**VI. Pension Rules — Amendment:**

In Letter No. 82170-N1/94-1 dt. 2—12—'94, the Board has ordered compliance of Govt. G.O. 885, Finance (Pension) Department dt. 26—10—'94 by which the qualifying service has been stipulated as twenty eight years or fifty three years or age whichever is earlier :

**VII. Collection of Development Charges from Domestic and Commercial Services :**

In Memo. No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE2/I(c)11/D405 dt. 8—12—'94 it has been clarified that the revised rates of development charges as per B.P. (FB) No.190 dt. 25—8—1993 will be applicable only for cases where development charges have not been collected earlier. If the development charges have already been collected at the old rates new rates before the issue of the B.P. then there is no need to collect refund the difference in development charges.

**VIII. DCW Works—Supply of Materials and Erection by the Consumers :**

In B.P. (FB) No. 358, Tech. Branch dt. 5—12—'94 it has been ordered-

- (a) To adopt 50% of the normal rate of Establishment & Supervision charges as chargeable to the consumer under DCW wherever the portion of works including supply of materials and execution of the works are done by the applicant/consumer.

The above will take into effect retrospectively in cases where estimates only have been sanctioned but works are yet to be taken up.

**IX. Fixation of Pay for Steno Typist on Promotion :**

B.P.(FB) No. 71, Adm. Branch dt. 8—12—'94, it has been ordered that fixation of pay to Superintendent-cum-Steno and Assistant-cum-Steno on promotion from Assistant-cum-Steno and Steno Typist respectively may be made under SR 33 (b) of T.N.E.B. Service Regulation from the date of their joining in the promoted category.

**X. Purchase of Stores — Adoption of Government Order :**

In B.P. (FB) No. 377 Tech. Branch dt. 16—12—'94, the Board has ordered adoption of G.O.Ms. No. 708, Finance (BPE) Dept. dt. 22—8—'94.

**XI. Grant of Family Pension and Gratuity to Employees who Disappear :**

In Letter No. 4928-N1/93-1 dt. 9—12—94 the Board has adopted the clarificatory order issued by the Government in Government Lr. No. 77003 Pen/92-5 dt. 13—1—'93.

**XII. Purchase of Materials—Enhanced Power to Superintending Engineers :**

In B.P.(FB) No. 128, Sectt. Branch dt. 22—12—'94, the Board has enhanced the powers of Superintending Engineer for purchase of materials under Limited System from Rs. 25,000/- to Rs. 75,000/-.

**XIII. Electricity Tax on Compensation Charges :**

In B.P. (FB) No. 379, Technical Branch dt. 17—12—'94 the Board has ordered that electricity tax need not be levied for the compensation charges for violation malpractice and in case of theft of energy the tax may be collected for the units assessed as theft at normal rates applicable and not for the penal amount,

**XIV. House Building Advance—Adjustment in case of death of employee :-**

In memo. No. 76797-E2/94-1 dt. 24—12—'94, the Board has prescribed the "Acknowledgement of debt" in cases where the HBA loanee employee die while in service and the amount due to the Board is adjusted from out of HBA Special Family Benefit Fund.

**XV. Dismantlement of Board's Buildings—Delegation of Powers to Chairman :**

In B.P. (FB) No. 130, Secretariat Branch dt. 22—12—'94, the Board has delegated powers to Chairman to sanction for dismantling of buildings of Electricity Board when the book value of the asset exceeds the powers of Chief Engineers.

**XVI. Grant of DCRG and Family Pension to Family Members of Employees whose Whereabouts are not known — Delegation of Powers to Chairman :**

In B.P. (FB) No. 129, Secretariat Branch dt. 23—12—'94, the Board has delegated power to Chairman to sanction DCRG and Family Pension to the eligible family members of the employees of the Board whose whereabouts are not known.

**XVII. Commutation of Pension :**

In Board Letter No. 79505-N1/94-1 dt. 17—12—'94, the Board has ordered adoption of G.O.Ms.No. 784, Finance (Pension) Dept. dt. 16—9—'94 which says that no employee against whom departmental or judicial proceedings have been instituted shall be eligible to commute a fraction of the provisional pension during the pendency of such proceedings.

**XVIII. Awarding Commendation Certificate to Retiring Employees :**

In Memo. No. 25709/O&M Cell (4)/92-18 dt. 20—12—'94, the Board has clarified that Commendation Certificate for retiring employee need not be issued when they are allowed to retire without prejudice to the DP case pending against him and against whom disciplinary action is contemplated.

ORDER :

The following Notification will be published in the **Tamil Nadu Government Gazette** :

#### Notification

In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby makes the following amendments to the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978.

2. The amendments hereby made shall be deemed to have come into force on the 16th April 1982.

#### Amendments

In the said Rules, in rule 29—

- (1) for the marginal heading, the following marginal heading shall be substituted, namely:—  
"Verification of qualifying service after 28 years of service or 53 years of age. -" ; and
- (2) for the expression "twenty-five years of service", the expression "twenty-eight years of service or fifty three years of age, whichever is earlier" shall be substituted.

