VI. Fixation of Pay in Selection Grade Posts :

In Memo. No. 21504/C2/92-2 dt. 4-3-'95, the Board has ordered that the pay of the employees appointed to the Selection Grade posts from the ordinary grade posts shall be fixed with reference to orders in para 2 of B.P. Ms. (FB) No. 10, Secretariat Branch dt. 2-2-'87. The orders in para 2 of the B.P. will take effect from 1-12-'84 notionally with monetary benefit from 1-4-'86.

VII. Departmental Enquiries — Grant of Allowance to complainants and non official witness :

In B.P. (CH) No. 46, Secretariat Branch dt. 2-3-'95, the Board has granted a daily allowance of Rs. 25/- to the complainants and non official witnesses for attending departmental enquiries.

VIII. Collection of Registration Fees for shifting of HT/LT services :

In B.P. (CH) No. 66, Tech. Branch dt. 7-3-'95, the Board has ordered collection of registration charges for shifting of HT/LT services as per new service connections as specified in B.P. No. 94 dt. 30-3-'94.

IX. Registration Fees for Street Light applications :

In B.P. (CH) No. 67, Tech. Branch dt. 7-3-'95, it has been clarified that registration fees for street light applications should be collected per service after investigation and then the application registered.

X. Agricultural Service — Revised self Financing Scheme SFS (R) :

In Memo. No. SE/RE & I (D)/RE2/D/FSFS (Revised)/DNo. 253/95 dt. 20-3-'95 the Board has introduced the revised Self Financing Scheme (SFS) (R)) based on Government G. O. Ms. No. 34/Energy (A2) Department dt. 14-2-'95 according to which the agriculturalists can pay Rs. 10,000/- for availing pumpset connection with a tariff of Rs. 250/- per HP per year or metered service at 50 paise per unit at the option of the consumer.

XI. Delegation of Powers to S. Es/Generation Circle :

In B. P. (FB) No. 12, Sectt. Branch dt. 22-3-'95, the Board has delegated powers to S. Es/Generation Circles as below :

- (a) To accord administrative approval upto Rs. 10,000/- for Jungle clearance estimates as against the existing powers of Rs. 1000/-.
- (b) To accord administrative approval for the maintenance and repairs of roads estimates upto Rs. 50,000/-.

XII. Development Charges For Temporary Supply :

In Memo. No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE2/F IC15/D71/95 dt. 23—3—'95, it has been ordered that in respect of temporary supply, development charges should be collected based on the purpose for which temporary supply is made. The development charges for motive power and heating may be collected at 25% of the development charges applicable for tariff IV and for lighting and combined installation of lights and fans, mixed load of lights and power exhibition 25% of the development charges applicable for tariff IX may be collected.

XIII. NMTPP — First Stage Commissioning — Incentive :

In B. P. (FB) No. 15, Secretariat Branch dt. 31—3—'95 the Board has granted one months Pay + DA of October '94 as incentive to employees of NMTPP subject to the conditions laid down in the B. P.

XIV. Shift Operation Special Pay to A. E. E. of HT Control room :

In B. P. (CH) No. 71, Secretariat Branch dt. 30—3—'95, the Board has ordered that the A. E. Es. of HT control room at Madras be granted shift operation special pay at the rates in force.

XV. D. A. During the Period of Re—employment :

In B. P. (Ch.) No. 69, Secretariat Branch dt. 28—3—'95, the Board has ordered that the periodical increase in DA and other allowances be given during the period of reemployment based on the pay last drawn at the time of retirement.

Srinivasan, Chief Engineer/Electrical relieved of his duties - Posting not given - Thiru R. Sengottaian, promoted as Chief Engineer/Electrical - W.P. filed by Thiru R. Srinivasan - Above promotion stayed by the High Court - Stay order vacated by the High Court subsequently - Matter placed before the Board - Amendment to the orders of promotion - Issued

