The maximum grid demand and consumption during November '94 were 3966 MW on 30—11—'94 and 80.187 MU on 30—11—'94 respectively. The average grid consumption in November '94 was 67.703 MU per day.

II. Hydro Inflows :

The hydro inflows during November '94 were 485 MU against 679 MU in November '93 and against the ten year average of 314 MU. The total inflows from July to November '94 were 3377 MU against 2630 MU during the same period last year and against the ten year average of 2015 MU.

VI. 1. Fixation of pay consequent on the merger of TA Grades I & II

In B.P. (CH) No. 298, Sectt. Branch dt. 3—11—94, the Board has ordered that the pay of TA Grade II in the scale of Rs. 1080—30—1290—35—1780 as on 1—12—92 shall be fixed at the next higher stage in the prervised scale of Rs. 1210—35—1490—40—2050 as on 1—12—92 and then the fixation of pay in the revised scale of pay shall be made.

2. Revised selection grade scales of pay for seven categories :

In B.P. (FB) No. 106, Sectt. Branch dt. 3—11—94, the Board has ordered that promotion posts' scales may be applied as selection grade scales to Vehicle Helper, Assistants, Superintendents, Accounts Supervisor, Administrative Supervisor, Stores Supervisor and Foreman I Grade.

3. Qualifying service for pension :

In Letter No. 68711-N1/94-1 dt. 1—11—94, the Board has ordered that the amendment issued by the Government to rule 43 sub-rule (3) of Tamil Nadu Pension Rules 1978 may be adopted in the Board which specifies that fraction of year equal to three months and above shall be treated as a completed one half year and reckoned as qualifying service.

4. Enhancement of monetary limit for purchase of warm clothing :

In B.P. (CH) No. 299, Sectt. Branch dt. 3—12—94, the Board has ordered enhancement of the monetary limit for sanction of advance for purchase of warm clothing from Rs. 500 to Rs. 1000 or two months basic pay whichever is less.

5. HBA—Disbursement of instalments :

In Memo. No. 58875-E2/94-1 dt. 3—11—94, the Board has clarified that 50% of the revised estimate should be disbursed as first instalment of the advance.

6. Extension of time for payment of EMD for extension of supply :

In B.P. (FB) No. 317, Tech Branch, dt. 8—11—94, the Board has ordered collection of a deposit fee of 2% of EMD per month/part of month for extension of time for payment beyond the date of expiry of extension time granted by the CE (Distn) in case of LT applicants.

7. HBA—change of category for sanction of HBA :

In B.P. (CH) No. 300, Sectt. Branch dt. 4—11—94, the Board has permitted change of category for sanction of HBA with retention of their original seniority subject to certain conditions specified thereon.

8. Compensation charges for non provision of capacitors :

In B.P. (FB) No. 314 Tech. Branch dt. 4—11—94, the Board has ordered addition of paras 2 & 3 under Clause 17.02 of the Terms & Conditions of Supply specifying the formula for compensation charges for inadequate provision of capacitors and for disconnection of service if the capacitors are inadequate and defective.

9. DP cases—Decision on findings of the Enquiry Officer :

In Memo. No. 18272/PI/94-1 dt. 11—11—94, the Board has adopted the Government's letter No. 105983/Per N/90 dt. 28—2—94 which stipulates that —

- (a) the disciplinary authority should communicate the reasons for any disagreement on the findings of the E.O. to the person charged along with a copy of enquiry while calling for further representation if major penalty is involved.
- (b) In case of minor penalty the enquiry report with reasons for disagreement may be communicated to the person charged at the time of communicating final orders.

10. Collection of development charges for tariff change :

In Memo. No. IEMC/EE3/AEE1/Instructions/D375/94 dt. 17—11—94 it has been clarified that regarding development charges —

- (a) B.P. (FB) No. 136 dt. 13—6—91 may be applied to all single phase services which got converted into three phase on or after 15—6—91 and the full development charges for three phase collected in case the same is not collected for single phase service.
- (b) B.P. (FB) No. 136 dt. 13—6—91 need not be applied for name transfer.
- (c) In case of tariff change, orders issued in Memo. No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE2/D231/94 dt. 20—7—94 may be followed for all services effected on or after 15—6—91.

11. Technical Education Loan :

In Memo. No. 75514-E2/94-1 dt. 16-11-94, it has been clarified that the technical education loan may be sanctioned for students studying in self financed colleges also subject to the amount being restricted to the fees prescribed by Government Technical Institutions/DOTE.

12. DCRG—Amendment to Rule 70 of Tamil Nadu Pension Rules :

In Letter No. 79956-N1/94-1 dt. 30-11-94, the Board has ordered implementation of G.O.Ms.No. 763 (Fin) (Pens) Dept. dt. 5-9-94 which adds note to Rule 70 of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules 1978 to the effect that gratuity is not liable to attachment in accordance with the provision of clause (g) of the provision to subsection (1) of section 60 of the Code of Civil Procedure 1908 (Central Act V of 1908).

Notification

In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby makes the following amendment to the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978,

2. The amendment hereby made shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st January 1986.

Sub : Labour—Direct action by Union—Belated submission of details of participants/absenteeism—Instructions.

In the event of strike, bandh/Dharna etc., instructions are issued to the field officers to take action for the maintenance of un-interrupted power supply and for the safety measures to protect the vital installations of Board. Instructions are also issued to report the details of participants/absenteeism on the day of strike/bandh/dharna etc., immediately for statistical purposes and to know the real impact.

2. The Chief Secretary to Government of Tamil Nadu in his recent circular has directed inter-alia that "all important matters where there are ongoing disputes or agitations by workers, service association, Government servants etc., the outcome of the talks held between service association and the Government and any other developments which require the attention of the Government for remedial measures should be immediately brought to the notice of the Chief Secretary by Secretaries concerned".

3. In most of the cases the reports of participants/absenteeism are submitted by the Superintending Engineers belatedly as a matter of routine without knowing its significance.

4. As the Board has to decide most of its policies in consultation with the Government and with its concurrence, the developments of strike and its real impact have to be enlightened immediately to the Government after the direct action is over.

5. In view of the above circumstances, the Chief Engineers, Superintending Engineers of the Board are hereby requested to report the details of participants/absenteeism immediately in the evening of the strike day / dharna / bandh etc., itself by Telex Message/Fax without fail.

Proceedings :

According to the orders issued in para 5(ii) of the Board's Proceedings cited, Technical Assistant, Grade II should be merged with Technical Assistant, Grade I and designated as Technical Assistant and will be fitted in the revised scale of pay Rs. 1250—45—1475—50—2225. A separate fitment Table viz. Table III(A) has been included in Schedule II referred to in Regulation 4(1) of the Revised Scales of Pay (Workmen) Regulations, 1994 contained in para 6 of the Board's Proceedings cited.