Memo. (Per.) No. 084147/N2/94—1, (Secretariat Branch), Dated the 6th December 1994.

Sub : Tamil Nadu Electricity Board—Medical Reimbursement Claims—Expeditious Settlement—Instructions—Issued.

The following two types of medical reimbursement claims are available in the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board :—

- (1) Claims made under Medical Attendance Rules.
- (2) Grant of assistance under Tamil Nadu Electricity Board employees Health Fund Scheme.

2. In Board's Memo. No. 23015—P2/79—1, dated 24—12—79 the following detailed guidelines have been issued for the Board's employees to follow whenever they resort for treatment in private clinics/dispensaries/hospitals :—

- (i) Treatment in a private hospital should not be resorted to generally but only occasionally in emergent situation.
- (ii) For availing the treatment in a private hospital, emergency certificate from an Authorised Medical Attendant should be produced to the effect that the removal of the patient to the Government Hospital would have entailed danger to the life of the patient.
- (iii) On the basis of the Emergency Certificate issued by an Authorised Medical Attendant, if patient takes treatment in a private hospital, he should be immediately brought to the Government Hospital as soon as the emergency is over and if a prolonged treatment is necessary a certificate should be obtained from the specialist of the Government Hospital, that similar facilities for undergoing treatment are not available in Government Hospitals.
- (iv) Reimbursement of expenditure incurred by an employee of the Board in a Private Hospitals would be restricted to what would have been the expenditure had the patient taken treatment in a Government Hospital.
- (v) The bills, vouchers, and essentiality certificates should be got countersigned by an Authorised Medical Attendant.
- (vi) If any one of the above condition is not satisfied the claim for reimbursement of the medical expenditure will be rejected.

3. Cases falling under the Medical Attendance Rules are being dealt with in Board Office Secretariat Branch.

4. In (Permanent) B.P. (FB) No. 57 (SB) Dated 6—5—93, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board employees Health Fund was constituted to provide a measure of relief by way of grant/loan to the Board employees struck by the following major ailments :—

- (i) Open Heart Surgery.
- (ii) Renal transplant.
- (iii) Lithotripsy.

5. The procedure for assistance under this scheme has been clearly spelt out in para 5 of the regulations contained in the annexure to the said B.P. Under this Health Fund Scheme, the claims of employees of Board Office Secretariat Branch, Board Office Audit Branch and all the officers in Class I Service are being dealt with in Board Office Secretariat Branch, and all other cases are dealt with in Board Office Administrative Branch.

6. With a view to help the claimants to get the assistance quickly, it has been decided that for the cases arising out of the Health Fund Scheme, the essentiality certificate need not be insisted and based on bills and vouchers produced by the officials obtained from private hospitals, the claims of the officials might be admitted upto a maximum extent of Rs. 50,000/- or 75% of the total claim whichever is less, after consulting Chief Medical Officer/Tamil Nadu Electricity Board.

7. Despite these clear out guidelines and procedures prescribed for submitting, processing and sanctioning of the medical reimbursement claims, while forwarding the claims of the employees by the heads of office concerned, the applications are not scrutinised with reference to the guidelines and procedures prescribed and referred to above, but are simply forwarded. Invariably, on scrutiny at the Board Office Secretariat Branch, the claims by the employees have to be returned to the office concerned, for rectifying the defects by way of supplementing the required information, certificates etc. This results in avoidable and unnecessary delay in scrutinising and sanctioning the claims. It is necessary to ensure that the claims are settled quickly.

8. All the Chief Engineers, Superintending Engineers are requested to adhere to the guidelines and instructions of the Board scrupulously and forward the medicals claims of the employees in complete shape to the authority concerned with specific recommendation and with a certificate, that, the application has been scrutinised strictly in accordance with the rules, guidelines and procedures prescribed and that all the relevant bills, vouchers, certificates required are enclosed in original.

According to the provision (iii) under Sub-rule 6 (iii) of Rule 49 of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules 1978, family pension shall be paid for life to the son or daughter of a Government Servant who is suffering from any disorder or disability of mind or is physically crippled or disabled; so as to render him or her unable to earn a living through guardian as if he or she were a minor subject to certain conditions

2. Following the orders issued by the Government in the G.O. second cited, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board directs that the pension payment order to be issued in future shall include all the members of the family including the disabled/mentally retarded/handicapped children and the following procedure shall be adopted, in cases where the name of eligible children have not been mentioned in the pension pay order :

"The pensioner if he so desires can furnish a list of eligible children to the pension sanctioning authority inter-alia indicating whether any child is handicapped, mentally retarded or not. The receipt of this list may be acknowledged by the Pension sanctioning authority, mentioning the details of eligible children taken on record. This acknowledgement may be preserved by the members of the family of the pensioners for production at the time of submission of claim for family pension in their own turn to the pension sanctioning authority. In case of mentally retarded children or minor who would draw pension through a guardian, the responsibility of producing this acknowledgement will fall on the guardian. The production of acknowledgement will however not be a pre-condition to the processing of claims for family pension".

In the Government letter second cited, it has been ordered that family pension at normal/enhanced rates as may be applicable in individual cases will be payable to the families of missing employees.

