**VI. Promotion of non-conventional energy source—revision of power purchase rate :**

In B. P. (FB) No. 127, Technical Branch dt. 6—5—'94 the Board has ordered :—

- (a) Purchase price of energy from Private Wind Mills be raised from Rs. 1.25 to Rs. 2.00 per unit.
- (b) Private Wind Farms of less than 5 MW be connected through 11 or 22 KV ; 5 MW and above through 33 KV and 10 MW and above through 66 KV or 110 KV.

**VII. Leave travel concession-availing to other states :**

In B. P. (FB.) No. 24, Secretariat Branch dt. 5—5—'94 the Board has directed that the employees of Board be permitted to avail LTC for journeys to any place outside the State of Tamil Nadu subject to reimbursement of travel cost limited to 400 KMs from their place of work.

**VIII. Pension—enhancement of pension for retired persons between December '84 and 30th September '85**

In B. P. (Ch) No. 117, Secretariat Branch, dt 30—4—94, the Board has ordered that for the purpose of calculation of average emoluments of employees retired between December '84 to 30th September '85 the entire DA upto the average price Index of 528 points shall be treated as dearness pay with effect from the dates on which these are sanctioned.

**IX. Supply of full pants to RWE workmen :**

In B. P. (FB) No. 26, Adm. Branch dt. 9—5—1994, the Board has sanctioned full pants to the RWE employees who are now getting half pants.

**X. Reduction of load in HT services :**

In B. P. (FB) No. 132, Tech. Branch dt. 9—5—1994, the Board has amended Clause 13.09 of the Terms and Conditions of Supply Act to the effect that in case of reduction of load by any HT consumer during special guarantee period of five years the formula prescribed for termination of the agreement shall be adopted for reduction of load also.

**XI. Sanction of Posts—Enhancement of Powers to Chairman :**

In B. P. (FB) No. 25 (Secretariat Branch) dt. 23—5—1994, the Board has enhanced the powers of sanction of Chairman to accord initial sanction of all posts for various offices of the Board from Rs. 5 lakhs to Rs. 10 lakhs per annum in each case.

**XII. Revision of Pay and Allowances of Officers from 1—12—'92 :**

In B. P. (FB) No. 23 (SB) dt. 4—5—1994, the Board has issued detailed instructions in regard to revision of scales of pay and allowances to officers of the Board from 1—12—'92.

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A question has been raised by Chief Engineer/Distribution/Vellore Region in connection with the method under which Leave Travel Concession is to be sanctioned, while an employee performing tour in zig-zag routes, not mentioning his ultimate destination in Form III.

2. This has been examined and it is clarified, that the employees who avail Leave Travel Concession can go to one particular terminal touching different places on the way and come back by taking the shortest route. The claim has to be calculated on the shortest route only. Besides, the employees have to mention the place of ultimate destination in their application made to the authority for availing the Leave Travel Concession.

**Proceedings:**

1. At present the payment of Telephone Bills in respect of DOT phones provided in Offices and residences of Officers in the Head Quarters (other than Secretariat Branch and Audit Branch) is made by Administrative Branch. Initially sanction is accorded by Chief Engineer/Personnel, for payment of telephone bills. Thereafter the Chief Internal Audit Officer passes the bills and the Chief Financial Controller issues the cheques, which are remitted to Madras Telephones by Administrative Branch. These procedures consume considerable time and the payment made almost on the due date or just before that. At times when payment is made after due date, disconnection of phone takes place, which involves payment of reconnection charge, sustaining financial loss to the Board. The Madras Telephones has introduced from April 94 onwards payment of surcharge, if the telephone bill is paid after due date (Due date is 25th of the month).

2. Therefore to overcome the above difficulties and to the process of payment of telephone bills, it is decided to make payment of telephone bills by the Officers concerned, themselves instead of by Administrative Branch, Madras. The payment of telephone bills is a statutory claim and no sanction order is necessary. The claim can be made by means of contingency bill by the Officers concerned just as other claims under contingency are made.

3. After careful examination, it is ordered that the payment of telephone bills relating to DOT phones provided both in offices and residences of Head Quarters Officers (other than Secretariat Branch and Audit Branch) be paid by the Officers concerned themselves, to avoid delay in making payment before due date.