In B.P. Ms. No.591 (Admn.) Dated 30.9.1981 and in B.P. Ms. No.629 (Adm.) Dated 22.10.1981, the Board issued orders absorbing 21 Supervisory/Covenanted Officers on technical side and also fixing their inter-se-seniority as indicated in the Annexures therein. Thiru R. Srinivasan, one of the Officers of the Salem Erode Electricity Distribution Company was working as Engineer-in-Charge at the time of acquisition of that Private Electrical Undertaking along with other Private Electrical Undertakings. He was absorbed as Assistant Divisional Engineer in B.P. Ms. No.591 (AB) dated 30.9.1981 and his inter-se-seniority was fixed in between the two Assistant Divisional Engineers of the Board. Aggrieved by this fixation of inter-se-seniority, he filed W.P. No.11437/81 before the High Court. The High Court, in its judgement dated 25.7.1990, quashed the above orders and directed the Board to absorb him in the post of Divisional Engineer as on 30.9.1981 with effect from 1.12.73 and to work out the monetary benefits payable to him and also fix his seniority appropriately and give him promotion on such absorption. The Board challenged the said order in W.A. No.519/91. This was dismissed by the Division Bench of the High Court, on 17.8.1992. As directed by High Court, in its judgement dated 25.7.1990, Thiru R. Srinivasan was absorbed as Divisional Engineer as on 1.12.1973 and he was given consequential temporary promotion as Chief Engineer by Chairman on 8.1.1993 pending fixation of inter-se-seniority in the categories of Superintending Engineer and Chief Engineer. He joined as Chief Engineer/Technical Audit on 11.1.1993. This promotion was challenged by Thiru R. Sengottaian and others before the High Court in W.P. Nos.1826 to 1831 of 1993. These petitions were disposed of by the High Court on 27.7.1993 by directing the Board to prepare gradation list indicating the position of Thiru R. Srinivasan in the categories of Executive Engineer, Superintending Engineer and Chief Engineer with the Board Officers, give opportunity to raise objections and issue final orders after examining objections, received, if any. Thiru R. Sengottaian and others filed Writ Appeals (Nos. 1001 to 1007 of 1993) challenging the above orders of the High Court and the show cause notice issued by the Board. While disposing these Writ Appeals, the Division Bench of the High Court had directed the Board on 4.3.1994 to fix equation of posts of all the Private Electrical Undertakings and also to fix inter-se-seniority of the 22 Officers of the Board, within a period of two months after examining the representations received, if any, on the equation of posts and fixation of inter-se-seniority. Based on the orders of the High Court referred to above, Thiru R. Srinivasan was relieved from the post of Chief Engineer on 27.4.1994 and no posting was given to him pending fixation of his seniority in the post of Superintending Engineer and Chief Engineer.

2. In order to arrive at a decision on the equation of posts and inter-se-seniority, Thiru R. Subramanian, I.A.S. (Retd.) was appointed as One Man Commission. The One Man Commission gave his recommendation on 13.9.1994. The report of the One Man Commission was examined and the contents of report were communicated to all the Engineers of the Board including the absorbed Engineers. After examining the objections received from them, orders in regard to equation of posts and fixation of inter-se-seniority were issued in (Per.) B.P. (Ch.) No.313 (SB) Dated 11.11.1994.

3. The above orders were challenged by the T.N.E.B. Engineers' Association and Thiru R. Sengottaian and other in W.P. Nos. 21416/94 and 419/95 on the ground that the Board is the authority competent to issue the said orders. The High Court directed that the report of the One Man Commission had to be given to all the parties concerned and to be made available to all, receive objections within 3 weeks from 18.1.1995 and to issue orders by the Board within 8 weeks from 18.1.1995. Accordingly, printed copies of the report of the One Man Commission were furnished to all the parties in the W.P.s etc. and copies were also communicated to all the Chief Engineers/Superintending Engineers with a request to make it available for perusal by all the Engineers (Electrical) so as to raise objections, if any, on the report of the One Man Commission. The time limit to raise

objections has been extended by the High Court till 10.3.1995 and the Board has to issue orders on or before 15.4.1995.

4. Thiru R. SRINIVASAN, who was relieved from the post of Chief Engineer on 27.4.1994, filed a W.M.P. in W.P. No.1683/95 before the High Court challenging the orders of promotion given to Thiru R. Sengottaian on 27.1.1995 and requested stay of the operation of the promotion order. On 7.2.1995, Hon'ble Justice Jayasimha Babu had stayed the orders issued in (Per.) B.P. (Ch.) No.24 (SB) dated 27.1.95 promoting Thiru R. Sengottaian, as Chief Engineer/Electrical.

