VI. Application of Tariff in Respect of Rice Mill, Flour Mill Etc.,

It has been clarified in memo. No. SE/IEMC/EET/AEE1/AE2/LT IV/CR 02849/95 dt. 2—5—'95 that with effect from 1—2—'95, LT service relating to coffee grinding, Ice Factory, Body building unit, Saw Mill, Rice Mill, Flour Mill, Prawn Farming, Poultry Farming and battery charging unit may be charged under LT IV even if they undertake job work.

VII. Public Services—Enquiries/Investigation by DV & AC Against Retired Employees :-

In B.P.(FB) No. 19, Sectt. Branch dt. 25—4—'95, the Board has adopted Govt.Lr.No.17499/Per.N/94-1 dt. 1—8—'94 which empowers DV&AC to take up enquiries/investigation against retired employees of State owned companies/undertakings if the event took place within four years before such institutions.

VIII. H.B.A. — Inspection of Constructed Building :

In Memo.No. 20252-E2/95-1 dt. 5-5-'95 the Board has clarified that one A.E.E.(Civil)/TNEB nearer to the construction spot may be deputed to inspect on receipt of completion report from the loanee employee and they need not be insisted to furnish a certificate issued by an A.E.E.(Civil)/T.N.E.B.,

IX. H.B.A.—Sanction of Advance—Registration of Agreement :

In B.P. (CH) No. 108, Sectt. Branch dt. 2-5-'95. the Board has ordered the following in regard to registration of agreement between the employees of the Board and flat promotor.

If the ownership of the land is vested with the flat promotor, the agreement between the Board employees and flat promoters should be registered. If the promotor transfers the undivided interest in the land to the purchaser of a flat, and enters into a separate building agreement, in relation to the building/flat with the purchaser of the undivided interest of the land, the Board employees concerned who purchases an undivided interest in the land under a registered document should produce the said document along with the builder's agreement wherein the terms between the builder and the purchaser of the flat are entered into in writing. The builder's agreement need not be registered.

X. Marriage Advance — Enhancement :

In B.P. (CH) No. 110, Secretariat Branch dt. 4-5-'95, Board has enhanced the ceiling on the quantum of marriage advance to the employees as below with effect from 4-5-'95.

(i) For male employees and sons of employees	Rs. 6,000/-
(ii) For female employees and daughters of employees	Rs. 10,000/-

XI. Terms and Conditions of Supply — Amendment to Clause Clause 28.01 :

In B.P. (FB) No. 149, Technical Branch dt. 10-5-'95 the Board has amended clause 28.01 of the T & C of supply as below :-

"A consumer's request to disconnect the service connection temporarily upto a period of one year will be considered for bonafide reasons such as seasonal conditions, demolition, remodelling of building or alteration of electrical wiring in the building. The consumer will however have to pay the minimum monthly charges as provided in the tariff and in clause 18.02 during the period of disconnection :

XII. Extension of Supply for Construction Purposes where Already Permanent Supply Exists:

In memo No. 6398 /SE/IEMC/EE(T)/AEE1/AE2/CR1909/Temporary Supply/95 date 9-5-'95 it has been clarified that where a permanent supply given for domestic service is utilised for extension of building in the existing building such services may be charged under LT Tariff IX subject to the condition that domestic loads are predominant to the construction load. In other cases the instructions in memo.No. SE/IEMC/EE(T)/AEE/AE2/GO 35/Clarification/CR 02904/94-1 dt. 12-7-'94 have to be followed.

XIII. DCW—Refund of Advance Consequent on Non Availing of supply :

In memo.No. SE/IEMC/EE3/AEE1/F. Instructions/DCW/D230/95 dt. 22-5-'95 it has been clarified —

- the orders issued in B.P. (FB) No. 135 dt. 2-7-'93 regarding development charges are applicable to backed out applicants under DCW also.
- 5% of estimate amount subject to a minimum of Rs. 100- and a maximum of Rs. 2,500/- will be deducted from the deposit made by the party while refunding the amount in backed out cases prior to taking up work under DCW.

XIV. Motor Conveyance Advance — Delay in Purchase/Hypothecating Insuring—Delegation of Powers :

In B.P. (CH) No. 131, Sectt. Branch dt. 30-5-'95, the Board has delegated powers to the next higher authority to sanctioning authority to condone the delay due to genuine reasons and to grant extension of time for purchase/hypothecating Insurance of the vehicle purchased out of Board's loan.

In B. P. (FB) 121/20-12-94 second cited honorarium for attending excess over yardstick and vacant seat work has been fixed at Re. 1/- per effective service with a maximum ceiling limit of 375 services per assistant per month.

Several representations from the Superintending Engineers/Distribution Circles have been received expressing the difficulties in distributing the arrear works relating to excess over yardstick and vacant seat among the existing billing Assistants with the ceiling limit of 375 services per Assistant because of more number of vacancies in the Revenue Branch. Superintending Engineers have requested to lift the ceiling of 375 services per Assistant so as to allocate the arrear work among the willing assistant without any ceiling.

After considering the difficulties expressed by the various Superintending Engineers and after examining their suggestions the following orders are issued:

(i) To lift the ceiling of 375 services per Assistant per month, temporarily for three months where the staff express their willingness.

(ii) To utilise the services of the willing non-billing assistants and Accounts Supervisors of the Revenue Branches in clearing the pending works for extra remuneration.

The Superintending Engineers are therefore requested to distribute the arrear work, relating to Excess over yardstick and vacant seat among the willing billing Assistants/Non-Billing Assistants/Accounts Supervisor and arrange to get the work done at the earliest, on payment of Honorarium at Re. 1/- per effective service as ordered in B. P. (FB) No.121/20-12-94.