4. Consequent on the above orders, the Chief Engineer/Personnel, Administrative Branch will forward the telephone bills to the Officers concerned on receipt from the Madras Telephones for making payment by themselves. Hereafter, it is the lookout of the Officers concerned to watch the receipt of telephone bills and to get the duplicate bills from the Madras Telephones if original bills are not received in time, to avoid payment of surcharge for belated payment and to avoid disconnection and reconnection charges. The payment of telephone bills relating to safe custody period will be borne on by the previous user.

5. It is also ordered that the Officers concerned have to forward proposal invariably to the Chief Engineer/Personnel, Administrative Branch for getting approval and ratification of Chairman in cases where the call charges exceed the ceiling limit of Rs.4,000/- per phone per month with reference to (Per.) B.P. (Ch.) No.23, Administrative Branch, dt. 19.1.89 furnishing justifications.

6. The orders issued in para 3 of the proceedings shall take effect from June 1994 onwards.

In his letter cited the Superintending Engineer/Madras Electricity Distribution Circle/North has requested

to clarify whether duty relief may be given to the Union representative for their assistance to the delinquent employees governed under Board's Standing Orders during the enquiry with reference to the orders of High Court dated 19.6.92 delivered in W.P. No.581 of 1983.

2. In the W.P. No.581 of 1983 in the High Court of Madras filed by the Superintending Engineer/Mettur Electricity Distribution Circle against the orders of the Presiding Officer/Labour Court/Coimbatore, the High Court has held that reasonable opportunity contemplated in Standing Order No.21 (vii) (e) includes the right of the delinquent to have the assistance of a co-employee or Union representative as on duty, and that the interpretation by the Presiding Officer/Coimbatore in this regard is fair and proper. The High Court has also held that it is not however reasonable to demand travelling allowance and halting allowance if the representative come from another station. Under these circumstances the Writ Petition filed by the Superintending Engineer/Mettur Electricity Distribution Circle was dismissed.

3. The Legal Adviser in his Letter No.44309/CC1/92-1, dated 16.7.92 has opined that no further appeal to Division Bench of High Court will be necessary as there is no substantial question of law or interpretation of Standing Order 21 (vii) (e) of the Standing Orders exists in this case. The Legal Adviser has further opined, that there is similar provision in Standing Orders 32 (vii) (e) of the Standing Order for non-clerical workmen, as in Standing Order 21 (vii) (e) of the Standing Order applicable to the workmen engaged in clerical department, and that the ratio of the judgement in the W.P.No.581/83 will be applicable to the Regular Work Establishment employees also.

4. Under the above circumstances it is hereby clarified that the Union representative who is normally a co-worker of the delinquent employee will be entitled to duty relief with reference to Standing Order No.21 (vii) (e) of the Standing Order applicable to clerical workmen and Standing Order 32 (vii) (e) of the Standing Order applicable to non-clerical workmen, for assisting the delinquent workmen at the time of enquiry. However they are not eligible for travelling allowance and halting allowance for the above purpose as observed by the High Court. Receipt of this memo. may be acknowledged.

2. Now, the Board has decided that the instructions issued in the memo. cited will also apply for availing of "Personal Loan" from the Private/Nationalised Banks/Financial/Commercial Institutions by the Board employee. The Board consider that 'Consumer Loan' is one meant for acquisition of specified consumer durables. Consumer loan is secured by the pledge of assets and there is also a partial contribution by the loanee. It, therefore, enables the acquisition of an asset. 'Personal Loan' is not with reference to any specified purpose. It is an unsecured loan and is often taken for consumption needs. It may or may not lead to asset formation which will depend on the use, the loanee puts it to. When even 'Consumer Loans' (which lead to asset formation) are not encouraged, it is not desirable to encourage 'Personal Loans'. Accordingly, it is hereby clarified that the instruction issued in the memo. cited will also apply to availing of "Personal Loan" by Board employees from the Private/Nationalised Banks/Financial/Commercial Institutions.

2. The Government in G.O. Ms. No.2, Finance (All.) Department, dt. 3.1.94, issued orders permitting the State Government employees to avail Leave Travel Concession for journeys to any place outside the State of Tamil Nadu also subject to certain conditions.

