary retirement is necessary. The appointing authority may withhold the permission sought for by the employee, if any of the conditions specified in clause (e) are not satisfied.

(g) The employee may withdraw the notice of voluntary retirement or withdraw the voluntary retirement after acceptance, as the case may be, subsequently with the approval of the appointing authority, before the expiry of the period of notice".

According to the orders issued in the B.Ps. cited, in the case of the employees of the Board retiring from service on or after 26-2-70, Dearness Allowance upto the level obtaining in December, '66 shall be reckoned as pay for purposes of pension and gratuity.

2. Following the orders issued by the Government in G.O.Ms.No. 911, Finance (Pension) Department dated 4-12-1991, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board passes the following orders :-

- (i) In the case of the employees of the Board who have retired during the period from 1-12-66 to 25-2-70, the Dearness Allowance upto the level obtaining in December 1966 as mentioned below shall be reckoned as pay for purposes of pension gratuity :-

The Dearness Allowance prevailing upto the level of December '66 can be treated as pay for the entire period of calculation of average emoluments only in cases where the period of average emoluments falls on or after 1-12-66. In case where the entire period of average emoluments falls before 1-12-'66, the Dearness Allowance admissible from time to time prior to 1-12-66 only can be treated as pay. In case where the period of average emoluments falls partially before 1-12-66, and partially on or after 1-12-66, the Dearness Allowance admissible prior to 1-12-66 for the period of average emoluments before 1-12-66 and the December 1966 Dearness Allowance for the period of average emoluments on or after 1-12-66 has to be treated as pay.

(ii) In respect of the employees who have retired prior to 1-12-'66, the Dearness Allowance actually drawn by them shall be reckoned as pay for purposes of pension and gratuity. The rates of Dearness Allowance admissible from time to time are furnished in the Annexure-I to this order.

3. Each pensioner whether he is within or outside the State of Tamil Nadu shall apply for recomputation of their original pension at the time of retirement in the prescribed form (Annexure-II) to the Chief Internal Audit Officer.

4. The re-computation of pension in terms of these orders shall be made notionally in respect of the following revision :-

- (1) Revision of original pension at the time of retirement with reference to this order.
- (2) Revised pension from 1-4-78 with reference to B.P.Ms.No. 106 (Adm.) dt. 17-10-79.
- (3) Revised pension from 1-10-79 with reference to B.P.Ms.(FB)No. 77, (SB) dt. 15-9-84.
- (4) Revised pension from 1-10-79 with reference to B.P.Ms.(Ch)No. 54, (SB) dt. 19-3-91.

- (5) Revised pension from 1-10-'84 with reference to (Per.) B.P. Ms. No. 479, (SB), dt. 30-12-85.
 (6) Revised pension from 14-12-'87 with reference to B.P.Ms. (Ch) No. 28, (SB) dt. 8-2-'88
 (7) Revised pension from 1-6-'88 with reference to (Per.) B.P. (Ch) No. 258. (SB) dt. 20-9-'89;

5. The notional revised pension so arrived at from 1-6-88 may be paid with effect from 1-12-91. In the case of employees of the Board who have retired prior to 26-2-70 but died prior to 1-12-91, such pensioners are not eligible for revision. However, in respect of cases of death of pensioners on or after 1-12-91, the life time arrears is payable to legal heirs. For this purpose, the legal heirs may also apply to the Chief Internal Audit Officer.

6. Commutation of pension is not permissible for the additional amount of pension accruing as a result of this order.

Proceedings :

M/s. Southern Railways are availing H.T. supply from Tamil Nadu Electricity Board at several Traction Sub-station points. They are exceeding the Contracted Maximum Demand at a particular point of supply of Traction Sub-station due to transfer of loads from the adjacent Traction Sub-station point of supply in case of emergency (i.e. Electricity Board supply failure). The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board is charging such excess Contracted Maximum Demand at double the normal rate as per Clause 18.02 of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity. M/s. Southern Railways have represented to Tamil Nadu Electricity Board not to levy penal charges on such contingencies.

After careful consideration of the above representation Tamil Nadu Electricity Board hereby orders not to levy penal charges for any excess demand which has arisen due to transfer of load of a particular Traction Sub-station point of supply to another adjacent Traction Sub-station point of supply in case of emergency arising out of Electricity Board's supply failure etc.

Further to the letter first cited, it is to be informed that the Board has approved the request of M/s. Southern Railways not to levy penal charges for any excess demand which has arisen due to transfer of load of a particular Traction Substation point of supply to another adjacent Traction Sub-station point of supply in case of emergency arising out of Electricity Board's supply failure etc. Hence you are requested to contact the Chief Engineers/Superintending Engineers concerned in the matter whenever such contingencies arise.

(2) The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board has not approved the request of M/s. Southern Railways for not levying penal charges whenever they exceed the sanctioned maximum demand where the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board is not able to accord sanction for additional loads in a period of two months due to various Technical reasons attributable to Tamil Nadu Electricity Board.

Electricity—Wind Power generation by private sector—Parallel operation with Board's grid—Revised guidelines—issued.

Proceedings :

The Board is encouraging private wind power generation and has extended a number of facilities to the private sector in this regard. The Govt. of India is also giving depreciation benefit in the Income tax to the industries. In order to avail this income tax benefit, the industries are very keen in commissioning their private windmills before March or September every year. To enable the industries to commission their wind mills within March or September every year, the Board has to streamline the procedures so that the private windfarm applications are processed in a time bound manner.

2. The following guidelines are issued to partial modification of the existing instructions in Board's proceedings (2) cited.