2. I am now directed to clarify that the enhanced rate of family pension is payable only after death is conclusively established or after a period of 7 years from the date of missing.

In the Board Proceedings cited, orders were issued that if an officiating Board employee is discharged from service for want of vacancy, he shall on reappointment to the same post, draw the pay last drawn prior to discharge from service that the periods during which such pay was last drawn count for purpose of future increment in the time scale of pay of that post. It is not necessary to condone specifically the break in officiating service occurred prior to issue of the above said B. P. and the appropriate authority shall take action to count the past service rendered by the Board employee prior to the break and fix subsequent increments. In the reference second cited, clarification was issued that the breaks occurred prior to the date of regularisation of service can not be counted for purpose of future increment and the breaks occurred in the same post alone can be regulated and counted for purpose of annual increment.

2. It has been brought to notice that some of the Superintending Engineers have taken into account the break period mentioned in the B. P. cited as service weightage for purpose of fixation of pay on wage revision and for annual increments. The above action of the Superintending Engineers are not correct. The Chief Internal Audit Officer has also suggested to issue clarifications in this regard.

3. It is therefore clarified that the orders in the B. P. cited will not apply in connection with permitting service weightage on wage revision pay fixation and for this, there will be clauses in wage revision orders from time to time. Further, in the latest wage revision weightage is not on the basis of length of service but it was allowed on the basis of percentage of pay subject to a limit. Regarding counting of service before a break for increment, break period can not at all be counted. The orders are very clear that periods during which such pay was drawn should be counted. For actual break period, there is no question of drawal of pay.

### ANNEXURE

#### Duties and Responsibilities of Revenue Supervisors Posted to Section Office

The main purpose of posting the Revenue Supervisor to the Section Office is to relieve the Section Officer from the responsibility of cash custody. The Revenue Supervisors will be under the Administrative Control of Section Officer.

The following duties are allotted to the Revenue Supervisor at the Section Office.

- (i) Review of consumption and energy charges as shown in the Green Meter Cards as below:-
  - (a) Industrial services : 20%
  - (b) Other services : 10%
- (ii) 10% checking of pre-receipts with Green Meter Cards.
- (iii) Checking daily collections made by one Assessor and Inspector of Assessment with reference to collection statement, advice slips, estimates, assessment order for penal charges etc.
- (iv) Attending to collection of Miscellaneous charges and C.C. Charges whenever conditions warrant.
- (v) Receiving cash from the Assessors and Inspector of Assessment daily for cash custody.
- (vi) Arranging for the remittance of cash collected by the Assessors/Inspector of Assessments promptly as per the rules in force and verification of the remittance chalan daily.
- (vii) Watching of depositing into bank of cheques received towards C. C. charges and its realisation and to take follow up action for the dishonoured cheques.
- (viii) Periodical review of defect register and meter card Registers to see that Inspector of Assessment is taking prompt action on the meter defects pointed out by the Assessors and Revenue Branch in the MCR.
- (ix) Ensuring prompt despatch of Meter card Registers to the Revenue Branch and its return.
- (x) Furnishing of all statistical returns to the Revenue Branch under the signature of the section Officer.
- (xi) Ensuring the prompt despatch of collection records to the Revenue Branch.
- (xii) Surprised check of cash collection of Assessors/Inspector of Assessment.
- (xiii) To ensure that assessment are made for all new services effected during the previous two months.



- (xiv) Verifying the pro-rata claims of the Assessors.
- (xv) Checking of the collection of interest on delayed payments worked out by the Inspector of Assessment.
- (xvi) Over-seeing the work of Assessors and Inspector of Assessment.
- (xvii) Verifying the uncollected P. Rs. of Assessors whenever possible.
- (xviii) Attending consumer's enquiries/correspondence relating to Assessment and collection.
- (xix) Arranging rotation of assessors periodically in consultation with Section Officers.
- (xx) Verifying the cancelled Pre-Receipts with reference to collection statement after the collection period is over.
- (xxi) Revision of bills due to wrong assessment watching payment of penal charges due to violation of terms and conditions, theft of energy and furnishing details on the matter to Section Officers.
- (xxii) Review of the cases where assessment is made based on average basis or based on previous month's consumption.
- (xxiii) Review of Door locked cases.
- (xxiv) Review of cases where Door locked reported for 2 assessments.

#### **General:**

The amount collected by the Assessors and Inspector of Assessment are to be received by the Revenue Supervisor and should be kept under safe custody by the Revenue Supervisor. In the absence of Revenue supervisor, Senior-most Inspector of Assessment will be in charge of the cash custody and other works of the Revenue Supervisor attended. The responsibility for the custody of cash till it is remitted into the Bank rest with the Revenue Supervisor. Necessary escort from RWE staff will be arranged by Section Officer for remittance. During the peak day collections as the consumers will be waiting for the remittance. Inspector of Assessment and RWE staff as escort is to be deputed for the remittance of cash into the Bank.