3. Following the orders issued by the Government the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board directs that the employees of Board be permitted to avail Leave Travel Concession for journeys to any places outside the State of Tamil Nadu subject to the condition that the reimbursement of travel cost should be limited to a maximum distance of 400 Kms., from the place of their work. 3. The Board has decided that the increase in Dearness Allowance shall be paid in cash to all the employees irrespective of pay drawn by them with effect from 1st January 1994. There shall be no change in the regulation of earlier increases in Dearness Allowance sanctioned previously to those drawing pay above Rs.3,500/-. The details of admissibility of revised Dearness Allowance for employees drawing pay upto Rs.3,500/- are given in the Annexure-I to this order. The details of admissibility of revised Dearness Allowance for employees drawing pay above Rs.3,500/- and the amount to be credited to respective Provident Fund Account as per the earlier orders are given in the Annexure-II to this order.

4. For the purpose of calculation of revised Dearness Allowance, the basic pay including personal pay, if any, shall be taken into account. In cases, where the pay plus personal pay of employees fall between the two pay ranges indicated in column (1) in the Annexures-I and II to this order, the revised Dearness Allowance shall be worked out at the specified percentage rates. The revised Dearness Allowance shall be rounded to the nearest rupee.

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#### Proceedings:

In order to encourage power generation through Non-Conventional Energy Sources like Wind Energy, the Board in B.P.Ms.(FB) No.129, (Technical Branch), dated 29.3.86 has permitted the installation of private wind mills in a windy location and to tie up with the Board's grid. The private wind mill developer is permitted to use the power generated by his wind mill to his industry located anywhere in Tamil Nadu after deduction 2% of the energy generated towards Board's commission. Subsequently private wind mill developers are permitted to sell their surplus power to the Board at the rate of Re.1/- per Unit and at the rate of Rs.1.25 per Unit as approved in B.P. Ms. (FB) No.120, (Technical Branch), dated 3.7.90 and B.P. (FB) No.206, (Technical Branch), dated 8.9.92 respectively. Many of the industries in Tamil Nadu who are paying huge income tax have started putting up wind mills as they get power adjusted in their industrial consumption as well as depreciation benefit in their income tax. So far 264 wind electric generators for a total capacity of 64.49 MW have been commissioned by the private sector. Another 100 MW capacity of private wind mills are expected to be commissioned during the year 1994-95.



2. In partial modifications of the orders issued in (Per.) B.P. (FB) No.206, (Technical Branch), dated 8.9.92, the Board directs that the purchase price of energy from the private wind mills may be raised from Rs.1.25 to Rs.2/- (Rupees Two only) with immediate effect in order to attract the industrialists of other States also to put up wind mills in Tamil Nadu availing various fiscal and promotional incentives available on hand and to sell the energy to Board. No demand charge is payable as the power generation from wind electric generators is intermittent and not continuous which cannot meet the steady demand.

3. The nett units generated and pumped into the grid at the point of supply i.e. Units exported minus units consumed by the wind electric generator during start up and by the auxiliaries may be taken up for accounting and billing. The payment will be made on monthly basis within three months of taking meter readings.

A large number of H.T. and L.T. service connections are being inspected by the Anti Power Theft Squad and by the officers of the Electricity Distribution Circles and violations and theft of energy are being detected.

2. Of late, it is seen that the procedures laid down in the Terms and Conditions of supply of Electricity are not being followed strictly and assessment notice in respect of a large number of cases has not been issued promptly nor periodical reviews made at certain levels. The very purpose of inspection is thus defeated and this encourages the unscrupulous consumers to carry on their clandestine activities without fear of being penalised.

3. It is therefore considered necessary that the details of follow-up action on all inspections carried out by both APTS and Field Officers of Distribution Circles are recorded in a Register in the Section, Sub-Division, Division and Circle Offices so as to enable review by the inspecting officers.

4. The Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles should make a monthly review of the followup action taken in respect of all cases of violations and theft of energy detected in their Circles. Similarly, the Chief Engineers of Distribution Regions will conduct the review once in three months and send reports thereon to both the Inspector General of Police/Vigilance and the Member (Distribution).

5. For conducting the above review enclosed formats I and III may be used. Enclosed formats II and IV may be adopted for the maintenance of the records in the Section, Sub division and Division Offices. (Separately for Theft of Energy and Violation of T & C).

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In the reference (2) cited, the procedure to be adopted for refund of cost of meters supplied by the consumers by adjustment in current consumption bills have been issued.