2. Representations have been received from the Unions that merger of the two grades of Technical Assistant may be in the pre-revised scale on 1—12—92 by fixing the pay at the next higher stage and then fixation of pay in the Revised scale of pay of Rs. 1250—45—1475—50—2225 may be made on the same date as per Table No. IV in Schedule II referred to in regulation 4 (1) of the Revised Scales of Pay (Workmen) Regulations, 1994.

3. After careful consideration, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board has decided to accept the representations, Accordingly, in partial modification of the orders issued in the Board's Proceedings cited, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board pass the following orders:—

- (i) the pay of the incumbents of Technical Assistant, Grade II in the pre-revised scale of pay of Rs. 1080—30—1290—35—1780 as on 1—12—92 shall be fixed at the next higher stage in the pre-revised scale of pay Rs. 1210—35—1490—40—2050 on 1st December 1992.

- (ii) From the pay as arrived at under item (i) above, fixation of pay in the revised scale of pay shall be made to all the incumbents of Technical Assistant, II Grade (merged with Technical Assistant I Grade) in accordance with Table No. IV in Schedule II referred to in 4(1) of the Revised Scales of Pay (Workmen) Regulations, 1994 on 1st December 1992.

4. In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 79c) of the (Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board hereby makes the following amendments to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Revised Scales of Pay (Workmen) Regulations, 1994 :—

- (2) Table No. III(A) in Schedule II referred to Regulation 4(1) of the Revised Scale of Pay (Workmen) Regulations, 1994 shall be deleted.

- (1) At the end of sub-clause (i) under Regulation 5 of the said Regulations, the following Note shall be added, namely :—

NOTE: In the cases of Technical Assistant Grade II merged with Technical Assistant I, the next increment in the Revised scale shall be granted on the date he would have drawn the increment had he continued as Technical Assistant, Grade II.

Order :

It has been brought to the notice of the Government during the Collectors' Conference held on 27—7—94 that in certain Government Communications the terms 'Higher' or 'Upper' caste are used to denote the persons belonging to other than Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Backward Classes. The Honourable Chief Minister announced that in all the Government communications there will be no reference to 'Higher' or 'Upper' caste, but these will be referred to as 'Other castes' in future. Accordingly, the Government now direct that the term 'Other Castes', instead of 'Higher' or 'Upper' caste, be used in all Government communications in future.

2. The District Collectors and Heads of Departments etc., are requested to follow the above instructions scrupulously in Government communications. The receipt of this order shall be acknowledged.

With reference to the clarification issued under items 3 and 4 of the Board's memorandum cited, a doubt has been raised as to whether 50% of the pre-revised estimates or 50% of the revised estimates should be disbursed as first instalment of the advance.

In Regulation 2(i) of the Revised Scales of Pay (Officers) Regulations 1994 contained in the Board's Proceedings cited, the term 'present emoluments' has been defined as mentioned below :

“(i) “present emoluments” shall comprise,

(a) the basic pay as on 1st December 1992 of an officer in the existing scale

(b) Personal Pay drawn by the officer on 1st December 1992”.

Personal Pay allowed with a condition that it should be absorbed in future increments and personal pay allowed on appointment to a post by internal selection will have to be excluded from the above definition, if the 1988 Wage Revision concept is to be followed. It has been decided to amend the definition of 'present emoluments' keeping in view the principle followed in 1988 Wage Revision.

2. In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 79(c) of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948 the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board makes the following amendment to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Revised Scales of Pay (Officers) Regulations 1994.

Amendment

For the existing Regulation 2(i) of the said Regulations, the following shall be substituted namely:—

“(i) ‘present emoluments’ shall comprise

(a) the basic pay as on 1st December 1992 of an officer in the existing scale.

(b) personal pay granted to an officer on movement to selection grade to ensure one increment in the ordinary grade scale and such personal pay is continued in higher post even after fixation of pay in higher post.

Note (1) : In the case of Officers drawing personal pay on 1st December 1992 in the existing scales of pay which as per the existing regulations should be absorbed in future increments the personal pay will continue to be drawn in the revised pay to be absorbed in future increments and as such this will not be included in the basic pay defined in clause (a) above.

Note (2) : In the case of Officers appointed through Internal Selection drawing personal pay as on 1st December, 1992 in the existing scales of pay which was allowed by way of protection of previous posts' pay the personal pay will continue to be drawn in the revised pay by allowing protection with reference to previous post's revised pay as is being done with reference to the existing orders, and as such this will not be included in the basic pay defined in clause (a) above.

2. In B.P. Ms. No. 591. (Administrative) Dated : 30—9—91 and In B.P. Ms. No. 629, (Administrative,) Dated : 22—10—81, the Board issued orders absorbing 21 Supervisory/Convenanted Officers on technical side and also fixing their inter-se-seniority as indicated in the Annexures therein. The above orders were challenged in Courts of Law. In the judgement delivered in W.A. Nos. 1001 to 1007 of 1993 dated 4—3—1994, the Division Bench of the High Court, while quashing the orders of the Board, had issued the following guidelines for determining the equation of posts and fixation of inter-se-seniority of the Officers of the erstwhile Electrical Undertakings with Officers of the Board :—

- (i) The nature and duties of a post;
- (ii) The responsibilities, powers exercised by the Officers holding a post, the extent of territorial or other charges held or responsibilities discharged;
- (iii) The minimum qualification;
- (iv) The salary of the post;
- (v) Age of the persons and other factors being equal, for instance, seniority may be determined on the basis of age;
- (vi) Length of continuous service whether permanent or temporary in a particular grade;
- (vii) Primarily it required among others, evaluation of duties and responsibilities of the respective posts. More often, the functions of 2 posts may appear to be the same or similar but there may be difference in degree in the performance. The quantity of the work may be the same, but the quality may be different and that cannot be determined by relying upon averments in the affidavit of the interested parties. The equation of the posts or equation of pay must be left to the Executive Government. It must be determined by expert bodies like Pay Commission.

The Division Bench of the High Court had also issued the following orders :—

“The Board shall in the first instance fix the equation of posts by applying the relevant principles laid down by the Supreme Court in the various decisions referred

to earlier. On the basis of such equation of posts, the fitment of the 22 Officers of the erstwhile undertakings and the fixation of their seniority vis-a-vis the Officers of the Board shall be done after giving due opportunity to the concerned persons to make their respective representations. It is only on the basis of such seniority list, the relevant orders of promotion to the higher posts with reference to the parties to these proceedings shall be made."