2. The Revenue Supervisor should take to the notice of the Section Officer, any discrepancies he come across in the assessment, collection and remittance. The remittance register should be put up to the Section Officer daily for his review. He shall also cause field verification, obtain the original receipts available with the consumer issued by the Inspector of Assessment to verify the correctness of the amount and date with that of the office copy of the receipts.

3. The Money Orders addressed to the Section Officers by the Consumers will be acknowledged by the Revenue Supervisor and the amount handed over to the respective Assessor/Inspector of Assessment for issuing receipts. The Money Order register should be maintained.

4. The Revenue Supervisor should verify the cheque register daily and ensure the prompt remittance and realisation.

5. The issue of Pre-receipts book shall be authorised by the Revenue Supervisor.

6. In case of certain Sections, the Assessor may have camp collections. The Revenue Supervisor will make surprise check of these above camp collection centres also. The Revenue Supervisor shall be the Co-ordinator between the Section Officer and Revenue Branch and ensure proper flow of information (Meter Card Register, Assessor Remittance Chalan, Petty cash Book etc.) from Section Office to Revenue Branch and proper accounting in the Section Office.

#### **Duties and Responsibilities of Inspector of Assessment Posted to the Sections:**

The following items of work shall be entrusted to the Inspector of Assessment posted to Section Offices.

- (i) 100% field verification of the final reading of the Services remaining disconnected over three months.
- (ii) 10% field verification of the correctness of the assessment of industrial and commercial services.

- (iii) Verification from monthly return of new service connection as to whether all the newly connected services have been assessed.
- (iv) Receiving miscellaneous collections like service connection, Reconnection Charges, Temporary supply services and charges from Hut services when kits for hut services are not available.
- (v) Bringing to the notice of the Section Officer defects, if any, noticed during field verification by entering such defects in the Defects Register.
- (vi) Overseeing the work of Assessors.
- (vii) Maintaining records for the receipt of collection records like Pre-Receipts, Permanent Receipts, Petty Cash Books, Assessors' Remittance Challans etc., and issue the same to the Assessors.
- (viii) The completed Pre-Receipts, Assessors Remittance Challans etc., returned by Assessor should be arranged to be sent back to the Revenue Branch of Division Office.
- (ix) Maintaining records for the works done under items (i) to (iv).
- (x) Calculation of interest on delayed payment of assessment charges.
- (xi) Inclusion of short assessment pointed out by the Audit. RR Act Amount, Charges pointed out by APTS branch, ASD amount in the Green Meter Card.
- (xii) Attending to remittance work in the absence of Assessors and also on peak collection days.
- (xiii) Checking the assessment made by the Assessor on average basis in respect of services with defective meter.
- (xiv) Checking the pre-receipts prepared by the Assessor with GMC.
- (xv) Giving credit for the cost of Meter in GMC when meters are supplied by the consumers for new services.
- (xvi) Verifying whether the defects pointed out by the Revenue Branch in the Meter Card Register is promptly included into GMC.
- (xvii) Review of cases for Door locked is reported for 2 consecutive assessments.

**Duties and Responsibilities of the Inspector of Assessment Posted to Each Revenue Branch of Division Office to Attend the Following Items of Work.**

- (i) Receiving from Central Office, the Stationery connected with the assessment and collection of energy charges and also stationery relating to collection of miscellaneous charges and keeping them in safe custody.
- (ii) Issue to the Section Offices the Registers and Book relating to collection by Assessors/Inspector of Assessments in the Section Office after checking the continuity and recording the certificate therefor and maintenance of proper records for this purpose.
- (iii) Watching of the return of the completed Assessor's Remittance chalans, Pre-receipts Books, other Receipt Books and Petty Cash Books issued and checking continuity of each of them
- (iv) Obtaining all the uncollected pre-receipts and putting up the same to the Assistant Accounts Officer for review.
- (v) Receipt of Collection statement from the concerned Assessor, entering of dates of collections in the collection statement from Assessors's Remittance chalans received, watching the weekly progress of collection by the Assessors, maintenance of the Register for this purpose to be put up for review by the Assistant Accounts Officer.
- (vi) In Distribution Circles other than Madras city circles the maintenance of collection Abstract Register showing Distribution wise Collection made by the Assessors should be done. In Madras city Electricity Distribution Circles (South, North, Central and West) the Register should be maintained Cycle Book wise. The tallying the totals with the ARC Cash Book also should be done.

- (vii) Maintenance of a Control Register for watching the continuity of Assessors Remittance chalang.
- (viii) Inspector of Assessment will co-ordinate between the Section Offices and the Revenue Branch of the Office and assist the Assistant Accounts Officer incharge of the Revenue Branch of Division Office in regard to assessment and collection.
- (ix) Preparing the returns for collection work such as RVM-III, monthly return on prompt disconnection etc., which are to be sent to Financial Controller by Assistant Accounts Officer.

#### **Duties and Responsibilities of Assessors :**

The Duties and Responsibilities of the Assessor prescribed in B.P. Ms. (FB) No. 74 (Sectt. Branch) dt. 25-8-1987 will stand except the following.

The number of services to be assessed per day by an Assessor shall be as per B. P. (FB) No. 5 (Sectt. Branch) dt. 25-1-1994.