Now the Superintending Engineer/Salem Electricity Distribution Circle has stated that much difficulty is being experienced in Central Office for passing the claims and proposing journal entry by Accounts Pay Section as instructed in the Chief Financial Controller's reference cited and it takes nearly 3 to 4 months for refunding the cost of meters by way of adjustment through current consumption charges of services in Central Office.

If journal entries are to be proposed in the concerned revenue branches on receipt of such proposals from the Assistant Engineers/Junior Engineers, the refund of cost of meter by way of adjustment through CC bills can be done quickly and effective follow up is also ensured both at revenue branch and at Section Office level. The above proposal has been examined and in order to have a uniform procedure the following instructions are issued.

The Assistant Accounts Officer of Revenue branches of the concerned Circle has to propose necessary journal entry for refund of cost of the meters by way of adjustment through CC bills with due intimation to the party and Assistant Engineers/Junior Engineers as hitherto followed at Central Office. The other instructions issued in the CFC's letter dated 24.8.92 should be continued to be followed.

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Sub: Electricity - Extension of supply to the Agricultural Pumpsets situated in the River/Channel/Bank - Instructions - Reg.

Ref: Lr. No.SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE2/D.801/93, dt. 19.11.93.

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Of late, it is seen that number of representations and references are being received from the Agricultural Consumers/Government, regarding extension of supply to the Agricultural Pumpsets situated near the rivers/canals.

There are also references received from the Chief Engineer/Superintending Engineer/Public Works Department of concerned jurisdiction stating that the agricultural pumpsets in the wells near the rivers/canals are illegally used for drawing water from the river/canals directly. In the letter cited under reference, it has been instructed not to effect supply to the agricultural pumpsets situated within 200 mts. from the river banks.

Hence, the field officers are requested to adhere the following instructions in future without fail.

1. The applications for extension of supply to the agricultural pumpsets especially in cases under Self Financing Scheme have to be thoroughly scrutinised and the cases where the wells lie within 200 metres from any river bank/Canal/Channel/any water resources should not be entertained and they should be returned at the initial stage itself even before collection of the registration fee Rs.500/-.

2. In cases where an individual applicant/some society, as the case may be, applies for, extension of supply to the agricultural service by drawing water from well situated within 200 metres from any river/any other

water resources, the field officers themselves have to verify whether the G.Os. or any other certificates issued are genuine and satisfy the actual distance of the well from the river and other resources in accordance with the G.Os./any other certificates issued.

3. For the cases of applications under normal priority/Seif Financing Scheme for which extension of supply is requested to the wells lying within 200 metres from any river bank/any other water resources have already been entertained and processed before the issue of the above instructions and the progress in various stages like

- i) Reported readiness/works completed.
- ii) Reported readiness with party paid the amount/works not taken up/partly completed.
- iii) Reported readiness/party not paid the amount.

then in all above three cases supply should be extended only on submission of No Objection Certificate from the concerned Superintending Engineer/Public Works Department, by the parties.

The above stipulations will also apply to additional loads in agricultural services where the wells are within 200 metres from the bank of water resources.

In cases of the applications requiring supply to the agricultural pumpsets for the wells situated 200 metres away from any river/water resources, the field officers themselves can process after satisfying about the distance and checking the genuineness of the certificates issued by the authorities concerned.

## Proceedings :

In the Board's Proceedings first cited, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board revised the scales of pay, rates of Dearness Allowance, House Rent Allowance, City Compensatory Allowance and other Allowances and Special Pays of the Officers of the Board. The Board has considered the question of revision of scales of pay and allowances of its Officers after holding discussions with the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Engineers' Association and the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Finance and Accounts Officers' Association. After careful consideration, the Board passes the following orders :-

### (1) Revision of Scales of Pay :

The present scales of pay of the various categories of Officers of the Board will be revised with effect from 1.12.1992 as set out in the Schedule to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Revised Scales of Pay (Officers) Regulations, 1994 vide para II below. The revised scales of pay for the Officers indicated in the Schedule to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Revised Scales of Pay (Officers) Regulations, 1994 shall not automatically apply to any workmen covered by (Permanent) B.P. (FB) No. 5 (Secretariat Branch) dt. 25.1.1994 by virtue of these orders.