Orders were issued in the Board Proceedings first cited for enhancement of maternity leave from 2 months to 90 days and also restricting the leave to married women Board employees having three children. Orders were also issued in the Board's Memo. second cited that maternity leave may be allowed to married women Board employees for their third confinement also, if they are having two living children and no maternity leave is allowed for the confinement of the Board employee who is already having three living children. In the Board Proceeding third cited, orders were issued that the married woman Board employees having two living children shall be granted Maternity leave for the next confinement only if they give an undertaking that they would resort to sterilisation immediately after delivery and that if after delivery they fail to keep up their undertaking the Maternity leave granted shall be cancelled.

2. In the Board proceeding fourth cited orders were issued :—

- (i) that in the case of women Board employees with two living children, maternity leave of six weeks for natural abortion or abortion under Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act may be granted for two times with a condition to undergo sterilisation permanently for the grant of this leave for the second time,
- (ii) that in the case of women Board employees with one child, Maternity leave of six weeks for Natural abortion or abortion under Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act may be granted for three times with a condition to undergo sterilisation permanently for the grant of this leave for the third time, and
- (iii) that in the case of women Board employees with no child, Maternity leave of six weeks for natural abortion or abortion under Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act may be granted for two times only.

3. Considering that some more restrictions are necessary for the grant of maternity leave, the Government, in their Government Order fifth cited, have issued orders so as to promote the small family norm in the State. Following the orders of Government, the following orders are issued:—

- (i) A woman Board employee with less than two surviving Children may be allowed maternity leave for a period of 90 days from the date of its commencement.
- (ii) Maternity leave not exceeding 6 weeks for mis-carriage, including natural abortion or abortion under Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act, 1975 may be granted to a woman Board employee, irrespective of number of surviving Children on production of Medical certificate.
- (iii) Notwithstanding the requirement of production of medical certificate, leave of the kind due and admissible upto a maximum of one year may, if applied for, be granted in continuation of Maternity leave granted.

In the Government Order read above, the Government have issued orders Standardising the terms and conditions governing the deputation of Government Servants on Foreign Service terms under Fundamental Rules 110 to 114 to various Institutions.

2. As per F. R. 110(b), the Government sanction the deputation of A & B Group Officers on Foreign Service under FRs 110 to 114 and Heads of Departments sanction the deputation of C & D Group Officers. The terms and conditions of deputation are indicated in each and every order deputing the Government Servants on Foreign Service terms.

3. It has been brought to notice that incorporating the terms and conditions in each and every deputation order would involve unnecessary scriptory work and it would be avoidable if general terms and conditions are prescribed and the individual deputation ordered to be governed by such general terms.

4. The Government have examined the matter carefully and have decided to accept the above view. They accordingly now issue "Standardised terms and conditions" governing the deputation of State Government Employees to Tamil Nadu State Government Undertakings and to institutions other than State Government Undertakings such as Universities, Co-operative Institutions etc. as indicated below:—

1. **Pay/H.R.A./C.C.A.:** While on Foreign Service the officers shall draw the pay and allowances admissible to him in his post in the Government and the usual allowances, viz., Dearness Allowance, House Rent Allowance and City Compensatory Allowance at the rates admissible under the orders in force from time to time.
2. **Conveyance Allowance:** The Foreign Employer may sanction conveyance allowance with reference to the needs of the job, at the rates applicable to a similar class of employee under the Foreign Employer.
3. **Project Allowance:** If a Government Servant deputed to a Foreign employer works in a project area and a project allowance is paid to the other similar employees in that area, such project allowance may be paid to the deputationist also.
4. **Cash Allowance:** A deputationist shall be permitted to receive cash allowance in lieu of residential Office Assistant, if there is a residential Office Assistant attached to the post under the Foreign Employer and the Foreign Employer has a scheme of cash allowance in lieu of residential Office Assistant.
5. **Leave Salary and Pension Contribution:**
 - (i) In respect of deputation to Tamil Nadu State Government Undertakings:—
Leave Salary contribution shall not be recovered from the foreign employer and leave salary for any period of leave taken including leave surrendered and encashment of leave in the event of retirement or death, under the foreign employer shall be borne by the foreign employer. The foreign employer shall also pay the leave salary charges in respect of any disability incurred in and through foreign service even though such disability manifests itself after the termination of the foreign service. The entire expenditure in respect of any compensatory allowance for periods of leave in or at the end of foreign service shall be borne by the foreign employer. No additional pension contribution shall, however be recovered in respect of the period of the disability leave. Pension Contributions shall be recovered at the rate of 10% of the maximum of the scale of pay. Penal interest would be levied if payments are delayed.

- (ii) In respect of deputation to institutions other than Tamil Nadu State Government Undertakings such as Co-operative institutions, Universities, Other Autonomous Bodies etc. :—

Necessary contribution towards leave salary and Pension shall be recovered from the foreign employer and their remittance shall be made by crossed cheque or demand draft to the lending authority. The foreign employer shall also pay the leave salary charges in respect of any disability incurred in and through foreign service even though such disability manifests itself after the termination of the foreign service. The entire expenditure in respect of any compensatory allowance for periods of leave in or at the end of foreign service shall be borne by the foreign employer. No additional pension contribution shall, however, be recovered in respect of the period of disability leave. The grant of leave and payment of leave salary shall be regulated as per G.O. Ms. No. 838, personnel and Administrative Reforms, dated 9-7-1977. Penal interest would be levied if payments are delayed.