#### **Administrative, Disciplinary and Technical Control :**

The Assessor will hand over the cash to Revenue Supervisor. He will be under the Administrative control of Inspector of Assessment and Revenue Supervisor. The Asst. Exe. Engineer/Section Officers shall exercise administrative, disciplinary and technical control over the regular Assessor and reserve Assessor. The Reserve Assessor will be under the control of Asst. Exe. Engineer when they are not given work in the Sections.

As per para 3 of (Permanent) B. P. (FB) No. 273 (Secretariat Branch) dt. 19-10-94, in respect of employees drawing pay above Rs. 3,500/- p. m. the increase in Dearness Allowance sanctioned with effect from 1-7-90, 1-1-91, 1-7-91, 1-1-92 and 1-7-92 shall not be credited into General Provident Fund of the employees instead it shall be paid in cash from the salary for October'94 onwards (i.e.) no portion of Dearness Allowance need be credited in their General Provident Fund Account from October'94 onwards. Hence the question of stopping midway the recovery of the arrears of impounded Dearness Allowance, arisen due to revision of pay scales with effect from 1-12-92 and upto the salary for September 1994 does not arise. The above recovery of impounded Dearness Allowance from the arrears of pay should be continued till the entire amount is recovered in the number of instalments already ordered.

Instructions were issued in the reference cited to implement Revised Work Norms by giving promotions etc. for the posts sanctioned for the purpose on or before 31—10—1994.

2. The Board has not yet taken decision on the residual issue of "Upgrading remaining posts of Lineman in the Distribution Circles as Line Inspector". The decision of the Board will be intimated shortly. In view of the above, Superintending Engineer can issue promotion orders to the categories of Line Inspector and Commercial Inspector with a clause that inter-se-seniority will be decided later.

3. As per the revised work norms, there will be no post of Assistant Commercial Inspector in future. Some of the Superintending Engineers have raised clarifications regarding giving promotions to the Assistant Commercial Inspector as Commercial Inspector. As the educational qualification for Asst. Commercial Inspector and Commercial Inspector are the same difficulties, will arise in the case of Asst. Commercial Inspectors against whom D.P. is pending or in the case of Asst. Comml. Inspectors who are undergoing punishment.

4. The Assistant Commercial Inspectors facing Disciplinary Proceedings can be promoted as Commercial Inspector and the punishment if any imposed can be undergone in the post of Comml. Inspector. In the case of Assistant Commercial Inspector undergoing punishment, monetary equivalent **Should not be recovered** for giving promotion. They can be promoted as Commercial Inspector and the pay fixation given in the higher post after completion of the punishment or pay fixed with reference to the pay actually drawn (lesser pay) by them due to the punishment.

In continuation of the instructions issued in the reference cited, the following further instructions are issued :—

- (i) All the Chief Engineers, Superintending Engineers, Deputy Secretaries, Chief Financial Controllers, Chief Internal Audit Officer, Senior Personnel Officers and other appointing authorities will open separate registers for class II, Class III and Class IV categories for whom they are the appointing authorities. A separate register shall be maintained under the supervision of the Secretary, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, for all Class I officers. Detailed entries shall be made in these registers, against whom disciplinary proceedings are pending or enquiry/investigation is being done by the Inspector General of Police (Vigilance) or Director of Vigilance and Anti-corruption.

- (ii) The Inspector General of Police/Vigilance will send reports of persons on whom preliminary enquiries or detailed enquiries are taken up by him or by the Director of vigilance and Anti-corruption to the appointing authority concerned. These information and the details of disciplinary proceedings cases pending should be promptly and correctly entered in the said register.
- (iii) This register should be reviewed and attested by the appointing authority concerned at least once every month.
- (iv) The information in the register shall be taken into account for inclusion or otherwise of a name in the panel for promotion and for retirement of employees on superannuation. Such cases need not be referred to Vigilance Cell but a decision shall be taken by the authorities concerned, based on the entries in the register.
- (v) Where an enquiry by the Inspector General of Police/Vigilance or Director of Vigilance and Anti-corruption against an employee is dropped or when the allegations or complaints against an employee are not substantiated, such facts should also be immediately sent by the vigilance cell to the appointing authority, concerned to update the entries in the above register suitably, so that the employee concerned is not deprived of promotion etc.

2. Vigilance Clearance for preparation of panel and retirement on superannuation shall be obtained only for Class I officers.

3. As for Vigilance Clearance for sanction of House Building Advance and Conveyance Advance, the procedure adopted prior to the issue of the instructions dated 8-11-94 shall continue to be followed.

An instance has come to the notice of the Government where a “Commission of enquiry” was appointed to enquiry into grave irregularities against Government officials and certain aspects of the Commission's findings were not brought to the notice of the Enquiry Officer entrusted to enquire the charges framed in the said case to enable him to explain divergence of views from the findings of the “Commission of Enquiry”. So, the reasoning behind the findings of the Enquiry Officers can be deemed to be their explanations to the divergent views.