5. Thiru R. Sengottaian filed a W.M.P. before the High Court requesting to vacate the stay ordered by Hon'ble Justice Jayasimha Babu. This case came up for hearing on 10.2.1995 and the Hon'ble Justice Shivappa has issued orders vacating the stay granted on the ground that it has become infructuous since Thiru R. Sengottaian has already joined as Chief Engineer/Electrical on 1.2.1995.

6. The Division Bench of the High Court, in its Judgement dated 4.3.1994 has observed as follows:-

"The Board shall in the first instance fix the equation of posts, by applying the relevant principles laid down by the Supreme Court in the various decisions referred to earlier. On the basis of such equation of posts, the fitment to the 22 Officers of the erstwhile undertakings and the fixation of their seniority vis-a-vis the Officers of the Board shall be done after giving due opportunity to the concerned persons to make their respective representations. The entire work shall be completed within a period of two months from this date. It is only on the basis of such seniority list, the relevant orders of promotion to the higher posts with reference to the parties to these proceedings shall be made".

In view of these observations of the Division Bench of the High Court, which is binding on the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board, the Board has been advised to modify the orders of promotion given in (Per.) B.P. (Ch.) No.24 (SB) dt. 27.1.1995 in respect of Thiru R. Sengottaian and the earlier promotion to other Superintending Engineers who are parties to these proceedings.

7. The above matter was placed before the Board. The Board, in its 721st meeting held on 24.2.1995, had resolved as follows:-

"This subject was discussed at length and it was decided to issue an amendment to (Per.) B.P. (Ch.) No.24 (SB) dt. 27.1.1995 indicating that promotion given to Thiru R. Sengottaian as Chief Engineer is purely on temporary basis and it is subject to outcome of fixing of inter-se-seniority pending with the Board and also subject to outcome of W.P. No.1683/95 filed by Thiru R. Srinivasan. The Board has also decided that all promotion made after 4.3.1994 may be treated as temporary and it is subject to the outcome of fixing of inter-se-seniority pending with the Board and also subject to outcome of W.P. No.1683/95 filed by Thiru R. Srinivasan. The Board has also directed that, in future, promotion to the post of Chief Engineer may be made on temporary basis only".

8. Accordingly, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board hereby directs that regular promotion given to the following Superintending Engineers/Electrical as Chief Engineers/Electrical, after 4.3.1994 in the B.Ps. noted against each, shall be treated as temporary promotion under "Regulation 106 of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Service Regulations" and they are subject to the outcome of fixing of inter-se-seniority of the 21 erstwhile Private Electrical Undertaking Officers with the Board Officers, pending with the Board and also subject to outcome of the W.P. No.1683/95 filed by Thiru R. Srinivasan:-

The Government, in the Government Order second cited, have issued orders, exempting the Government servants/Officers including employees of Public Sector Undertakings/Corporations proceeding on Hajj Pilgrimage to Saudi Arabia through the Tamil Nadu State Hajj Committee on "Pilgrimage Pass", from obtaining "No Objection Certificate" from the Heads of Departments concerned.

2. Following the orders of Government, it is hereby ordered that, the employees/officials of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board who proceed on Hajj Pilgrimage to Saudi Arabia through the Tamil Nadu State Hajj Committee on "Pilgrimage Pass" be exempted from obtaining "No Objection Certificate" from the Board as required under Regulation 27A of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Employees Conduct Regulations. Sub: Office Procedure - Information on official matters - Practice of contacting sections direct for information - To be discouraged - Instructions - Issued.

It has come to notice that some employees of the Board, trade Union office bearers and even outsiders who have some grievances resort to the practice of contacting the sections concerned direct, for eliciting information. This practice should be stopped forthwith.

2. As per para 16-19(iii) of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Office Manual 1991, Staff of the Board are precluded from divulging to outsiders or to any other member of the establishment, any information (whether expressly marked confidential or not) that may have come to their knowledge in their official capacity. All the staff, must be constantly on their guard against the leakage of any official information, whatsoever. If any member of the establishment is approached by any one, not officially entitled to do so, either inside or outside the office,

in regard to any matter, which is or will be dealt with in the office, he should refuse to see him but refer him politely to the higher officer concerned and if the person persists, he should be warned that the fact of his visit will be reported to the higher officer and a report should be made accordingly at the very earliest opportunity.