6. **Medical concession :** The deputationist shall be allowed to enjoy the medical concessions prevalent under the foreign employer. If the medical concessions prevalent under the foreign employer are less attractive than the concession under the Government, he shall have option to avail to the medical concessions of Government.
7. **Claim for arrears :** The claims of the officer for arrears of pay and allowances for the period spent in foreign service shall be paid by the foreign employer, whether the claims are made during, or, on the expiry of, foreign service.
8. **Joining time transfer travelling allowance :** The deputationist shall be eligible for joining time admissible under F.R. 105 and 106 while joining the post under foreign service and on reversion therefrom.

He shall be eligible for travelling Allowance as on transfer at the rates admissible to the employees of the foreign employer for his journey to join the post and on reversion from foreign service and for travelling allowance as on tour at the rates admissible to the employees of the foreign employer for journeys performed by him in connection with the work of the foreign employer or at the rates applicable to him under Government whichever may be more advantageous to him.

9. **Period of deputation :** The period of deputation will, unless otherwise specifically stated, be three years. The deputationist may, however, be recalled by the lending authority at any time at its discretion subject to these conditions, the deputation will commence on the date on which the deputationist hands over charge of his post under the State Government or under the previous Foreign Employer, as the case may be, and end on the date he assumed charge of a post under the State Government.
10. **Applicability of Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules and Government Servant Conduct Rules :** The deputationist will be deemed to be a member of the State and Subordinate Service to which he would have belonged but for the deputation, for purposes of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules and the Government Servants Conduct Rules notwithstanding that his services are placed at the disposal of the foreign employer. Besides, he shall also be governed by the special rules of conduct or secrecy, if any, of the Foreign employer. If the officer had, before his deputation to the foreign employer, committed any act or omission, which renders him, liable to any penalty specified in the said rules, the State Government or the appropriate disciplinary authority, as the case may be, under whom he was serving at the time of commission of such act or omission, shall alone be competent to institute disciplinary proceedings against him and to impose on him a penalty specified in the said rules, as they think fit and the foreign employer under whom he is serving at the time of institution of such proceedings shall be bound to render all the reasonable facilities to the Government disciplinary authority for conducting such proceedings.
11. **Cost of higher studies :** If the officer is deputed for any training/course, the cost shall be borne by the foreign employer, irrespective of the fact whether he will return to the same post or not.
12. **Accountant general to watch recovery :** The Accountant General, Tamil Nadu is requested to watch the recovery of Pension and other contributions due from the foreign employer.

13. **Strict adherence of terms and conditions :** The foreign employer shall strictly adhere to the terms and conditions in this order and not allow any higher scale of pay or concede any concession of pecuniary value other than those specified in these terms and conditions without prior concurrence of the lending department.
14. **Leave travel concession :** A deputationist shall be allowed to avail himself of the Leave Travel Concession available to him in Government Service. (or as available in Foreign Service, whichever is more advantageous).
15. **Recall :** The foreign employer shall revert a deputationist at any time before the expiry of the sanctioned period of deputation to Government Service, if so required by the Government or the lending authority.
16. **Death in harness—transportation expenses :** The foreign employer should bear the cost of transportation of dead body of a Government Servant who dies in harness while on deputation, to his place of residence or place of cremation or to his native place as desired by the members of the family of the deceased, by arranging departmental vehicle or hired vehicle in case of death within the State or by air in case of death outside the State so as to perform the cremation, the religious rites, etc. without any loss of time.
17. **Bonus :** The deputationists, while on deputation, shall be allowed to draw bonus if any, admissible under the payment of Bonus Act, 1965 as declared by the Foreign employer.
18. **Reimbursement of leave salary during compulsory wait :** In the cases of officers who were relieved from foreign service but were on compulsory wait, the salary for the period of compulsory wait shall be paid by the foreign employer initially and the amount got reimbursed from the Government Department to which the officer is subsequently posted. If any officer is posted again on foreign service to any other foreign body after compulsory wait, then the Government Department from which he was first deputed to foreign service, shall reimburse the salary paid for compulsory wait to the foreign employer.
19. **Leave Account :** An extract of leave account shall be supplied to the Foreign employer by the Head of Office from which the Officer has been deputed to foreign service. The foreign employer will determine the leave admissible to the Government servant and sanction it under intimation to the Head of Office.
20. **Charges of Electricity, Water, Cooking Gas :** The foreign employer should not bear the charges towards electricity, water and cooking gas in the residence of the deputationist and this should be the liability of the officer deputed.
21. **Festival Advance :** Festival Advance shall be paid to a person in foreign service as admissible to the Government Servant or as admissible in the foreign service, whichever is more advantageous to him. The outstanding advance, if any, shall, on reversion to parent department be recovered and paid to the foreign employer in the balance number of instalments in the parent department.

5. All lending authorities are requested to specify that the general terms and conditions of deputation shall be as per these orders while sanctioning the deputation of any officer under their control, without narrating or repeating the conditions. Only additional or special conditions, if any, need be specifically mentioned in deputation orders. Even if no terms are mentioned, all deputations to Tamil Nadu State Government Undertakings/Corporations/Boards, as well as Universities/Co-operative Institutions/Autonomous Bodies, etc., shall be deemed to be governed by these general terms and conditions.

6. Further, the authority issuing deputation orders should maintain relevant Foreign Service Card and it should be sent to the Audit Officer along with the deputation orders for indicating the rate of Leave Salary contribution and Pension contribution. The instructions laid down in G. O. Ms. No. 12, Personnel and Administrative (F. R. II) Department, dated 8-1-91 should be followed scrupulously in maintaining the Foreign Service Card.