2. The procedures before a Commission of enquiry and the enquiring authority in a disciplinary case are not the same. They are under different legal provisions and start from different corners. While on enquiry Commission tries to ascertain the facts, a departmental enquiry analyses the specific imputations. Once the imputations could not be proved and there are no grounds for alternative imputation, it is desirable that the matter be allowed to come to a close. In order to avoid the above contingency it is necessary that important aspects of the Commission's findings should be brought to the notice of the Enquiring Officers and they have to be asked to explain divergence of views, if any, so that the reasonings behind the findings of the enquiry officers can be deemed to be their explanation to the divergence of their views. In the above circumstances, it is desired that wherever disciplinary action is initiated under Rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules against officials on the basis of the reports of findings of “Commission of Enquiry” such reports or relevant chapters thereof should form the imputations leading to the charges and should be communicated to the accused officers. In cases where minor punishments are warranted, explanation may be called for under rule 17(a) of the said rules on the basis of the findings in the report/relevant chapters thereof, which should be communicated to the delinquents.

3. All the disciplinary authorities may therefore be instructed to ensure that the procedure indicated in para 2 above are strictly observed without fail.

In pursuance of Memoranda of settlement arrived under Section 18(1)/12(3) of the I. D. Act 1947 between the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board and its workmen on 31—12—93/19—1—94, orders were issued in the Board's Proceedings first cited, revising the work allocation and staff pattern of certain section of staff in the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board covered by earlier settlement as also the scale of pay, rate of Dearness Allowance, House Rent Allowance, City Compensatory Allowance and other special pay and allowances with effect from 1—12—92.

2. A provision in the said settlement envisages for the reduction of post of Linemen in the Distribution Circle and the resultant surplus Lineman will be utilised to handle one unit till they get their promotion. As the unions insisted for upgrading the said surplus Linemen/Linemen equivalent posts in Distribution Circles as Line Inspector, it was agreed to examine the request separately for which a clause was also included in the settlement. In view of the above commitment in the settlement, detailed discussions were held with the Unions, who are parties to the settlement on the above issue. In the reference second cited, the Board constituted a Committee to study the proposal of the Unions. The committee submitted its report on 11—10—94.

3. After careful consideration of the report of the committee and taking into account the views of the signatories to the settlement, the Board hereby orders :

- (i) All the remaining posts of Lineman/Lineman equivalent in Distribution Circles rendered surplus consequent on the implementation of the revised work allocation and staff pattern be upgraded as Line Inspectors/Line Inspectors equivalent posts with effect from 1—1—94.
- (ii) The incumbents of the upgraded posts of Line Inspectors will be posted to Line Inspector/Line Inspector equivalent posts and the balance should handle one unit and any other work assigned to them by immediate and other superiors for carrying out the O & M work for providing uninterrupted power supply to consumers as set out in the settlement, till they get their next promotion or any new sanction of Line Inspector made thereafter, whichever is earlier.
- (iii) (a) The existing incumbents of surplus Lineman/Lineman equivalent posts who are qualified for further promotion be promoted as Line Inspector with benefit of fixation of pay as per existing rules in force.

- (b) In case of existing incumbents of surplus Lineman/Lineman-equivalent posts who are not qualified for further promotion be promoted as Line Inspector duly relaxing the qualification prescribed in the Regulations in their favour, as a special case, with benefit of fixation of pay as per the existing rules in force.
- (iv) Relaxation of qualification permitted as a special case in this order is for one time and should not be quoted as precedent for any further occasion. Under any circumstances, no further promotion will be considered unless he is fully qualified with reference to the qualification prescribed for the higher post.
- (v) The Chief Engineers/Superintending Engineers concerned are authorised to issue orders of relaxation of qualification, wherever necessary, for the above promotion, based on the merit of the individual case.
- (vi) The date of effect of 1-1-94 ordered in para 3 (i) above will be for the limited purpose of probation, seniority, and future increments of those staff promoted and appointed in the upgraded posts of Line Inspectors/Line Inspectors-equivalent posts. Monetary benefit will be from the date of their joining duty in the upgraded post, as was done in the case of others who joined in the promoted post, based on the revised work allocation and staff pattern with reference to the orders issued in (Permanent) B. P. (FB) No. 87 dated 11-10-94.
- (vii) Amendment to Service Regulation, if any, will be examined and orders issued separately.

Sub : T. N. E. B. — Manufacturing of Prestressed Concrete Poles — weigh batching and use of 43 grade cement — Instructions — Issued.

#### 1. Batching For Concrets :

- 1.1. It is seen that PSC poles are being cast on volumetric basis at Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Pole yards. It is necessary to adopt Design Mix for all the concrete being used in T. N. E. B. including pole casting as required in Clause 8.2 of IS: 456/1978.
- 1.2. Weight-batchers, should be used after determining the Design Mix to suit the requirements of strength. The weigh-batching arrangement should be made absolutely reliable.
- 1.3. The practice of casting of PSC poles on volumetric basis should be stopped from 1—4—1995.