For the existing selection grade scales of pay (1988 scales) applicable to the Officers indicated in Column (1) of the Table below, the corresponding revised selection grade scales of pay effective from 1.12.1992 shall be as indicated in Column (2) of the Table, subject to all the other conditions already in force :

In the case of the Officers, who had already moved to Selection Grade posts prior to 1.12.1992, fixation of pay in the above mentioned Revised Selection Grade Scales of pay shall be made as per the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Revised Scales of Pay (Officers) Regulations, 1994.

**(2) Dearness Allowance :**

- (a) The Dearness Allowance for the newly arrived pay shall be sanctioned for different periods from 1st December 1992 as indicated below :

1st December 1992	(i) Upto Rs. 3500/	- 83 per cent of pay
	(ii) Above Rs. 3500/-	- 62 percent of pay subject to a minimum of Rs. 2905/- per month.

	(ii) Above Rs. 3500/-	- 69 percent of pay subject to a minimum of Rs. 3220/- per month
1st July 1993	(i) Upto Rs. 3500/	- 97 per cent of pay
	(ii) Above Rs. 3500/-	- 73 percent of pay subject to a minimum of Rs. 3395/- per month

The rates of Dearness Allowance admissible for various stages of pay in the revised scales of pay are indicated in Annexure - I.

- (b) In future, Dearness Allowance will be sanctioned twice a year on 1st July and 1st January taking into account the variations in the previous twelve months average of the All India Consumer Price Index numbers, adopting the same formula adopted by the Government of Tamil Nadu. The mode of payment of additional instalment of dearness allowance shall also be on the same pattern as followed by the Government of Tamil Nadu.
- (c) Dearness Allowance shall be calculated only with reference to basic pay and personal pay granted to the Officers for compensating monetary loss, if any, due to revision or fixation of pay. Other items like special pay or any other emoluments given as pay shall not be taken into account for calculation of Dearness Allowance.

**(3) House Rent Allowance and City Compensatory Allowance :**

ON coming over to the Revised scales of pay on or after 1.12.1992, the Officers shall be paid the House Rent Allowance and City Compensatory Allowance as laid down in the Tables in Annexure II, in lieu of the existing arrangements.

Wherever rent free quarters are provided to the Officers or a rental of 8% of basic pay or less is charged for the occupation of quarters provided by the Board, no House Rent Allowance shall be admissible.

**(4) Other Allowances and Special Pays :**

- (a) ON coming over to the Revised Scales of Pay on or after 1.12.1992, the Officers will be paid the following Allowances and Special Pays in accordance with the Tables in Annexure III, in lieu of the existing arrangements :-

1. Hill allowance
2. Isolated Locality Compensatory Allowance
3. Project Allowance
4. Investigation Allowance
5. Winter Allowance
6. Project special pay
7. Transmission Line Construction Special pay, Tranformer Erection Special Pay, Sub-station, Erection Special pay, Power Line Carrier Communication special pay and Madras Development Circle special pay.
8. Hot Line special pay
9. Thermal allowance (There will be no dust allowance)
10. Special pays to Officers in Vigilance Cell & Anti Power Theft Squad.
11. Thermal Incentive bonus at Tuticorin Thermal Power Station.

(b) The rates of Shift Operation special pay shall be revised as indicated below :-

(c) With effect from 1.4.1993, conveyance allowance payable to blind and orthopaedically handicapped employees will be revised from "5 per cent of pay, subject to a maximum of Rs. 50/-" to "5 per cent of pay subject to a maximum of Rs. 75/-".

(d) The above revision of the rates of the special pays and allowances should not be taken as extension of these special pays and allowances to any new area. It is only revision of the rates to those who are already entitled to them with reference to the existing Regulations/Orders.

#### (5) Pay Fixation :

- (i) The pay of the Officers shall be fixed in the Revised Scales with reference to the present emoluments which shall comprise pay as on 1.12.1992 together with a sum calculated at ten per cent of the existing basic pay. Accordingly, the Board passes the following orders on the Fitment Formula.
- (ii) The fixation of pay in the Revised Scales shall be governed by the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Revised Scales of Pay (Officers) Regulations, 1994 - vide para II of this order.