(i) The request for a 'No Objection Certificate' to install private windmill will be made by the promoters to the Special Officer/Wind Energy Development Cell/Madurai (SO/WEDC). The Special Officer/Wind Energy Development Cell will arrange to investigate the request and to recommend the case to Chief Engineer/Planning within 15 days. The Chief Engineer/Planning will put up the proposal to Member (Generation) within a week for approval. On approval, the 'No Objection Certificate' will be issued within a week with copy to concerned officers in Distribution Circles and Wind Energy Development Cell.

(ii) The feasibility report for tie up shall be prepared by the Special Officer/Wind Energy Development Cell in consultation with the respective Superintending Engineer/Distribution Circle and submitted to the Chief Engineer/Planning within 15 days. The Chief Engineer/planning will put up the proposal to Member (Generation). Tie up approval for synchronising will be communicated by Chief Engineer/Planning with copy to all within a week.

(iii) The Special Officer/Wind Energy Development Cell will submit the estimate for carrying out the interfacing works to the respective Chief Engineer/Distribution. The Chief Engineer/Distribution shall sanction the estimate within a week. The Special Officer/Wind Energy Development Cell will collect the estimated amount and carry out the interfacing works. The actual expenditure has to be assessed immediately after completion of the works and the balance amount, if any, shall be collected from the Company immediately. Similarly the excess amount, if any, shall be refunded to the Company promptly so as to avoid unnecessary representations from them.

(iv) Agreement should be executed by the respective Superintending Engineer/Distribution circle with the Companies immediately on payment of the estimated amount towards deposit contribution works. Where 'No Objection Certificate' has been issued to certain Companies for more than one windmill and if they put up only a few wind mills initially and then go in for installing the remaining wind mills at a later date, the agreement has to be executed only for the units proposed to be installed and commissioned initially.

(v) On completion of work, the machines shall be tied up with the grid immediately after obtaining necessary clearance from Chief Electrical Inspector to Government.

(vi) Generally one HT service connection for one Wind Electricity turbine is approved for adjusting/banking the energy. In cases where the metering point is for more than one Wind Electric turbine, the number of H.T. service connections where energy is adjusted will be equal to the number of Wind Electric turbines, but these H.T. service connections shall be in one and the same circle. In exceptional cases where more number of H.T. service connections are approved for adjustment of energy, the above guidelines shall be observed. Where H.T. service connections in different circles are envisaged for adjustment, the promoter shall have corresponding number of metering points grouping the wind Energy Turbines suitably.

(vii) For adjustment of banked energy in respect of L.T. services, the L.T. service shall be treated as H.T. service for billing purposes and the account maintained in the Central office of Distribution Circles. After preparing the bill for the units consumed by the L.T. service connection, the energy generated by the private wind mills shall be adjusted at the H.T. tariff energy rates.

(viii) Since the metering is provided by the Board after collection of the amount from the promoters, the cost of subsequent repairs to the meters, if any, need not be collected from them. During the defective period of the meters, the units generated can be computed based on the units recorded in the control panel of the windmill and by comparison with the nearby wind mill generator.

(ix) In the case of non-availability of trivector meters, energy meters/peak hour meters can be installed in the private wind mills. Hence in the agreement, the words "trivector meter/energy meter" shall be incorporated instead of "Trivector meters".

(x) Wind energy generated every month can be wheeled and wiped out within three successive billing months. The Company may sell the **surplus energy** or the entire energy to the Board at the unit rate fixed by the Board which is at present Rs. 1.25. If the Company does not desire to sell even this surplus energy to the Board, it can opt for banking scheme.

(xi) Banking of wind power can be considered based on the representation of the Companies. In the Banking scheme, the Banking charges of 2% should be collected only for the energy required to be banked besides the 2% wheeling charges already imposed on total units generated. The Company may also have the option of banking the energy directly without adjusting in the bills. In that case the banking charge of 2% is applicable to all the energy requested to be banked besides the 2% wheeling charges. The banked energy can be permitted to be drawn during power cut period also, over and above the energy quota. The additional demand can be permitted as per Restriction & Control orders during power cut for this additional energy.

In exercise of the Powers conferred by Section 49 of the Electricity (Supply) Act 1948 (Central Act LIV of 1948), the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board issues the following amendment to the Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity notified in B.P. Ms. (F.B.) No. 61 (Adm. Br.) dated 24-12-88 and published in Part-VI-Section 3 (b) of the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette No. 8 of 1-3-89 and as amended subsequently.

The orders will come into force with immediate effect.

Amendment

The existing Clause 8.01 and 8.02 of Schedule Part-I of Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity shall be deleted and the following texts shall be substituted.

8.01 : If any consumer commits in a second or subsequent violation in the same service connection, action will be taken as follows :

Sl. No.	Violation	Action
(a)	For the second time within five years from the date of first violation.	Supply will be kept disconnected and re-connection can be done on payment of 5 times the rate as defined in Clauses 2.02 and 2.03 of this Schedule, in one lumpsum and also on removal of violation.
(b)	For the third time within five years from the date of first violation.	Supply will be kept disconnected and re-connection can be done on payment of 10 times the rate as defined in Clauses 2.02 and 2.03 of this Schedule in one lumpsum and also on removal of violation.
(c)	For the fourth and subsequent violations within 5 years from the date of detection of the first violation.	Supply will be kept disconnected for one month and reconnection can be done on removal of violation and after expiry of 1 month in addition to payment of compensation charges at four times as defined in Clauses 2.02 and 2.03 of this Schedule.

In view of this amendment the term 'violation' wherever occurs in Clause 10.00 of Schedule Part-I shall be deleted.