#### 2. 43 Grade Cement :

- 2.1. Most of the concrete operations in Tamil Nadu Electricity Board are being made with 33 grade ordinary cement, mostly marketed by TANCEM. However, there is considerable scope for economising on the use of cement by adopting the higher 43 Grade cement, which is available easily in the market.
- 2.2. To make a start on the adoption of the higher 43 grade cement in Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, instructions are hereby issued that 100 bags of 43 Grade cement may be purchased by Chief Engineer/Madurai. Few poles and test cubes may be cast at SAMAYANALLUR P.S.C. Yard based on design mix using 43 Grade cement and results reported by 31—12—94.

A sum of Rs. 4,68,780/- being chargeable to consumer under 'DCW' basis was collected from M/s. Hindustan Photo Film, Ooty for extension of H.T. supply to a sanctioned demand of 1000 KVA.

The major portion of work namely "Cable supply and erection of cables" was executed by the consumer himself. Hence the Superintending Engineer/Coimbatore Electricity Distribution Circle/ North/Coimbatore had refunded Rs. 3,87,947/-including the establishment and Supervision charges amounting to Rs. 89488/-

Based on certain audit query, the Chief Engineer/Distribution/Coimbatore Region has sought for instructions on the quantum of establishment and supervision charges to be collected from the consumers who have supplied the materials and executed the works.

Eventhough the consumer executes the work with his own materials this requires the supervision, testing and certification etc., by the Board officials in order to ensure that this meets the requirement of the Board's Standard and elewant rules in force.

Taking this into account Tamil Nadu Electricity Board approves the following proposal.

(1) to adopt 50% (Fifty percent) of the 'normal rate of Establishment and Supervision charges as chargeable to the applicant/consumer under 'Deposit Contribution Works' wherever the portion of works including supply of materials and execution of works are done by the applicant. consumer himself.

(2) Chief Engineer/Distribution/Coimbatore Region should collect 50% of the sum of Rs. 89488/- from M/s. Hindustan Photo Film, Ooty towards establishment and Supervision charges for the portion of works executed by the said H.T. consumer.

The general instructions under (1) above may take retrospective effect in respect of 'DCW' cases where the estimates have only been got sanctioned but works including supply of materials and execution the same by the applicant/consumer at his request are yet to be done.

In the B.P. cited under reference, it has been indicated therein that the revised rates shall come into force from the date of the B.P. In this connection, the Audit Branch/Tamil Nadu Electricity Board has requested to clarify whether in cases of domestic and commercial services effected on or after 25—8—93 for which development charges had been collected at the old rates prior to 25—8—93, the difference in the development charges is either to be collected or refunded consequent on the revision of rates ordered in B.P. (F.B.) No. 190 (Technical Branch) dated 25—8—93. In this connection the following clarifications are issued.

The revised rates of development charges specified in the B.P. (F.B.) No. 190 dated 25—8—93 will be applicable only for the cases where the development charges have not been collected earlier to issue of this B.P. If development charges have already been collected at the old rates before the issue of this B.P. then there is no need to collect/refund the difference in development charges due to the revision.

Further if subsequently the difference in development charges have been collected for the cases where development charges have been collected at the old rates before the issue of the B.P. dated 25-8-93 then in such cases also the different in development charges already collected need not be refunded.

**ORDER :**

In the Government order first read above, orders have been issued on the system of purchase preference and price preference in respect of purchase of Stores, servicing and repairing, etc. by Government Departments, Public Sector Undertakings, Statutory Boards and Local Bodies. The question of revising the list of institutions in the priority list ordered in the Government Order first read above has been engaging the attention of the Government for some time. The proposal was therefore placed before the Secretaries Committee on Public Enterprises. The committee, among others, has recommended a revised system of purchase preference and the modification to the system of advance payment to the Institutions in the priority list.

The Government departments/State Public Sector Undertakings/Statutory Boards/Local bodies/Co-Operative Institutions etc. shall in making any purchase/servicing/repairing first approach the Institutions/State Public/Sector Undertakings/Government Departmental units in the order given below :—

- (a) Jails/Borstal Schools under Prison Department for products made by them.
- (b) The units run directly by Tamil Nadu Khadi and Village Industries Board in respect of their own manufactured products.
- (c) Modern training-cum-production Centre, Muttukkadu for the products made by them.
- (d) State Government Public Sector Corporations for the products made by them as also departmental units of Government.

4. The revised scheme of purchase preference as outlined in para 3 above implies that there can be direct approach to these institutions and no tender is required. It may be noted that this will cover only products manufactured by them and not products merely marketed by them. No purchase preference will be available for Joint Sector enterprises and Co-Operative institutions. The products manufactured within the State and supplied through Small Industries Development Corporation Limited under its "Marketing Assistance Scheme" will not be covered under the revised scheme of purchase preference. In case any department/organisation considers that any institution in para 3 is over charging it may take up the issue with the concerned administrative department which shall decide the issue in consultation with Finance (BPE) Department.

5. Whenever products/services cannot be supplied by the institutions mentioned under clauses (a) to (d) in para 3 above the open tender system shall be followed. While adopting open tender system, the price preference and guidelines thereto ordered in paras 6, 7 and 9 of the Government Order first read above shall be operated.