The Division Bench of the High Court had also directed that the entire work should be completed within two months from the date of judgement, i.e., 4-3-1994. The High Court had directed that the cases of 22 Officers of the erstwhile undertakings should be examined and orders passed by the Electricity Board in regard to the equation of posts and the fixation of their seniority vis-a-vis the Officers of the Electricity Board. It is to be pointed out in this connection that one of those 22 Officers by name Thiru R. Ramamoorthy, Junior Engineer (S.M.E.S.C.) had already resigned his job from the service of the Board on 4-10-1980. Regarding his absorption by the Board in the cadre of Junior Engineer as on 1-12-73, final orders had been issued in B.P. Ms. (FB) No. 54 (Administrative Branch), Dated 30-9-1983. No one had so far gone to the High Court challenging these orders of the Board. Thiru R. Ramamoorthy's case was therefore not considered by the Board for the equation of posts and for the fixation of his inter-se-seniority, when the orders were issued by the Board during 1981.

3. The Board examined the question of equation of posts and fixation of inter-se-seniority in respect of the 21 erstwhile Electrical Undertaking Officers based on the materials available in the Board as well as with reference to the guidelines given by the High Court. In the meantime, the time given by the High Court to decide the case was already over. The Standing Counsel of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board was, therefore, requested to move the High Court to grant extension of time till 31-7-1994 to implement the orders of the High Court.

4. The question of equation of posts is purely an administrative matter to be decided with reference to the principles laid down in the judgements and also in the Regulations of the Board. It was considered that a senior retired Officer of the Government would be in a better position to give his views on the above subject. Thiru Subramanian, I.A.S. (Retired), Commissioner of Prohibition and Excise and Arbitrator of Tamil Nadu Civil Supplies Corporation Ltd. Nominee, Director of SIPCOT/TIC was, therefore, appointed as ONE MAN COMMISSION to study the matter and give his recommendations. Accordingly, in Board's Letter No. 6344/A 2/93-23, Dated; 23-6-1994 communication was sent appointing Thiru R. Subramanian as One Man Commission and he assumed charge on 12-7-1994. In the meantime, notices were issued to all the erstwhile Electrical Undertaking Officers furnishing the guidelines given by the Division Bench of the High Court and requested them to furnish information relating to duties and responsibilities etc. discharged by them in the erstwhile Electrical Undertakings available with them.

5. In the Board's letter Dated 23-6-1994, the One Man Commission was also requested to study the entire matter and to give his recommendations on the five points indicated below :—

- a) Equation of posts of the erstwhile Electrical Undertakings with corresponding posts in the Tamil Nadu Elec. Board as or vesting date ;
- b) After deciding the equation of posts, the inter-se-seniority of the erstwhile Electrical Undertaking Officers with Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Officers and also their subsequent notional promotion in the Board ;
- c) If the present recommendation of the One Man Commission in regard to particular Officer is either advantageous or dis-advantageous with reference to earlier absorption, the method to regularise notional promotion with monetary benefit, if any.
- d) Out of 21 erstwhile Electrical Undertaking Officers, some of the Officers have retired and in their case also, there may be changes due to revised absorption. Whether the revised absorption should be made applicable to retired Officers also and consequent monetary benefit, if any, to be allowed or to be recovered from them ;
- e) Other recommendations, if any, to implement the orders of the High Court.

6. The One Man Commission before examining the above 21 cases, has gone thro' the written representations made by the 15 Officers of the erstwhile Electrical Undertakings and also the records available with the Board. It has also gone through the copies of the judgements delivered by the Madras High Court on several writ petitions and writ appeals filed by both the Officers of the Electricity Board and the Officers of the erstwhile Electrical Undertakings and also the affidavits and the Counter-affidavits filed by them.

7. The One Man Commission has attended the above work for 46 working days from 12-7-1994 to 13-9-1994 and has given his recommendations on 13-9-1994. In the meanwhile, extension of time applied in the High Court, viz., 31-7-1994, already expired. Therefore, the Standing Counsel was requested to move the Court for extension of time upto 30-9-1994. As the recommendations of the One Man Commission had to be examined with reference to the original records after getting objections from all the concerned persons and as the issue involved was complicated one, it was considered necessary to get further extension of time from the High Court till 31-12-1994. In the meantime, Thiru C. S. Krishnamoorthy, Standing Counsel of the Board, reported that the CMPs asking for extension of time came up before their Lordships Tvl. M. Srinivasan and Thangamani on 7-10-1994. He has stated that their Lordships have observed that there will not be any more extension of time and if directions are not complied with, it will be treated as contempt of Court. He has also stated that the learned Judges have extended time upto 31-10-1994 and advised the Board to issue orders within the stipulated time as otherwise it will lead to contempt of Court.

8. Only 17 days excluding holidays were available to pass orders in this matter, after obtaining the objections from all the concerned persons as directed by the High Court. Therefore, the basis on which the One Man Commission has given his recommendations on the question of equation of posts and inter-se-seniority was communicated and objections were called for from the concerned persons, (namely parties to the various Writ petitions, Writ Appeals filed in the Madras High Court and S.L.P. filed in the Supreme Court and all the Officers (both serving and retired) of the erstwhile Electrical Undertakings), in Memo. dated 11-10-1994. As the High Court has given clear direction to pass orders before 31-10-1994, all the concerned persons were requested to send their objections within 7 days. A copy of the above communication was also sent to all the concerned persons by Registered Post with Acknowledgement Due/Special Messenger/Fax with copies to the Chief Engineer/Supervising Engineers concerned and they were specifically requested to display the above Memo. in the Notice Board for wide publicity. The concerned persons were also requested to send their objections to the SECRETARY/Tamil Nadu Electricity Board direct.