The Residential Audit Officer, Office of the Accountant General (Audit) II brought to the notice of the Board the following discrepancies during audit in various offices of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board in regard to the sanction and reimbursement claims towards Leave Travel Concession :—

- (i) The Leave Travel Concession claims for brothers and sisters were reimbursed, which is not admissible since Family as per Regulations 2(IV) of Travelling Allowance Regulations of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board does not include brothers and Sisters of an employee.
- (ii) Unspent amounts by the employees in respect of Leave Travel Concession are not being remitted immediately after completion of Journey. Instead, the unspent advance amounts are permitted to be recovered subsequently from the pay and allowances of the respective employees, resulting in much delay in recoveries.
- (iii) In case of children below 12 years of age, the Railway allow 50% concession in fares and similarly, Children below 5 years are allowed to travel free of cost. However, it is observed that in certain cases of Leave Travel Concession bills, full fare for Children below 12 years and 50% fare for children below 5 years are admitted and paid.
- (iv) Instances had come to notice wherein two different officials claimed Leave Travel Concession quoting the same Railway Ticket numbers, whereas journeys were performed on different dates.
- (v) There were instances wherein Leave Travel Concession claims for journeys in I Class etc. were admitted without insisting the employees to quote ticket numbers. In the absence of details regarding ticket numbers etc., the authenticity of the claim could not be verified in audit.
- (vi) The entire expenditure incurred on account of Travel through circular routes instead of shortest route were reimbursed resulting in excess payments, in the case of certain Leave Travel Concession claims.
- (vii) The Railway Ticket numbers furnished by Officials in the Leave Travel Concession claims consisted of numbers which were not genuine.

2. Several instructions have been issued in regard to strict adherence of Rules relating to Leave Travel Concession by sanctioning authorities. Had the Sanctioning Authorities exercised proper scrutiny while sanctioning Leave Travel Concession claims, the discrepancies pointed out by the Residential Audit Officer in para 1 would not have occurred.

3. Therefore, instructions issued so far, in regard to sanction of Leave Travel Concession should be followed scrupulously while scrutinising the Leave Travel Concession Claims.

ANNEXURE—I

Conditions for the issue of N. O. C. to apply/Renewal of Passport in connection with visit to foreign countries.

1. The individual should not take up any appointment or undergo any other training or study programme during his stay abroad without prior approval of the competent authority.
2. The individual should not seek or canvass any business.
3. The Board will not be made liable for any expenditure including his travel expenses etc., in connection with his trip, if it is purely a private visit. In other cases, necessary expenditure as permissible under the rules of the Board or as per specific orders of the Board will be allowed.
4. The individual should not tender resignation of the post held under Board and his resignation of the appointment under Board while abroad will not be accepted on any account.
5. The individual should execute the bond prescribed for the purpose along with the leave application before he leaves to travel out of India.
6. The individual should apply for the leave to which he is entitled and get it sanctioned for the entire period of absence in connection with his trip abroad which shall not exceed six months.
7. The individual shall not use the passport obtained on the basis of No Objection Certificate for any subsequent trip without prior permission; and
8. The No Objection Certificate will be valid for a period of six months from the date of issue and is issued only in connection with the tour of the individual mentioned above.

ANNEXURE—II

Conditions for Processing and issue of N.O.C. for taking up Employment abroad.

1. The period of employment abroad shall normally be five years. However, it shall be restricted to the actual period of contract.
2. The Board will not be liable for any expenditure including travel expenditure etc., in connection with his trip abroad.
3. He should not tender resignation of the post held by him under the Board while abroad and his resignation will not be accepted on any account.
4. The individual should not undergo any training or study programme during his stay abroad without the prior approval of the Board.
5. He should not canvass or seek any business while abroad other than the one specified in the order.
6. He should not use this No Objection Certificate for any subsequent trip abroad without the prior permission of the Board.

7. The period of absence during employment abroad will be treated as extraordinary leave without pay and allowances but such period of absence will not be construed as a break in service. It will not be counted for service benefits such as increment, pay, leave etc., However, if contribution towards pension is paid by the foreign employer or employee such period will count for pension provided a pension scheme is available in the parent organisation.
8. On return from abroad, the official shall not claim any preference over other in his parent department for promotion or higher pay by virtue of the experience gained in foreign employment nor shall claim exemption from working experience or other qualifications required under the rule;
9. The individual should pay the pension contribution to the Board if the foreign employer does not pay the same.
10. The individual on securing employment abroad should intimate to Board the date of joining under the foreign employer and his foreign postal address;
11. That no prosecution is pending or contemplated in a court of Law against the individual;
12. That there is nothing adverse against him in the records of the Special Branch CID (Security) Madras.
13. That he does not belong to scarce category whose services are considered essential by the Board.
14. That no Board dues are pending recovery from him;
15. He should not have any subsisting contractual obligation to serve the Board for specified period.
16. No enquiry or investigation is pending or is contemplated in the Directorate of Vigilance and Anti Corruption/Vigilance Cell against the employee.
17. No disciplinary case is pending or contemplated against the employee.
18. The employee is eligible for sanction of Extraordinary Leave without Allowances for the period applied for.
19. The Board to ensure that the individual has disclosed his assets in the property return submitted to the Board.

In the Board's Proceedings second cited, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board accorded recognition to the then Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Supervisors' Sangam, now renamed as Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Engineers' Sangam (Reg. No. 124/MDS) as a union of Industrial Employees of the Board subject to the conditions contained in Board's Proceedings first cited. Among other things, the recognition accorded is liable to be withdrawn in the following circumstances :

- (i) If the Union or its office bearers permit demonstrations of any kind without prior intimation to the officer concerned or rowdiness in or around Board's premises.
- (ii) Engaging in Union activities during working hours, unless provided for by law, agreement or practice.