6. The system of advance payments to Khadi Industrial Co-operatives and Industrial Co-operatives by the Government departments/undertaking etc. ordered in the Government orders second and third read above respectively shall be completely scrapped with immediate effect.

7. These orders shall in addition to Government departments, also apply to purchases made/ services requisitioned by all State Public Sector Undertakings, Statutory Boards, Local Bodies and Co-operative Institutions.

8. The enforcing mechanism and the procedure for redressal of grievances in respect of the policy on purchase and price preference, ordered in paras 10 and 11 of the Government order first read above shall continue to be operated.

9. The Industries Commissioner and Director of Industries and Commerce and the functional Registrars of all the co-operative Institutions shall give wide publicity of the order issued in this Government order to the Small Scale Industries Units and Co-operative institutions under their control respectively. The Director of Stationery and Printing shall publish the orders in the Government Gazette at the earliest issue.

10. The receipt of this Government order shall be acknowledged.

#### Proceedings :

The Chief Electrical Inspector to Government, Madras has stated by way of clarification that additional tax has to be levied on the Compensation Charges and extra levy in the cases of violations and thefts detected. This clarification is found to be not in order since additional tax has to be collected for the energy consumed only.

The matter has been examined by the Board in detail and the Board after careful examination decides not to levy Electricity tax for the compensation charges in case of violation/malpractice levied and only in the case of theft of energy, electricity tax may be collected for the units assessed as theft, at the normal rates applicable and not for the penal amount.

1.0. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board had approved the deputation of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board staff for the testing of relays lightning arrestors and communication equipments at 230 KV/110 KV Villianur Auto SS and other Substations in the Pondicherry State at the specified rates and conditions in the B.P. first cited.

2.0. It has been ordered in the B.P. second cited that the rates approved in the B.P. first cited shall be reviewed every year starting from March 1992. Accordingly the rates and conditions were reviewed periodically and approval accorded.

3.0. The rates and conditions approved in the B.P. first cited is due for revision from 1993—94 onwards. Due to delay in settlement of the revision of wages to TNEB staff, approval was accorded to continue the same rates and conditions approved in the B.P. first cited temporarily during the year 1993—94 also and claiming supplementary bills after the revised rates are approved after settlement of wage revision.

4.0. Consequent to settlement of revision of wages to Tamil Nadu Electricity Board staff in the references third and fourth cited, the rates and conditions approved in the B.P. first cited are revised as below :

VEHICLE HIRE CHARGES	: Rs. 600/- per day (Rupees six hundred only) Plus Diesel cost at prevailing market rate at the rate of one litre per 8 km
FOR TESTING KITS	: Rs. 1,000/- per day (Rupees One thousand only)
FOR SMALL TESTING INSTRUMENT	: Rs. 500/- per day (Rupees five hundred only)
* Full calendar day shall be accounted for any partial working of the day.

5.0. The revised rates approved in Para 4.0 above is deemed to have been effective from 1—4—93 onwards and will be valid upto 31—3—'96. These rates will be reviewed after 31—3—'96.

Sub : Electricity—Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity—Clause 8.01 and 8.02 Merger of services—Instructions—Issued.

Ref : (1) Circular Memo. No. 636/IEMC/EE(T)/T. I(2)/91-2. dt. 23—6—92.  
(2) Circular Memo. No. 636/IEMC/EE(T)/T. I(2)/91-6, dt. 12—7—94.

In this office Circular memo cited (2) under reference the time limit for merger of services of consumers coming under Clause 8.01 and 8.02 of Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity has been extended upto 31—12—94 and the Superintending Engineers/Electricity Distribution Circles were requested to indicate the number of such services existing as on 30—6—94 and whether all such services could be merged before 31—12—94.

In this connection Superintending Engineers/Electricity Distribution Circles are informed as below:

(1) The merger of services in many cases, arises mainly due to existence of L.T.I. and L.T. IX and L.T. IV and L.T. IX in the same premises.

(2) As far as L.T. IV is concerned, prior to 1—3—93 L.T. IV was applied to services with power loads including industries.

But in the Tariff Notification effective from 1—3—93, L.T. IV is applicable only to Industries (other than covered under L.T. Tariff-III).

In view of the above, all L.T. IV services which were effected prior to 1—3—93, for power loads including industries have to be reviewed and such of those L.T. IV services of power loads which are not industries have to be brought under L.T. IX from 1—3—93 onwards. In such cases, the two services which come under L.T. IX can be merged.

(3) In case of Industries where L.T. IV is applied for industries, and L.T. IX for lighting and non-industrial loads, these have to be brought under L.T. IV as one services and L.T. IV applied if the lighting and non-industrial load is within 15% and where the non-industrial and lighting loads are in excess of 15% levy, entire services has to be brought under L.T. IX.

(4) In case of L.T. I and L.T. IX existing in the same premises, if there is physical segregation then separate services under L.T. I for domestic and L.T. IX for commercial purposes can exist. However where there is no physical segregation only one service can be given under L.T. IX till they are physically segregated.

The Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles are requested to adopt the above procedure and categories all the services accordingly before 30—6—95 and furnish a compliance report.