9. Both the Engineers of the Board and the erstwhile Electrical Undertaking Officers have raised objections to the recommendations of the One Man Commission. The Officers of the erstwhile Electrical Undertakings generally wanted higher absorption than the one recommended by the One Man Commission. The Board Engineers in their representations, have raised objections to the findings of the One Man Commission. The following are the main objections contained in the representations of the Board Engineer:—

- (a) The Board sought to have constituted a Committee consisting of atleast 5 persons, out of which atleast two with expert Engineering background, atleast one with service and labour background, atleast one with legal background and one Retired Member of Public Service Commission to determine the question of equation and fitment etc.
- (b) Equation of post should be first decided and approved by the Board based on the recommendation of an expert body and the Board should issue formal orders regarding equation of posts and then call for objections and after the receipt of such objections and disposing the same, the Board shall issue final orders. After passing of the final orders by the Board regarding equation of posts, the Board shall work out the inter-se-seniority and issue formal orders, again call for objections, dispose of the objections received and then only pass final orders;
- (c) The Commission has neither followed the established procedure of law nor adhered to the principles of natural justice guaranteed by the Constitution of India and the guidelines prescribed by the Division Bench.
- (d) The Board and Commission appear to have acted in a biased manner to favour Thiru R. Srinivasan and some other Engineers of the Undertakings. The employees of the absorbed undertaking companies cannot claim to have any better position than that they might get if the company was not acquired;

- (e) As per Section 15 of the T.M.P.U.E.S. (Acquisition) Act, 1973 the employees of the Undertaking companies are automatically deemed to continue in the same position as if the undertaking company was not acquired and their respective equal position as to the post held in the company alone can be given, i.e., to say at the maximum, the equal position of a Main Superintendent as on date of determination of the equation, which according to the Commission is equal to Executive Engineer, can alone be given to the Undertaking Engineers.
- (f) The Board should and ought to have enclosed a copy of the entire findings and report of the One Man Commission. It appears that the Commission has not considered the functional similarities and co-equal responsibilities, the qualitative difference of the nature of work etc."

10. Apart from the Board Engineers, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Engineers Association has also raised the following objections to the recommendations of the One Man Commission :—

- (a) Appointment of One Man Commission itself is not on Sound principles.
- (b) Opportunities for the affected Board Engineers were not given including this Association to express their views,
- (c) Lack of materials for the Commission to come to this decision,
- (d) It is presumed that the One Man Commission does not consider the functional similarities and co-equal responsibilities, the qualitative differences of the nature of work etc.

The Association has, "there-fore, requested the Board" not to implement the recommendations of the One Man Commission.

11. The Objections received were carefully considered and they are examined below :

- (a) The circumstances under which the One Man Commission was constituted have already been explained in detail in paragraphs 3 & 4 above.
- (b) The One Man Commission is a senior retired I. A. S. Officer of the Tamil Nadu Government who had vast experience in deciding matters like this.
- (c) The One Man Commission, before making his recommendations, has studied all the relevant materials, Court orders, Board Regulations etc. as indicated in para 6 above,
- (d) Some of the materials not available with the Board were called for from the erstwhile Engineers and they were also studied along with the records available with the Board,
- (e) One Man Commission has given sufficient reasons as to why he is recommending absorption of some erstwhile Undertaking Officials from earlier date so far as their seniority is concerned.
- (f) In respect of Vellore Electrical Undertaking the designation of the three Officers are one and the same, namely, Assistant Engineer. The One Man Commission has given reasons as to why they should be absorbed in two different posts. This will show that the recommendation of the One Man Commission in each case is not a hasty one but based on detailed and careful analysis of all the relevant materials and facts of the case;
- (g) The circumstances under which One Man Commission was constituted instead of a multi Member Commission has been explained in paras 3 and 4 above
- (h) The High Court direction to implement the orders before 31—10—1994 was received only on 10—10—1994 and only 17 working days were available at the disposal of the Board to pass orders in this case after getting objections from all the concerned persons. They have been given sufficient time to give their views on the recommendations of the One Man Commission.

12. The One Man Commission has given his recommendations to the Chairman on 13—9—94 and it was under examination along with the documents available with the Board. Before the examination could be completed, the Board's Standing Counsel in his letter Dt. 7—10—1994 has informed the Board that the Division Bench of the High Court have given extension of time only upto 31—10—94 and advised the Board to issue orders within the stipulated time as otherwise it will lead to

contempt of Court. The report of the One Man Commission consists of 17 pages besides Annexures containing his recommendations on Equation of posts and inter-se-seniority of the 21 erstwhile Electrical Undertaking Officers numbering 164 pages. As already indicated in para 8 above, only 17 days excluding holidays were available to the Board to pass orders in this matter, after obtaining the objections from all the concerned persons as directed by the High Court. In view of the paucity of time, it was not possible for the Board to get this voluminous report printed and supplied to all the concerned persons inviting objections, if any, examine the objections to be received and pass orders before 31-10-94. Therefore, the equation of posts of the Officers of the erstwhile Electrical Undertakings and the name of the post to be equated in the Board and the Inter-se-seniority of the above two categories of Officers as recommended by the One Man Commission were communicated in Memo. dated 11-10-94 to enable the affected parties to raise objections, if any, to the recommendations of the One Man Commission.

13. The B.P. Ms. No. 591. (Administrative) Dated 30-9-81 and 629, (Administrative) Dated 22-10-81, were issued with the approval of the Board. The Division Bench of the High Court has quashed the above orders and has given direction to issue orders regarding equation of posts in the first instance by applying the relevant formalities laid down by the Supreme Court and on the basis of such equation of posts the fitment of 22 Officers of the erstwhile Electrical Undertakings and the fixation of their seniority vis-a-vis the Officers of the Board shall be done after giving due opportunity to the concerned persons to make their representations. The above matter was placed before the Board. The Board in its meeting held on 13-4-1994, has passed the following resolutions:-

"The Board after detailed discussion have decided to implement the orders of the Division Bench of the High Court dated 4-3-1994."

Based on the above minutes, One Man Commission was formed. The One Man Commission has recommended equation of posts only upto the level of Executive Engineers. The Chairman is the appointing authority for posts upto the level of Superintending Engineers. Therefore, the Chairman is competent to pass orders on the recommendations of the One Man Commission regarding equation of posts and inter-se-seniority. Moreover, it is also proposed to give an opportunity to the aggrieved employee to prefer an appeal to the Board within one month from the date of these proceedings. In the circumstances, it is considered not necessary to place this matter before the Board as the Chairman is only implementing the decision of the Board dated 13-4-1994.

14. The report of the One Man Commission along with objections received from all the Officers of the erstwhile Electrical Undertakings and Officers of the Board have been examined carefully and the records connected with this case have also been scrutinised.

15. The recommendations of the One Man Commission are more or less similar to the decision already taken in 1981 in 15 cases as detailed below:-

17. However, in respect of the following two Officials, out of the six referred to above, the recommendations of the One Man Commission do not justify their absorption to higher cadre for the following reasons :-

1. Thiru K. KRISHNAMOORTHY

He was working as Assistant Engineer in Vellore Electrical Undertaking drawing a basic pay of Rs. 400/- in the scale of pay of Rs. 375—25—450—30—750—40—950. Apart from Thiru K. Krishnamoorthy, the following two Officers were also working in the same Undertaking in the same scale of pay and discharged the same duties and responsibilities but drawing more basic pay on the vesting date as furnished below :-

The above two Officers, though drawing more pay than Thiru K. Krishnamoorthy, were recommended for absorption as Junior Engineer (Now) Assistant Engineer. The One Man Commission has recommended the case of Thiru K. Krishnamoorthy, who was drawing lesser pay than the above two Officers to the higher post, viz., Assistant Engineer (Now) Assistant Executive Engineer. As this is not in consonance with the principles of absorption, Thiru K. Krishnamoorthy has to be absorbed as Junior Engineer (Now) Assistant Engineer as on vesting date along with other two Officers of the same Electrical Undertaking.