2. On 3—4—95, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Engineers' Sangam, represented by its office bearers and members in large number, without prior intimation to the Board, wilfully and deliberately assembled and held demonstration during office hours in front of the Electricity Board complex at 800, Electricity Avenue, Anna Road, Madras-2. While doing so, all of a sudden, about 500 of them surged inside the Electricity Board Complex, trespassed into the office premises ignoring the instructions of the Deputy Superintendent of Police/Security and squatted in the verandahs of 7th to 10th floors of the High Rise Building and in front of the Chambers of the Chairman and other top officers and caused obstruction to the staff and officers who are public servants, from discharging their official duties.

3. In spite of repeated requests by the Chairman, Inspector General of Police (Vigilance), Secretary, Deputy Superintendent of Police/Security and other officers of the Board, office bearers and the members of the Sangam refused to leave the premises but wanted immediate orders on their demands for giving promotion which were then under active consideration and for which discussions were held with all the Unions including Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Engineers' Sangam. Therefore, a complaint was preferred to the Inspector of Police, Chintadripet Police Station and based on the request of the Board, the Police Department deputed police personnel to evict them, if they refused to leave the premises. Only after the police personnel entered the High Rise Building, they vacated the premises.

4. In the communication dated 4—4—95, a show cause notice was issued to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Engineers' Sangam as to why the recognition granted to them should not be withdrawn in the circumstances described in paras 2 and 3 above which are clear violations of the conditions under which recognition was accorded to it. The Sangam was allowed 10 days time to submit its explanation. The Sangam in its letter dt. 15—4—95, requested to grant extension of time for 5 more days. The request was conceded and the Board in their letter dt. 17—4—95 granted time to submit the explanation before 15—4—95. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Engineers' Sangam submitted their explanation on 19—4—95.

5. The Tamil Nadu Electricity Board carefully examined the explanation offered by the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Engineers' Sangam with all the relevant materials. In their explanation dt. 19—4—95 the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Engineers' Sangam :—

- (i) has not denied that without giving any prior intimation to the management, the demonstration, trespassing, squatting, preventing the officers and others from discharging their legitimate duties etc. on 3-4-95 have taken place.
- (ii) has not denied that there was a large gathering of its office bearers and members outside the Electricity Board Complex during office hours without any permission on 3-4-95.
- (iii) has not denied that the office bearers and the members engaged in union activities during office hours on 3-4-95.
- (iv) has not denied that their office bearers and members in large number 'assembled' in several floors of the High Rise Building and in front of the Chairman's room during the office hours on 3-4-95.
- (v) has stated that the demonstration was spontaneous.

6. On enquiry, it is found that the entire unlawful activities of the Sangam on 3-4-95 were not spontaneous but were well planned and deliberate in view of the fact that a large number of office bearers and members have come to Headquarters in trains and hired buses and vans. One of the conditions of recognition is that if the Sangam or its office bearers permit demonstration of any kind without prior intimation to the officers concerned, the recognition accorded will be withdrawn. The office bearers and members of the Sangam cannot take law into their own hands for settling their grievances. The Sangam has not even expressed any regret for the action of their members. On the contrary, they have justified their action. Such acts of gross indiscipline and violation of the rules of recognition, cannot be tolerated in a sensitive and vital public utility like Tamil Nadu Electricity Board. Therefore, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board has decided to take the extreme step of withdrawing the recognition accorded to the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Engineers' Sangam for violation of Rule 8(i) and (ii) of the Rules for the recognition of unions of industrial employees issued in B.P. Ms. No. 2822, dt. 31-12-63 under which the recognition was granted. Accordingly, the recognition accorded in B.P. Ms. No. 185, dt. 5-2-70, to the then Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Supervisors' Sangam, now renamed as, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Engineers' Sangam (Reg. No. 124/MDS) as a union of industrial employees of the Board, is hereby withdrawn.

As per Regulation 10 (c) of the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board Leave Regulations, the employees of the Board are permitted to prefix the holidays preceding the day on which his leave begins and suffix the holidays following the day on which his leave expires. For such a purpose of prefixing and suffixing Sunday and other holidays, the term "Leave" covers different kinds of leave viz., Earned Leave, Unearned Leave on Medical Certificate, Unearned Leave on Private Affairs and Extra Ordinary Leave.

2. In pursuance of the instructions issued by the Government in the letter cited, the following instructions are issued:—

1. Prefixing and Suffixing of holidays to leave, other than leave on Medical certificate, shall be allowed automatically, except in cases where for administrative reasons, such permission is specifically withheld and where no substitute is posted in the leave vacancy.

Tariff IV in respect of Rice Mill and also clarifications are also being sought for regarding application of correct tariff in respect of Rice Mill with effect from 1—2—95.

In this connection, it is to be stated that as per present G. O. (Ms.) No. 29, Energy (A2) Department, dated 31—1—95, L.T. Tariff IV is applicable to Coffee Grinding, Ice Factory, Body Building Unit, Saw Mill, Rice Mill, Flour Mill, Prawn Farming, Poultry Farming, Battery charging unit and industries not covered under L.T. Tariff III.

Hence, the Rice Mill should be classified under L.T. Tariff IV with effect from 1—2—95, even if they undertake job work only.

Superintending Engineers of Elec. Distn. Circles are instructed to apply L.T. Tariff IV in respect of services given to Coffee Grinding, Ice Factory, Body Building unit, Saw Mill, Rice Mill, Flour Mill, Prawn Farming, Poultry Farming, Battery charging unit with effect from 1—2—95 as per G.O. even if they undertake job work only.

Necessary instructions may also be issued to the field officers.

Sub : Electricity—Extension of supply to hut Services under One light per one hut Scheme Target for the year 1995-96—Regarding.