3. As per para 16-19 (vi) of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Office Manual 1991, the employees of the Board are also prohibited from seeing outsiders, at any place in connection with official matters pending in Board in which such people are personally interested. Also, as per para 16-19 (Vii), if any employee has any grievance, he may represent it to the higher officer in person or he may present it in writing to the head of the office through the immediate officer, if the latter is incharge of the establishment.

4. All the Chief Engineers/Superintending Engineers etc. are instructed to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the subordinate officials for strict compliance.

(The judgement of the Court was delivered by the Hon'ble CHIEF JUSTICE)

ORDER

This appeal is preferred against the order dated 14.11.1994 passed by the learned single Judge in W.P. No.13733 of 1994. In the writ petition, the petitioner sought for quashing the Official Memorandum dt. 4.12.1992 and also sought for a Mandamus to restore the Official Memorandum dt. 21.5.1985. Both these Official Memorandums contain the guide lines for the purpose of effecting transfers of the employees of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board. The learned single Judge has quashed the Official Memorandum dated 4.12.1992 on the ground that the Mettur Power Thermal Station and Mettur Power Thermal Project should not have been treated as one and that the earlier Memorandum dated 21.5.1985 is more reasonable than the latter one.

2. First of all, we would like to make it clear that these Official Memorandum being the guidelines for the purpose of effecting transfers, the same do not confer any enforceable right on the employees of the Board and they are intended to ensure that the authorities empowered to effect transfers do not exercise their powers arbitrarily. For this is an established legal position. In this regard it is sufficient to refer to the decision in UNION OF INDIA AND OTHERS - vs- S.L. ABBAS (1993) 4 SCC 357. In paragraph 6 of the said decision, it has been clearly stated thus:

"..... All he says is that he should not be transferred because his wife is working in Shillong, his children are studying there and also because his health had suffered a set back sometime ago. **He relies upon certain executive instructions issued by the Government in that behalf. Those instructions are in the nature of guidelines. They do not have statutory force**".

Again in paragraph 7 of the said decision, it has been stated thus:

"..... The guidelines say that as far as possible, husband and wife must be posted at the same place. The said guidelines however does not confer upon the Government employee a legally enforceable right".

In the instant case, the Board has issued the impugned memorandum in order to meet a particular contingency. It is stated in the very same memorandum that it would be applicable only when the transfer is to be effected by reason of abolition of posts. The relevant portion of the official memorandum states that the juniormost in the combined two circles shall be transferred out. The grievance of the respondent is that whereas in the case of Class III and IV, seniormost employees should be transferred and when it comes to the inferior category employees, the juniormost should be transferred. It is highly inequitous and opposed to the earlier memorandum, which is found as reasonable by the learned single Judge. If such a contention is to be countenanced, then the Electricity Board - the Employer, will have no power to effect transfer of its own employees. There is no right vested in the writ petitioner to contend that he is not transferable. For the purpose of transfer, certain guidelines are adopted. We may also point out that the impugned guidelines has not affected the petitioner in any manner. It has been brought to our notice that state-wide seniority list is prepared for the purpose of effecting promotions and that the petitioner is also included in the panel of official to be promoted. The combined seniority of persons serving in the Mettur in M.T.P.P. and M.T.P.S. is only for the purpose of effecting transfers as a result of abolition of posts.

3. It may also be noticed in this connection another decision of the Supreme Court reported in N.K. SINGH - vs - UNION OF INDIA AND OTHERS (1994 (6) SCC 98), wherein it has been specifically observed that -

"the transfer of the appellant from CBI to BSF has no adverse consequence on the service career and prospects of the appellant and the transfer of the appellant to BSF was in an equivalent post and the appellant was given two promotions there after in due course".

Again in paragraph 24 of the said decision, it has been observed thus:

"The private rights of the appellant being unaffected by the transfer, he would have been well advised to leave the matter to those in public life who felt aggrieved by his transfer to fight their own battle in the forum available to them. . . . **Challenge in courts of a transfer when the carrer prospects remain unaffected and there is no detriment to the government servant must be eschewed and interference by courts should be rare, only when a judiciously manageable and permissible ground is made out. This litigation was ill-advised**".