(2) Thiru K.V. Srinivasan

He is a Diploma holder of Kumbakonam Electrical Undertaking. Normally in the Board service Diploma holders were initially appointed by direct recruitment as Junior Engineer II Grade and promoted as Junior Engineer I Grade and then following 3 : 1 ratio between Degree and Diploma holders, promoted as Assistant Engineer (Now) Assistant Executive Engineer. Hence, his absorption in the Board should be only in the post of Junior Engineer I Grade. However, the One Man Commission has recommended his absorption as Assistant Engineer (Now) Assistant Executive Engineer. As this is not in consonance with the Board's Regulations, Thiru K.V. Srinivasan has also to be absorbed as Junior Engineer I Grade.

18. Subject to the above two modifications, the other recommendations of the One Man Commission in respect of nineteen Officers in so far as they relate to equating of posts is concerned are accepted, over-ruling all the objections.

19. As far as the inter-se-seniority is concerned, the recommendations of the One Man Commission require modifications in respect of the following five Officers :—

Thiruvallur :

1. M. S. Narayanamurthy
2. V. N. Madhava Rao
3. A. Balasubramanian
4. K. Krishnamoorthy
5. K. V. Srinivasan

The above five cases are examined below :—

1. Thiru M. S. Narayanamurthy

He was appointed as Assistant Engineer on 25—6—54 by the erstwhile SEEU Company. He was promoted as Main Superintendent on 25—2—63. As per the recommendation, of the One Man Commission, the post of Main Superintendent in the Company has to be equated as Divisional Engineer in Board's Service. Hence, Thiru M. S. Narayanamurthy may be absorbed as Divisional Engineer in Board's service as on vesting date (viz. 1—12—1973).

The One Man Commission has suggested the fixation of inter-se-seniority of Thiru M. S. Narayanamurthy above Thiru S. Sabapathy and below Thiru N.S. Veera Raghavan. The above two Board Engineers worked as Superintending Engineers on the vesting date (viz. 1—12—73). Therefore, it may not be appropriate to fix the inter-se-seniority of Thiru M.S. Narayanamurthy in the post of Divisional Engineer in between the above two Board Engineers as suggested by the One Man Commission. Hence, his inter-se-seniority with Board Engineers has to be fixed below the senior most person who worked as Divisional Engineer on the vesting date (viz. 1—12—73). Thiru S. S. Kannan, who was the senior most person, working as Divisional Engineer was promoted as Superintending Engineer on 16—6—1973 and Thiru T.V. Subramanian was promoted as Superintending Engineer on 3—12—1973. Therefore the inter-se-seniority of Thiru M.S. Narayanamurthy may be fixed above Thiru T.V. Subramanian and below Thiru S.S. Kannan.

(2) Thiru V. M. Madhava Rao

He was appointed as Junior Resident Engineer on 1—7—65 by the erstwhile Vellore Electrical Undertaking. As per the recommendations of the One Man Commission, the post of Junior Resident Engineer in the Company has to be equated as Assistant Divisional Engineer in Board service. Hence, Thiru V.M. Madhava Rao may be absorbed as Asst. Divisional Engineer and Asst. Exe. Engineer in Board service as on vesting date (viz. 7—1—74).

The One Man Commission has suggested the fixation of Inter-se-seniority of Thiru V. M. Madhava Rao above Thiru S. Padmanaban and below Thiru K. M. Thirumalaisamy. The above two Board Engineers, xxxx worked as Assistant Divisional Engineer with effect from 9—7—62 in Board Service (i.e.) prior to the date of joining of Thiru V. M. Madhava Rao in the said Company. Therefore, it may not be appropriate to fix the inter-se-seniority of Thiru V. M. Madhava Rao in between the above two Board Engineers as suggested by the One Man Commission. Hence, his seniority with Board Engineers may be fixed below Thiru P. S. Kailasam and above Thiru V. Jayaraman who joined as Assistant Divisional Engineers (Now AEEs) in Board's service with effect from 9—1—65 and 17—7—65 respectively.

3. Thiru A. Balasubramanian

He was appointed as Junior-Engineer on 29—6—66 and he was promoted as Assistant Engineer on 1—8—68 by the erstwhile SEEU Company. As per the recommendation of the One Man Commission, the post of Assistant Engineer in the company has to be equated as Assistant Divisional Engineer (Non AEE) in Board Service. Hence, Thiru A. Balasubramanian may be absorbed as Assistant Engineer (Now) Assistant Executive Engineer in Board Service as on vesting date (viz. 1—12—73).

The One Man Commission has suggested the fixation of Inter-se-seniority of Thiru A. Balasubramanian above Thiru A. Remakrishnan and below Thiru J. Kanagasabapathy taking into account the date of joining as Junior Engineer in the Company on 29—6—66. The above two Board Engineers joined as Assistant Engineer now Assistant-Executive Engineers with effect from 28—5—66 and 15—7—66 respectively and continued as such as on vesting date. Therefore it may not be appropriate to fix the inter-se-seniority of Thiru A. Balasubramanian in between the above two Board Engineers as suggested by the One Man Commission. Hence, his inter-se-seniority with Board Engineers may be fixed taking into account the date of joining of Thiru A. Balasubramanian on 1—8—68 in the equated post of Assistant Engineer in the Company below Thiru K. Shanmuganathan and above Thiru R. Venkatesan who joined as Assistant Divisional Engineers (Now AEEs) on 11—7—68 and 25—11—68 respectively.

4. Thiru K. Krishnamoorthy

He was appointed as Assistant Engineer on 19—4—72 by the erstwhile Vellore Electrical Undertaking. As per the recommendation of the One Man Commission, the post of Assistant Engineer in the Company has to be equated as Assistant Engineer now Assistant Divisional Engineer in Board Service. Hence, the One Man Commission has suggested that he may be absorbed as Assistant Engineer now Assistant Executive Engineer in Board Service as on vesting date (VIZ. 7—1—74).