The Districtwise/Circlewise targets for extension of supply to 40,000 hut services under the 'One light per one hut' scheme in respect of normal programme for the year 1995-96 are given in Annexure-I & II.

In this connection, it may be noted that not less than 75% of the target shall be reserved for the huts belonging to Adi-Dravidars. The small houses constructed in Rural areas for the Scheduled caste/Scheduled tribes under NREP/RLEGP/JVVT may also be taken into account against this 75% target.

Priority shall also be given in extending supply to the houses constructed by THADCO and to the houses constructed under Kamarajar Adi-Dravidar housing scheme in village panchayat areas only.

In case, the number of SC/ST applicants is less than 75% of the circle target, the Chief Engineer (Distribution) of the Region may reallocate the circle target within the Region without affecting the overall District Target so as to ensure that 75% of the services are effected to the SC/ST beneficiaries.

The other terms and conditions for effecting hut services now in vogue remain unaltered.

The number of hut services for Adi-Dravidars under general category, NREP/RLEGP/JVVT, Kamarajar Adi-Dravidar Housing scheme may be arranged to be furnished separately in the monthly return on 20 Point Programme. Any modification of the circle target by the CE(D) of the Region shall be duly intimated to S. /RE & I (D).

Sub: T. N. E. B. — Manufacturing of prestressed concrete poles — Strength requirement and acceptance criteria — Instructions issued.

1. Working instructions extracted from relevant ISS were issued in Memo. No. TM/ETAM/F 145/D 148 (Technical Audit Instruction No. 3) dated 3—12—83. (P. 498 of Gazette) on the aspects of (i) the methods of sampling and testing and (ii) analysis of concrete. A copy of this is enclosed.

2. It is seen that the sample cubes cast in some of the PSC pole casting yards like PSP yard, Mettur dam and Samayanallur, Madurai do not satisfy the acceptance criteria as per clause 15.1 & 15.2 of IS Code 456—1978.

3. It must be ensured that the mix prepared meets the requirement of acceptance criteria as outlined in the memo enclosed and the instructions in the memo are to be followed scrupulously. If the particular mix does not comply with this requirement, action is to be taken to redesign the mix as per IS: 10262 1982.

4. It is also to be ensured that whenever there is a change in the quality of cement, quarry from which the aggregates are procured, gradation of aggregates or any other factors that affect the strength of concrete, trial mixes are to be made, sample cubes cast and tested, and if required, mix is to be redesigned.

Sub: Testing of Concrete.

1. During the course of Technical Examination of Several Works in the field, it is found that testing of concrete has not been done as per ISS, due to non-availability of I. S. S. and testing machines.

A condensed working instructions extracted from relevant ISS on the aspects of methods of sampling, testing and analysis of concrete as provided in the relevant ISS are given in the annexure for wider publication.

The field officers will ensure that the salient aspects are rigourously followed in the field. The field officers are instructed to refer the three ISSs for more detailed explanation of the aspects and also other points not specifically included in the annexure. Any omission to adopt the ISS will be viewed seriously.

2. **TESTING MACHINES:**

It is found that one of the most important reasons for not testing the cubes at the specified age of 28 days is non-availability of the testing machine. The Superintending Engineers are instructed to provide reliable testing arrangements at the project sites so that expensive transport to other testing sites can be avoided and omission to test at the specified age is eliminated altogether.

It is seen that 200t Hydraulic Compression testing machines are available at a cost of about Rs. 20,000/- and 48t hand-operated machines are available at a cost of about Rs. 4000/-.

3. The Superintending Engineers in Projects, General Construction Circle and incharge of Pole Casting Yards will ensure that ISSs relating to various relevant works are purchased and-kept for ready reference in each division.

A few important ISSs may be supplied to the Sub-divisions also.

1. Sampling of fresh Concrete in the field :

1.1. Sample Procedure :

A random sampling procedure is adopted to ensure that sampling is spread over the entire period and covers all mixing units.

1.2. Frequency:

The minimum frequency of sampling of concrete of each grade shall be in accordance with the following :

Quantity of Concrete in the work, m ³	Number of Samples
1 — 5	1
6 — 15	2
16 — 30	3
31 — 50	4
51 and above	4 plus one additional sample for each additional 50m ³ or part thereof.

Note : At least one sample shall be taken from each shift.

1.3. Procedure :

1.3.1. From Mixers : At least three approximately equal sample increments totalling 0.02 m³ from a batch; at about the time when one-quarter, one-half and three-quarters of the concrete has been discharged from the mixer.

1.3.2. From concrete at place of deposit : Collect sample from not less than five well-distributed positions.

1.4. Mixing the composite sample :

Mix the samples obtained as per (1.3.1) and (1.3.2) above.

1.5. Recording of samples :

The following information regarding the samples shall be recorded :

- (a) date and time of sampling.
- (b) method of sampling used.
- (c) Mix proportions (proportion of ingredients including water, admixtures etc.,)
- (d) Mixer from which delivered (if more than one is used)
- (e) The location of the sampled batch after placing, and
- (f) Temperature and weather conditions.

2. Making, Curing and Testing :

2.1. Number of specimens :

At least three specimens shall be made from each sample for testing at 28 days.

2.2. Size :

Cubes of 15 x 15 x 15 cm.

2.3. Moulds :

2.3.1. Cube Moulds Variation in sizes not more than ± 0.2 mm. Angle between faces shall be $90^\circ \pm 5^\circ$

2.3.2. Coat the mould with oil.

2.4. Compacting :

Fill mould with concrete in layers 5 cm deep.

2. Compacting by hand :

Steel tamping rods 16mm in diameter, 0.6m long and bullet-pointed at the lower end. No. of strokes with bar not less than 35 per layer. Strokes shall penetrate into the underlying layer.