When it is not possible to hold that the impugned memorandum is in any way opposed to any of the rights of the petitioner, muchless the fundamental right, it is not open to the court to substitute its reasons to hold that the earlier memorandum is reasonable than the later one, as long as the later one lies within the power of the -appellant-Board. Hence, we are of the view that the learned single Judge is not justified either in quashing the impugned memorandum or interfering with the transfer. Accordingly the Writ Appeal is allowed. The order dt. 14.11.1994 passed in W.P. No.13733/94 by the learned single Judge is set aside. The Writ Petition is dismissed. No costs.

2. The Collector of Chengalpattu M.G.R. District screened 270 fishermen village wise i.e. Kattukuppam, Sivanpadai, Thalankuppam and Uppupadagu Thozhilalar Sangam, Ennore Village who are starving without any employment since fishing could not be done due to the dredging of Ennore creek water by the N.M.T.P.P.

3. Number of meetings were conducted between the villagers, Revenue authorities and Board officials to solve the problems. Finally an amicable settlement is arrived in this matter to extend job opportunity to the above affected villagers one member from each family who have lost livelihood due to dredging operations by N.M.T.P.P. in the fishing areas.

4. In G.O.Ms. No.656 (Labour & Employment Department) dt. 29.6.78, Government issued orders to recruit without reference to employment exchange one member in each family which is displaced on account of acquisition of lands for any project, provided that the acquired land should have been the one or major source of substance of the family.

5. In Permanent B.P. (FB) No.3/Adm. Br./dt. 25.1.90 the Board has approved the proposal for giving employment assistance to one male member, in each family from whom lands have been acquired for construction of North Madras Thermal Power Project. It has also been ordered among other things that rehabilitation assistance including employment assistance be extended to 768 families and so far 767 persons were given employment assistance under this scheme.

6. After careful examination approval is accorded to provide job assistance the 270 Fishermen subject to satisfying the conditions in educational qualification and age etc. as fishing work is completely affected due to the dredging operation by N.M.T.P.P. in the fishing area.

According to rule 16 (2) of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules 1978 the authority issuing orders of substantive

appointment to a civil service or post is referred to in sub-rules (1) of the said rules shall along with such order require in writing the employee to exercise option under sub-rule within three months of the date of issue of such order or if he is on leave that day, within three months of his return from leave whichever is later and also bring to his notice the provisions of clause (a) in the said sub-rule. If no option is exercised within the period referred to in clause (a) the employee shall be deemed to have opted for clause (a) of sub-rule (1).

- (i) The Military pensioners when they are re-employed in the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board's Service or post seeking the benefit of past military service, shall be allowed to exercise option for counting of military service as a qualifying service within a period of one year from the date of joining Tamil Nadu Electricity Board's Service or post and that the amount of pension, gratuity etc. already received by such Tamil Nadu Electricity Board employees from the military authorities, shall be refunded to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board with simple interest at 6% from the date of their joining the civil service.
- (ii) In the case of military pensioners already re-employed in the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board's service or post prior to the date of issue of this order, shall be allowed to exercise option, for counting of military service as qualifying service along with Tamil Nadu Electricity Board's service or post, within a period of 6 months from the date of issue of this order. Sub: Energising Power Lines without PTCC approval — To be stopped — Regarding.

As per I. E. Act., 1910 and subsequent amendments, energisation approval of PTCC is mandatory, for energising any power line.

It is pointed out by telecommunication authorities that of late, the above mandatory regulation is violated and lines are energised inspite of objection by local Telecommunication Officials, especially in the wind farm areas, where private entrepreneurs are installing wind mills.

Telecommunication authorities have also pointed out that such violations greatly endangers their equipment safety and in particular the safety of the public.

Such practice of energisation of power lines without intimation to PTCC should be stopped forthwith, and it should be ensured that application for PTCC approval is made in advance, and approval obtained before energising the lines.

Electricity—Revision of tariff rates for supply of Electrical Energy to Municipal Licencees Collection of Low Power Factor Compensation charges and 100% Maximum Demand charges Approved.

1. Minutes of the 721st Meeting held on 24-2-95 (Item-23).

Proceedings :

The Government of Tamil Nadu in the G.O. Ms. No. 35, Energy (A2) Department dated 1-3-94 have ordered revision of tariff rates to all the consumers including the Municipal Licencees.

As per the above G.O. the average power factor of the consumer installation shall not be less than 0.90 lag and compensation charges at the rate indicated in the G.O. will be levied if the power factor is less than the stipulated limit with effect from 1-6-94.