- (iii) Annexure - IV to this order gives the detailed Fitment Tables for the various existing scales of pay based on the formula prescribed, which is given in the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Revised Scales of Pay (Officers) Regulations, 1994. There shall be no deviation from the Fitment Tables, wherever available, while fixing the pay in the Revised Scale. There are certain cases in which the pay of officers drawing Personal Pay cannot be fixed as per the Fitment Tables. In such cases, along with the pay as on 1.12.92 and 10% of basic pay, personal pay shall also be added and then the pay fixed at the next stage in the revised scale which may in some cases differ from the stage shown in the Fitment table. The pay fixing officer shall, after verifying the Revised scale for the category of the post with reference to the existing scale given in the schedule, refer to either the Fitment Tables or the other principle referred to above and fix the pay in the Revised Scale of Pay, with reference to the existing stage in the present scale of pay.
- (iv) The next increment in the Revised scales of pay shall be due on the date normally due in the existing scale.
- (v) The pay fixation statement may be prepared in the Form given in Annexure V and got approved by the Head of Office and attached to the Service Book of the Officers.

**(6) Stagnation Increment :**

In the case of the Officers, who stagnate at the maximum of their scales, stagnation increment at the rate of last increment shall be sanctioned once in two years subject to a maximum of three stagnation increments. Stagnation increment will be granted upto the pay limit of Rs. 6,950/-.

II. In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 79(c) of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board hereby makes the following regulations, namely :

**1. Short title and commencement**

- (i) These Regulations may be called the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Revised Scales of Pay (Officers) Regulations, 1994.
- (ii) They shall be deemed to have come into force on 1st December 1992.

**2. Definitions :**

In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires -

- (i) "present emoluments" shall comprise,
  - (a) the basic pay as on 1st December 1992 of an officer in the existing scale.
  - (b) Personal Pay drawn by the officer on 1st December 1992.
- (ii) "existing scale" in relation to any post means the scale of pay admissible to an officer in respect of such post on the 1st December 1992.
- (iii) "post" means any post specified in the Schedule.

- (iv) "revised scale" in respect of any post means the revised scale of pay specified in respect of such post in the Schedule.

### **3. Application of Revised Scales of Pay :**

Save as otherwise provided in these Regulations, these shall be paid to holders of all posts in a substantive or in officiating capacity or appointed or promoted temporarily under Regulation 106 of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulations or promoted specified in the Schedule (including those on suspension or deputation or foreign service or leave or suspended lien), pay calculated in the revised scales of pay.

### **4. Fixation of pay :**

- (1) The initial pay of an Officer who elects to be governed by the Revised scale from 1st December 1992, shall be fixed separately in respect of his substantive pay in the permanent post on which he holds a lien or would have held a lien if it had not been suspended, and in respect of his pay in the officiating post held by him, in the following manner :-

- (a) An amount representing ten per cent of basic pay in the existing scale of pay shall be added to the present emoluments of the officer as defined in Regulation 2(i).

**Explanation :** If the amount so computed includes a part of a rupee, then if such part is fifty paise or more, it shall be rounded off to the next rupee and if such part is less than fifty paise, it shall be ignored.

- (b) the pay shall be fixed in the revised scale at the stage next above the amount computed under clause (a).

Provided that -

- (i) If the amount as computed under clause (a) is less than the minimum of the revised scale, the pay shall be fixed at such minimum of that scale ;
- (ii) If the amount as computed under clause (a) is more than the maximum of the revised scale, the pay shall be fixed at such maximum of that scale.
- (iii) Where the difference between the pay and dearness allowance in the revised scale and the pay and dearness allowance in the existing scale is less than Rs. 250/- the pay in the revised scale shall be fixed at such level so that the difference is not less than Rs. 250/-.
- (2) The pay of an Officer appointed or promoted to a post on or after the 1st December 1992 shall be fixed in the following manner :
- (i) If he was holding a post on 1st December, 1992 and was promoted or appointed to another post subsequently, his pay in the old post shall be fixed as on 1st December, 1992 under sub-regulation (1) of this Regulation in the revised pay scale and then his pay in the post which he held subsequent to 1st December 1992 fixed in the appropriate revised scales under the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulations or other orders in force. Such officers shall also be permitted to revise the option for Promotion Pay Fixation already

exercised by them under the existing scale if they so desire within a period of four months. Such option once exercised will be final.