Compacting by vibration :

Vibrate each layer.

2.5. Curing :

Cure specimen under damp matting or sacks for 24 hours \pm half an hour. After this, remove from moulds and store in water. Keep specimen continually wet until test.

2.6. Age at test :

Only 28 day compressive strength of concrete is the criterion for acceptance or rejection of concrete.

2.7. Procedure for Test :

Remove specimens stored in water and test immediately while they are still wet wipe off surplus water and grit. Dry specimens shall be kept in water for 24 hours before test. Place cubes such that load is applied to opposite sides of the cubes as cast, i.e. NOT TO THE TOP AND BOTTOM. No packing shall be used between specimen and testing machine. Continuously increase load at 140 kg/cm² per minute.

2.8. Calculation :

The test strength shall be the average of 3 specimen. Individual variation not more than \pm 15% of the average.

2.9. Report :

The following information shall be included in the report on each test specimen :

- (a) Identification mark
- (b) date of test
- (c) age of specimen
- (d) curing conditions, including date of manufacture of specimen in the field
- (e) Weight of specimen
- (f) dimensions of specimen
- (g) Cross-sectional area
- (h) Maximum load
- (i) Compressive strength, and
- (j) appearance of fractured faces of concrete and type of fracture, if these are unusual.

3. Analysis :

3.1. Standard Deviation : (s)

At least 30 test results required. Calculation of standard deviation to be brought upto date atleast once in a month.

3.2. Determination of Standard Deviation : (s)

$$s = \sqrt{\frac{\sum \Delta^2}{n - 1}}$$

Where

Δ = Deviation of the individual test strength from the average strength of n samples; and

n = number of sample test results.

3.3. Assumed Standard Deviation :

If test results are insufficient, assume the following standard deviations :

4. Acceptance Criteria :

4.1. Concrete Complies with the strength requirement if :

- every sample has a test strength not less than THE CHARACTERISTIC value ; or
- When the strength of one or more samples is less than the characteristic value : Find the following values :
 - Characteristic strength — 1.35 s
 - 0.80 times the characteristic strength
 Strength should not be less than the greater of the above two.
- average strength of all samples is not less than the characteristic strength plus

$$\left[1.65 - \frac{1.65}{\sqrt{n}} \right] s$$

4.2. Concrete shall be deemed not to comply with the strength requirements if :

- the strength of any sample is less than the greater of :
 - characteristic strength — 1.35 s and
 - 0.80 times the characteristic strength
- the average strength of all the samples is less than the characteristic strength plus

$$\left[1.65 - \frac{3}{\sqrt{n}} \right] s$$

4.3. Concrete which does not meet the strength requirements as per 4.1. above but which has a strength greater than that required by 4.2. may be accepted at the discretion of the designer.

4.4. Concrete coming under 4.2. above :

Structural adequacy of the affected parts shall be investigated

4.5. Assess concrete of each grade separately.

4.6. Assess concrete daily for compliance.

4.7. Concrete is liable to be rejected if it is porous or honey-combed ; its placing has been interrupted without providing a proper construction joint ; the reinforcement has been displaced beyond the tolerance specified ; or construction tolerances have not been met. However, the hardened concrete may be accepted after carrying out suitable remedial measures to the satisfaction of the engineer-in charge.

5. Inspection and Testing of Structures :

5.1. Inspection of Structures :

Immediately after stripping the formwork, all concrete shall be carefully inspected and any defective work or small defects either removed or made good before concrete has thoroughly hardened.

5.2. Testing of Structures :

Sub : Extension of supply to Agricultural pumpsets—Target for 1995-96—Reg.

1. Out of the Annual Target of 40,000 Agricultural pumpset connections for the year 1995-96, a tentative initial target of 10,000 pumpsets in each of the Normal & Special priority of one pole/mere service is allotted now and allocation for the balance 20,000 pumpsets for various categories will be issued shortly on receipt of Board/Government orders.

2. Accordingly the Districtwise and Circlewise Targets have been worked out and furnished in the Annexures. The target for the divisions may be fixed in such a way that the division having the oldest applications gets a substantial higher target.

3. Special priority in extending supply to pumpsets may be given as per Govt. orders in force within the overall target of Electricity Distribution Circles.

4. Priority may be given to the parties who have already reported their readinees under normal priority and issue of notices may be regulated to 50% of the target including the number of parties who have already reported their readiness.

5. The Chief Engineer (Distribution) and Superintending Engineers/Electricity Distribution Circles are requested to adhere to the targets and send monthly progress reports to the Superintending Engineer/Rural Electrification & Improvements (Distribution). Monthly progress reports shall cover the no. of agricultural service connections effected under the following categories.

- (i) Pumpsets for handicapped, widows, tribals and Ex-Servicemen as per Government orders.
- (ii) Jeevandhara scheme for scheduled caste/scheduled tribes under National Rural Employment programme (NREP) and Rural Landless Employment Guarantee Programme (RLEGP).
- (iii) Restoration of supply to the Agriculturists whose services were disconnected/treated as having been dismantled prior to 1-4-79 and paid all payments to the Board before 31-12-91.
- (iv) Spillover cases of mere service connections/one pole for Special reasons.
- (v) Normal registration priority.
- (vi) Drought Prone Areas Programme (DPAP) community wells.
- (vii) Mere service/One pole category.

6. In case of any shortfall in achieving the target in any of the circles, the Chief Engineer (Distribution) of the region may reallocate the target to the other circles within the region without affecting the Districtwise targets. Any such modification may be intimated to Superintending Engineer/Rural Electrification & Improvements (Distribution) for information.