There were three Assistant Engineers in the Vellore Electrical Undertaking in the same scale of pay discharging the same duties and responsibilities. Out of three Assistant Engineers, the One Man Commission has recommended equation of Post for two persons as Junior two Engineers (now) Assistant Engineers and the other person (viz) Thiru K. Krishnamoorthy who was drawing lesser basic pay than the above two persons as Assistant Engineer (now) Assistant Divisional Engineer. Therefore the recommendation of the One Man Commission for equation of post of Thiru K. Krishnamoorthy may be modified as Junior Engineer (now) Assistant Engineer and his inter-se-seniority may be fixed below Thiru S. Krishnamoorthy and above Thiru A. Natarajan who joined as Junior Engineers (now) Assistant Engineer in Board Service on 15—4—72 and 27—4—72 respectively.

5. Thiru K. V. Srinivasan

He was appointed as Assistant Engineer on 1—1—67 by the erstwhile Kumbakonam Electrical Undertaking. As per the recommendations of the One Man Commission, the post of Assistant Engineer in the Company has to be equated as Assistant Divisional Engineer in Board Service. Hence, the One Man Commission suggested that Thiru K. V. Srinivasan may be absorbed as Assistant Divisional Engineer (Now) Asst. Exe. Engineer in Board Service as on vesting date (viz. 7—1—74).

Thiru K. V. Srinivasan is only a diploma holder drawing the basic pay of Rs. 475/- p.m. in the scale of pay of Rs. 350-25-550. In Board service, the diploma holder was initially recruited only as Supervisor II Grade (now) Junior Engineer II Grade and then promoted as Supervisor I Grade (now) Junior Engineer I Grade according to seniority subject to passing of E. D. test and based on suitability and then appointed as Assistant Engineer (now Assistant Executive Engineer) after following the ratio of 3:1 between the Degree and Diploma holders. It is seen that the appropriate equal scale of pay operated in Board for the post of supervisor I Grade (now Junior Engineer I Grade) was (Rs. 300-25-650). As such, he may be absorbed as Supervisor I Grade (now Junior Engineer I Grade) in the Board as on vesting date and the inter-se-seniority may be fixed with Board Engineers below Thiru S. V. Eswaran and above Thiru K. Mohammed Ali who joined as Junior Engineers I Grade on 1-2-66 and 9-2-68 respectively.

20. Subject to the modifications indicated in para 19 above, other recommendations of the One Man Commission in regard to fixation of Inter-se-seniority of the sixteen erstwhile Electrical Undertaking Officers with the Engineers of the Board are accepted over-ruling all the objections.

21. It is hereby ordered that the 21 Officers of the erstwhile Electrical Undertakings working in the Technical side be regularly absorbed in the service of the Board in the categories noted against each as detailed in Annexure-I to these proceedings.

22. The inter-se-seniority of the 21 absorbed erstwhile Electrical Undertaking Officers with the Board Engineers, based on the question of posts indicated in Annexure-I, shall be as detailed against each in Annexure-II to these proceedings.

23. If any employee (serving/retired) is aggrieved by the absorption and inter-se-seniority ordered in Annexures-I and II to these proceedings, he may prefer an appeal to the Board within one month from the date of these proceedings.

2. On receipt of the report of the enquiry officer, the disciplinary authority will examine it carefully. After satisfying itself that the Government servant has been given reasonable opportunity to defend himself, the disciplinary authority will record its findings in respect of each article of charge saying whether, in its opinion, it stands proved or not. If the disciplinary authority disagrees with the findings of the enquiry officer, or any article of charge, it will, while recording its own findings, also record reasons for disagreement. Reason need not, however, be given if the disciplinary authority agrees with the enquiry officer.

3. According to G.O. Ms. No. 405, Personnel & Administrative Reforms (Per. N) Department, dt. 19-9-90 if the competent authority proposes to impose any major punishment on the person charged, it shall, before making an order imposing such punishment furnish to him a copy of the report of the enquiry or personal hearing or both, as the case may be, and call upon him to submit his further representation, if any, within a reasonable time not exceeding 15 days. The position whether the disciplinary authority should communicate the reasons for his disagreement with the findings of the enquiry officer to the person charged along with the report of the enquiry officer while calling for further representation has been examined by the Government.

4. In Prakash Rao (B.S.) Vs. State of Andhra Pradesh and another (1959 (1) LLJ P. 560), the High Court of Andhra Pradesh among others has held as follows:—

“It is only in cases where the disagreement is to the detriment or prejudice of the officer that he should be given an opportunity to put forward his case in regard to the charge over which there is difference of opinion nor is it necessary for the Government to state reasons for its agreement with the findings of the Tribunal. Such an obligation is cast on the Government only when it is unable to agree with the conclusions of the Tribunal...”.

In view of the above, I am directed to state that the disciplinary authority should communicate the reasons for any disagreement on the findings of the enquiry officer, to the person charged along with a copy of the enquiry report while calling for further representation from him where it is proposed to impose a major penalty. However, in case only a minor penalty is awarded, such report with reasons for any disagreement may be communicated to the person charged at the time of communicating final orders.

5. All Departments of Secretariat and all Heads of Department are therefore requested to follow the above instructions scrupulously while dealing with the disciplinary proceedings in future.

ORDER :

After considering the recommendations of the Tamil Nadu Second Backward Classes Commission headed by Thiru J. A. Ambasankar, the Government published three lists of socially and educationally backward Classes for the purpose of reservation under Articles 15(4) and 16(4) of the Constitution. A comprehensive list of Backward Classes including the Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities was approved in G. O. Ms. No. 1564 Social Welfare Department dated 30—7—85. A separate list of Most Backward Classes and that of Denotified Communities were approved in G. O. Ms. No. 1566 Social Welfare Department dated 30—7—85 and G. O. Ms. No. 1567 Social Welfare Department dated 30—7—85 respectively. Government also declared the Converts to Christianity from any Hindu Backward Class Community as Backward Class in G. O. Ms. No. 558 Social Welfare Department dated 24—2—86.

2. Under Clause (a) of section 3 of the Tamil Nadu Backward Classes, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Reservation of seats in Educational Institutions and of appointments or posts in the Services under the State) Act, 1993 (Tamil Nadu Act 45 of 1994) the Government have to notify in the **Tamil Nadu Government Gazette**, the list of Backward Classes of citizens who are socially and educationally backward including the Most Backward Classes and the Denotified Communities as Backward Classes of citizens. Accordingly, the following Notification containing the lists of Backward Classes of citizens will be published in the **Tamil Nadu Government Gazette**, Extraordinary dated the 19—7—94.