As per the above G.O. the Maximum Demand charges for any month and at the point of supply shall be based on the KVA demand recorded in that month or 100% of the sanctioned demand whichever is higher will be collected.

But, the Licencees have requested to exempt them from the above compensation charges.

In the meantime Government have issued orders vide G.O. Ms. No. 156 (Municipal Administration & Water Supply Department) dated 10-6-94, that the Corporation/Municipal Electrical Undertakings be taken over by the Board.

In view of the above position the non-payment of the Low Power Factor compensation charges and the short fall in collection of demand charges will continue to remain as a liability until the finalisation of the compensation amount to be paid to the Municipalities.

After careful consideration of the circumstances, the Board orders that in respect of all Corporation/Municipal Electrical Undertakings except Coimbatore Corporation the non-payment of Low Power Factor compensation charges from 1-7-94 and short fall in demand charges effective from 7/94 monthly reading onwards as per the G.O. Ms. No. 35, Energy (A2) Department, dated 1-3-94 be adjusted from the compensation amount payable to the respective Corporation/Municipal Electrical Undertakings, consequent on the taking over of these Electrical Undertakings by Tamil Nadu Electricity Board.

However, the collection of Belated Payment Surcharge be limited upto the date of taking over of the Electrical Undertakings by the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board.

Based on G.O. cited at (1) above, instructions have been issued for adoption of G.O. for energisation of pumpsets under Revised Self Financing Scheme (SFS (Revised)) vide Member (Distribution) Memo. cited reference (2) above. Some of the field Superintending Engineers and

Chief Engineers (Distribution) are asking for working instructions for implementing the scheme. The subject has been examined and the following instructions are issued.

1. The scheme will be applicable to all the Agriculture service applications. The scheme is called Revised Self Financing Scheme (SFS (R)).
2. Under this scheme, Special priority would be given to the agricultural applicants who come forward to pay Rs. 10,000/- per service. Such applicants will also pay Rs. 250/- per H.P. per annum towards electricity consumption charges or metered tariff at the rate of 50 paise per KWH at the option of the consumer.
3. For the purpose of eliciting the willingness of the applicants for the above Revised scheme, arrangements shall be made to publicise the intimation in the notice Boards of Offices of Superintending Engineers / Electricity Distribution Circle, Executive Engineer/O&M, Asst. Executive Engineer/O&M and section offices and in the Government offices like Block Development office, District Development office, District Agriculture office and the Collectorate Office and also necessary slides may be arranged to be shown in local cinema theatre.
4. The agriculture applicants who are willing to avail the service connection through this scheme shall give a consent letter as per Form-I enclosed to this memo. and also to remit Rs. 500/- (Rupees Five hundred only) either by cash or by Demand Draft drawn in favour of Superintending Engineer/Tamil Nadu Electricity Board on a local Bank of the area. Receipt for the above sum will be issued at the section office. Then the section office will prepare the estimate in the order of priority of remittance of the deposit at the section office and obtain sanction of the competent authority. After sanction of estimate, the Executive Engineer/O & M shall issue 60 days notice of intimation, to remit the balance Rs. 9500/- either by cash or Demand Draft drawn in favour of Superintending Engineer/Tamil Nadu Electricity Board in the local bank of the area for which, when paid at the section office, a separate receipt will be issued to the applicant by the Inspector of Assessment. In case of the applicants who give consent and pay Rs. 500/- but do not remit the balance amount Rs. 9500/- within 60 days, the sum of Rs. 500/- will be forfeited. The date of remittance of the Rs. 9500/- (Rs. 10,000/- — Rs. 500/- = Rs. 9500) will be the date of priority for effecting supply. A separate priority register shall be maintained for this scheme both in section office and Division office.
5. The cases of applicants who are not willing to opt for this scheme shall be considered under normal priority.
6. The Superintending Engineers are requested to closely monitor the response under this scheme and intimate the number of applicants who come forward to avail supply under this scheme before 30—4—95 so that the target for special priority of one pole/mere service for 1995—96 could be fixed suitably.
7. A separate return indicating circlewise, number of parties paid Rs. 500/-, No. of parties for whom estimate prepared and intimated for paying balance Rs. 9500/-, No. of parties who have remitted the balance of Rs. 9,500/-, Total amount received, No. of services effected, cumulative total services effected under this Revised Self Financing Scheme by all the Chief Engineers (Distribution) may be sent on or before 5th of every month to Superintending Engineer/Rural Electrification & Improvements (Distribution) office.
8. Those who have already paid the estimate amount under old Self Financing Scheme but supply not yet effected have been necessarily be accounted in old Self Financing Scheme only.
9. For those who has remitted Rs. 500/- under the old Self Financing Scheme but not paid the estimate amount and 60 days notice has not expired, they can be given option to come over to the Revised Self Financing Scheme.