- (ii) If he was appointed to the service in the Board for the first time on or after 1st December, 1992 and before the 30th April, 1994, his emoluments on the date of joining comprising the basic pay on the date of his joining service shall constitute the emoluments and the revised pay shall be fixed as per Regulation 4 with effect from the date of his joining service.

- (3) (i) If the pay as fixed in the officiating post under sub-regulation (1) is lower than the pay fixed in the substantive post, it shall be fixed at the stage next above the substantive pay.

**Note :** If an Officer officiating in a higher post has not been confirmed in the lower post from which he has been promoted to the present officiating higher post and put in not less than five completed years of service in such lower post, his pay in such lower post shall be deemed to be substantive pay only for the above provision.

- (ii) Where the pay of an Officer who has moved from a lower post to a higher post or from an Ordinary Grade to a Selection Grade is fixed at a stage lower than that would have been admissible in the lower post or the Ordinary Grade (if he is in the Selection Grade Post) his pay shall be stepped upto the stage equal to the pay in the lower post or Grade, or if there is no such stage, to the next higher stage;

Provided that this will apply only to the Officer who have actually moved to the higher or Selection Grade post from the lower or ordinary Grade post.

- (4) If an Officer is confirmed in a lower post which he held in an officiating capacity previously with retrospective effect from a date prior to 1st December, 1992 he shall be entitled to have his substantive pay in that post refixed on the 1st December, 1992 and also to have his pay refixed in the higher officiating post which he actually held on the 1st December, 1992 at the stage next above that substantive pay.
- (5) If an Officer is on leave on 1st December, 1992 he shall be entitled to the revised scale of pay from that date, but the pay so fixed in the revised scale shall be admissible to him only from the date of his return to duty in the post after the expiry of leave and the period commencing on 1st December, 1992 and ending with the date of such return will count for future increment in the revised scale depending on whether it will count for future increment in the existing scale.
- (6) An Officer, who on 1st December, 1992, is on leave preparatory to retirement shall be entitled to choose his pay either in his substantive post or in the officiating post in the revised scale with effect from that date for the purpose of computing his gratuity and pension.
- (7) If an Officer was under reduction of pay or stoppage of increment as a punishment on 1st December, 1992, his pay shall be fixed in the revised scale on the basis of present emoluments he drew on the 1st December, 1992 and he shall continue to draw the pay so fixed in the revised scale till the expiry of the period of punishment. His pay in the revised scale shall be refixed immediately following the date of expiry of the period of punishment, with reference to the present emoluments which he would have drawn on 1st December, 1992 taking the fact into consideration whether the punishment awarded is with cumulative effect or without cumulative effect.

If, for instance, an Officer's increment falling due on 1st July, 1992 has been postponed for a year without cumulative effect, his actual present emoluments as on 1st December, 1992 would be the basis for determination of his revised pay with effect from 1st December, 1992 and the pay so fixed shall be in force upto 30th June 1993. For the purposes of determination of his pay with effect from 1st July, 1993, however, his pay on 1st December, 1992 shall be refixed notionally based on the present emoluments which he would have received on 1st December, 1992, but for the punishment and he will get the next increment on 1st July, 1993 from the stage.

If, however, the punishment of stoppage of increment due on 1st July, 1992 had been awarded with cumulative effect, the revised pay shall be fixed based on his actual present emoluments as on 1st December, 1992. There shall be no refixation of pay in his case.

- (8) If an Officer is under suspension on 1.12.1992, his pay shall be fixed notionally in the revised scale on 1.12.1992 on the basis of the present emoluments drawn by him prior to his suspension but the pay so fixed in the revised scale shall be admissible to him only from the date of his return to duty. If an Officer was discharged from a post before 1.12.1992 and is re-appointed to that post after that date, he shall be entitled to the revised scale of pay only from the date of his reappointment to that post.

#### **5. Date of Increment**

- (i) The next increment of an Officer in the revised scale shall be granted on the date he would have drawn the increment had he continued in the existing scale. In the case of an Officer to whom pay fixation in the revised scale on 1.12.1992 taking into account his present emoluments as on 30.9.1992, is made, an increment in the revised scale may be given on 1st December, 1992, itself.
- (ii) If an Officer draws his next increment in the revised scale under clause (i) above and thereby becomes eligible for higher pay than his senior whose next increment falls due at a later date, then the pay of such senior shall be refixed equal to the pay of the junior from the date on which the junior becomes entitled to higher pay.