Notification

A certificate from the Tahsildar to this effect will have to be produced.
- (ii) When a dependant of the family of the deceased Government servant was employed even before the death of the Government servant and was living separately without extending any help to the family, then the case of other eligible dependant will be considered.
- (iii) A married daughter who is deserted by her husband and living with the family of the deceased Government servant and widowed or divorced daughter living with the family may be considered, if the widow of the deceased Government Servant gives her consent in writing.

2. Following the Government order dt. 16-7-93 the Board in its Permanent B.P. (Ch.) No. 330 (Adm. Br.) dt. 2-11-93 has issued orders to be made applicable to the T.N.E.B.

Under Clause 17.02 of Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity, under the heading 'Installation of Capacitors, at the end of para 1, the following may be added as para 2 and 3.'

"In respect of services where inadequate Capacitor is found, the compensation charges may be levied by adopting the following formula."

Compensation Charges = $\frac{A-B}{A} \times 10\%$ of Current Consumption charges for preceding two assessment periods ie. four months.

Where 'A' = Rating of the Capacitor required to be installed.

'B' = Rating of the Capacitor actually found healthy during inspection.

In respect of services where the Capacitors provided are inadequate and at the same time some of them are defective, in addition to levying compensation charges as above, the consumer will be given one month notice to rectify the defective Capacitors or replace the Capacitors failing which the supply will be disconnected. The service connection will be reconnected only after the defective Capacitors are rectified or replaced and adequate Capacitors are installed.

Sub : Assessment of compensation charges for violations as per Clause 5—Schedule Part I of Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity—Consumption during the preceding six months—reckoning the period of six months—Instructions—Issued.

The Compensation Charge for violations covered under items (i) to (v) & (vii) of Clause 2—Schedule—Part I of Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity, shall be assessed as per the formula stipulated in Clause 5 of the same schedule.

The component "a" in the above formula shall be the "Total consumption recorded during the preceding period of six months or from the date of service connection whichever period is less.

The compensation charge shall be based on the six months' consumption in cases where the service is more than six months old as on date of detection of violation.

It has been reported that the field Officers in different areas adopt two different methods to arrive at the consumption for the back period of six months.

In Method I, the preceding period of six months is reckoned exactly from the date of detection of violation, whereas in Method II the preceding period of 6 months is assumed to be the same as the three "Bi-months" (either odd or even months depending on the group of the individual case) preceding the month in which the violation is detected, and the compensation charge is calculated according to the six months consumption so arrived at in each method.

In both the methods, the spirit of the above clause (viz.) to levy compensation charges for six months consumption to the maximum, is kept up and hence both of them may be correct, irrespective of the methods adopted in them for reckoning the back period of six months and its consumption.

However, the Method-I would appear to attempt at too much meticulousness than what is necessary for the purpose. Whereas the Method II would appear to be simple and acceptable as it utilises directly the preceding three Bi-monthly consumption for the calculation of the compensation charge and it does not require the calculation of proportionate consumption for certain number of days, which is required to be calculated in Method I.

In view of the above and in order to have uniformity in assessment of compensation charges for violations, the field officers are hereby informed that they may adopt the Method II in preference to Method I, in future, for assessment of compensation charge indicated in Clause 5—Schedule—Part I of the Terms and Conditions of Supply of Electricity.

In the para 3 of the Permanent B.P. (F.B.) No. 136 dated 13—6—91, it has been stated that in case of conversion from single phase to three phase, the difference in development charges may be collected provided the initial development charges were paid while availing Single phase service.

The Superintending Engineer/Trichy Electricity Distribution Circle/North has Sought for clarification on whether the difference in Development charges if any have to be collected in respect of services effected after 15—6—91.

Based on certain Audit point, the Superintending Engineer/Trichy Electricity Distribution Circle North has also sought for clarification on whether development charges have to be collected in respect of Tariff changes ordered for services which were effected prior to 15—6—91.

After examining the above, it is instructed that the instructions issued in Para 3 of the Permanent B.P. (F.B.) No. 136 dated 13—6—91 may be applied to all the Single phase services which got converted into three phase on or after 15—6—91 and the full development charges for three phase have to be collected in case the same was not collected for Single phase service.

It is also instructed that the orders issued in Permanent B.P. (F.B.) No. 136 dated 13—6—91 need not be enforced for Name Transfer.

In case of Tariff change the orders issued in Circular Memo. No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE. 2/D 231/94 dated 20—7—94 may be followed for all services for which tariff change was effected on or after 15—6—91.

In its letter under reference cited, the Board Office Audit Branch had suggested to provide in the estimate 10% on the cost of materials required for 'DCW' works to cover the cost of escalation as estimates for some of the 'DCW' are prepared before the issue of cost-data for the current year.

After examining the above suggestion, the following instructions are issued for guidance.

1) The estimate for Deposit Contribution works may be prepared with the available current year cost-data or the previous year cost-data if the current year cost data is not issued. A revised estimate may be prepared on completion of works, based on latest cost-data and got sanctioned from the competent authority.

2) Before collecting the deposit contribution from the intending consumers/applicant an undertaking may be obtained to the effect that the difference in the original estimated cost and the cost of the revised estimate prepared after actual completion of Deposit Contribution Works as per the current year latest cost data is payable by the consumer/applicant on an advice from the Board.

3) With the concurrence of the consumer such payment may be added to the CC bills of the service connections available in the name of the intending applicant. If no service connection is available in the name of the intending applicant the payment may be included in the CC bills of the service connection which is serving power supply to that applicant, without detrimental to the interest of the Board.

4) If no other means is available to recover the difference in cost of estimates, then only a provision of 10% may be made in the original estimate itself. The excess payment if any found on completion of works arises, then it may be refunded to that consumer/applicant.

All Officers of the Distribution area may ascertain the intending applicant/consumer's status with respect to the items 3 and 4 above on receipt of application from them.

In the Government Order Sixth read above, orders were issued exempting the Units of Paper, Textiles, Chemical and Sugar Industries which generate energy using their captive self-generating sets,

from the levy of Electricity Tax on the consumption of Electricity under the Tamil Nadu Electricity (Taxation on Consumption) Act, 1962, irrespective of the fuel they use for a period of one year from 1—8—93.

2. While examining the question of extending the above concession after 31—7—93, it was decided to continue to extend this concession for further period of one year from 1—8—93 and to constitute a Committee to go into the following questions :

- (1) Whether the above concession may be restricted to five years for a new set of captive generators.
- (2) The amount of revenue that would be generated by accepting the above.
- (3) To classify the kind of process/fuel used in captive generation.
 - (a) LSHS/LDO/HFO/Coal — all petro products and fossil fuels.
 - (b) Waste heat recovery.
 - (c) Process Waste — bagasse, straw etc.
 - (d) Non-conventional but renewable energy sources like Solar, Wind etc.