7. If any new circle is formed, the Chief Engineer (Distribution) of the Region may suitably reallocate and fix the target for the bifurcated circle without affecting the Districtwise targets, under intimation to the Superintending Engineer/Rural Electrification & Improvements (Distribution).

8. Target for Revised SFS will be intimated separately after ascertaining the response from circle SEs.

In the circular memo. cited under reference (1) it has been clarified that in case of extension of building in the existing building where already a permanent service is existing, then the billing may be done at the revised rate under temporary supply with effect from 1-3-94.

The Chief Engineer (Distribution)/Trichy Region in his letter cited under reference (2) has requested to re-examine the issue regarding application of tariff in respect of services given to Domestic purposes when a minimum load is utilised for the construction purposes.

In view of the above it is clarified that where a permanent supply given to domestic purposes is also utilised for extension of building in the existing building, such services utilised for dual purposes viz. domestic purposes and construction purposes may be charged under L.T. Tariff-IX subject to the condition that domestic loads are predominant to the construction load.

In other cases the instructions under reference (1) may be followed.

Necessary instructions may be issued to the field officers accordingly.

Ms. (F.B.) No. 61 (Adm. Branch) dated 24-12-88 and published in Part-VI Section 3(b) of the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette No. 8 dated 1-3-89 and as amended subsequently.

This amendment shall come into force with immediate effect.

In the 2nd line of para (1) of Clause 28.01, the words "Seasonal conditions" shall be inserted between the words "such as" and "demolition".

The amended 1st para of Clause 28.01 shall be read as follows: "A consumer's request to disconnect the service connection temporarily upto a period of one year will be considered for bonafide reasons such as seasonal conditions, demolition, remodelling of building or alteration of electrical wiring in the building. The consumer will however have to pay the minimum monthly charges as provided in the tariff and in Clause 18.02 during the period of disconnection."

Hence, it has become difficult to cope up with the demand.

Further no Purchase Order is pending for supply of three phase meters and the analysis of the tenders opened for supply of 3 phase meters is under process.

In the above circumstances, the Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles are requested to accept new three phase meters from the prospective consumers till such time the supply position of meters improves considerably, subject to the condition that they should ensure before acceptance of new meters from consumers that there is no stock of three phase energy meters at stores.

Further the Superintending Engineers of Distribution Circles are also informed that the refund of cost of meters supplied by the prospective consumers may be made as per Circular memo. dated 15-9-94 cited under reference (1) The procedure now in vogue may be followed for acceptance and refund of cost for the meters supplied by the consumers.

The State Government while reviewing the achievement of agriculture pumpset connections during 1994-95 under 20 Point Programme remarked that proportionate target has not been achieved. Hence, it has been decided that 10,000 numbers may be allocated for effecting service under special priority scheme with mere service connection and one pole extension cases and the scheme can be taken up simultaneously along with normal priority.

The following instructions are issued :

- (1) Out of the target of 40,000 agricultural pumpsets to be energised during 1995—96, 10,000 pumpsets shall be energised under normal priority and 10,000 pumpsets under special priority scheme of on line/one pole extension.
Allocation for the balance 20,000 pumpsets for various categories will be issued separately.
- (2) The investigation for both mere service and one pole categories may be taken up simultaneously and notices may be issued strictly according to their priority of registration of applications.
- (3) Accordingly, the targets for each division under the mere service connection (on-line category) and one pole extension shall be 50% of the division target fixed. In case of shortfall in any of the division; Superintending Engineers can redistribute the target under this category to other divisions and in case of shortfall in a circle, the Chief Engineers/Distribution of the regions can reallocate among circles in their regions without affecting the district targets.
- (4) The notice period for this category shall be 45 (forty-five) days. Notice for reporting readiness shall be issued in such a way that the expiry date for the 45 days shall not go beyond 31—10—95.
- (5) All ready cases under this scheme should be effected supply on or before 29—2—96 and the total no. of pumpsets connected shall not exceed the target fixed under this scheme.
- (6) All other instructions issued in the circular memo. first cited for the implementation of the special programme during 1990—91 may be followed for this year's programme also.
- (7) The Chief Engineers/Distribution are requested to programme the service connections for the agricultural pumpsets such that both the schemes viz. connections coming under Special Priority envisaged in this circular memo as well as connections coming under normal priority are given side by side. The progress of these services may be reported separately to the Superintending Engineer/Rural Electrification & Improvement (Distribution). All pumpsets coming under this special priority scheme shall be effected before 29—2—96 and there shall not be any carry over to next year.

Regarding the Incentive Scheme proposal for Distribution/Town/City I invite your kind 1. Instructions were already issued to avert accidents to departmental staff in the references cited. Inspite of the above instructions, accidents to staff are still occurring due to non-observance of safety precautions.

2. A fatal accident occurred to a departmental wireman in Chidambaranar Elec. Distn. Circle on 22-12-94. He attempted to attend a fuse off call without observing safety precautions and without using safety appliances such as Gloves, Belt rope etc., He got electric shock and fell on the ground and died on the way to the Hospital.

3. If strict action had been taken to enforce the safety instructions laid down in chapter III/ Clause 13 (1, 2 & 3) and Chapter IV, clause (5) of Tamil Nadu Electricity Board safety manual, this accident could have been avoided.

4. The Chief Engineers/Distribution of all regions are requested to ensure that the instructions already issued for formation of "Safety Committee" vide Circular Memo No. SE/RE & I (D)/DB/A4/F. Accident C. No. 475/D. No. 475-2/91, dt 13-8-91 (Copy enclosed) are enforced and the committee convened regularly once in three months to inculcate the safety habits widely in the minds of departmental Staff.