**Note :** In cases where the pay of an officer is stepped up in terms of clause (ii) above and Regulation 6 below, the next increment shall be granted after completing requisite qualifying service.

#### **6. Rectification of pay anomaly :**

- (1) In cases where an Officer promoted to a higher post before 1st December 1992 draws less pay in the revised scale than his junior who is promoted to the higher post on or after 1st December 1992, the pay of the senior officer may be stepped up to that of the junior with effect from the date on which the junior draws more pay, provided that -
- (i) the senior and the junior officer belong to the same category and have been promoted to the same post ;
- (ii) the pre-revised and revised scales of pay of the lower and higher posts in which they are entitled to draw pay are identical; and



- (iii) the anomaly should have arisen directly as a result of the introduction of the revised scales of pay.

**Note :** If, in the lower post, the junior officer was drawing more pay in the pre-revised scale than the senior by virtue of any advance increment granted to him, the seniors to such juniors have no claim over the pay of the junior.

- (2) In case where an officer who had drawn incentive increments in the prerevised scale and drawn more pay than his junior prior to 1st December 1992 draws less pay than his junior in the revised scales of pay consequent on the sanction of incentive increments in the revised scales of pay, then the pay of the senior may be stepped up to the level of the junior from the date from which the junior draws such higher pay.
- (3) where a junior opts to come over to the revised scale from a date subsequent to 1st December, 1992 and happens to get more pay than that of his senior by way of fitment benefit, then the pay of the senior shall be stepped up to the level of the pay of the junior with effect from the date from which the junior draws such higher pay, provided that the senior was drawing pay higher than or equal to the pay of the junior in the pre-revised scales of pay from time to time.

## **7. Option.**

- (1) An officer may exercise option to remain in the existing scale of pay until the date on which he earns his next increment in the existing scale of pay. An officer who had drawn an increment in the existing scale on 1st October 1992 may also exercise option for pay fixation in the revised scale on 1.12.1992 taking in to account his present emoluments as on 30th September 1992.

Provided that if an Officer does not exercise the option within the period specified below, he shall be deemed to have opted for the revised scales of pay with effect from 1st December, 1992 taking into account his present emoluments as on that date.

**Note :** Officers may also exercise option to come over to the revised scale on getting promotion / movement to selection grade during the period between 1st December 1992 and 30th November 1993.

- (2) The option shall be exercised in the Form given in Annexure-VI to these Regulations within four months from the date of publication of these Regulations and intimated by the Officer to the Head of his office.

Provided that in the case of an Officer who was on leave on that date or who was discharged from service before and was not in service, on that date or who was on deputation or in foreign service, the option may be exercised within a period of three months from the date on which he returns from leave, or is re-appointed to the post, or rejoins duty in the Board, as the case may be.

- (3) The option once exercised shall be final.
- (4) If an officer, opts to remain in the existing scale of pay for a specified period, he shall be entitled to draw pay in the existing scale during that period and also the amount of dearness allowance, at the existing rates and in the latter case his pay shall be fixed in the revised

scale at the end of the period specified in accordance with the provisions under these Regulations.

**8. Power to remove difficulties :**

The Board may, by order, remove any difficulty that may arise in giving effect to the provisions of these Regulations.

**9. Power to amend schedule :**

- (1) The Board may, by order, amend the Schedule.
- (2) All references made in these Regulations to the schedule shall be considered as relating to the Schedule as amended from time to time in exercise of the powers conferred by these Regulations.

**10. Effect of other Regulations :**

Save as otherwise provided in these Regulations, no provision of any other Regulation made or deemed to have been made under Section 79 (C) of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948 shall, in so far as it is inconsistent with any of the provisions of these Regulations, have any effect.

III. The Chief Engineers, Superintending Engineers and other Officers are requested to have copies of these proceedings displayed conspicuously on the Notice Boards of the office under their control.

IV. The Adhoc amount of Rs. 1,500/- or less paid to the employees of the Board with reference to the orders in (per.) B.P. (FB) No.110 (SB) dt. 5.11.93, third cited, shall be adjusted against the arrears of pay and allowances due to fixation of pay in the revised scale payable to the officers with reference to these orders.