A Committee was also constituted accordingly, in the Government order Seventh read above.

3. In the meantime, the President, SIPCOT Industries Association has requested for permanent exemption from the levy of tax to the self-generated electrical energy from captive generator.

4. The extension of the concession ordered in the Government Order Sixth read above expired on 31—7—94. The Government examined the question of extending the concession for a further period of One Year from 1—8—94, pending receipt of the report by the Committee mentioned in para-2 above and have decided to extend the above concession for a further period of one year with effect from 1—8—94.

5. The following notification will be published in an extra-ordinary Gazettee of Tamil Nadu Government dated 4—11—94.

6. This order issued with the concurrence of the Finance Department vide its U.O. No. 3581/FS/P/Fin./Dated 25—7—94.

20.B. 7 Small, Medium and Large Scale Industries registered within Tamil Nadu are eligible for quantity/price preference as per Board's orders issued from time to time.

(i) a. Small Scale Units including tiny sector units registered in Tamilnadu will be given 15 (fifteen) percent price preference vis-a-vis medium/large industrial units and Small Scale Industries units registered in other States.

b. Medium/large scale units located within the State will be given 5 (five) percent price preference vis-a-vis units located outside the State.

c. Co-operative Institutions of Tamil Nadu shall be entitled to a price preference of 5% for products directly manufactured by them vis-a-vis medium/large industries. As against small scale industries, they shall be on the same footing.

(ii) The price preference should be worked out on ex-factory price only.

(iii) If the lowest acceptable price is quoted by on industrial unit within the State, no price preference need be allowed over it to any small, medium or large scale industry located within the State.

In superceeding the orders issued in the Board's proceedings cited, the Board now directs that the total Consultancy Services may be offered by the Board to the Private Wind Farm Developers involving the following works.

- (i) Site selection.
- (ii) Survey and soil test.
- (iii) Micrositing.
- (iv) Preparation of feasibility report.
- (v) Preparation of Tender specification.
- (vi) Floating of Tenders, Tender evaluation and making recommendation.
- (vii) Assisting in getting the loan from the financial Institutions such as IREDA etc.
- (viii) Grid interface studies.
- (ix) Design & detailed Engineering.
- (x) Project Management Services.
- (xi) Inspection of equipments.
- (xii) Supervision of civil works.
- (xiii) Technical Co-ordination in obtaining CEIG approval.
- (xiv) Supervision of Testing and commissioning.

2. The Board directs that the total Consultancy works should be offered to the companies who are putting up wind mills within Tamil Nadu only. The total Consultancy Services charges, will be as below :

- (i) 0.75% of the project cost for wind farm projects upto 5 MW capacity.
- (ii) 0.6% of the project cost for wind farm projects more than 5 MW and upto 10 MW capacity.
- (iii) 0.5% of the project cost for wind farm projects more than 10 MW and upto 20 MW capacity.
- (iv) The charges will be fixed on negotiation for wind farm projects more than 20 MW capacity.

If the wind farm developer want to put up wind farms at two different sites, then the capacity of the projects at each site should be treated separately for arriving at the Consultancy charges based on the above rates.

3. The Board also directs that the Consultancy Service charges of the Board on daily basis may also be increased from Rs. 2170/- to 3000/- (Rupees Three thousand only) per person within Tamil Nadu and from 2170/- to Rs. 5000/- (Rupees Five thousand only) per person out side Tamil Nadu apart from the T.A. and D.A. of the Board's officers deputed for Consultancy works.

4. The Board also directs that the existing Consultancy charges of (i) 0.25% of the project cost for identification of sites and preparation of feasibility report and (ii) 0.25% of the project cost for preparation of specification for the procurement of wind mill equipments, tender analysis and making recommendation may be continued for such a those wind farm developers who do not require total Consultancy services. The order will take effect from the date of issue of this Proceedings.

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Establishment of Generating Stations in Tamil Nadu Under Private Sector—Transmission System for power evacuation—Scope of works to be done by the TNEB and Private Generating Companies—Approval Accorded.

Proceedings :

1. Presently, all the generation schemes in Tamil Nadu, other than those under Central Sector, are owned and executed by the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board. Any generation scheme should have a matching transmission scheme for evacuation of power into the grid. As per the practice followed so far, the demarcation between the generation scheme and the associated transmission scheme will be as below :

- (i) The generation scheme will include the generating plant and machinery proper as well as the switch yard. The switch yard will consist of the step up transformers, EHV bus bar arrangement, auto transformers if any, transmission line bays with the associated switch gears etc.
- (ii) The transmission system will include only the transmission lines and bay extensions with switchgear at the far end sub-stations where the lines will terminate. As such, the transmission system of a generating station will not include any switchgear at the switchyard of the generating station.

2. As both the generation and transmission schemes were under the control of TNEB only, no difficulty/problem arose even in case of overlapping of certain works between a generation scheme and a transmission scheme.

3. Under the liberalised economic policy introduced by the Government of India, a no. of generating stations are proposed to be established in Tamil Nadu under private sector. Since TNEB is already owning a vast transmission network in the State, all the power generated in the private generating stations has to be evacuated into the TNEB network only by constructing suitable transmission system. Since the private generating companies will confine their activities to the generating stations only, a clear demarcation is necessary regarding the scope of work to be done by the private generating company and TNEB in respect of the works to be done in the switchyard of the generating station and the power evacuation transmission system.

4. The Board, after careful consideration, approves the following :

- (i) The TNEB will construct and own only the transmission lines proposed for power evacuation from the switchyard of the private generating station and the terminal bays and the switchgear etc. at the far-end substations. Wherever necessary TNEB will co-ordinate with other agencies like POWER GRID.
- (ii) The private generating company will execute all the works in the switchyard including transmission line bays (with switchgear), interconnecting transformers, if any, etc.
- (iii) TNEB will furnish to the private generating company, details such as the voltage to which the power has to be stepped up, no. of transmission line bays (with necessary switchgear), no. of interconnecting transformers, if any, to be provided etc.
- (iv) The operation of the switchgear controlling the power evacuation transmission lines and the interconnecting transformers in the switchyard will be under the control of TNEB. For this purpose the private generating company will construct a separate control room with all necessary equipments, in the premises of the generating station and hand over the same to the TNEB.

4. The above arrangements shall be insisted upon in respect of Neyveli Zero unit and Pillai Perumal Nallur Gas Turbine Power Projects, for which power purchase agreements have already been signed, as on date.