The Superintending Engineer/Coimbatore Electricity Distribution Circle/North in his letter dt. 4—1—95 cited under reference has requested clarification with regard to the rate at which development charges for temporary supply have to be levied since, as per the G.O. dt. 1—3—94 cited under reference (2) the temporary supply for lighting or combined installation of lights and fans, mixed load of lights and power, exhibition have been clubbed with Motive Power heating and a single flat rate of Rs. 3/- per KW Hour has been charged.

The above matter has been examined and the following clarifications are issued.

In the Permanent B.P. (FB) No. 136 dt. 13—6—91 the development charges have been fixed based on the purpose for which the supply is made and the load.

In the tariff notification effective from 1—3—94 though single flat rate has been fixed for temporary supply, the mode of supply, has not been changed (ie) Lighting or combined installation of lights and fans mixed load of lights and Power, exhibition, motive Power and heating.

Before collecting the development charges it may clearly decided the purpose for which temporary supply is made.

The development charges for motive Power and heating may be collected at 25% of development charges applicable for Tariff IV and for Lighting or Combined installation of lights and fans, mixed load of lights and power exhibition, 25% of the development charges applicable for Tariff IX may be collected.

ORDER :

In the Government Order first read above, orders were issued, among other things, that 17 posts of Assistant Electrical Inspectors be upgraded as Electrical Inspectors in addition to the existing 5 Electrical Inspectors at the District Headquarters of Madurai, Coimbatore, Trichy, Vellore and Madras. In paragraph 6 of the said Government Order the Chief Electrical Inspector to Government was directed to send proposals for issue of Notification the Government under Section 36 of the Indian Electricity Act, 1910 (Central Act IX of 1910) to appoint the Chief Electrical Inspector to Government, Senior Electrical Inspector and Electrical Inspectors as Statutory Electrical Inspectors for proper distribution of Power vested with the Chief Electrical Inspector to Government. Accordingly, to ensure uniform implementation in the State as a whole, a draft notification was sent by the Chief Electrical Inspector to Government. The Government approved the said notification in the Government Order second read above.

2. In his latter fourth read above, the Chief Electrical Inspector to Government pointed out certain infirmities in the notifications issued in Government Order second read above. He had requested the Government to keep the notification approved in the Government Order, in abeyance. The Chief Electrical Inspector to Government was however informed that as a statutory notification had been issued in the Government Order second read above, it could not be kept in abeyance by issue of an executive order, that the said notification would be in force until it was superseded by another statutory notification or rescinded under the relevant statutory provisions, that until then the notification approved in the Government Order second read above would be in force and that it should be implemented. Regarding the proposals for modifying the provisions in the notification approved in the Government Order second read above, the Chief Electrical Inspector to Government was informed that the deficiencies and the difficulties, if any, can be explained and detailed proposals sent to the Government in due course.

3. In view of the directions of the Government in the Government letter fourth read above, the Chief Electrical Inspector to Government has sent a revised draft notification to be issued under Section 36 of the Indian Electricity Act 1910 (Central Act 18 of 1910) eliminating the lacuna and also the practical difficulties in the implementation of the existing notification approved in Government Order second read above. He has also requested that the notification approved in the Government Order second read above and published in the Public Works Department Notification No. II (2)/PWE/854/93 on page 218 of Part II Section 2 of the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette dated the 24th February 1993 may be superseded to remove the lacuna and difficulties expressed in his letter sixth read above, by issue of a fresh Notification. He had sent revised draft Notification (I & II) for approval of the Government.

4. The Government have carefully examined the draft revised notification sent by the Chief Electrical Inspector to Government in the light of the lacuna and practical difficulties experienced by him and decided to issue a fresh notification for the purpose. The Works Manager, Government Central Press is requested to publish the Notification appended to this order in the next issue of the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette.
